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## OUR COMMITMENT TO ST. PHILIP'S NORTH

***St. Philip's North deserves leadership that listens, acts, and understands the pressures families are under, and DELIVERS practical results.***

This manifesto is organized under three pillars that reflect both immediate concerns and long-term growth.

### **1) Environmental Stewardship**

Cleaner communities, healthier families, greater pride, and stronger resilience.

### **2) Self-Development & Empowerment**

Building people, expanding opportunity, and strengthening families through education, skills, and enterprise.

### **3) Infrastructure & Community Safety**

Safer roads, better drainage, brighter communities, disaster readiness, and stronger public confidence .

These are not promises without direction. They are commitments with structure, and each one must answer a simple question: how does this make life better for the people of St. Philip's North ?



## PILLAR ONE



### Environmental Stewardship

A cleaner and healthier St. Philip's North benefits everyone. It means fewer health risks, stronger community pride, safer surroundings for our children, and better protection for the land and spaces we all depend on.

Protecting our environment is not only about tomorrow. It is about how we live today: cleaner villages, reduced flooding, healthier public spaces, and preserving the beauty and value of our communities for future generations.

### Commitments

- Launch quarterly constituency-wide clean-up drives so communities remain cleaner, safer, and more dignified.
- Establish 3 community-led environmental committees to give residents a real voice in improving and protecting their own areas.
- Partner with schools and youth groups to create environmental clubs that build responsibility, awareness, and pride in community.
- Promote practical climate resilience and disaster readiness measures that help protect homes, livelihoods, and public safety.
- Support cleaner public spaces and stronger community upkeep through partnerships, volunteerism, and consistent follow-through.

### Measure of success

Visible improvements in community upkeep, stronger resident participation, and practical environmental habits becoming part of daily life across the constituency



## PILLAR TWO

A strong constituency is built when its people are given real opportunities to grow. That means investing in our young people, supporting working families, creating pathways for skills and employment, and helping residents build better futures with dignity and confidence.

### Youth Development

- Establish a St. Philip's North Scholarship Fund within Year 1 and work with sponsors to support at least 5 students annually.
- Launch structured homework centres so children have safe, supportive places to learn and parents have added help.
- Develop coding, AI, creative arts, and skills clubs to expose young people to modern opportunities and confidence-building experiences.
- Expand sports programmes with mentorship so discipline, teamwork, and character grow alongside talent.

### Vocational & Skills Training

- Partner with technical institutes to offer certification programmes.
- Launch an apprenticeship referral system to connect residents with practical work opportunities.
- Support at least 25 residents annually in skill-based training so more people can qualify for jobs and build more secure futures.

### Entrepreneurship & Innovation

- Host quarterly small business workshops.
- Create an annual St. Philip's North Market & Trade Fair to showcase local talent and enterprise.
- Facilitate access to small business financing guidance, including EDP and other opportunities as they arise.
- Support at least 10 new or expanding micro-enterprises within 2 years.



## PILLAR THREE

### **Infrastructure & Community Safety**

Families cannot thrive when roads are failing, drains overflow, communities are poorly lit, and residents do not feel safe.

Real progress must be seen and felt in the condition of our villages, the safety of our neighborhoods, and the quality of the infrastructure people rely on every day.

#### ***Roads & Drainage***

- Identify the top 10 priority road concerns within the first 3 months, with direct input from residents
- Continue strong advocacy for phased road resurfacing and related public works improvements.
- Improve drainage in flood-prone areas so families, schoolchildren, drivers, and businesses are not left battling avoidable hardship every time heavy rain falls
- Target at least 75% of identified priority repairs to be addressed within 2 years.

#### ***Lighting & Public Safety***

- Conduct a streetlight audit within the first 90 days.
- Push for the repair or installation of lights in high-risk and poorly lit areas so residents can move about more safely, especially at night
- Work toward reducing poorly lit areas by 75%.

#### ***Community Policing & Engagement***

- Facilitate quarterly police-community forums so concerns can be raised and addressed directly
- Advocate for increased patrol presence where needed.
- Monitor community satisfaction and petty crime trends to guide future engagement.

#### ***Disaster Preparedness***

- Establish an emergency response volunteer network.
- Host hurricane preparedness workshops.
- Develop a village-level emergency contact registry to improve coordination in times of need.



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## ACCOUNTABILITY FRAMEWORK

*This manifesto will not sit on a shelf.*

- Deliver an annual Constituency Report Card.
- Host Quarterly Town Hall Meetings.
- Provide public progress updates.
- Maintain transparent communication.
- Remain visible and answerable to the people of St. Philip's North.

### **Economic Participation & Job Access**

- Advocate strongly for St. Philip's North residents to benefit first from jobs created through public projects in and around the constituency.
- Partner with contractors and employers to provide on-the-job training and practical work experience
- Create a job information network so residents hear about opportunities early and are better positioned to apply.

### **Senior Citizen Support**

- Strengthen elderly outreach programmes so our seniors feel seen, supported, and respected.
- Advocate for easier access to healthcare transport, especially for those who face difficulty getting to appointments.
- Establish a Senior Advisory Group so elders have a direct voice in shaping support that reflects their real needs.

### **Women & Family Support**

- Encourage safe and respectful spaces for community dialogue where families, women, and residents can speak openly, be heard, and connect to support.
- Support initiatives that strengthen economic resilience, confidence, and family stability across the constituency.


