We talked, laughed, and prayed together at conference meetings and at Synod Assembly. The outcome was the One Church Experiment. As of now, congregations are looking at this Experiment, talking within their congregations, reaching out to neighboring congregations, and looking at how this Spirit-led concept might take root in the coming years.

From Your Synod Vice President

At the outset of each synod council orientation session, we are reminded of the meaning of the word synod, "on the way together."

Your synod council worked diligently this past year to work together with our bishop and synod staff, in the words of the initial rewrite of our Mission Statement during the synod council's October retreat, to "raise up courageous disciples."

To that end, the synod council authorized guidelines for two new restricted funds, "Youth and Young Adult Ministries" and "Practical Pastor/Deacon Fund". Monies given to these funds were used to defray costs for the ELCA Youth Gathering and training for our pastors/deacons, both endeavors to promote future disciples for our member congregations. We look forward to the new and creative opportunities in which future support can be used to promote ministry with our young members and within our congregations.

Likewise, the council revised the synod's human resource policy on continuing education and authorized funding for staff education to enhance their discipleship to our Synod.

To further enhance discipleship within our congregations, your synod continues to partner with our brothers and sisters in the Northwestern Ohio Synod in offering classes for lay persons in the diakonia program, "Growing in Faith". I and two other members of our synod council are currently enrolled in the second year of this joint educational opportunity. This program has opened the door to new friendships with fellow lay persons and rostered leaders alike as well as strengthened our personal faith walk. Participants in the diakonia program are from a wide range of ages, backgrounds, and level of interest. Flexibility is given for students to take a class or two as time permits or to work towards completion of the full two-year program. Growing in Faith class offerings can be found in our synod's weekly e-news, "Walking Together".

Much work has been accomplished to write guidelines and procedures to ensure continuity in the work of synod committees, compensation deliberations, use of restricted funds, and the financial operations of the synod. While this work was neither flashy nor flamboyant it was essential nonetheless to ensure the ongoing success of our synod's ability to effectively meet our charge to "cultivate faith networks".

My thanks to our bishop, synod officers, synod council, and synod staff for their diligence and unwavering support to our mission in "raising up courageous disciples" this past year. Additionally, thank you to our pastors, deacons, lay Leaders, and member congregations for your continued support that enables our synod to share the good news of The Gospel to all in Northeast Ohio.

Gather Together:

Building Community and Deepening Faith on Cleveland's West Side

Sometimes, the best ministries begin with a simple invitation. For Mary Washburn, that invitation came from Pastoral Intern Mariah Mills during her time at Bethany English Lutheran Church. Mariah saw potential in starting something new—a space for young adults to gather in faith, reflection, and community. With a little inspiration from the ELCA's Gather Network and a lot of grassroots energy, Gather Together was born.

Today, Gather Together is a joint ministry of Good Soil Lutheran Ministries and Bethany English Lutheran Church, rooted in the west side of Cleveland and coordinated by and for young adults. What began as a few "low effort" weekend gatherings quickly became something more: a growing, intentional community of people in similar life stages seeking spiritual connection.

Mary, one of the group's founding leaders, was in the middle of her own life transitions when Gather Together began. "It reminded me of campus ministry," she said, "but for this stage of life." She knew she needed community—and quickly realized she wasn't alone.

One of the most meaningful experiences so far was the fall 2024 retreat at HopeWood Shores. The retreat offered a full day of connection and renewal: from morning community-building to a digital detox and reflection on what it means to follow Jesus. The group shared in worship and communion, enjoyed time for journaling and prayer, and closed the day around a campfire with s'mores and song. "It filled me up," Mary said, "it was a full day of deep connection."





Holy Communion is a core part of the Gather Together experience. "It recenters us," Mary shared. "It reminds us not to focus on ourselves, but on the gifts we receive in baptism and in Christ." The ritual of passing the bread and cup among one another underscores the community's shared faith and mutual care.

Gather Together now engages about two dozen fairly regular participants. Mary dreams of a future where the ministry continues to thrive—even if she's no longer the one coordinating it all. "I want this in my life," she said. "And it seems like others do too. I've read more theology. I've asked more questions. I've reflected more deeply on what we say we believe," Mary's hope is simple: that in three years, the group is still gathering, still growing, still walking together in faith.

Gather Together is more than an event or a program. It's a community built on the desire to walk together in faith and friendship—a space where young adults are not just welcomed, but centered.

Gather Together is currently supported by a \$1,600 grant from the St. John/St. Paul Endowment Fund, as well as through the Youth and Young Adult Ministry Fund of the Northeastern Ohio Synod, which was strengthened by a gift from the holy closure of Redeemer Lutheran Church in Elyria. Events are often also funded directly by participants. This fund supports ministries like Gather Together that reach those not often engaged by traditional congregational models.

DISCERNMENT OF WHAT GOD HAS IN MIND FOR OUR FUTURE TOGETHER. This was by far our most robust conversation in 2024. From the conference and assembly conversations around Project Isaiah 43 to the unveiling of the One Church Experiment, lay people and rostered ministers alike were part of the discussion. The Holy Spirit was evident in the conversation, discernment, and roll out and the Holy Spirit continues to be with the congregations that are exploring what the One Church Experiment might mean for their faith community.

OUTREACH TO AND ENRICHMENT OF NEW AND EXISTING YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULT MINISTRIES IN OUR SYNOD.

Deacon Frantz and Bishop Barbins went to New Orleans with 175 of our younger members for the ELCA Youth Gathering last summer; plans are underway for an all-Ohio youth week at HopeWood Pines this summer; and after being awarded a grant, a young adult ministry in the Northwest Conference is looking to multiply its ministry throughout the synod.




Ministry Budget

Investing in Mission & Ministry: How We Steward Our Shared Resources

Each year, the faithful generosity of our congregations and ministry partners allows your Northeastern Ohio Synod to support vital ministry across our region and beyond. Through Mission Support and other designated giving, we invest in four key areas: **Church in Society, Congregational Life, Leadership, and Youth & Young Adults**. These categories reflect our commitment to strengthening congregations, equipping leaders, and serving our neighbors in Christ's name.

Leadership: Strong leaders are essential for a thriving church. We celebrate new rostered ministers, invest in continuing education, and offer care and guidance throughout every stage of ministry. We also assist congregations as they transition from one rostered minister to another. Synod staff play a key role in this work, offering pastoral care, consultation, and coordination.

Church in Society: A portion of our Mission Support goes to the ELCA churchwide organization, helping fund ministry nationally and globally. We also partner with social service agencies and ecumenical organizations to care for our neighbors in need.

Congregational Life: Vibrant congregations are central to our mission. We support renewal efforts through Congregational Vitality Grants, provide leadership and care Conference Deans, and gather for shared discernment at Synod Assembly. Our Region 6 Archives preserve our collective story, while Growing in Faith equips lay leaders. All of this is made possible through staff leadership, communications, and infrastructure connect and sustain these efforts.

Youth & Young Adults: We nurture young leaders through Campus Ministries, faithforming experiences at HopeWood Outdoors, and participation in the ELCA Youth Gathering. These ministries are rooted in relationship and sustained by synod staff who coordinate, communicate, and advocate for these vital opportunities for faith formation.

Every dollar—from staffing and building upkeep to grants and programs—reflects our commitment to walk together in faith and share God's love with the world. Thank you for being part of this shared ministry!

Ecumenical Worship Brings Witness of Unity in a Divided World

Christians from across denominations gathered on Thursday, January 23, 2025, at Christ the Redeemer Lutheran Church in Brecksville, Ohio, for an Ecumenical Prayer Service during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The service served as a powerful reminder of the unity shared in Christ, even in a world often marked by division.

Observed annually from January 18-25, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is a global invitation for Christians to come together in worship, reflection, and shared mission.



This year's gathering also marked the 1,700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, a historic milestone that shaped the Christian faith by establishing the Nicene Creed. The service provided an opportunity to reflect on this shared heritage and celebrate the deep connections that unite Christians across traditions.

Through prayer, scripture, and music, those in attendance embodied Jesus' prayer in John 17:21, "that they may all be one so that the world may believe." Held during the same week as the Presidential Inauguration, the service stood as a sign of hope, reconciliation, and collaboration in challenging times.

As the service concluded, those present were reminded that Christian unity is not just an annual observance but a lifelong calling. The spirit of the evening continues to resonate, inspiring deeper relationships, shared ministry, and a commitment to unity in the midst of diversity.
