Our Health and Safety Promise.

As a school, we are providing the safest environment that we can to help mitigate the spread of COVID. Please see the following procedures we've implemented this year:

- Ensuring social distancing of at least 3 feet
- Students eat in the classroom vs. lunchroom
- Partitions are on students desks and tables
- Hand sanitizing stations are in various places throughout the building
- Temperature check of all students prior to them entering the building
- COVID testing bi-monthly (The results are sent to the parent via email. We do not receive any results. If your child's test is positive, please inform the school immediately so that we can conduct contact tracing to determine close contact of any other students or staff)
- Deep cleaning of classrooms
- All water fountains are closed....we have water refilling stations throughout the building.
- All staff and students wear masks all day.
- Sponsored several vaccination drives

Please help us keep our students safe by wearing your masks. This is a village effort, let's do all we can to keep everyone safe.













We've hired additional staff to assist with instructional support to address learning loss over the last year and a half due to COVID-19. Each K-2 grade classroom has an additional teacher to provide intervention for reading and math and we have hired math and reading interventionists to assist with because of the pandemic. We have a full-time nurse, school counselor, and Communities in Schools staff person to assist with the medical needs, social/ emotional needs of scholars, and providing resources to our families if needed.
