I was recently watching a news story entitled, "It is the way the game is supposed to be played so, why is it such a big deal?" The story took place in June of 2016 at the Indiana State Baseball Championships, during which a player from the winning team went onto the mound to console the losing pitcher, who was laying on the ground visibly upset, rather than embarking in a celebration with his teammates.

At the end of the story, the newscaster made a point to say, "The actions of the player reflected on the coaches and the parents of the kid. Somebody is doing something very right." Adults in the player's life, leading by example.

When the newscast finished, I pondered about why the story made the news. I was happy that the actions of the boys made national headlines, but saddened that acts

of sportsmanship are not the norm. The realization that stories like this are highlighted because they are seen as something special and extraordinary was disheartening to me.

Throughout this year, the NMAA and our member schools are focusing on the importance of sportsmanship by coaches, players and spectators. When you attend a game as a spectator, remember that you too are setting an example for the kids on the court or field and for the individuals around you. Remember that it takes just one person to make a difference and the way you act can set an example for your community.

Be mindful of the example you set in whichever role you play in interscholastic athletics – as a coach, a parent, a player or a spectator. Be POSITIVE and support your team, without being negative towards opponents or contest officials. We need to all be a part of changing the culture of interscholastic athletics so that doing what is right is no longer newsworthy. Competing with Class should be the rule, not the exception.

Let us all band together and lead by example. Show the youth of today that sportsmanship matters. Show our student-athletes the proper way to win and lose. Show our "leaders of tomorrow" that their character far outweighs their performance. In New Mexico, our news story should always read, "It is the way the game is supposed to be played so, why is it such a big deal?" In New Mexico, let good sportsmanship and positive behavior always be the norm.





Legend of the Court Kristen Scanlan, Texico High School



If you are looking for a coach and program that have dominated high school volleyball in the state of New Mexico for the past decade, the list starts with Kristen Scanlan and the Texico Wolverine Volleyball program.

In 2008, Scanlan took over as head coach and the impressive streak began. In her first year in charge of the program, the Wolverines claimed the blue trophy with a victory over Navajo Prep. She followed it up with three more titles during the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons. Scanlan led Texico to four straight state championships from 2008-2011 and she was not done yet. In 2014, Scanlan and the Wolverines started a new streak with championships in 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

Not only is she a successful coach, she was a leader and winner as a player too. Scanlan was a state champion volleyball player at Arlington High School (TX) and went on to play for Texas A&M University. She was a two-year captain for her collegiate squad. After starting her coaching career in the state of Texas, Scanlan arrived in New Mexico in 2000. She was a teacher and coach with Dora Consolidated Schools. Scanlan led Dora High School to the state volleyball tournament in 2002. In 2004, she started working for Texico Schools and was a volleyball assistant at Texico High School under Coach Michael Littlejohn for two years (2007-2008). During

those years, the varsity team won back-to-back New Mexico state titles. She took over the head coaching job in 2008 and continued their success winning four more. The six consecutive titles by Texico placed the school in a tie with Hot Springs High School as the only other school in New Mexico history to win the most uninterrupted volleyball state titles.


Scanlan was selected as the 2014 New Mexico Volleyball Coach of the Year and was a finalist for National Coach of the Year honors. She is also the Texico High School girls' golf coach. In just her first season with golf, Texico finished second in district and qualified for the state tournament. Since taking over in 2009, the golf program has finished second, third, fourth and fifth at state.

What is it you love about volleyball?

I love the team aspect of it because it truly is a team game. You can't play without someone making the next touch.

Do you like it more as a player or a coach?

I loved playing the game. The difference between playing and coaching is you have more control in the outcome. As a coach, I can put the pieces in position but they have to play. You have to be trusting and give up a lot of things in coaching. When I played, I was more emotional. Now as a coach, once you get to a match, the kids should run the match.



You say you were more emotional as a player. How would you describe yourself as a coach?

I try to be excited, but also be as even keel as possible. I try to balance whichever way they're going, not too high or too low. I try get them to realize the match isn't over until the last play.

What's the secret to your success?

It's Texico. That's the secret. It's the Wolverine Way. There's nothing tougher than a Wolverine. The legacy gets passed down. Kids are proud to play in our program. We try to have

the seniors lead. We have a secret edge because of that. Everywhere we go, that's worth at least three points.

Do you have a motto or message for your kids each year?

The seniors come up with the motto every year. They are very different from year to year. Some past senior mottos include: NAFSAN (Never Accept Failure, Stop At Nothing), GETMAD (Give Everything To Make A Difference). This year's motto is GIHGIM. I can't tell you what it means right now. It's an acronym for what's important to them. It means something in particular to every class.

Is the streak something you talk about with the team?

I do not. I talk about the qualities it takes to reach that title game. We already have a target on our backs; kids don't need any more pressure. They know what happened and what it took to get there, but it's not like, "We're going to get another one." We all have to move on that journey together to do the best we can.

What led you to take over golf?

I am an avid golfer. Our principal at the time was also the golf coach. I jokingly told him, "I'll play you 18 holes, winner gets to have the golf program." I can't play volleyball like I used to, but I can play golf. It teaches life values in the game. At a small school, most people do multiple sports. You pitch in where needed. I also did track a couple years.

Are there any similarities between volleyball and golf? Golf is an individual sport, even though we compete as a team. The thing I like about golf is that it's all you. You have to make self-corrections. In volleyball, you have your teammates around you to lift you up after an error. Unbelievably, I have a lot of volleyball players who are golfers.

Of all the state titles your programs won over your career, is there one in particular, or a moment, that stands out the most?

I do want you to understand I don't win these titles. I'm along for the journey. They're the ones who win it. I had twin daughters play on the 2010 state team and I think that senior year was special for me because they were playing, the seniors, the leaders and it was fun to watch them and pass on the legacy. Every team has been so different with personalities and the way they approach things. They push me to grow.


What's next? How long will you continue to coach?

I get asked that a lot. As long as I'm enjoying teaching and I can make a difference, I will continue to do that. I'm trying to teach some former players who are now assistants. I want to pass some of the knowledge along so there won't be a big gap when I leave. My hope is that things we have done in the past to make it successful, I hope they continue to do.

2017 State Championship Recap

SANDIA CAPTURES THIRD STATE TITLE



The Sandia Matadors (17-6) defeated the Centennial Hawks (23-2) in the finals of the 2017 Rudy's Real Texas Bar-B-Q State Volleyball Championships to capture the Class 6A title. The Matadors won 3-2. It was the first title for Sandia in volleyball since 2013 and the third in school history.

Set one was a back-and-forth battle between the two schools until a tie at 15-15. Then, Sandia put together an 8-1 run to take a commanding 23-16 lead. The Hawks managed a few more points but the lead was too much, as the Matadors took set one, 25-19.


The Hawks jumped out early in set two and looked to be in control, holding an 18-9 lead. However, the Matadors made it interesting, battling back with an 11-5 run, cutting the Hawks' lead to 22-20. Centennial rattled off the next three points of the set to even the match at 1-1, winning 25-20.

The score was tied four times in the early part of set three, as neither team was willing to give an inch. Then, with the score tied at 10-10, Sandia went on an 8-0 run to grab an 18-10 lead in the set. Over the remainder of the set, the two teams exchanged points, with Sandia eventually taking set three, 25-16 and a 2-1 lead in the match.

Set four was do-or-die for the Hawks and the defending champions were not going to go down without a fight. The Hawks never trailed in the set but, at the same time, never had more than a three-point lead until late in the match. With the score 17-14 in favor of Centennial, the Hawks finished out set four on an 8-3 run, winning 25-17 and forcing a fifth and deciding set.

The fifth set of a classic Class 6A Championship match did not disappoint. Over the course of the set, there were six ties and four lead changes, as neither team was willing to let the blue trophy slip through their fingers. With the set tied at 9-9, Sandia scored the next two points to go up 11-9. Those two points proved to be the difference, as Centennial was never able to get closer than two points again. Sandia won set five, 15-12, capturing the 2017 Class 6A title, three sets to two.

LOS LUNAS WINS THIRD BLUE TROPHY IN SCHOOL HISTORY



For the second time in three years, the Los Lunas Tigers (21-4) hoisted the blue trophy overhead, beating St. Pius X (20-3) 3-2 in the finals of the 2017 Rudy's Real Texas Bar-B-Q 5A State Volleyball Championships.

It was also the third state title for Los Lunas, as the Tigers had won back in 1979 and most recently in 2015.

In set one, the Sartans moved out to a quick 15-9 lead over the Tigers. Los Lunas pulled to within two at 16-14, but St. Pius X was too much in set one, winning 25-19. Set two was controlled by the Tigers, as Los Lunas never trailed in the set until 24-23. The Sartans snuck out the final point to take the set 25-23 and a commanding 2-0 lead in the match. There were 13 ties in set two.

Set three started much the same as set two, as the Tigers controlled the majority of the match. This time, however, Los Lunas built a lead at 14-9 and again at 22-16, which were too steep for the Sartans to climb back, as the Tigers took set three 25-23.

Knowing their backs were against the wall in set four, the Tigers jumped out to an early 4-1 lead. The Sartans tied the score at 5-5 before Los Lunas went on a 10-5 run to grab a 15-10 lead. Another 10-4 run by the Tigers gave them the win at 25-17 and tied the match at 2-2, heading into the fifth and final set.

In the fifth set, Los Lunas jumped out to an early 5-2 lead before St. Pius X battled back to tie the set at 6-6. A 5-0 run by the Sartans put them up 10-6 but the Tigers refused to go away, eventually tying the set at 13-13. The two teams exchanged points until the set was tied at 18-18. Two hard fought points by the Tigers gave them the win (20-18) and the 5A State title for the third time in school history.

SANDIA PREP WINS BACK-TO-BACK TITLES


It was the fourth title in school history for Sandia Prep.

TEXICO COMPLETES 4-PEAT IN CLASS 3A



The Texico Wolverines (21-3) defeated the Santa Rosa Lions (18-6) in three sets, 3-0, to win the Class 3A 2017 Rudy's Real Texas Bar-B-Q State Volleyball Championships, completing a four-peat. It was the Wolverines' 11th title since 2001 and the 14th overall in school history.

In set one, Santa Rosa led most of the way, and at one time, by as much as four at 14-10. The three-time defending champions weren't going down that easily and eventually tied the set at 18-18, before going on a 7-0 run to take set one 25-18.

Set two was another back-and-forth battle between the two schools and, just like in set one, the score was tied at the midway point at 11-11 before Texico began to pull away again. An 8-4 run by the Wolverines gave Texico a 20-15 lead and a 5-1 run ended the set with 25-16 victory and a 2-0 lead in the match.

With six lead changes and six ties to begin the third set, it looked as though the Lions were not going away without a fight.

With the score tied 14 all, Texico went on a 7-0 run to take a 21-14 lead. Santa Rosa then cut the lead to 21-18 on a 4-0 run but the lead was too much to overcome as Texico captured set three, 25-19 and the 3A championship for the fourth consecutive year.



LOGAN WINS FIRST VOLLEYBALL TITLE IN SCHOOL HISTORY



The Logan Longhorns (21-3) defeated the Ramah Mustangs (20-3) in five sets, 3-2, in the 2017 Class 2A Rudy's Real Texas Bar-B-Q State Volleyball Championships. The Longhorns earned their first title in school history in the five set thriller.
