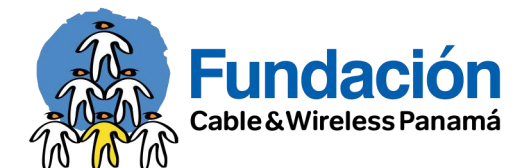
2023 REVIEW

For the Cable & Wireless Panama Foundation, 2023 marks milestones in its history. This year, the organization celebrated 20 years of working together with thousands of volunteers to develop programs and projects in various social areas that have a direct impact on the community, fulfilling a cycle of learning and evolution.

During 2023, we kept our financial and non-financial resources focused on the four pillars (Access, Environment, Disaster Support, and Learning) that constitute our north, with particular emphasis on education with an equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI) perspective. EDI is an integral part of our efforts. We signed alliances with important companies, organizations, and public institutions to carry out projects aimed at young people in education (National Oratory Contest). We resumed active participation of corporate volunteers in initiatives that ensure children's health and positive development (FANLYC). To complement our environmental commitment, we launched the student volunteer project +ECOGUARDIANES. We maintained our crusade to mitigate the pollution of nature: "Give a +green end to your cell phone." We continue to support communities impacted by natural disasters such as floods and connect non-profit organizations to ensure they continue their work for the comprehensive education of Panamanian children. We continue to transform employees into volunteers committed to the community

We reinvent ourselves to adapt to changes and amplify the positive impact of our social work. We changed our image and name. The Cable & Wireless Panama Foundation is legally transformed into the Más Móvil Foundation, whose official launch will occur in the second quarter of 2024. We are changing to strengthen our social commitment to the community and reinforce relationships of trust with the organizations and benefactors with whom we undertake challenging projects.

NATIONAL ORATORY CONTEST 2023

The National Oratory Contest is an educational project that promotes healthy competition, intellect, and leadership among young people who, through the art of oratory, address and analyze current issues that have marked the country's historical evolution year after year.

In 18 editions, the contest has impacted more than 800,000 students nationwide, maintaining its convening power among high school and middle school students. The Grand Final was an event of great impact throughout the country, putting in the public arena a relevant issue for Panamanian society through the perspective of 15 finalists who presented their vision on the theme "The Energy Transition in Panama: An opportunity for sustainability, democratization and economic development of the country," presented this year by the National Secretariat of Energy.







THE AYUDINGA FOUNDATION

We continue supporting the Ayudinga Foundation by donating connectivity services and permanent communication equipment to develop technological education projects that benefit thousands of students who connect through their study platforms. Ayudinga is a team of valuable young people who work to change the world through a quality, accessible, inclusive, and humane education for all children and adolescents in Panama and Latin America. Its digital content offers mathematics, physics, chemistry, and biology courses. They can be accessed from anywhere in the world, thanks to online technology.

SCHOOL SUPPLY DONATIONS

WE REWARD EFFORT

Intercollegiate Short Story Contest

To celebrate Black Ethnicity Month, the CWP Foundation awarded the first three places in the Intercollegiate Short Story Contest organized by the San José de El Valle de Antón Parish Foundation. The contest began its call in the middle of the World Book and Copyright Day celebration to motivate students to express their creativity by writing a short story. The educational centers (in rural areas) that responded to the invitation were the C.E.B.G La Compañía de El Valle, the C.E.B.G. The Valley and the Río Indio School.



National Spelling Bee 2023

The CWP Foundation awarded the first three places of the VIII National Spelling Bee 2023, jointly organized by the Ministry of Education, Imarketing Solutions, and SerTV. Public and private primary school students attended from the country's 16 educational regions. The main objective of the contest is to enrich the vocabulary of basic education students, providing them with new words and improving their daily communication skills.





SPACES FOR LEARNING

Providing an educational project at Eben Ezer School

The CWP Foundation inaugurated the Biology Laboratory of the Eben Ezer Bilingual School in the province of Colón as part of the educational project awarded second place in the 2022 National Oratory Contest. As part of the inauguration, the Foundation received recognition from the school in gratitude for its support for the growth of Ebenezer's youth.



Furniture Donation to the Marcia de Cañellas School

To help improve the conditions of teachers and students at the Marcia de Cañellas school, the CWP Foundation donated furniture. Furniture delivery is part of the Foundation's initiatives under the Learning action pillar.





LEADER IN ME

To positively impact the community of Pedregal through the transformation of the Marcia Cañellas School, the CWP Foundation sponsored its participation in the "Leading Schools for Panama" program. In this way, to generate change in the School through the Leader in Me® program, to a center of leaders focused on principles that will contribute significantly to society through being agents of change in the community, with the School being the central pillar as part of the process of transformation of education.

The Leader in Me® is a school-wide transformation model developed with educators. It empowers students with the skills they need to thrive in the 21st century. It integrates leadership development into the school curriculum, curriculum, and traditions in a way that doesn't seem to be "just another thing." More than a process, The Leader in Me® serves as a foundational operating system for an educational institution, improving relationships, transforming culture, and powerfully motivating teachers and students. The Leader in Me® is based on paradigms, content, and practices that transform and redefine what educational greatness is for the 21st century when implemented with levels of excellence. This new definition of the greatness of an educational institution is represented in leadership, culture, and academics.





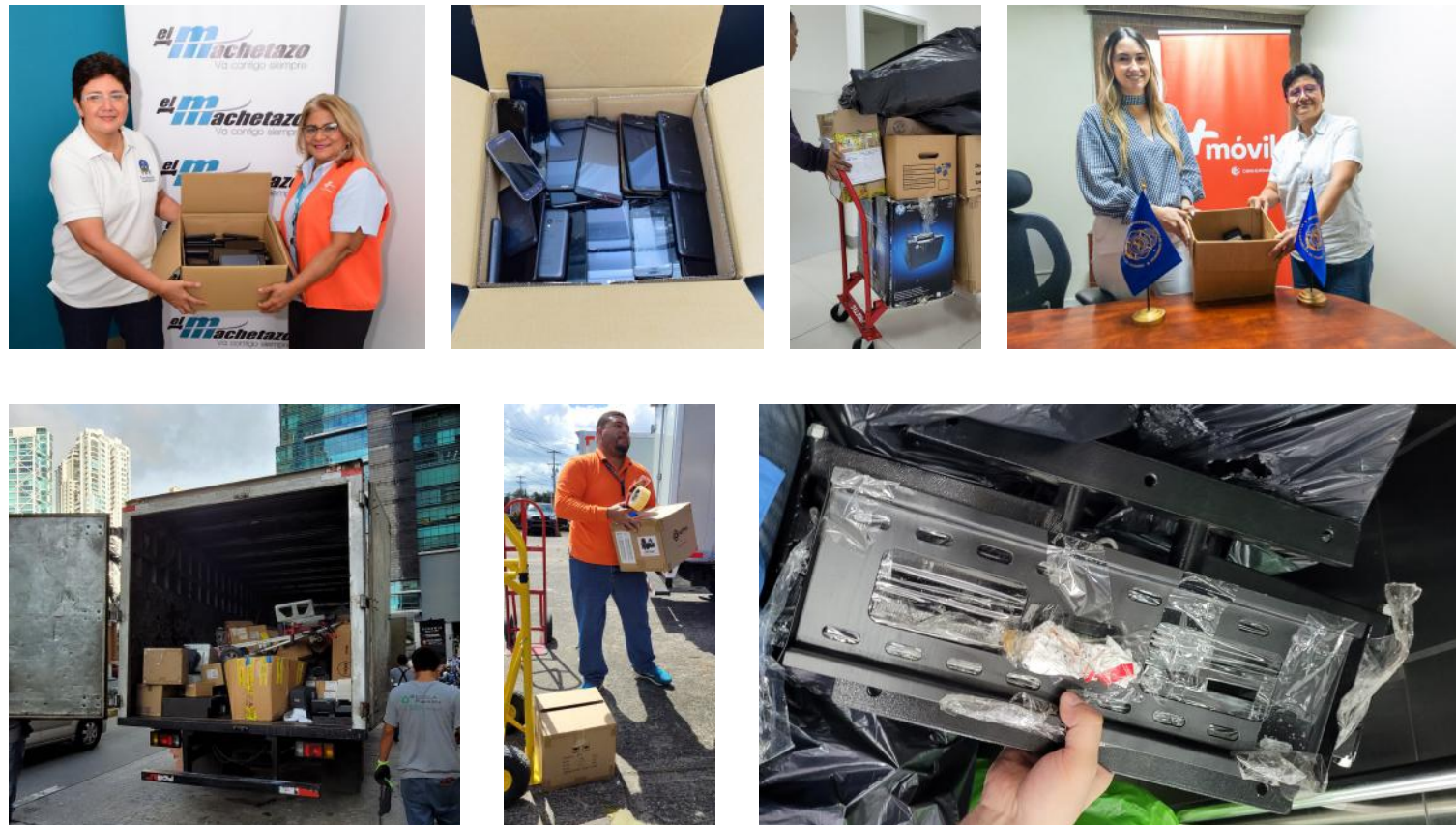
ENVIRONMENT

STUDENT VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

+EcoGuardians

To raise awareness about caring for the environment, the Foundation launched its pilot student volunteering project, "+EcoGuardianes." This initiative with young volunteers is added to the campaign "Give a +Green end to your cell phone," which focuses on one of the three R's (reduce, reuse, and recycle) of ecology: Recycling. Through research, the presentation of related topics, and the story of their own experience, students will address issues such as productive factors, transformation, productivity, RAAE (waste electrical and electronic equipment), their impact on the environment, and various health problems generated by the toxins they expel (leachates), dependence on technology, ethical dilemmas, artificial intelligence, global warming, the greenhouse effect, planned obsolescence, among others. The pilot was carried out at the Colegio Ingeniero Tomás Guardia in La Chorrera, with an average of forty-three students. At the end of the project, a recycling fair was held where students from all over the school participated by donating unused electronic equipment.



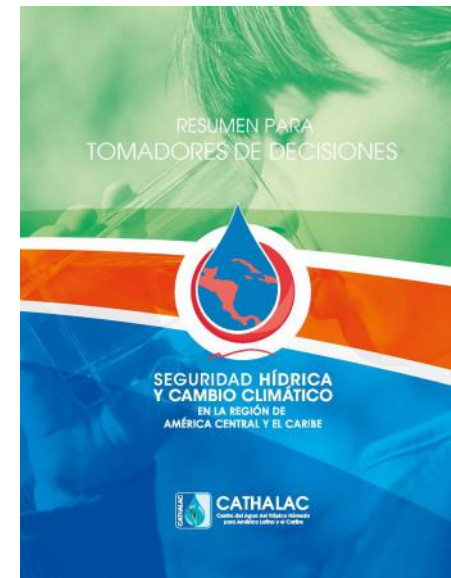
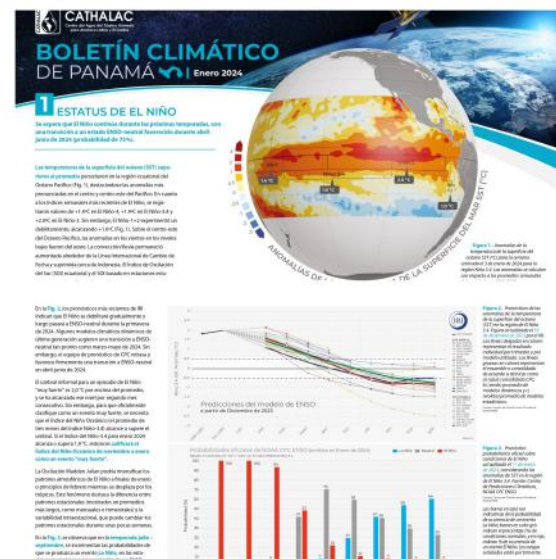
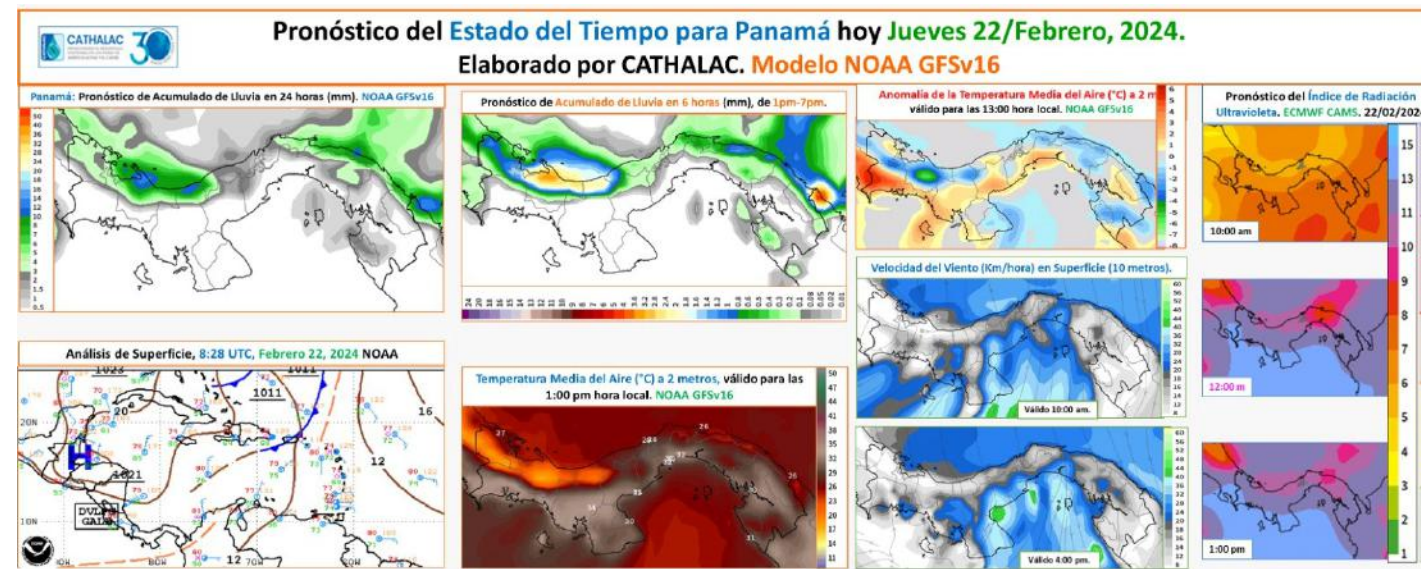


CATHALAC

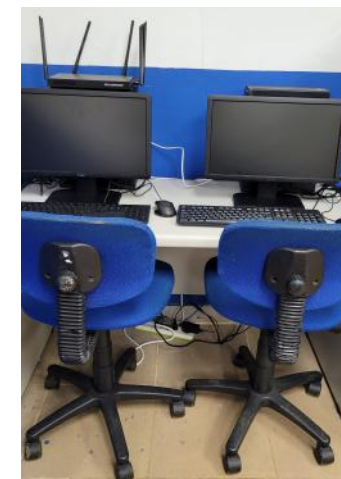
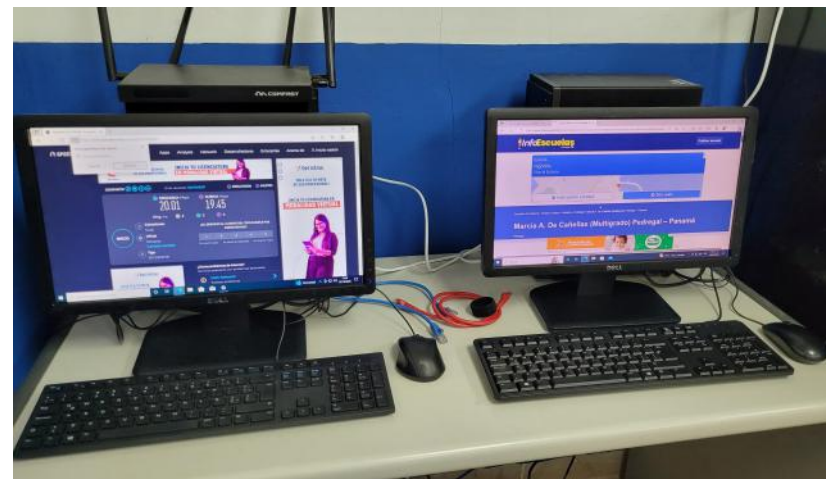
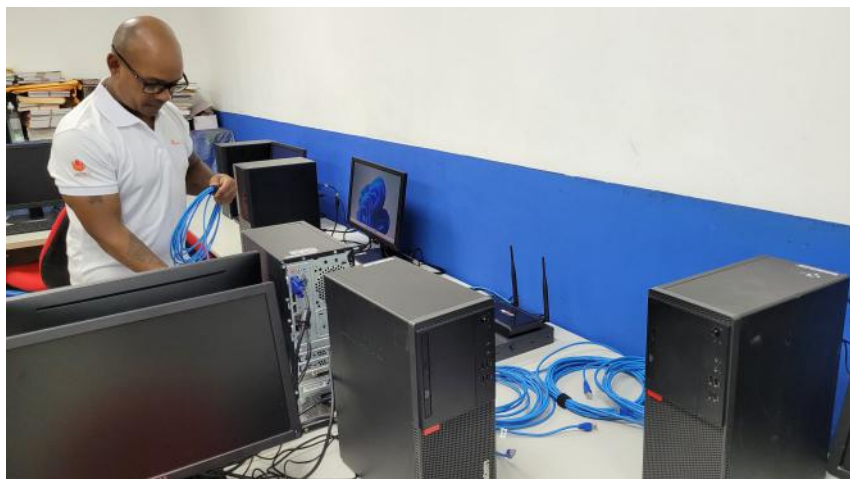
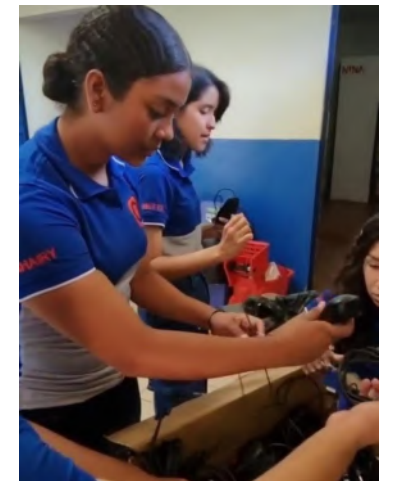




CONNECTING THE UNCONNECTED

Connectivity for the Marcia de Cañellas School

The Cable & Wireless Panama Foundation and +Móvil donated the Computer Lab for Pedregal's Marcia A. de Cañellas Multigrade School. Furniture, complete desktop computers, cabling, equipment, and fiber optic service were installed to make the laboratory operational. The Foundation's volunteers, finalists, and advisors of the 2023 National Oratory Contest, together with the school staff, were in charge of transforming the space to turn it into a door to knowledge through digital learning. The school's educational community comprises 130 people, including primary school students, teachers, and administrative staff.





DISASTER RELIEF



COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Visit to Tonosí, solidarity with victims

The volunteers of +Móvil, Liberty Latin America, and the Cwp Foundation traveled to the village of Tonosí, province of Los Santos, to show solidarity with the victims of the floods that hit several parts of the Azuero Peninsula. To mitigate the traumatic event's impact, more than 80 families received dry food, clothing, and entertainment.





PANAMANIAN RED CROSS

Equipped and prepared in the event of disasters

The CWP Foundation donated 39,000 masks and 432 gallons of alcohol gel to the Panamanian Red Cross – La Chorrera Committee. The Committee used these supplies for the protection and safety of the institution's paramedics and volunteers who participated in various health fairs in communities that are difficult to access and to support victims impacted by the floods in Western Panama. In addition, the team contributed supplies to the Aquilino Tejeira Hospital in Penonomé, Coclé province.

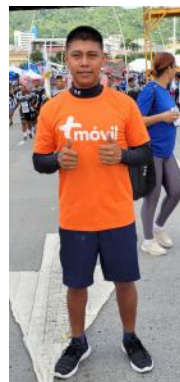
CORPORATIVE VOLUNTEERING



VOLUNTEERING IN ACTION

FANLYC

During Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, our corporate volunteers and collaborators from +Móvil and Liberty Latin America participated in the Relay Race for Life, organized by the Friends of Children with Leukemia and Cancer Foundation (Fanlyc). More than 300 volunteers walked 632 circuits to help support more than 500 children and adolescents diagnosed with cancer.



Student Volunteering

Students from the Oxford International School in Panama participated in the CWP Foundation's student volunteer project. They collaborated in the initiative organized in conjunction with the Buenos Pasos Movement in favor of children in vulnerable situations from the community of Altos de Howard in Arraiján, West Panama. Eighteen young people, together with the volunteers of +Móvil, took a moment of recreation to promote a greater social sensitivity of the students regarding the problems and needs of children from the most vulnerable sectors.
