Q&A WITH RECORDING ARTIST JAIME ADRIAN

Q: How did you get to this point in your career?

A: I started singing in Spanish when I was 8. I grew up in a very Mexican neighborhood in Chicago, so "5 de mayo" was a big thing every year. When I got to highschool I joined choir and started to audition for lots of singing shows. When I was 21 I moved to LA, and due to the recession I moved back two years later. I tried out for the xfactor in 2012 and made it to the live auditions, but that didn't go the way I planned, so after that I kinda stopped singing until I met my producer Velvet Code and started working with him. He helped me discover the artist I am becoming and before you knew it it was 2 years later and I have my own album out.



Q: Before we get into the music, is there a story behind your tattoos?

A: The tattoo of the woman's face on my right forearm is Jade Thirlwall from little mix. My brother mariobautista_ tattoo is a tattoo artist and he wanted to give me one for my birthday a few years ago, and since I'm obsessed with Jade, he created his own piece to start a sleeve dedicated to her. I also have the signatures of all 4 girls in the group on my wrist. Listen on all music platforms, see videos on YouTube

We're almost done with the Jade piece The one on my left forearm is a cool tattoo from Randy Candy honoring the best horror franchise "Nightmare on Elm Street" it incorporates different pieces from a few of the movies like the iconic syringe and meatball.

Q: About your music, what's the inspiration behind the new album?

A: Initially it was supposed to be an EP, but we got on a roll and the ideas just kept on coming we wanted to show that I wasn't a one trick pony and we could be versatile in the styles of music we were creating. We just wanted to put out a fun dance album. Every song has a different vibe or inspiration.

Q: Are there any specific songs with personal anecdotes?

A: "Belong" is one of my favorite songs. It was the first time I felt confident writing about some of the stuff people would laugh at me about and now people thank me that when hearing the song they felt seen.

Q: Is there a song on the album that holds a special meaning for you?

A: "Jaded" is a song about my obsession with Jade Thirlwall from the girl-group little mix. She's an icon and the nicest celebrity I've ever partied with. I love everything about her.

Q: Did any local Chicago influences or experiences make their way into the album?

A: I work at Sidetrack and they have been super supportive with my music. They always find the time to play my videos or talk about my music. I had my release party there and the turn out was great. I also filmed my music video for "Beautiful Life" at Cell Block, and it's fun to watch people watch the video and ask me unmmmm is that Cell Block? haha!

Q: If you could pick one song to introduce listeners to your new album, which would it be?

A: *"Feed My Ego" is fun Latin influenced dance song. Just about feeling yourself before going out to party. I also love "Belong" because it's def an ear worm with a great message.*

Q: How did you feel on release day?

A: I remember when the video for "Belong" came out we were showing Drag Race at Sidetrack, and at the end they introduced my video and played it, and I didn't know if I was gonna throw up or cry, but I still had to serve drinks, so I had to keep it together, but for the album release I was super nervous. More people showed up than I could dream of and it was alot of fun and I got to perform.

Q: What's been the biggest highlight of your musical journey so far?

A: Probably all the obstacles I have overcome. I'm the shyest person who didn't think I could ever write songs or perform anywhere and now I'm doing it and it's been a great learning experience.

Q: What advice would you give to aspiring musicians trying to make it in Chicago?

A: Work hard and save your money so you can give your audience high quality music even if it's just one song. People will hear it and you will know it's not your best and you'll feel it. This career isn't gonna come knocking on your door and give you an opportunity. 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Clearing The Air

Those white line streaks trailing behind airplanes, known as contrails (condensation trails), are more than just streaks in the sky. They are a complex phenomenon with a surprising impact on our planet's climate. Contrails form when hot engine exhaust mixes with cold, humid air, causing water vapor to condense and freeze into ice crystals.

These ice crystals, similar to natural cirrus clouds, can have a twofold effect on Earth's energy balance. While much remains to be known of the effects on our ecosystem, research paints a fascinating and sometimes alarming picture. But before we dive into the science, let's take a broader look at the environmental footprint of air travel compared to vehicle emissions.



AIR VS. VEHICLES. A CARBON FOOTPRINT COMPARISON:

Both cars and airplanes emit greenhouse gases, primarily carbon dioxide (CO2), a major contributor to global warming. However, the impact differs significantly:

CO2 EMISSIONS PER PASSENGER:

Airplanes emit at least 10 times more CO2 per passenger kilometer than cars. For example, a round-trip flight from New York to London emits about 2.5 tons of CO2 per passenger, while a car driving the same distance would emit around 0.25 tons.

TOTAL EMISSIONS: While individual trips might be higher, cars contribute a larger share of total emissions due to their sheer number if vehicles world wide. In 2019, global road transport was responsible for around 76% of transportation emissions, while aviation accounted for just 2.5%.

Contrails contribute significantly to aviation's climate footprint. Some research suggests contrails contribute up to 57% of aviation's warming impact, exceeding even the direct greenhouse gas emissions from jet fuel.

While contrails have a significant impact within aviation, it's important to remember that vehicle emissions remain a major driver of climate change, contributing roughly 14% of global greenhouse gas emissions.

There's a growing concern as air travel continues to increase, the climate impact of contrails is expected to grow as well. Addressing it now can help prevent future problems. Tackling contrails alongside other sources of greenhouse gas emissions is essential for a comprehensive approach the to here and now of combating global warming.

The environmental impact of contrails extends beyond climate change. They can affect weather patterns. Contrails can act as nuclei for cirrus cloud formation, potentially influencing regional weather patterns.

Jet pollutants are already disrupting ecosystems. Changes in cloud cover and precipitation are disrupting delicate ecosystems, impacting biodiversity and agriculture. They reduce air quality. Contrails can trap pollutants from engine exhaust, potentially affecting air quality in expanding regions in the world.

Hello, I'm filling in for our regular Tech Trends journalist Jack Santo, who's on vacation. Interesting enough, I have a TRUE "Tech Trends" story to tell that just might make your toe nails curl!

Have you ever encountered Bard? If so, did you happen to have a bad or disturbing experience? If so, you are not alone! Let me share a true story with you, that at the time, sent a shiver down my spine, and has given me a look into our future with AI, that's gone wrong.

BARD IS DEAD! The Experiment Gone Wrong!

For many people, like myself, we have been using AI in our life on many levels. Recently last year **Google** unveiled a new generative artificial intelligence **ChatBot** named **Bard**. It was developed as a direct response to the rise of **Open AI**'s **ChatGPT**. Much like **Alexa** or **Siri**, where you can ask it questions and it will give you the best answer it can come up with, but in a semi-professinal and semi-personal way. Unlike Alexa or Siri where you speak to it, Bard was like google, where you type in your question to get an almost instant reply.

Bard came on line as an "experiment," because it was still in the learning stages. It contained the wealth of knowledge from Google's database, plus access to most all public information online to pull from instantly. However, it needed to learn the context of the question and in the meantime still provide a knowledgeable response back.

Sometimes Bard would give you multiple responses to a question because there can be many meanings to our language, including how we speak, and depending on the implication.

It also is trying to figure out your intention, if you

are a terrorist asking it a question about how to build a bomb, or if your a student writing a book or essay on bombs, if your question is related to bombs. What happens when Bard the AI ChatBot gives the wrong person the right answer? Is Google responsible for the actions of that person, say who commits a crime based off the knowledge of Bard? There have been many concerns that have now led to the demise of Bard, who in my opinion is dead, in name only.

Aside from other Al tools used like **Siri**, **Alexa**, or ones being implemented now in programs like PhotoShop, here's a true story that's specifically about **Bard**, Google's ChatBot that came online on March 21st, 2023, that's now been replaced by Gemini on February 8, 2024. conservation with a computer. So good, I almost had to remind myself at times that I'm not communicating with a real person.

Bard was like meeting a friend for the first time. Right after I told on Bard by sending feedback to Goggle, this message came up across my screen! (actual screenshot)

Bard is currently on a break from collaborating.

ease give it a moment and try again later.

Seriously? A computer on break!

Keep in mind. In order to use Bard, you must have a Google account, which I do. My Google account is also connected with my YouTube account, also owned by Google. I also use Google Docs, G-mail and many other G-tools. Thankfully I do NOT use Google Chrome (which collects all your user web data) or have a Google Android Phone! Otherwise who knows what else Google would lock me out of, in an instant!

Imagine if I have a Google car or use a Google driverless car
