Lakota's finances continue to be very strong. Not only did we end fiscal year 2024 with our eleventh consecutive balanced budget, but we also received our ninth consecutive Auditor of State Award with Distinction. Additionally, we are not predicting the need for an operating levy in May's five-year forecast, continuing our long streak of not asking our taxpayers for additional funding since 2013.

Being fiscally responsible isn't something we just say...it's something we prove with every financial decision we make, while still ensuring that our mission statement holds true: "Everything WE do is designed to provide a future-ready, student-centered learning experience for every single child."

As we move into this new school year, we are pleased to once again be able to provide student supply kits and waive student fees. This is a result of the COVID-19 relief that Lakota was granted through the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) dollars. However, this is the final year that we will be able to use ESSER funds to pay for these supplies.

As we finish our last minute work before the start of the new school year, I want to say thank you to everyone who completed the enrollment process this summer. Not only have you kept our Welcome Center team very busy, but early registration also helps us be better prepared with staffing and planning for the new school year.

Community Curriculum Advisory Team Seeks Feedback

Lakota's new Community Curriculum Advisory Team (CCAT) is looking for feedback from parents, students, staff and community members.



"This group is much broader than just a curriculum audit or a curriculum review," Board President Lynda O'Connor said at the May 1 regular board meeting.

"We're hoping to wrap this (work) into a proactive piece that will bring different curriculum pieces through this team and

provide some feedback and recommendations," said Executive Director of Curriculum and Instruction Lori Brown. "But, we're also looking to be responsive within this team and have a process for handling any kinds of concerns that come to the table related to any of Lakota's curriculum."

Over the summer, the group requested that the district gather input from the community about Lakota's curriculum.

Lakota Creates Community Diversity Council

The Lakota Board of Education approved the creation of the Lakota Community Diversity Council at its June 5 meeting. The Council, which replaces the Board's diversity committee, will help support the district's nearly 17,500 students in their educational experience. Board President Lynda O'Connor and member Kelley Casper will serve as representatives.

The Council's mission statement says: "The purpose of the Lakota Community Diversity Council is to establish a supportive and welcoming school environment for Lakota students and staff of all backgrounds. WE will work to make sure all students have the same opportunities for success. WE will work to break down barriers to student learning for all students."

Participants of the council will be representatives of many different cultures. backgrounds, perspectives, learning styles and religions. "Part of the thinking is to bring some new faces to the table, as well as some who have been previously involved or are currently involved in the district," O'Connor said.

"The expectation is that all who serve must be willing to listen and to consider all sides (and) must be able to discuss collaboratively and respectfully what's best for students," O'Connor said.


The quarterly meetings will be led by a third-party facilitator as the Council works to remove barriers to education that may exist for the diverse makeup of students who call Lakota home.


