

Common Uses For Peeps Candies




Peeps are considered America's favorite non-chocolate Easter candy, and their popularity goes beyond eating them. People blow them up in microwaves; a Ham radio club even uses them in their radio balloon projects. Poor Peeps have been used like crash test dummies for all sorts of experiments, and there is no class distinction for Peep lovers. Young and old, rich or poor, genius or not, everyone seems to love them.

It all started when a Russian immigrant, named Sam Born, came to the United States (via France) in 1910. Thirteen years later, Sam Born opened up his first New York City candy shop, selling all sorts of goodies. He promoted his daily, fresh made candies by using the slogan "Just Born," along with the logo of a baby resting in a candy scale.

Sam didn't start making Peeps until 1953. In the beginning it was really labor intensive. Originally, Peeps were made by hand-squeezing a marshmallow mixture through pastry tubes. It took 27 hours to totally make a Peep from beginning to end.

Sam's son, Bob, inherited his father's mind of coming up with an easier way of doing things. Bob Born came up with a way to mechanize the making of Peeps. Let's just say the rest is history. Today, "Just Born" makes 4.2 million Peeps a day and 1.2 billion annually. Peeps are shipped to over 50 countries and are loved world-wide!

A Mini Landscaping Lesson

Landscaping has often been likened to the painting of a picture. Your art teacher might have told you that a good picture should have a chief point of interest, and the rest of the points simply go to make more beautiful the central idea, or to form a fine setting for it. So in landscaping there must be a picture of what the gardener desires the whole to be when he completes his landscaping project.

Should you include lots of bare open lawn in your landscaping theme? A large extent of open luscious green lawn space is always beautiful. It is restful. This type of open landscaping adds a feeling of space to even small grounds.

Do not center the tree or trees. Let them drop a bit into the background. Make a pleasing side feature of them. In choosing trees for your landscaping project, keep in mind a number of things. You should not choose an overpowering tree. The tree should have a good shape, with something interesting about its bark, leaves, flowers or fruit.



Shrubbery should complement the trees chosen in landscaping. Choosing flowering plants and shrubs that bloom at different times of the year keeps the area fresh and interesting all season long.

Landscaping may follow along very formal lines or along informal lines. The first would have straight paths, straight rows in stiff beds, everything, as the name tells, perfectly formal. The other method is, of course, the exact opposite. You should consider the advantages and danger points in each.

In conclusion, plan for open lawn spaces in your overall landscaping design and keep a visually appealing tree to blend in the background. Think balance and you will come up with a beautiful landscaping design for your yard.

RECIPE CORNER: Easter Bunny Rolls

24 Servings, Prep: 30 min. + rising, Bake: 10 min.

Ingredients

1 package (1/4 oz) active dry yeast 1/4 cup warm water (110 $^{\circ}$ to 115 $^{\circ}$)

3/4 cup warm milk (110° to 115°)

2 tablespoons sugar

2 tablespoons shortening

1 egg, beaten

2 teaspoons celery seed 1 teaspoon rubbed sage 1 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg 3-3-1/2 cups all-purpose flour Melted butter



Directions

In a bowl, dissolve yeast in water. Add milk, sugar, shortening, egg, celery seed, sage, salt, nutmeg and 2 cups flour; beat until smooth. Add enough remaining flour to form a soft dough. Turn onto a floured surface and knead until smooth and elastic; about 6-8 minutes. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease top. Cover and let rise in a warm place until doubled, about 1 hour. Punch dough down; let rest 10 minutes. Divide dough into 24 pieces. For each bunny, roll one piece of dough into a 20-in. rope. Cut rope into one 10-in. piece, one 5-in. piece, two 2-in. pieces and one 1-in. piece. Coil 10-in. piece for body; place on a greased baking sheet. Coil 5-in. piece for head; place next to body. Form ears from the 2-in. pieces and tail from the 1-in. piece; add to bunny. Pinch and seal pieces together. Repeat, placing bunnies 2 in. apart on the baking sheet. Cover and let rise until doubled, about 25 minutes. Bake at 375° for 10-12 minutes or until lightly browned. Brush with melted butter. Cool on wire racks.

Working For The Enemy: A Lesson In Conflict Management

Have you ever had a boss who you could never see eye to eye? Did it seem that everything that you did was wrong? Did you think you were working for the Enemy? Wait, don't quit! There may be a reason why the two of you seem like complete opposites.

As you know everyone is different in almost every way. The way people act and react is due to their nature (or genetics) and nurture (the environment they were raised in and live in now). The key to getting along witl your boss is to first understand his/her values when compared to your own.
