While watching the 2019 Women's U.S. Open earlier this school year, I witnessed an outstanding display of sportsmanship by 21-year-old Naomi Osaka, who hugged and consoled her 15-year-old opponent, Cori Gauff, after defeating her in the third round of the event. She hugged her and then went one step further by inviting her to do the post-match interview with her. I turned the channel after witnessing this emotional exchange between the two competitors only to watch story after story about countless individuals preparing to come to the aid of communities caught in the path of Hurricane Dorian.

In our own home state of New Mexico, I have seen signs in yards across our communities that read, "El Paso Strong" and have witnessed young kids throughout the state raising money for those struck by the tragedy that befell our neighbor to the South. It warms my heart to know that so many members of the New Mexico baseball community supported El Paso by volunteering their time and resources to facilitate a baseball clinic in the area. I have seen Boy Scouts and Girls Scouts of New Mexico performing various acts of community service. I recently pulled up to a stop light and saw a young adult handing a homeless person a bag full of toiletries and food. I saw a teenager mowing an elderly person's yard just because

it is the right thing to do. All of these beautiful acts of kindness occurred within a two-day period and those were only the ones I personally saw.

Every day, we witness humanity at its finest. Even though there are times when the negative headlines seem overwhelming, we still see displays of compassion and kindness all around us. We know there is so much goodness in our schools and our communities and we feel our faith restored when these acts hit close to home.

So, it makes me wonder - why do we allow "winning and losing" to become the focal point in athletics? Why does a "win at all costs" attitude seem so prevalent? Why do acts of poor sportsmanship sometimes overshadow all of the good that we know exists in interscholastic athletics? For every one bad event, we know there are hundreds, or even thousands, of great things going on with our student-athletes. Why can't we look past the scoreboard to see and remember the true meaning of sports?

Don't get me wrong. I am the most competitive person there is. Even at my "old" age, I refuse to lose. But, as we get older, we see that there are such bigger and more important things that we gain from competition and that we gain through participation in interscholastic activities. We realize that truly "winning" is not about the score. For educators, it is about teaching our students that they are playing a game and that, at the end of the day, the end result of learning the traits of responsibility, integrity, respect, teamwork, dedication, perseverance and commitment are far more important than a blue trophy.

The importance of interscholastic athletics is really about winning in the game of life. It is about producing citizens who are capable of being compassionate to those in need, who understand that life is bigger than a game and who truly know that true winners are those who care about others and who live a life of being trustworthy, honest and respectful.

There are so many daily lessons that are learned through participating in sports and activities and we see these lessons being lived out around us every day. It goes back to role models in professional sports. It goes back to volunteerism and kindness to communities suffering tragedies and disasters. It goes back to being service-oriented within our communities. It goes back to doing the right thing, even when no one is looking. In the words of football coach, Lou Holtz, "I follow three rules: Do the right thing, do the best you can, and always show people you care." This is the true recipe for being winners in the game of life.

Dr. Crit D. Caton
Artesia Public Schools

During his almost 35 year career in education, Dr. Crit D. Caton served in numerous capacities, including teacher, coach, athletic director, principal, assistant superintendent and superintendent in both New Mexico and Texas. His career started in Morton, Texas in 1986, where he was a teacher, coach and athletic director. In 1990, Dr. Caton moved to Artesia,

N.M., spending the next 14 years as a coach and teacher at Artesia Intermediate and Artesia High School. From 1994-2004, Dr. Caton was the Principal at Hermosa Elementary in Artesia.

In 2004, Dr. Caton was named the Superintendent at Fort Sumner Public Schools until 2005, before moving back to Artesia and assuming the role as Principal at Artesia Junior High from 2005-2006. Following the 2006 school year, Dr. Caton moved to Artesia High School, where he served as Principal for the Bulldogs from 2006-2011. At the start of the 2011-2012 school year, he assumed the role of Assistant Superintendent for Artesia Public Schools, a position he held until 2012, when he was named Superintendent. Dr. Caton held the Superintendent position from 2012-2019 before retiring at the end of the school year.

Dr. Caton graduated from Hobbs High School in 1981 and attended Texas Tech University, graduating with a bachelor's degree in 1985 and his master's degree in 1990. He later earned his doctorate from the same institution in 2005. Dr. Caton served on the NMAA Board of Directors for seven years and was named New Mexico's Superintendent of the Year in 2017. He was also awarded the NMAA's Outstanding Service Award in 2019 and was inducted into the NMCEL Hall of Fame in 2019.

Dr. Caton and his wife Carrie, have two children: daughter, Kirstin, a teacher at Artesia High School and son, Koby, an Athletic Trainer for Artesia High School.



Tom Manning
St. Michael's HS

For over 45 years, Tom Manning has been a staple in the education system in New Mexico. A graduate of St. Michael's High School in 1967, Manning earned his bachelor's degree from New Mexico State University in 1973 and his master's in 1981 from New Mexico Highlands University.

Upon completion of college, Manning worked as a P.E. teacher at Mesilla Park and Conlee Elementary in Las Cruces until 1979. Under his leadership as Athletic Director at St. Michael's, the Horsemen have 52 State Championships, 111 district championships and three NMAA Director's Cups.

Manning has served on several committees for the NMAA including the Board of Directors, the NMAA Commission, various sports specific committees and seeding and selection committees. He also a member of the NMADA. He has been awarded the NMHSCA AD of the Year award, the NMADA AD of the Year award and the Santa Fe Public Schools Teacher of the Year award.

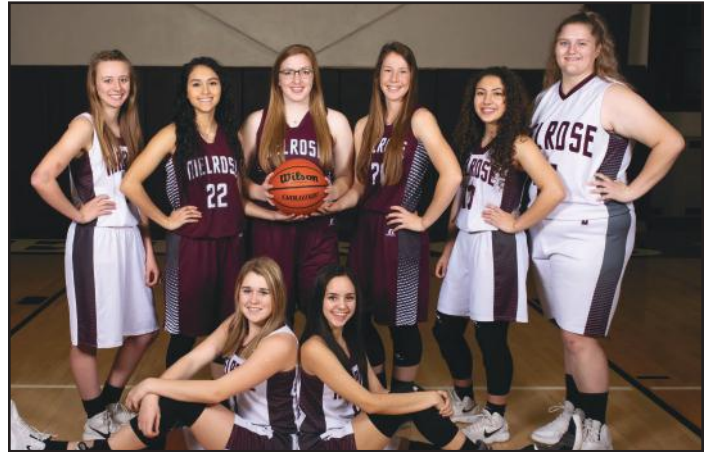

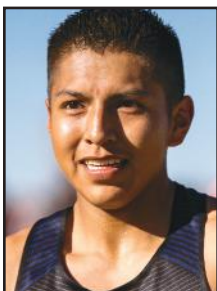
Tristan Sena – Melrose High School

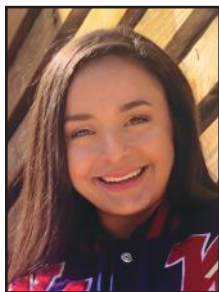
Jordan Sanchez – Santa Rosa High School

Nataley Mondragon is a senior at Melrose High School and will finish her high school career as one of the most decorated student-athletes in the school's history.

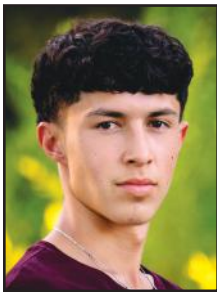

When one official thanked Ortiz for being a good role model, he responded by saying, “That’s what a captain is asked to do.” Ortiz also stepped up in a time of tragedy within the community to help honor a pair of his teammates. The senior was instrumental in helping friends and family heal following a fatal car crash involving the Sandoval brothers, Mateo and Pedro. and journalist. A sports enthusiast his whole life, Austin was particularly fond of the Denver Broncos, UFC and high school athletics. He served as a broadcaster for both ESPN Radio 101.7 The Team and Proview Networks. He started his broadcasting career by keeping offensive stats at high school football games and conducting the postgame interview with the coach. In the 2016-17 season, he added on to his broadcasting responsibilities by conducting the halftime show. He also served as a public address announcer for basketball and baseball games at his high school. His ultimate goal was to sit in a broadcast booth, something he was able to accomplish at a young age.

At the age of 14, Denton made an appearance at Super Bowl 50 in northern California and had the chance to interview Peyton Manning on live television. He was later invited to the NFL Today set on CBS in September of 2016 to introduce a segment in which he interviewed then head coach Gary Kubiak. In 2018, Austin was at the NFL Draft to introduce Denver's first-round pick Bradley Chubb.

Denton served on the NMAA's Student Leadership Advisory Council and in 2018 was named the Section VI recipient of the NFHS National High School Spirit of Sport Award winner. His positive attitude and approach to life will remain a lasting message for others.

"For me, every moment counts so you have to seize the moment," said Denton.

The 2020 State Basketball Championships won't be the same without Austin Denton. The former La Cueva High School student was one of the most passionate sports fans in New Mexico with a broadcasting career in his future. Denton would help call high school games on the radio for the past couple seasons. His smile, demeanor and voice became a fixture courtside at the Pit in March. It's his love for the game and dedication to his craft that makes Denton one of the Legends of the Sport.

The New Mexico sports community lost an inspirational individual in December of 2019. Denton passed away at the age of 18 of complications resulting from a tumor.

At two years old, Austin was diagnosed with a rare spinal cord tumor. He went through multiple rounds of chemotherapy, surgeries and rounds of radiation and was in remission for ten years. He described himself as a patient and advocate for St. Jude's Hospital and a cancer survivor.

"I may be in a wheelchair, I may only be able to walk on crutches or a walker, but that doesn't stop me from doing what I want to do," Austin said in a video for St. Jude's hospital. "I don't let physical limitations cross my mind at any time."

Despite facing numerous health issues throughout his life that prevented him from playing sports himself, Austin made significant contributions to athletics as a broadcaster

2019 State Championship Recap

Melrose Wins Championship for Second Straight Year



BOYS CLASS A

"We lost 5 or 6 seniors last year that did most of the playing time for us and if you would have told me we'd be in this position this year I would have told you 'you're crazy,'" said Melrose head coach Kevin Lackey following another championship run. Melrose (25-7) beat Ft. Sumner 54-50 in the Class 1A Boys Championship. It was the fourth time the two schools faced each other this season. All of the previous three meetings were decided by five points or less, so this one was bound to go down to the wire.

Melrose jumped out to a 10-4 lead in the first quarter and went up 28-19 at halftime. Ft. Sumner (23-9) came down the ramp after the break and went on a 17-9 run to get within one, but they could never take the lead. Melrose sealed the deal in the fourth and final quarter, outscoring Ft. Sumner 17-14 over the final eight minutes for the 54-50 final total.

Melrose won the battle of the boards with a dominating 62-45 rebounding advantage. The Buffaloes had three players in double figures led by Dylan Valentine with 15 points. Tate Sorgen added 12 points and Tristan Sena finished with 10.

"These guys battled and they got better and better," said Lackey. "We preach peaking at the right time and growing up at the right time. It was all heart, I'm super proud of them."

It's Three Straight for Pecos

For the third year in a row, the Pecos Panthers walked off the court at Dream-style Arena The Pit carrying the blue trophy. Pecos (26-3) beat Newcomb (29-2) in the Class 2A Championship game, 58-37. The Panthers led wire-to-wire after racing out to a 16-9 lead in the opening quarter. Pecos held an 11-point lead at halftime and put up 31 points in the final two quarters. The Panthers defense proved to take its toll on the Skyhawks, as Newcomb went 2-24 from three-point range. The fast-paced style of play by Pecos wore down their opponent as the Panthers scored almost half of their points (26) on the fast break. The Panthers had two players in double figures led by Xavier Padilla with 22 points. Ismael Villegas added a double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds.

"What a great bunch of guys," said head coach Ira Harge Jr. "It started this past summer, we weren't quite sure how they would react or respond after losing those seven seniors last year and they really stepped up and did a great job. I'm so proud of these guys. They did it for their community and everybody in Pecos."

Hot Springs Wins First State Title in 26 Years

For the first time since 1993, Hot Springs High School lifted the blue trophy at center court. The Tigers (27-4) beat Santa Fe Indian School 56-54 in a thrilling overtime finish for the Class 3A Championship.

It appeared to take Hot Springs a few minutes to shake off the nerves as SFIS (20-12) scored the first 6 points of the game. The Tigers trailed the entire first quarter. Hot Springs fell behind by as many as 14 points in the second quarter and headed to half-time down by 10.

The third quarter is when the momentum started to shift. The Tigers went on a 10-2 run and took their first lead of the day when a Verrels Lukman three-pointer made it 33-32. Hot Springs held SFIS to just 8 points in the third quarter. There were eight lead changes or ties in the fourth quarter alone and the two teams headed to overtime tied at 47.

After giving up the first point of overtime, Hot Springs would go on top 49-48 with a Tino Luna basket. SFIS tied the game at 49, but then the Tigers took the lead for good with a bucket by Coltin Whitehead at the 2:25 mark of OT. Some key free throws by the Tigers would allow them to hold on and win 56-54 in overtime. Lukman led Hot Springs with 17 points and Whitehead scored 11.

Second-year head coach Derek Bean was extremely proud of his group. "Sometimes it may take a few motivational words and it gets their motor running, but they never quit," he said. "Trust the process, put 'we' over 'me' and fall in love with defense. That's what they did. Defense won the ballgame today. We got down early, but we've been there before. We just had to believe in what we were doing. They don't give up. They don't know how. They just kept fighting, that's what I love the most about them."

Valley Upset #1 Seed to Claim the Blue Trophy



BOYS CLASS 4A

The Valley Vikings entered the 2019 State Basketball Tournament with a .500 record. The Vikings earned a #7 seed in the bracket, but they proceeded to take down #1 and #2 on their way to winning the Class 4A Championship. Valley (17-13) beat #1 Los Lunas in the title game, 37-34.

The Vikings knocked off seven-time state champ Hope Christian in the quarterfinals and had to face a Tigers squad in the championship that was on an 18-game win streak. Valley scored the first two baskets of the game and only trailed in the opening half twice. A three pointer by Seyi Oyeku in the closing minutes of the second quarter put Valley up 20-15. They would take a three-point lead into halftime.

In the third quarter, the Vikings fell behind by five after a furious run by Los Lunas (27-4). Valley went into the fourth quarter down by two. The Vikings held Los Lunas to just five points in the fourth quarter and it was a race to the finish line in the final minutes. Jevon Baker gave Valley a 33-32 lead with 2:09 to play. Los Lunas regained the lead on an AJ Garcia basket 30 seconds later. Oyeku gave the Vikings the go-ahead score with 1:22 to go in the game. A couple free throws by Derick Chavez in the closing seconds would seal the deal for the Vikings as they went on to win by a final count of 37-34. Oyeku led the winners with a game-high 19 points.

"These guys played so hard," said Valley head coach Joe Coleman. "From the start of the state tourney on against Highland, they learned how to fight and they stuck together. I'm so happy for these kids."

Back-to-Back Titles for Atrisco Heritage

In front of an estimated 14,000 fans at Dreamstyle Arena-the Pit, the Atrisco Heritage and Santa Fe basketball teams put on a thrilling show in the Class 5A Championship game. When the final buzzer sounded, the Jaguars (21-7) won the blue trophy for the second straight season by a final score of 61-58.

Dominic Rivas scored 12 of Atrisco's 16 points in the opening quarter, all from 3-point range. The Jaguars led 16-12 after the first quarter. For the remaining three quarters the two teams went bucket for bucket. Atrisco Heritage led 31-29 at half-time and 42-40 after three quarters. In the fourth quarter, there were six different lead changes. The blue trophy was still up for grabs in the final 8 minutes. Carlos Dassaro's three pointer to start the final quarter gave Santa Fe (24-7) a 43-42 lead. Atrisco's Isaiah Brooks gave the Jags a 45-43 lead with a three of his own the next time down the floor. Brooks put up 10 of his 11 points in the final quarter. A pair of free throws by Santa Fe's Antonio Lovato put the Demons on top 54-53 with 2:30 to play, but Joziah Ramos drained two free throws at the 1:53 mark to give Atrisco Heritage the lead for good. Solid free throw shooting down the stretch allowed Atrisco Heritage to win the championship for a second straight year 61-58. Ramos finished with a game-high 22 points and Rivas ended the night with 18.

"Atrisco Heritage is a blue-collar school," explained head coach Adrian Ortega. "They work hard and put up with my hard coaching every year and this is well deserved. I will tell you this, we're not done either."

Melrose controlled most of the first half leading by as many as seven. Tatum trailed 26-20 at the break. The third quarter proved to be the difference in this one. Melrose (24-7) built up their lead to 10 points, however Tatum finished the quarter on an 18-2 run and took a 38-34 lead into the final quarter. Pecos High School needed a little extra time to win their school's first girls basketball title. The Panthers (23-6) beat Mescalero Apache 53-46 in overtime of the Class 2A Championship. It was a battle of two former Santa Fe High School coaches as Ron Drake, now with Pecos, went up against Elmer Chavez.

After a low-scoring first quarter with Mescalero (23-8) leading 7-6, both teams went shot-for-shot in the second quarter as the two teams were tied 18-18 at halftime. Mescalero had a one-point lead heading into the fourth quarter where the two teams went shot for shot. The drama reached a high intensity in the final :30 seconds of regulation. Samantha Kazhe gave Mescalero a one-point lead with :25 remaining. Brittany Martinez then hit a pair of free throws to give Pecos a one-point lead (37-36) with :17 left. Back-to-Back Titles for the Tigers

Los Lunas ended the 2019 season the same way they finished the 2018 campaign, holding the blue trophy. The Tigers (28-3) beat top seed Kirtland Central 49-43 in the Class 4A Championship. It was a #1 vs #2 showdown as the top seeded Lady Broncos had beaten the Tigers already once this season.

The first quarter was a close contest as Kirtland (27-4) took an early 12-10 lead. The Tigers regained the lead when Natalie Jojola hit a three with 5:35 before halftime and Los Lunas wouldn't trail the rest of the night. Jojola hit four shots on the game, all of them three pointers for her 12-point effort. Her teammate Mia Guest had 3 triples of her own as part of her game-high 15 points.

It was the second and third quarters that made the difference in this one as the Tigers outscored the Broncos 28-16 during that stretch. Los Lunas held on in the fourth quarter for their 49-43 victory.

Los Lunas locked down a Kirtland squad that was used to putting up points all year. Never give up. That's the message you can take away from the 2019 Class 5A Championship game. The West Mesa Mustangs survived a 21-0 run by the #1 team in the state and claimed their first blue trophy by beating Hobbs in the title game 63-51.

The Mustangs (28-3) started the game strong taking a 10-5 lead following a Cece Barela three-pointer five minutes into the game. Then Hobbs (29-3) went on a 21-0 run to give the Eagles a 26-10 cushion with about 5 minutes before the half. The Mustangs trailed 32-27 at the break.

"We knew they were going to go on some runs and we were going to make some runs," explained West Mesa head coach Manny Otero. "Our girls were resilient and kept their composure and we have to give them credit for hanging in there and toughing out Hobbs' best blow and we kept going."

West Mesa climbed back into it in the third quarter. The Mustangs outscored the Eagles 16-10 during the eight-minute stretch and led 43-42 heading into the final quarter. Maiah Rivas scored five straight points in the fourth to give West Mesa the insurance they needed for their 63-51 win and first state title.

"Any score that we were down, I had faith in our girls that they could come back," said Otero. "We're happy to take the blue trophy back to the west side."

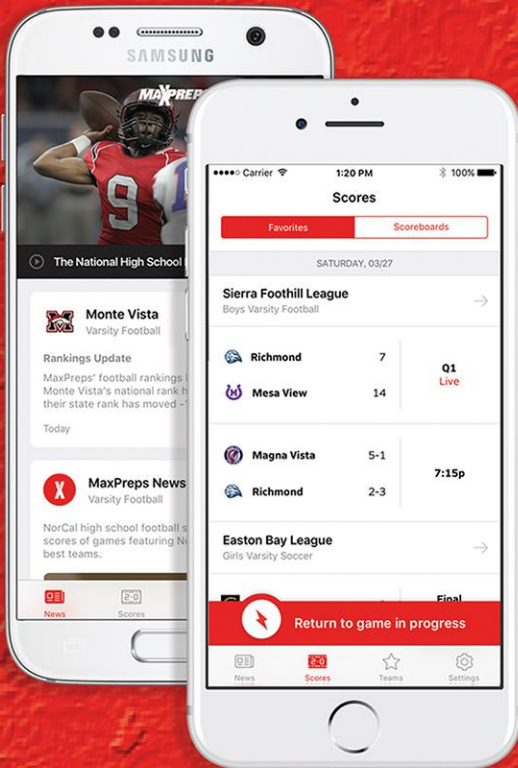
