Our Place in the World



At Our Lady and St. Hubert's we are strengthened by our diversity and range of family backgrounds and this theme celebrates who we are. Children will learn about the history and geography of people – who we are, where we come from and why many people choose to settle and live where they do – particularly in our local area and Great Britain. Children will celebrate who they are through creating self-portraits; community events held within school will celebrate our range of family backgrounds; children will discover more about the variety of faiths followed by our local communities, underpinned by learning about the values that we have in Britain. Enrichment visits to local places of worship, will enhance children's understanding of a variety of faiths.

Understanding the World - Geography

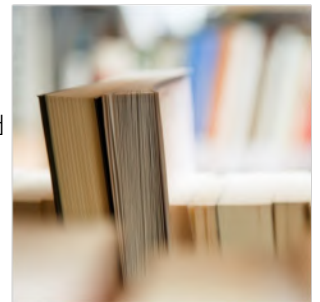


We will explore the new playground and consider what is new, and the differences in materials and what changes they notice.

Writing and Reading

Through their English lessons this half term, the children will retell the story of The Rainbow Fish, continuing to develop their understanding of the structure and sequence a story. This includes how characters may change throughout the story.

Children will also continue to work on practising writing their name, as well as using their print and letter knowledge to begin to form words.



Other theme information

Application and 6cs

We will be looking at ourselves and considering the similarities and difference we have compared with other people.

Theme Impact

Through this theme children will begin to explore their place in the world and how they see themselves within it. Through their developing understanding of similarities and differences that they may have, they will start to consider how this can inform their decisions and that their opinion may be different to a friends.

Enrichment opportunities

Children will visit a farm and compare and consider the similarities and differences of the different animals.. During their visit, children will be able to feel and feed a range of animal and think about the similarities and differences between them.,

Catholic Social Teaching - Solidarity and the Common Good

This theme helps children understand that everyone is connected and responsible for the wellbeing of each other, especially the most vulnerable, such as refugees.

Through the concept of the Common Good, they will begin to develop an understanding that the social conditions will enable and support individuals and groups to flourish and to reach their full potential.



Religious Education

Pentecost – The children will begin to develop an understanding of this time, and that Holy Spirit is invisible and is always with us.

God's family – This unit builds on the idea that we are all members of God's Family, through Baptism and that this community has a special place to gather on a special day.



Other taught areas



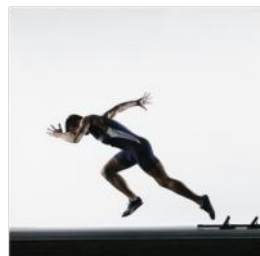
Maths

We will continue to develop our understanding of repeats, with the children taking the lead and creating their own. This will further be developed through with the children making patterns together. We will also be working on completing puzzles such as jigsaws, focusing on seeing where pieces need to go and match against another. The children will also consolidate their subitising knowledge and use this to make games and actions.



Understanding the World - Science

Throughout Science the children will explore and talk about different forces and actions. Some of this will be done through creating pathways using the waterwall or making ramps of different heights to test how fast cars will go down them.



Physical Development - P.E

This half term the children will continue to create obstacle course that they create themselves using a variety of resources. They will collaborate together to manage and move large resources.



Understanding the World - Computing

The children will continue to use iPads to take photographs, which they will use the photobooth app to explore how they can manipulate the effects and filters of an image.

They will also continue to develop their understanding of data and why we need to record it accurately when using the internet, such as when taking the register.



Expressive Art and Design - Drawing

This half term the children will continue to develop their drawing skills through adding or beginning to add more details to their pictures. The children will have the opportunity to have a range of different objects to draw,, focusing on different details.



Communication and Language - Music

The children will be developing their skills in matching the tone or pitch being sung by another person. They will also continue to work on the melodic flow of familiar songs.

They will also have the opportunity to create and perform their own songs.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development - RSE

The children will continue to work on how they can play and involve other children, extending and elaborating on play ideas.

In RSE the children will continue their journey on exploring communities and begin to understand that they have responsibilities to people and the planet, and that these grow as they get older.

Individual Liberty

In this unit, children will explore the meaning of freedom and what it means to have individual liberty. They will develop an awareness of their own needs, views, and feelings, learning to express themselves confidently and respectfully. Through activities focused on encouraging difference and celebrating uniqueness, children will practise using kind and supportive language to respect everyone's individuality. They will reflect on their own personality and consider the hopes and dreams we all share, understanding the importance of being free to be themselves while respecting others.
