PAYING FOR TRAINING

Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship

Arkansas residents with a high school diploma or GED may qualify for up to \$800 toward CDL training. We guide you through the simple application.

VA Education Benefits

Eligible veterans and dependents can use VA education benefits to pay for CDL training. Our staff helps you navigate the process and access the benefits you earned.

Ticket to Work

Adults ages 18–64 who receive disability benefits may qualify for Ticket to Work support for CDL training. Logan Vest at the White River Area Agency on Aging can help at (870) 612-3000.

Traditional Financial Aid

CDL training is included in our Heavy Equipment Operations technical certificate program, allowing students to use financial aid like Pell Grants to help pay for their education.

Where to Buy

- The CDL Packet is available for \$50 at any State of Arkansas Revenue Office
 - The **Batesville Revenue Office** is located at 1207 E Main St.
- It includes your CDL study manual, three attempts at the written test, and score sheet

What to Bring

- When purchasing your manual, be sure to bring:
 - Your original birth certificate
 - A second form of ID (e.g., driver's license, passport)

How to Schedule Your Department of Transportation (DOT) Physical

- Contact us by calling 870-612-2082 or emailing workforce@uaccb.edu
 - UACCB staff will authorize your DOT Physical with Sherwood Urgent Care
 - The cost of the physical is included in the program's tuition
- **If you DO NOT receive authorization** from UACCB for the physical, the college **WILL NOT** pay for it

- Your CDL packet expires one year from the date of purchase
- You have until the CDL Packet's expiration date to obtain your license
- If you fail the exam three times, you may purchase another CDL manual for \$50 and try again

The app provides practice questions tailored to the CLP exam. You only need to focus on these sections: General Knowledge, Combinations, and Air Brakes.

Use the Practice Mode to understand why an answer is correct and challenge yourself with the Exam Mode to gauge your readiness. If you can pass the Exam Mode in the app, you'll be ready to pass the real test!



CDL CLASS A CURRICULUM

Our CDL Class A professional skills training provides comprehensive, hands-on instruction to prepare you for a successful career in commercial trucking. With small class sizes, you'll receive personalized attention and spend most of your time behind the wheel.

Program Highlights

- Approximately four weeks of full-time training
- Learn to drive automatic or standard transmissions
- Small classes of three students

Core Training Topics

While the focus of the program is hands-on training, you'll also learn about:

- Federal and State Regulations
- Vehicle Systems and Maintenance
- Pre-Trip Inspections and Daily Safety Checks
- Defensive Driving and Safety Practices
- Hours of Service Rules
- Logbook Requirements





CURRICULUM CONT.

Behind-the-Wheel Training

Our small class sizes mean more driving time for you.

Hands-on training includes:

- Vehicle operation in various driving environments (highways, city streets, and rural roads)
- Backing maneuvers, including straight-line backing, alley docking, and parallel parking
- Coupling and uncoupling trailers safely and efficiently
- Advanced maneuvers and turning techniques for large vehicles

CDL Driving Test Preparation

The program culminates in preparing you for the CDL Class A skills test, which includes:

- Pre-Trip Inspection: Demonstrate thorough vehicle inspections
- Basic Control Skills: Master essential driving techniques
- On-Road Driving: Navigate real-world scenarios with confidence





ROAD TO PROSPERITY



Drive a tractor-trailer combination or a truck with a capacity of at least 26,001 pounds Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW). May be required to unload truck. Requires commercial drivers' license. Includes tow truck drivers.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How many times can I take the written Commercial Learners Permit (CLP) test?

As many as you need, but each CDL Packet you purchase from the state only provides three testing opportunities.

For how long is my Commercial Learners Permit valid?

You have until the CDL Packet's expiration date, one year from the date of purchase, to obtain your license.

After I pass the written CLP exam, how do I get my plastic learners permit card?

You must take your scorecard from the exam to your local state Revenue Office.

Will I be required to take a drug screening test?

Yes! Prior to the start of class, you must pass a drug screening test.

What do I do if I can't make it to a day of class?

You must call your instructor BEFORE the class begins that day.

QUESTIONS CONT.

Will I need to pass a driving test to get my CDL?

Yes. Our instructor will bring one of our trucks to the testing site for you to drive.

What happens if I do not pass my driving test?

You can re-test, but if you fail to pass the driving test two times, you must pay UACCB \$125 for each additional re-test to help cover fuel, instructor, and maintenance costs.

When I'm studying for the written Commercial Learners Permit exam, what topics should I focus on?

The CLP exam covers General Knowledge, Combinations, and Air Brakes.

When is payment due for this class?

Payment must be made, at the latest, 15 days before your scheduled start date.

Are scholarships available for this program?

Yes! Eligible students can apply for the Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship, which provides up to \$800 in funding.

QUESTIONS CONT.

Besides the Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship, is other funding available?

Yes! You may qualify for funding or assistance from other programs, too. We can help you find programs that may offer support.

Can I work while taking this course?

The CDL training program is intensive, so we recommend limiting other commitments to ensure success.

How long does it take to complete the program?

The program typically lasts four weeks, depending on scheduling and your mastery of driving skills.

What kind of jobs can I get after completing this program?

Graduates can pursue careers as local, regional, or long-haul truck drivers, with potential earnings ranging from \$31,495 to \$96,959 annually based on experience.

Am I required to pass a DOT physical?

Yes. The cost of the physical is covered by your tuition.
