The purpose of this award shall be to recognize and honor the life-long commitment of Betty Garlick, the first Michigan AEYC president, to children and families. Betty Garlick was a pioneer in the field of early childhood education. She was a teacher of children, an advocate on behalf of children and families, an author and editor, an environmentalist, a consultant, an innovative programmer and an evaluator. The breadth and depth of these contributions should serve as a guide in selecting future recipients.

Recipients of this award should have devoted a large part of their lives to working on behalf of Michigan's children and families, and be at the end of their career or within a year of retirement. Further, individuals considered for this award shall have made exceptional contributions to the early childhood profession, locally and statewide. They will also have been involved in professional activities beyond their paid position. These may include (but are not limited to): legislation, research, publication, and leadership in professional organizations.

The Michigan AEYC Mentor Teacher Credential prepares early childhood professionals to serve as effective, reflective mentors for emerging educators. Participants build skills in relationship-based mentoring, adult learning, and coaching practices that support professional growth and retention. This credential emphasizes equity, reflective practice, and real-world application, strengthening the early childhood workforce across Michigan.

The Michigan AEYC Mentor Teacher Credential builds the knowledge and skills early childhood professionals need to effectively mentor and support others in the classroom. Participants focus on relationship-based mentoring, adult learning principles, and reflective coaching practices. This credential strengthens professional growth, retention, and leadership capacity, contributing to a more confident and supported early childhood workforce across Michigan.



#3

The Michigan AEYC Mentor Teacher Credential supports early childhood professionals in developing competencies aligned with the Michigan Professional Standards and Competencies for Early Childhood Educators (MiPSC). Participants strengthen skills in relationship-based practice, adult learning, and reflective coaching to support educator growth across roles and settings. This credential promotes leadership development, continuous quality improvement, and a stable, effective early childhood workforce.

Eligibility

To be eligible for a CDA or MI-YDA Assessment, Associates/CDA training, or a Bachelor's scholarship:

- Work in a licensed child care center, family or group home a minimum of 20 hours per week with children. Positions include Director, Assistant Director, teacher, assistant/aid, para-pro assigned to birth-PreK setting, owner, family/group child care owner, family/group child care assistant, curriculum specialist/director, floater, site supervisor, school-age program staff. High school applicants are excluded from eligibility requirements.
- Pursuing a CDA, MI-YDA, associate's degree, or bachelor's degree in early childhood education, including ZN and ZO endorsements when combined with ZN at a TEACH-approved college or university (we have maps of approved schools on our website).
- Meet the following income eligibility requirements:
 - Earn no more than \$29.90/hour if pursuing a CDA, MI-YDA, associate's degree or bachelor's degree coursework
 - Work in a program willing to sponsor you on a scholarship, or are employed in a stipend scholarship approved program

Michigan AEYC and Community Colleges statewide are partnering to bring high quality CDA training to meet the needs of early care and education providers to communities near you.

Each community college cohort below offers CDA training fulfilling the 120 clock hours of training required by the Council for Professional Recognition while earning college credits that apply toward an Early Childhood Associate Degree. 


Participants will earn 12 MiRegistry training hours upon completion and enjoy the added benefit of included coaching, tailored to your unique goals and challenges.

Early Foundations Program

New staff and/or staff in new positions will gain immediate skills needed to feel supported and be successful in the classroom, even before achieving a CDA or degree. Busy Program Administrators enrolling new staff in the Early Foundations Program will benefit by reducing their in-classroom onboarding time and be confident that their new staff are knowledgeable in Developmentally Appropriate Practices and necessary classroom management skills. Participants must meet all the following eligibility requirements:

- Staff without a CDA or degree in early childhood education/child development
- Staff who are in their first 2 years of employment in a licensed child care program OR who have been in their position/role less than 2 years
- Participants must be able to maintain an openness to new ideas, a willingness to think differently, and a dedication to doing what is best for young children.



Participants will complete a 4-month training and support cycle.

- 2 hours of training per month on topics include but not limited to: Welcome to the ECE profession, Developmentally Appropriate Practice, principles of child development and learning, strengthening relationships with families, positive guidance, and more.
- Biweekly virtual coaching and individualized support.
- Additional coaching and support are available upon request.
- Participants schedule their training and coaching sessions at times that fit their schedules.
- All participants will receive a "Welcome to the Early Childhood Education Profession" gift.



About the Standards

The Michigan Professional Standards and Competencies for Early Childhood Educators outline what all professionals working with children from birth through age eight need to know and be able to do, in any early learning setting. These standards reflect the nationally recognized Power to the Profession initiative and build a stronger foundation for the preparation, support, and growth of early childhood educators.

Key Benefits of the Standards

- **Consistency Across Systems** – Aligning with national standards ensures Michigan’s educators are prepared and recognized across the country.
- **Mobility and Recognition** – Educators moving between state and national frameworks will experience smoother transitions, with their competencies recognized and valued across settings.
- **Stronger Educational Programs** – This alignment helps ensure ECE programs meet both state and national standards, improving the quality and relevance of professional development and higher education offerings.
- **Elevating the Profession** – Reinforces Michigan’s commitment to a skilled, respected, and unified early childhood workforce.
