





Free College Credit

Students may graduate with a year or more of transferable university credit or earn a trade certification.




GRADE 13 AT MCHS

Grade 13 is an <u>optional</u> additional year of high school. During that time, students may continue taking DTCC courses with the goal of finishing a degree or certificate by the end of Grade 13. Tuition, fees, and books will continue to be free for students. Interested students must submit an application directly to the MCHS Magnet Coordinator who, in consultation with the principal, will evaluate it based on the student's grade and credit history, attendance, and discipline history.
