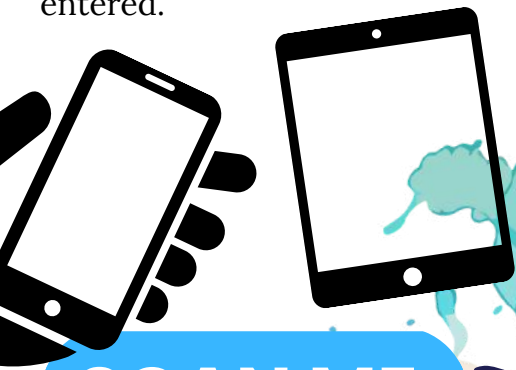
Gallery of Living History Art Competition Year 10 Students

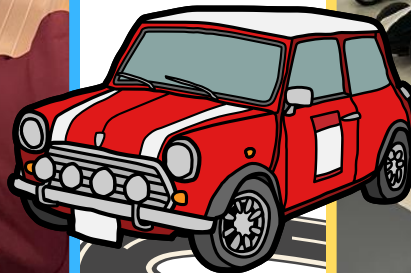


Year 10 and Year 12 D&T Trip to the British Motor Museum

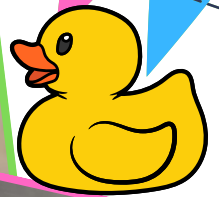


The Polesworth School's Summer Fayre

Healthy ME was demonstrated through their fitness levels to be able to cope with the events they were in and the confidence they had to achieve their best.

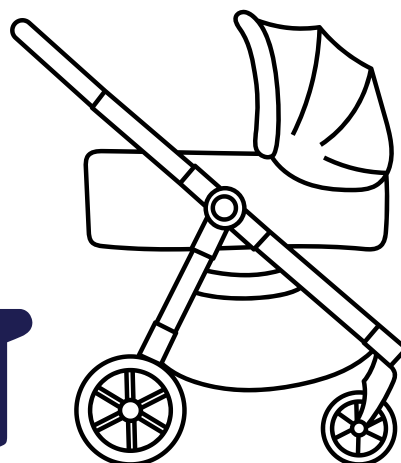
As a department we were proud of the students and the commitment they showed in striving to become district champions once again.

All Pastoral Support Officers will work as a team, but the one attached to your year group is the one who will work with your child the most and who will be your point of contact along with your child's Head of Year.

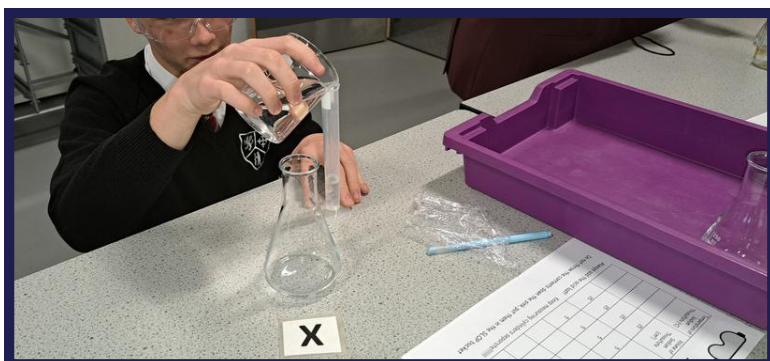
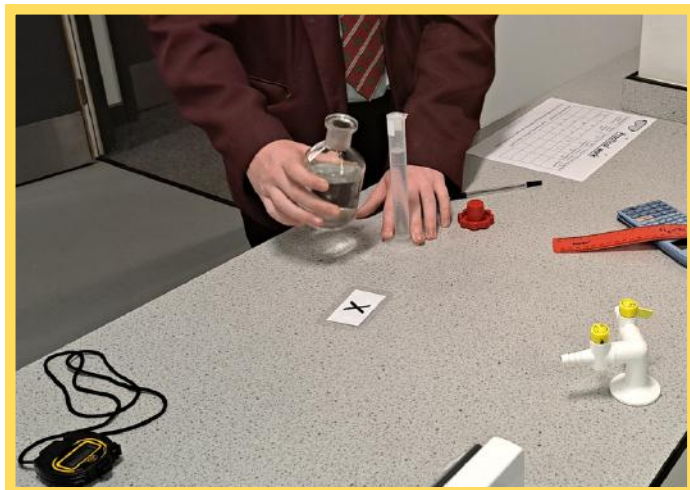
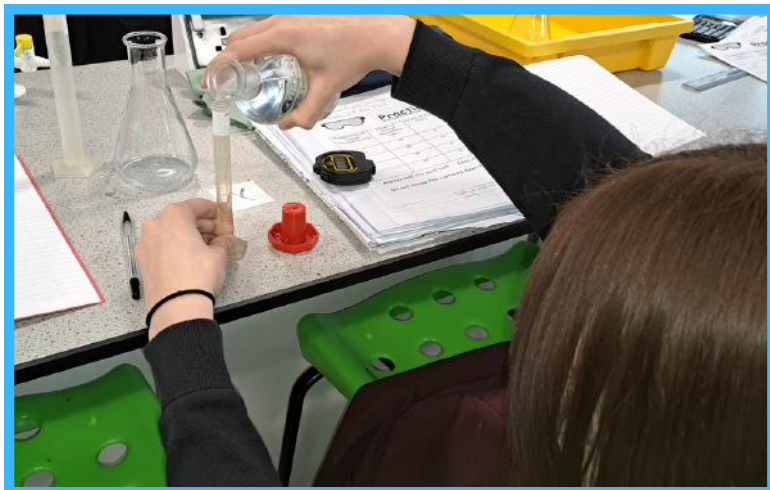
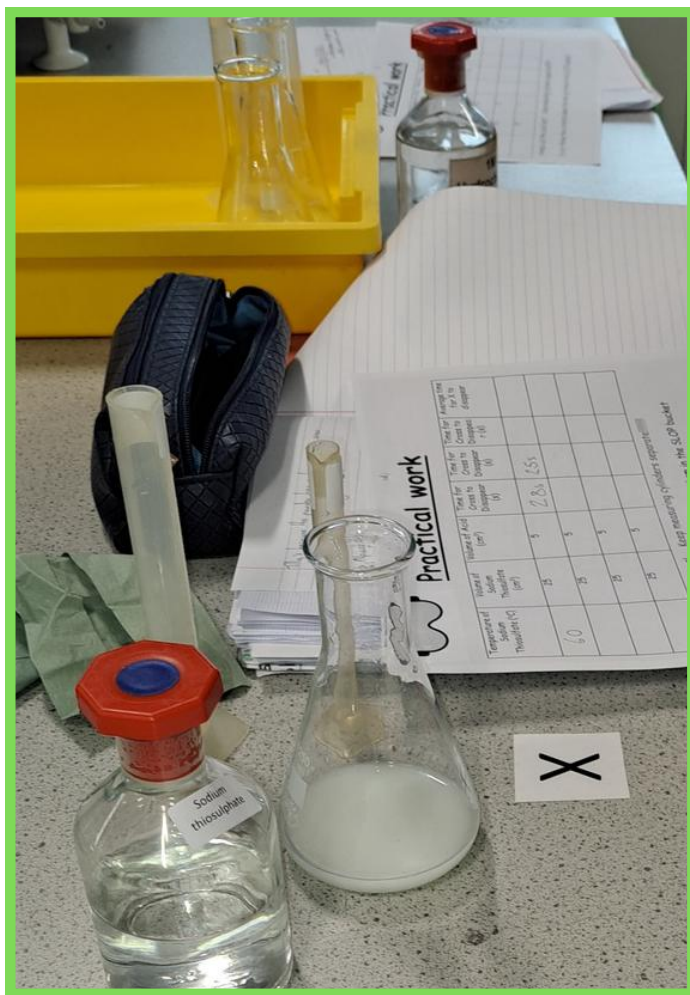

Practical Science Class- 10M

10M carried out a practical to investigate the effect of changing temperature on the rate of reaction. We used Sodium Thiosulfate and Hydrochloric Acid in the reaction. The reaction produces a precipitate called Sulfur. This is cloudy yellow and it allows us to time the reaction. When we can no longer see the laminated cross through the solution, we say that the reaction has finished. We recorded 3 times for each of the different temperatures of Sodium Thiosulfate and then went on to construct a graph.

National Scientific Thinking Challenge

For the first time ever at The Polesworth School, 57 Year 10 students took part in the 'National Scientific Thinking Challenge' back at the start of May. This challenge has been created by professors at some of the top universities in the country and encourages deep thinking skills in STEM-related contexts. Of the students who took part, 8 achieved silver awards for being in the top 25% of the country and a further 11 achieved bronze awards; this was for being in the top 40% of the country. We will be making this a regular event with students studying Triple Science in Year 10 entered each year. Well done to all the students who took part.

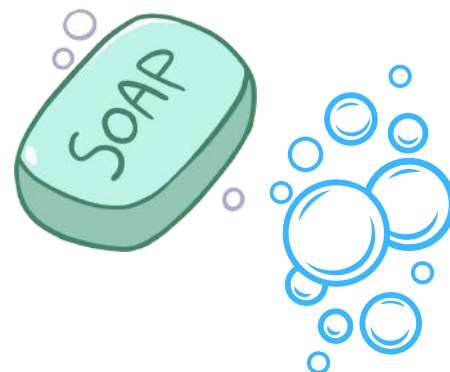
Year 12 Chemistry

Year 12 Chemistry students have reacted castor oil (containing triglycerides) with sodium hydroxide. The resulting solid product (a sodium carboxylate salt) is commonly known as soap.

Evidence has been found that ancient Babylonians understood soap making as early as 2800 BC.

Archeologists have found soap-like material in historic clay cylinders from this time. These cylinders were inscribed with what we understand as saying, "fats boiled with ashes" (an ancient method of making soap).

The market size, measured by revenue, of the UK Soap & Detergent Manufacturing industry was £2.6 billion in 2023!

REMEMBER THAT THEY MIGHT NOT TELL YOU EVERYTHING THEY ARE USING, SO IT IS A GOOD IDEA TO ASK THEM TO SHOW YOU THEIR DEVICE. CHILDREN CAN FORM POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS WITH PEOPLE ONLINE, AND THIS HAS BECOME MORE COMMON THANKS TO ONLINE MULTI-PLAYER OPTIONS, BUT THEY MAY NOT FULLY UNDERSTAND THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A FRIEND AND A STRANGER. YOU COULD MAKE THE QUESTION MORE SPECIFIC TO YOUR CHILD. FOR EXAMPLE: "HAVE YOU MET ANYONE ONLINE THAT YOU LIKE TO PLAY GAMES WITH?" THEY MAY NOT WANT TO SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH YOU, SO ENSURE YOU TEACH THEM ABOUT HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS.

Do you know where to go for help?

ALTHOUGH YOU MAY BE THE ADULT THEY TRUST THE MOST, SOME CHILDREN STRUGGLE TO TALK ABOUT WHAT HAPPENS ONLINE DUE TO CONFUSION OR EMBARRASSMENT. BECAUSE OF THIS THEY MAY STRUGGLE TO APPROACH THE NORMAL PEOPLE WHO WOULD HELP, SUCH AS YOURSELF OR A TEACHER. HAVE A CHAT TO YOUR CHILD ABOUT EXACTLY WHERE THEY CAN GO FOR HELP, AND HOW THEY CAN REPORT ANY ACTIVITY THAT THEY BELIEVE IS INAPPROPRIATE ONLINE.

Do you know what your personal information is?

YOUR CHILD MAY ALREADY KNOW WHAT THEIR PERSONAL INFORMATION IS BUT THEY MIGHT NOT THINK ABOUT HOW IT CAN BE SHARED. HAVE A CONVERSATION ABOUT WHAT PERSONAL INFORMATION IS AND HOW THIS CAN AFFECT THEM IF IT IS SHARED BEYOND THE INTENDED RECIPIENT. IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOUR CHILD UNDERSTANDS THE DANGERS OF SHARING CONTACT DETAILS OR PHOTOS, AS INFORMATION SUCH AS THIS CAN SPREAD QUICKLY ONLINE.

CHILDREN MAY NOT UNDERSTAND THE NEGATIVE IMPACTS OF DEVICE OR GAME ADDICTION. TALK TO THEM OPENLY ABOUT HEALTHY HABITS AND ASK WHETHER OR NOT THEM SPENDING TIME ONLINE OR PLAYING A GAME IS AFFECTING THEIR SLEEP, PERFORMANCE AT SCHOOL OR IF THEY ARE GENERALLY LOSING INTEREST IN OTHER ACTIVITIES.
