We are on the *Home Stretch* of the renovation of the Emergency Housing Shelter:

In 2023, we were able to truly enter the "home stretch" of the long-planned renovation to the family shelter that began before the pandemic. Since 1980, we have been providing a safe space for families experiencing homelessness to find shelter while they work to secure-long term housing. This renovation is designed to make the century old building a better place to live, add space for a ninth family and enhances our ability to deliver individualized trauma-informed services.

This is a community effort and we are grateful beyond measure to all of the individuals and businesses who have supported the project. It is our goal to always remember that **KIDS LIVE HERE**. We work to do everything we can to ensure that as we support parents to secure housing, kids have a warm, safe and friendly place to take their first steps or blow bubbles in the backyard. We want the kids to remember not that they lived in a shelter but that this was a place where they lived once, and that the people were kind.

Providing Emergency Shelter and Improved Access to Long Term Housing Stability for Families:

23 Families Housed in 2023

Friends Program Emergency Housing, the only low-barrier permanent shelter for families with young children in Merrimack County, can house up to 8 families (soon to be 9) at a time with an average stay of 4-6 months.

In 2023, Emergency Housing Services greatly expanded the Continuum of Care model where staff support families for at least six months after they have exited the shelter. This support greatly increases the success families experience in the community.

100% of the families who have transitioned out of the shelter have maintained permanent housing in the last 3 years!

Improving Educational Outcomes for Children around the State:

Classroom Grandparents mentored and tutored nearly 800 students in 2023, a 75% increase over 2022! They provided **41,790** hours of service at 49 schools and childcare sites around the state!

That extra support and personalized attention improved participation, increased attachment to school and increased emotional and social skills development. 93% of the at-risk youth served by a classroom grandparent demonstrated improved literacy and 95% improved in math!



Increasing Access to Food Security:

AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers around the state grow, harvest, prepare, and distribute food to over **7,200** people at-risk of food insecurity.

in 2023, the Backpack Program provided over **15,000** meals to children who would otherwise go hungry over weekends and vacations.

RSVP Caregivers volunteers completed 486 shopping trips for isolated seniors in the greater Concord area.

Leveraging the Power of Volunteers to Address Community Needs:

RSVP volunteers serve around the state to address unmet community needs. You will find them growing and gleaning crops for food pantries, mentoring young children, stocking supplies at the diaper pantry, ushering a show at your community theater, working a blood drive, or even volunteering their favorite canine for some pet therapy. The possibilities are limited only to our imagination.

RSVP volunteers served 31,727 clients in 2023.



Helping Seniors Live Healthy Lives:

2459 Bone Builders free exercise classes were held throughout Rockingham, Merrimack, and Belknap Counties- an 18% increase over 2022.

2013 rides to important appointments and 275 friendly check-in calls were provided by volunteers to isolated seniors.

Inspiring Confident Kids:

Youth Mentoring served at-risk youth through community based one-to-one matches with a caring adult and site-based programs that use younger volunteer mentors.

In 2023, we broadened services offered to at-risk youth to include short-term mentoring opportunities and family enrichment activities all at no cost to families. Classes included creativity and focus, game night and a collaboration with Media Power Youth.
