The majority of events will be held in Katoomba at **The Carrington Hotel** at 15-47 Katoomba Street or the **Katoomba Community Hall** at 81-83 Katoomba Street. **The Baroque Room** is part of The Carrington complex and is accessed via the circular driveway rather than the hotel itself.

Workshops and the Children's Program will be held at the Blue Mountains Cultural Centre and Blue Mountains Library, Katoomba Branch at 30 Parke Street.

Writers in the Sky and Among the Trees will be held at Scenic World, on the corner of Violet Street and Cliff Drive, Katoomba. The Skyway is wheelchair accessible, but please note that the Scenic Railway is not wheelchair accessible.

Beers and Books will be held in Mountain Culture's Katoomba brewery at 23-25 Parke Street. While the main venue has flat access, unfortunately the upstairs space where Beers and Books will be held is not wheelchair accessible.



Accessibility

The Blue Mountains Writers' Festival strives to make every event as accessible as possible. To find more information about access for each venue, please go to the Festival website.

All events except *Beers and Books* at Mountain Culture and *Among the Trees* at Scenic World are wheelchair accessible

The Festival will have Auslan interpreters available for the weekend and will schedule them into sessions on request. Audience members can check a box requesting Auslan interpreters when they book a ticket. Portable T-loops will be available in both the Grand Dining Room and Katoomba Community Centre stages.

All events in the Grand Dining Room at The Carrington and Katoomba Community Centre will have real-time captions.

Registered/accredited assistance animals are welcome at all Festival events and venues.

The Blue Mountains Writers' Festival is a member of the Companion Card scheme.

We have received funding this year to offer a 50 per cent discount on a limited number of Festival passes and tickets. This ticket is available for patrons on a Disability Support Pension, or for those whose income is severely impacted by their disability or a lack of access. Please note that these tickets are limited and subject to availability.

Accessible toilets are located at the Carrington Hotel, Katoomba Community Hall, Blue Mountains Cultural Centre, as well as Scenic World.
