



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
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YVELINES



HISTORY & GEOGRAPHY

The current territory of the Yvelines has been populated since prehistoric times, about 400,000 years ago. Many sites attest to the presence of humans for thousands of years, such as collective graves, dolmens, shrines, Roman ways, etc.


The blazon of the Yvelines is "of azure sown with flowers of gold lilies to the two bands of silver wavy pinning on the whole".



Located in the west of Île-de-France, the Yvelines department was created in 1968 following the division of the Paris region and the disappearance of the Seine-et-Oise. The name «Yvelines» was inspired by the poet Jehan Despert, evoking the natural landscape of the territory crossed by many rivers, in particular the forest of Rambouillet, formerly called Yveline. The addition of the "s" brings a touch of elegance and reflects the diversity of the places.


With an area of 2,284.4 km², Yvelines is the largest department in Île-de-France. Although the east and north of the department are part of the Paris agglomeration, the rest of the territory remains predominantly rural. Yvelines is home to 85% of natural and agricultural areas, including important wooded areas such as the forest of Rambouillet and the regional natural park of the upper valley of Chevreuse. This makes Yvelines the main forest department of the region, with more than 30% of its area covered by forests.


The Palace of Versailles and its domain

An emblematic marvel of France and a must-see destination for lovers of history, art and architecture, the Palace of Versailles was the main residence of the kings of France Louis XIV, Louis XV and Louis XVI.

Experience the grandeur of the royal apartments, lavish reception rooms, and beautifully maintained French gardens. You will pass by the famous Hall of Mirrors, masterpiece of baroque art.

Castle open from Tuesday to Sunday from 9am to 5:30pm from 01/11 to 31/03 and from 9am to 6:30pm from 01/04 to 31/10. **To access the castle, booking a time slot is mandatory: only online purchase guarantees entry to the Castle within half an hour following the reserved time slot.**

It is also possible to visit the Trianon estate, the Carrosses gallery, the Sculptures and Casts gallery, the Marly estate and the Jeu de Paume hall.

Estate of Trianon

The estate of Trianon is a part of the park of the Palace of Versailles, located in its northern part, and which includes the Grand Trianon, the Petit Trianon, and the Queen's Hamlet.

Not far from the castle, Louis XIV gave free rein to his love of architecture and gardens by creating this domain reserved for his personal use.

Open from Tuesday to Sunday from 12pm to 5:30pm from 01/11 to 31/03 and from 12pm to 6:30pm from 01/04 to 31/10.

The Carrosses Gallery houses real jewels designed by the most talented artists of the time. These carriages also represent a remarkable testimony of the technological progress of their time, illustrating the constant evolution of the techniques and innovations of the time.

Gallery of Sculptures and Casts

The current gallery of Sculptures and Casts, was originally occupied by the stalls of horses. Since 1970, the gallery hosts the Gypsothèque of the Louvre Museum, but also original marble statues directly from the Gardens.

The estate of Marly

Another major achievement of Louis XIV who made it his residence of pleasure, it remains today the park and elements like the Abreuvoir, with its two basins. In 2022, the estate of Marly received the "Jardin Remarquable" label. The Domain Museum also brings the site to life with its paintings, drawings, statues, engravings and archaeological furniture.

Open every day from 7am to 7:30pm. Extended opening until 9:30pm on weekends from 14/05 to 29/08, and until 8:30pm on weekends from 03/09 to 18/09.

Hall of the Jeu de Paume

Built for the Parisian masters-paumiers, the Court and the royal family to practice, the Jeu de Paume hall became the symbol of the Revolution of 1789.

On 20 June 1789, the deputies of the Third Estate took an oath not to separate before giving France a written constitution, a scene immortalized by the painter Jacques-Louis David.



Open for free visit every first Sunday from April to October from 12.30pm to 6.30pm and guided tour only on the rest of the time.





Castle of Breteuil


Nestled in the Chevreuse Valley Natural Park, Breteuil Castle offers a captivating immersion into the daily life of a family during the history of France, thanks to a collection of 50 wax characters. The outbuildings also house the presentation of eight Perrault tales.

Stretching over 75 hectares, the park offers a variety of attractions, including several gardens, a labyrinth, a medieval dovecote, as well as spaces dedicated to games and picnics.

Opening of the park at 10am and closing at 7pm in winter and 8pm in summer. Free visits of the castle every day from 11am to 12pm and from 2pm to 5:30pm. Guided tours organized the week at 12pm and 4.30pm, and weekends at 12.30pm and 4.30pm.

Collegiale Church of Mantes-la-Jolie

Listed as a Historical Monument in 1840, the Collegiate Church of Mantes-la-Jolie is an old collegiate church of the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. It appears as the most important medieval church of the Yvelines, and as one of the major buildings of Île-de-France, with Notre-Dame de Paris, Saint-Denis and Meaux.

Saint-Germain-en-Laye Castle & National Archaeology Museum


The castle of Saint-Germain-en-Laye, houses the National Archeology Museum since 1862, which became the National Archeology Museum in 2005.

The National Archaeology Museum preserves, studies and exhibits objects dating from the Palaeolithic to the First Middle Ages and includes a collection dedicated to Comparative Archaeology.

With nearly 85% of its territory dedicated to natural and agricultural areas, the Yvelines are distinguished by the predominance of vast green areas and remarkable wooded areas.


The Yvelines are a true paradise for nature lovers, offering landscapes of striking beauty and endless possibilities of wonder and rejuvenation.


France Miniature offers a fascinating experience where you can explore a faithful 1/30th scale reduction of France, with meticulous reproductions of its most famous monuments

TO ADMIRE

The architectural heritage of the Yvelines is an exceptional showcase of French history and art, with treasures such as the <u>Castle of Versailles</u>, the <u>Castle of Rambouillet</u> or the <u>Castle of Saint-Germain-en-Laye</u>, testifying to the elegance and architectural diversity of the region.

Castle of Thoiry

Built in the 16th century, the castle of Thoiry was the residence of the La Rochefoucauld family for several generations. It is renowned for its Renaissance architecture and richly decorated interior.

The park of the castle of Thoiry is also remarkable. Designed by Achille Duchêne and Henry Vaughan, it features a variety of French gardens, fountains, ponds and wooded walkways.

Throughout the year, the estate hosts events such as outdoor concerts, art exhibitions, but also <u>escape games</u>.

Opening hours of the castle vary according to the season. Gardens open from June to August (accessible exclusively with <u>Zoo Safari Thoiry</u> tickets). Find all schedules <u>here</u>.




Madeleine Castle

Today, it testifies to the importance of the writer in the French cultural landscape and offers visitors the opportunity to discover the place that inspired some of the most significant works of French literature.



French writer

PORTRAIT of the nineteenth century, ÉMILE ZOL Émile Zola is widely recognized as one of the greatest writers of French literature.

Zola was a committed writer, known for his naturalistic approach to literature, in which he sought to portray social and human reality with raw and uncompromising realism.

In addition to being a writer, he was also an influential journalist and art critic. He played a major role in the Dreyfus affair, a political and judicial scandal that shook France in the late 19th century. Zola published her famous article "I accuse...!" in 1898, denouncing injustice and anti-Semitism in the Dreyfus case, which led to legal proceedings and exile.

Castle of Maisons-Laffitte

A magnificent example of 17th-century classical French architecture, the Castle of Maisons-Laffitte is famous for its elegance and architectural harmony.

The interior of the castle is also remarkable, with its sumptuously decorated lounges, painted ceilings, period furniture, hall of mirrors and guard room.

The castle is surrounded by French gardens designed by André Le Nôtre, the famous landscaper who worked on the gardens of Versailles.

Monte-Cristo Castle

In 1844, at the height of his fame, following the successes of the *Trois Mousquetaires* and the *Comte de Monte-Cristo*, the writer Alexandre Dumas aspires to find a refuge conducive to literary creation.

To realize his project, Dumas called on the architect Hippolyte Durand, to whom he expressed his desire for a Renaissance style castle facing a Gothic castle, surrounded by a lake. He also imagined an English-style park, embellished with caves, rockeries and waterfalls.


Today, Monte-Cristo Castle functions as a museum dedicated to the life and work of the writer.


Castle of Dampierre

Built in the 17th century by the architect Jules Hardouin-Mansart, one of the greatest architects of the time, it belongs to the Luynes family since the 16th century and has been considerably enlarged and embellished over the centuries.

The gardens, meanwhile, were designed by the famous gardener André Le Nôtre, and are among the most beautiful in France. They include flower beds, groves, shady alleys, fountains and pools, offering an enchanting setting for strolling and relaxing.

Open from Tuesday to Friday from 10am to 5.30pm and on weekends from 10am to 6.30pm. During school holidays in Zone C and on public holidays, the castle is open every day from 10am to 6.30pm.



The Desert of Retz is an exceptional example of the English landscape style, characterized by winding paths, ponds, caves, factories and picturesque ruins scattered in a naturally hilly landscape.

Among the most remarkable elements of the Retz Desert are the broken column, the ruins of the abbey, the temple of Pan and the pyramid of Bricks.

NOTRE-DAME MARKET

A crossroads of colours and flavours, the Notre-Dame de Versailles Market was elected "the most beautiful market in the lle-de-France region".

Built under Louis XIII, the second market in France is full of fresh and regional products. Established in the same location since the 17th century, its creation responded to the royal request to create a practical space, including halls, stalls and benches, to offer merchants adequate shelter for their goods.

The market square is lively every day and is one of the most important commercial hubs of Versailles. The Halles Notre-Dame are open every day except Monday.

The Notre-Dame open-air food market is open on Tuesdays, Fridays and Sundays morning.



Leisure center of the Ponds of Holland

True haven of relaxation and leisure in the countryside, the Leisure center of the Ponds of Holland extends over a vast green area dotted with ponds.

The base offers a multitude of activities for all ages and tastes. Water sports enthusiasts can enjoy supervised swimming in summer, canoeing, pedalo or windsurfing.

Hiking and cycling trails also offer the opportunity to discover the natural beauty of the place on foot or by bike.

Opening from 16/06 to 31/08 from Wednesday to Sunday, from 11am to 7pm.


Discover the evolution of trains through the ages, from the first steam locomotives to modern trains, through detailed reproductions of railway stations and landscapes.

Temporarily closed. Reopening in autumn 2024.







Alexandre Dumas' parrot often accompanied him during his long hours of writing. It is widely reported that the bird was often perched on Dumas' shoulder while he wrote, perhaps encouraging him with his colourful jabot and cheerful cries.

Dumas had a very large collection of...puppets!



Dumas was a passionate collector, but also a talented puppeteer. He created a puppet theatre in his house, where he organized private performances for friends and family.

Dumas invented the story of his novel *Les Trois Mousquetaires*.



The writer drew directly these characters from the Memoirs of M. d'Artagnan, written in 1700 by the polygraph Gatien de Courtilz de Sandras. Athos, Porthos and Aramis as well as D'Artagnan all existed.

The grandmother of Alexandre Dumas was a slave.



As a child, the little Alexander wears beautiful blonde curls, which later turn into a crêpe hair. These origins will be worth to Alexandre Dumas, quarteron (half-breed having a quarter of black ancestry and three quarters of white ancestry), numerous racist attacks.

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
