March 1984 marked the beginning of a year of strike for miners, their families, and communities.

It was the largest industrial dispute the UK has ever seen, and Rotherham was right at its centre.

Rotherham's miners and their supporters were fighting not just for pay, but for their jobs and the future of their communities.

This year marks the 40th anniversary of this strike. It is an important year to remember the pivotal events in our history with those that lived them and to capture their stories for future generations.

Cultural partners and communities across Rotherham have come together to mark this event with a 40th Anniversary Creative Programme.

Through exhibitions and events, conversations and performances, the lived experiences of Rotherham's former mining communities are shared and remembered.

ROTHERHAM MUSEUMS ARTS AND HERITAGE

Clifton Park Museum is an accessible and free venue with exhibitions and galleries celebrating Rotherham people, stories and collections. The team have worked creatively with mining communities to amplify their personal stories and spark intergenerational conversation.

Days of Laughter, Days of Pain: The Miners' Strike in Rotherham, 1984 - 1985

2024 marks 40 years since the historic 1984 - 1985 miners' strike, the largest industrial dispute the UK has ever seen. This exhibition explores the strike year in Rotherham. From the organisation and mobilisation of pickets, rallies and support groups in the spring and summer of 1984, through the intense struggle of autumn and winter, before the mass march back to work in March 1985.

Miners' Strike Poetry Reading with Ian Parks and Sarah Wimbush

Yorkshire poets Ian Parks and Sarah Wimbush present poems from their new collections to explore the 40th anniversary of the year-long strike that tore the nation apart. Ian Parks was born in Mexborough. The son of a miner, he was active during the strike. A poet and academic, he is editor of 'Versions of the North: Contemporary Yorkshire Poetry' and the 'Selected Poems of Harold Massingham'. Sarah Wimbush grew up in Doncaster. Her first poetry collection, 'Shelling Peas with my Grandmother in the Gorgiolands', was published with Bloodaxe in 2022. Her second collection, 'STRIKE' (Stairwell 2024), commemorates the 40th anniversary of the 1984 - 1985 miners' strike through poetry and photographs.
