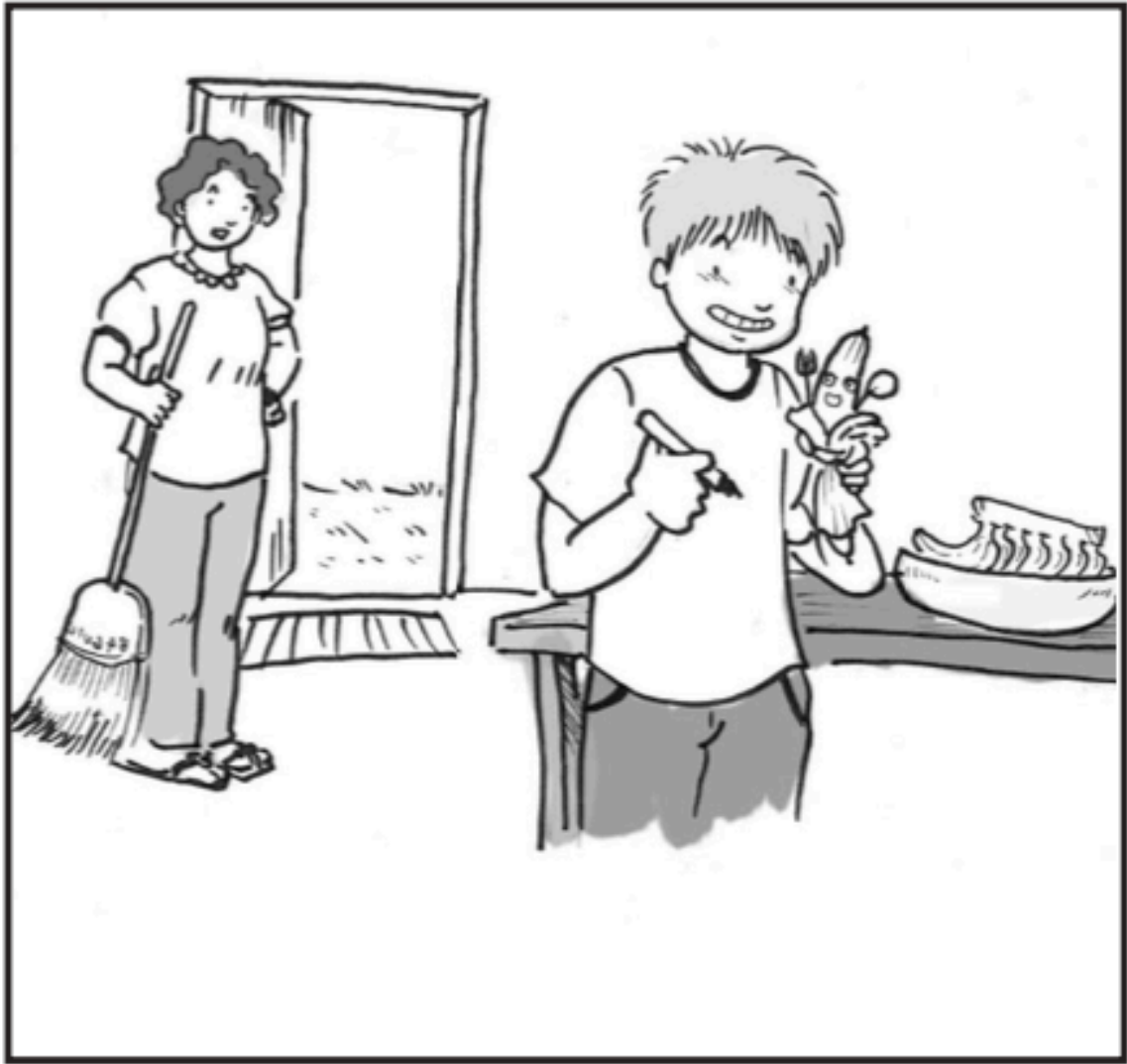

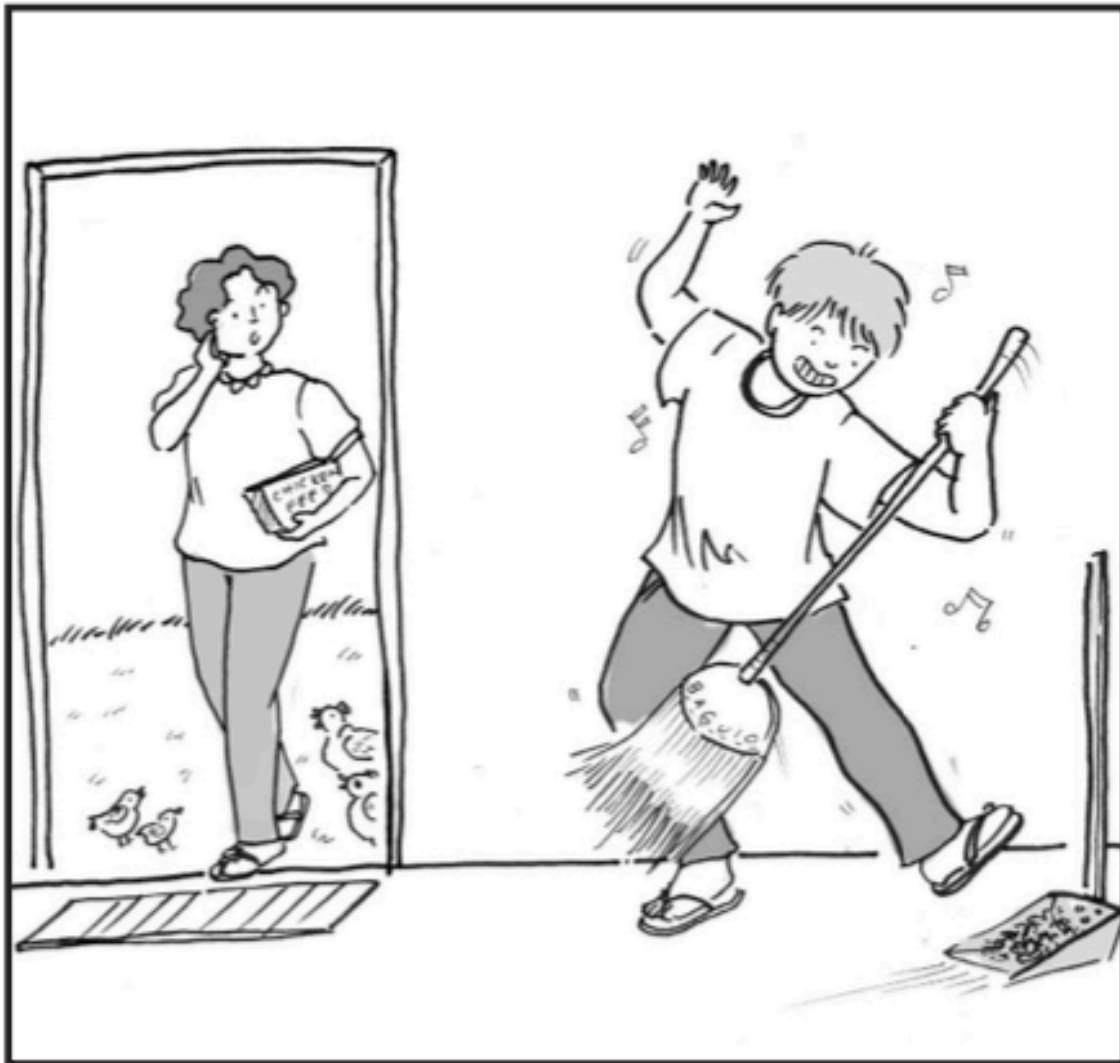
“May I play now?” asks Max.

“No, you must feed the chickens,” says Mama.



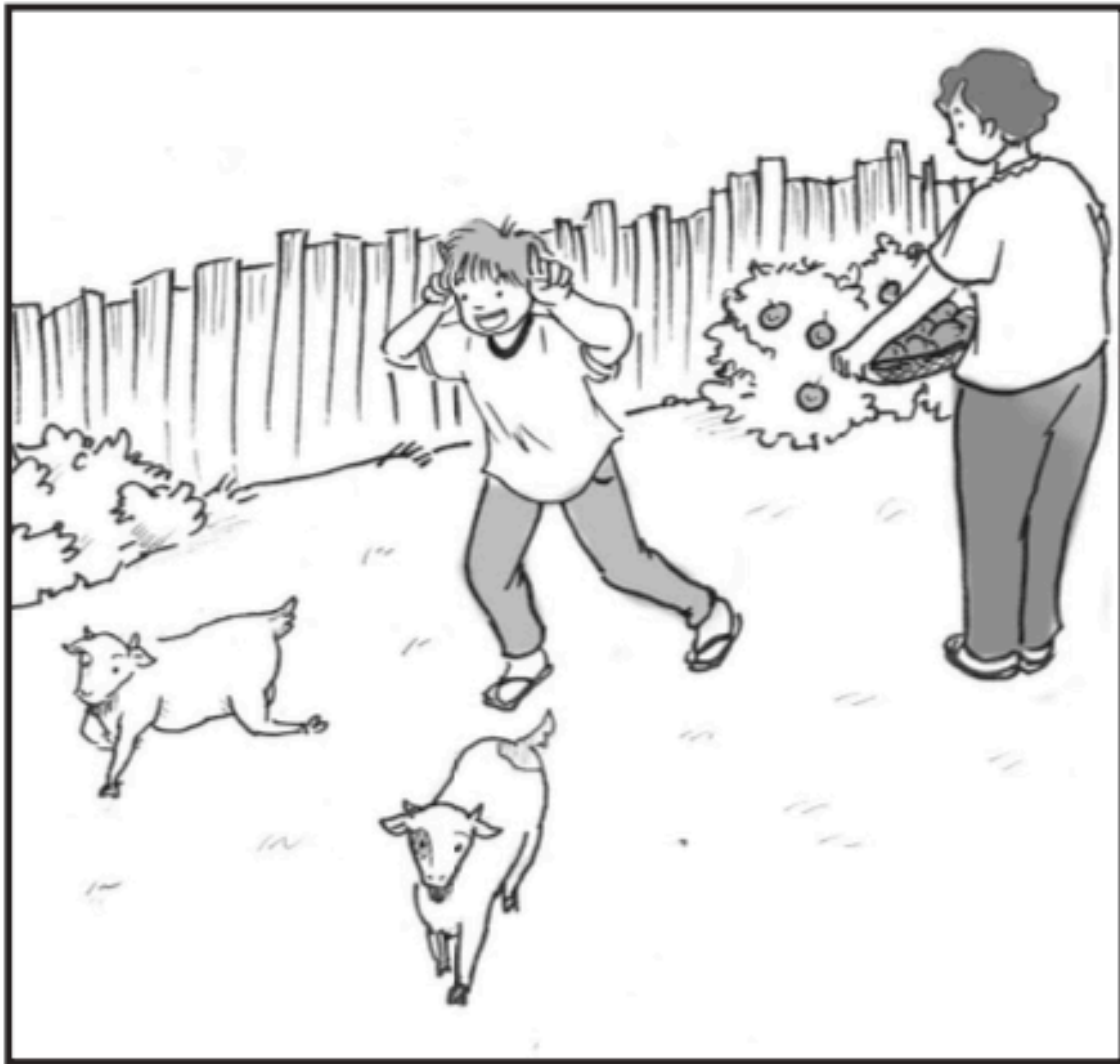
“May I play with the chickens?” asks Max.

“No, you must wash the clothes,” says Mama.

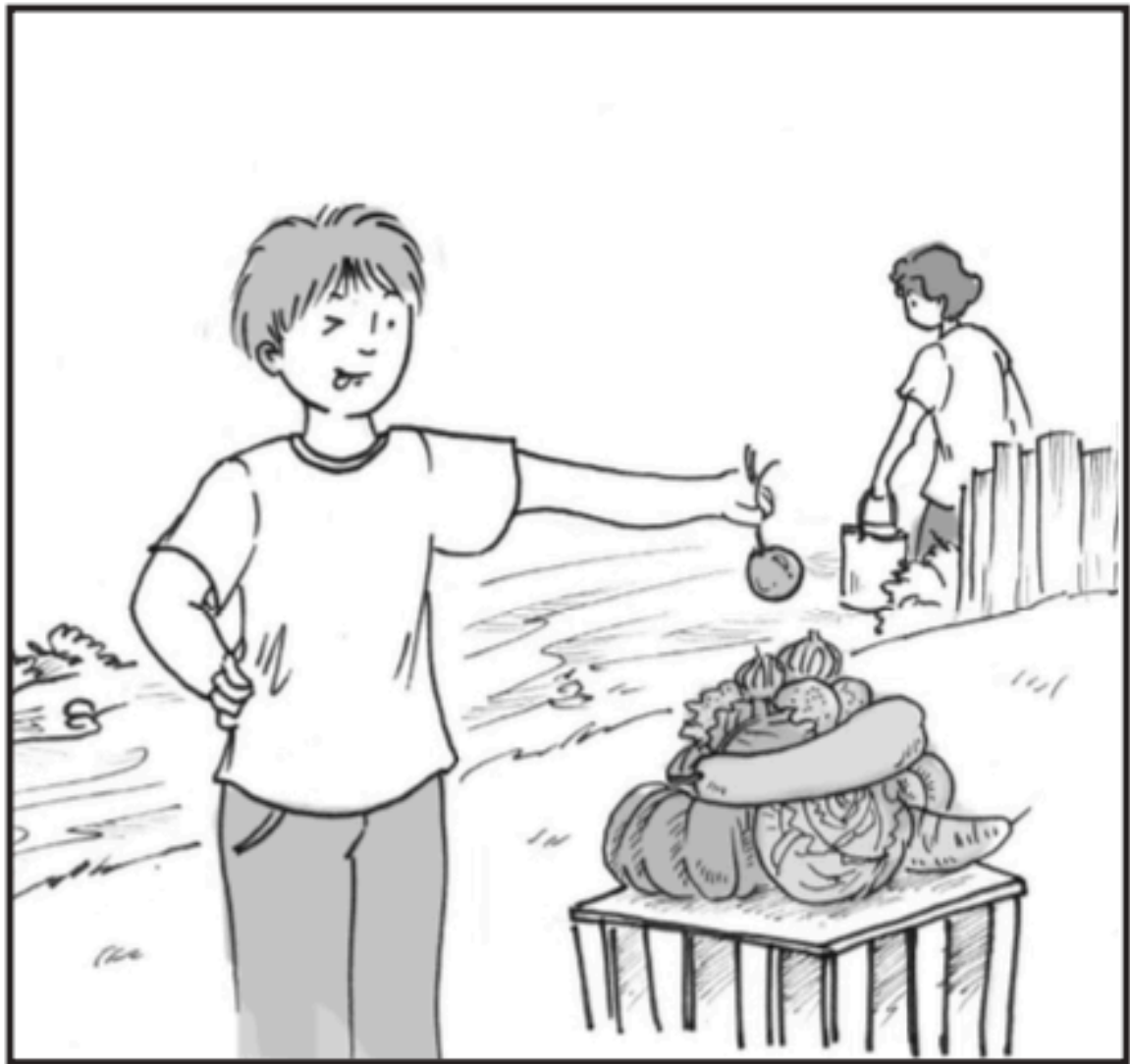


“May I play with the clothes?” asks Max.
