

1. Draw a paper star and colour it.


Step-

- 2. Cut the star shape.
- 3. Place the star on the background and trace around one side of the star to mark its location.
- 4. Apply glue to the part.
- 5. Glue on paper strips, one by one.
- 6. Make a few loops.
- 7. Apply a small amount of glue at the end of each strip and stick it to the cardboard.
- **8.** Repeat with every strip.
- •9. Finally, glue the paper star.


