## Our Legacy



### Church ordains homosexual as minister in California

SAN CARLOS, Calif. — Rev. Dan Johnson, a former president of Houston's Christian Youth Center — and the first of a major denomination — was ordained by the United Church of Christ Sunday night in this suburb of San Francisco.

In the afternoon prior to the service, Johnson said he had open conversations with a group of about 100 people through downtown San Francisco, in the city's first gay parade — featuring 20 floats and a homophile sheriff's posse.

The service at San Francisco was presided by the Rev. James Clark Brown, pastor of the First Congregational Church of San Francisco and a leading supporter of Johnson in his application for ordination.

The Rev. Mrs. Brown, whose own congregation was not in broad accord over the ordination, presided on the left.

"The Ministry to which God has Called Me" — the title of the congregation of 17 clergy and visitors from 12 San Francisco Bay Area churches.

"God is not primarily concerned with whether you are a man or a woman, but with whether you are a Christian. This is the difference between marriage and the marriage of convenience. God is a God of love, not a God of judgment — and it is this conviction that says: 'There is a need and a mission here for a full-time minister.'"

The denomination's traditional ordination service also featured "a Dramatic Word" performed by Cecily Zillmer and Linda Chase of the San Carlos Church's Youth Group which Johnson, 25, has served as pastor since 1974.

The ordination's moderator, Bishop Johnson of Houston, was present at the ceremony, as was his brother, Wayne, a Houston advertising man, who was formerly a member of the church.

Johnson, a member of the church in a special urban ministry called the "Houston's First Evangelical

## Susan Abraham, ThD

*Vice President of Academic Affairs, Dean of Faculty and Professor of Theology and Postcolonial Cultures*



Dr. Susan Abraham is the author of *Identity, Ethics, and Nonviolence in Postcolonial Theory: A Rahnerian Theological Assessment* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2007), co-editor of *Shoulder to Shoulder: Frontiers in Catholic Feminist Theology* (Fortress, 2009), *Blessed are Those Who Mourn: Depression, Anxiety, and Pain on the Path of an Incarnational Spirituality* (Marymount Press, 2020) and numerous essays and articles in anthologies of contemporary theology and peer-reviewed journals. She is also the President of the Board of Editors of *Concilium: An International Journal of Theology*. In 2023 she was elected to the presidential line of the Catholic Theological Society of America (CTSA) and was installed as the current president of the CTSA for the year of 2025-2026.

Dr. Abraham brings wide experience and knowledge of higher education and institutional practices through her past affiliations with St. Bonaventure University, Harvard Divinity School, and Loyola Marymount University. Her publications, courses, and presentations weave practical theological insights from her experience of working as a youth minister in Mumbai, India, with theoretical perspectives from postcolonial theory, cultural studies, political theory and feminist theory.

## Student Awards

### **Freda Smith Feminist Preaching Award**

Honoring Rev. Elder Freda Smith, the first woman ordained in Metropolitan Community Churches known for her groundbreaking feminist preaching, this prize is awarded for a prophetic, innovative, and transformational feminist sermon. Feminist means advocating for women's full humanity and well-being (including transgender women). **This year's award recipient is Shannon Marckx.**

### **Marcella Althaus-Reid Award in Queering Religion and Theology**

To honor the pioneering theological vision of Marcella Althaus-Reid, Pacific School of Religion's Center for LGBTQ and Gender Studies in Religion presents an award in her honor for the best student essay on "queer-ing religion and theology." Marcella Althaus-Reid was born in Rosario, Argentina, and received her first degree through a center in Buenos Aires to study liberation theology in Latin America. With a Ph.D. from the University of St. Andrews, she became a professor of contextual theology at the University of Edinburgh. She also trained for the ministry of the Methodist Church of Argentina. Her first book, *Indecent Theology* (2000), quickly raised her profile throughout the theological world. With the publication of *Queer God*, she was at the forefront of a brand new and controversial field in the academic study of theology. She passed away on February 22, 2009. **This year's award recipient is Barbara Rene Craft.**

### **Michael M. Mendiola Prize in Ethics**

The Michael M. Mendiola Prize in Ethics is awarded to the graduating student who has submitted an outstanding essay or thesis on the questions of theodicy and human suffering or other vital topics in contemporary ethics. The award is named for a much-beloved former PSR ethics professor who served on the faculty from 1992 to 2009. Dr. Mendiola helped to birth the Center for LGBTQ and Gender Studies in Religion and made significant contributions to the study of biomedical issues. This award was established at the time of his untimely death by faculty colleagues and friends in honor of his many contributions to the life of this institution. **This year's award recipient is Garrett House.**

### **Paul Wesley Yinger Preaching Awards**

The Paul Wesley Yinger Preaching Award is presented each spring to the graduating students judged to be the most outstanding preachers with demonstrated dramatic skills. The recipients are selected each year by a committee chaired by the professor of homiletics, other faculty who teach courses in homiletics at PSR, and the dean of the faculty. Dr. Yinger's family and friends established the endowed award, a noted United Church of Christ preacher who served as a trustee of Pacific School of Religion from 1962 to 1985. **This year's recipients are Natalie Janine Gates and Manuel Teofilo Mansueto Falcon Padua.**

## Koinonia Awards

In making this annual award the Office of Community Life seeks to honor graduating students who have strengthened PSR through outstanding contributions of spirit, insight, and intellect during their time at the school; made a significant contribution to and greatly enriched the spiritual, social, and community life of PSR through their presence and efforts; served the school through active participation in campus life, institutional committees, and/or by helping to create new possibilities for community involvement; and demonstrated academic excellence, thereby contributing to and enhancing the scholarly reputation of PSR.
