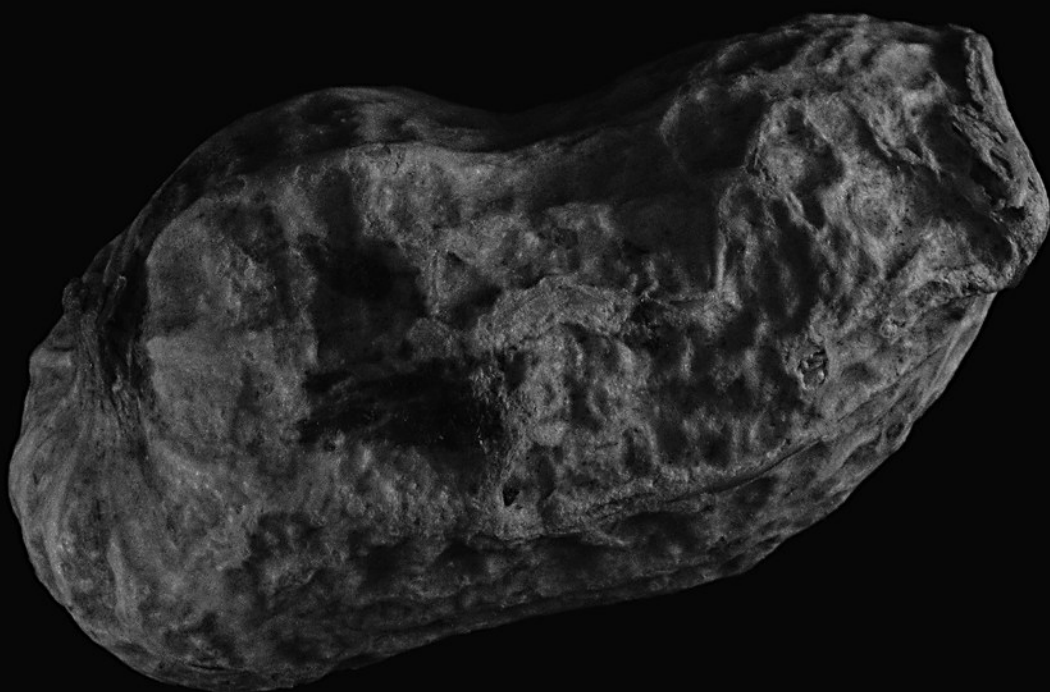


















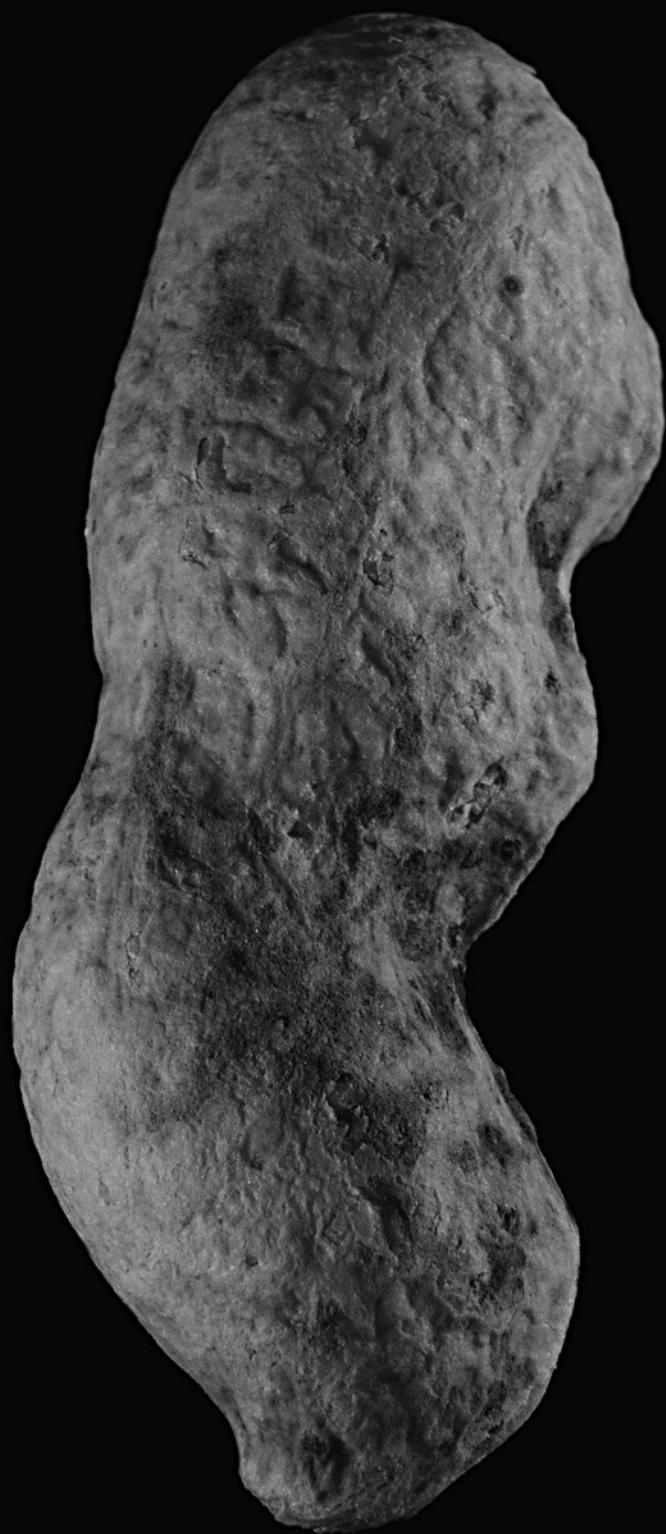










































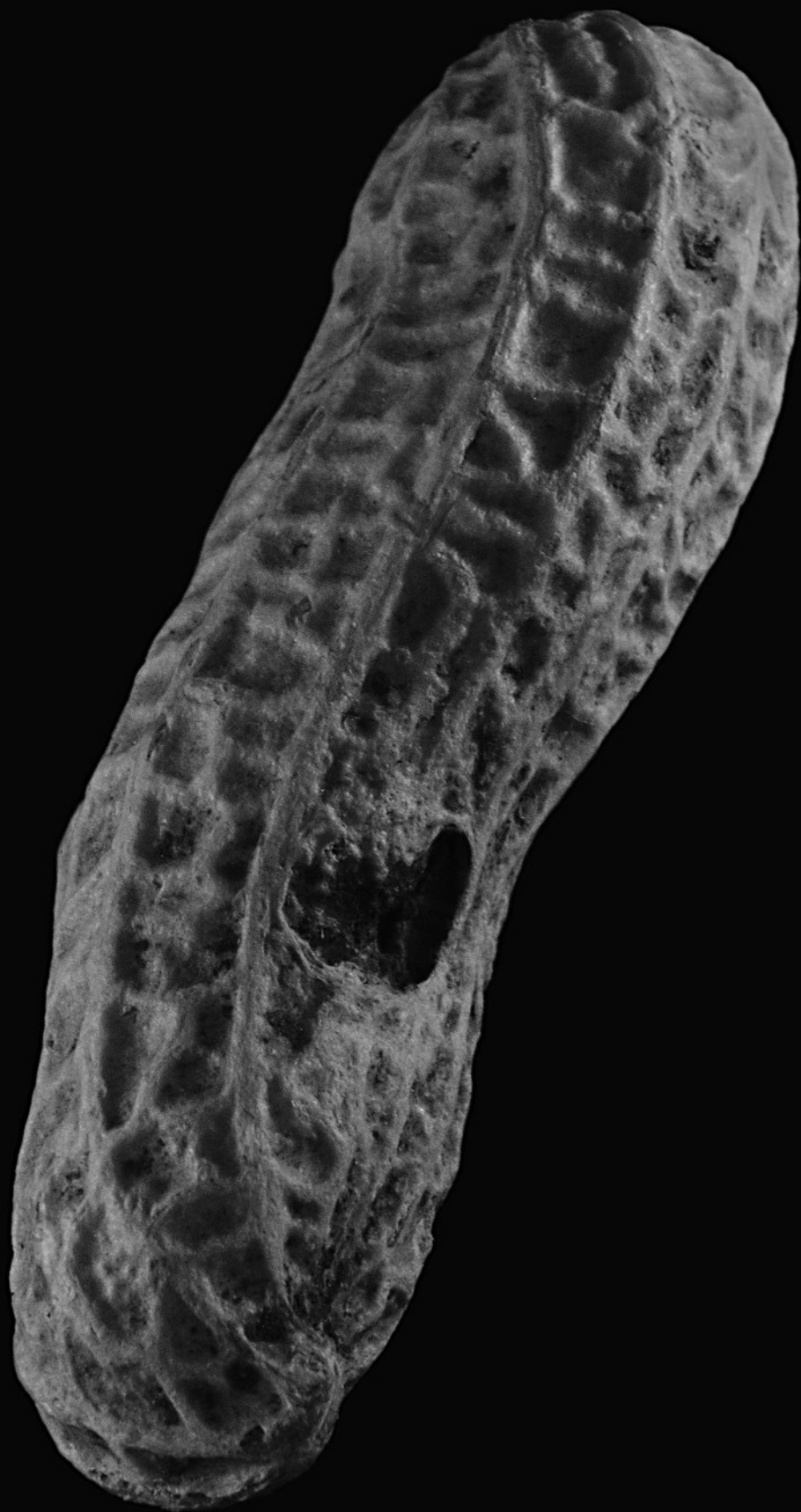


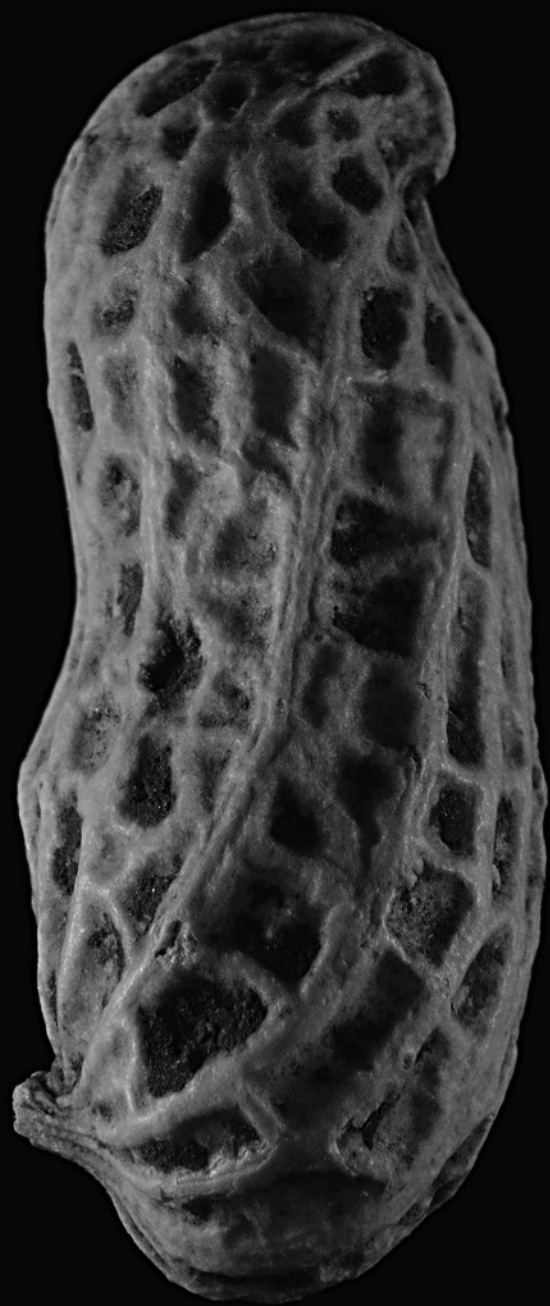


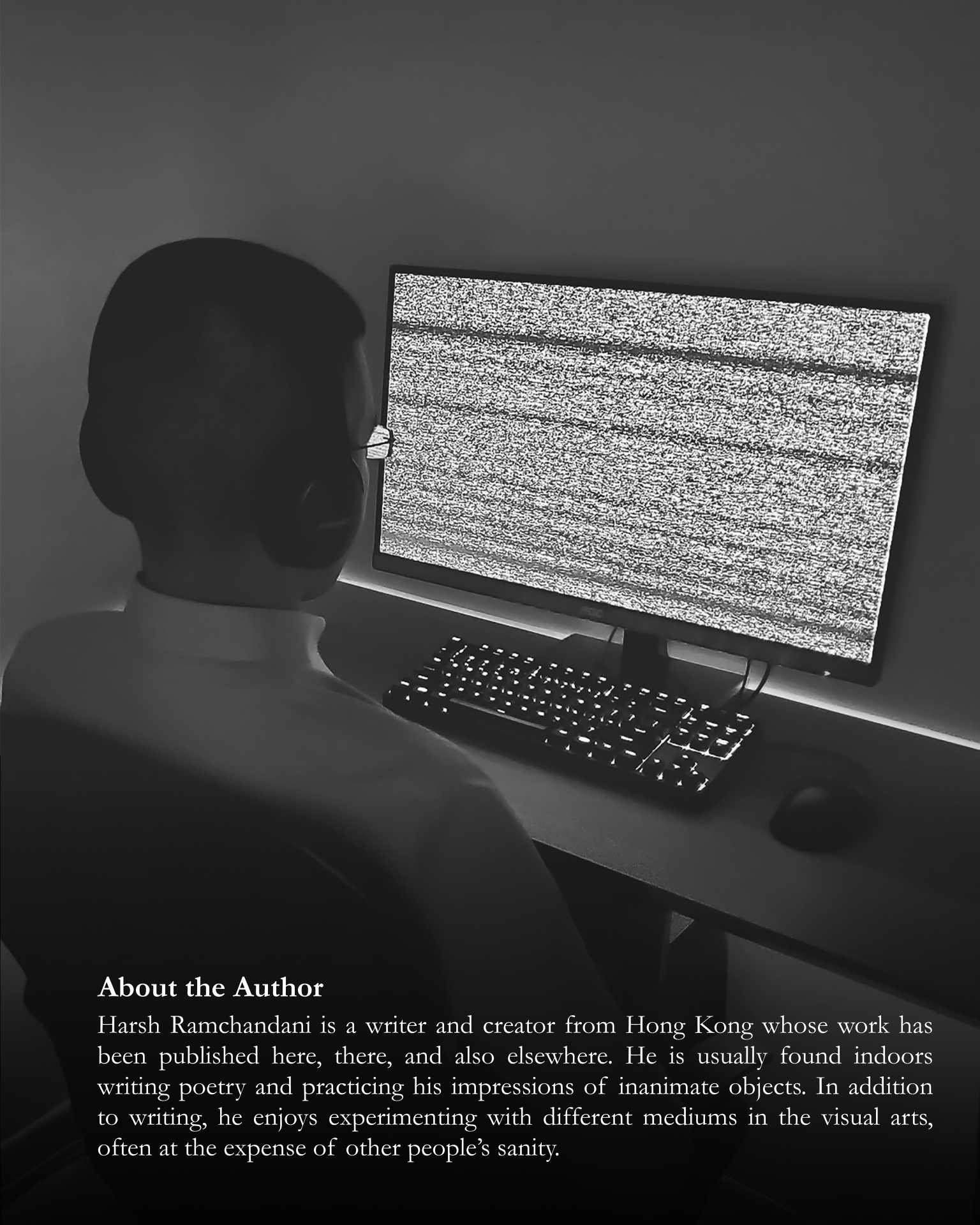












About the Author
