The AWLS Board of Education meets monthly at the Central Administrative Offices. Meetings are open to the public and are <u>live-streamed and recorded</u> for those who cannot attend in-person.

Highlights from the November 3 Meeting:

- School Social Worker, Rebekah Hrcka shared an overview of her work in the District, and was joined by community members, Anne Stevens and Amy Barrett to provide an overview of how Neighborhood Bridges supports Anthony Wayne students and their families.
- The Board recognized the state-level accomplishments of the fall season student-athletes to date.
- A \$6,000 OneNet Connectivity Grant to support with technology infrastructure.
- Refunds of \$1,766.94 from Lial Catholic School and \$3,212.13 from Discovery Express School were approved for unspent auxiliary funds for FY24-25. These funds will be returned to the state, as required.
- The Board approved several personnel changes, including resignations and retirements, the hiring of new classified employees, substitutes and volunteers.
- Superintendent Herman shared a message of gratitude for district staff members, students and their families, along with AW community members

for making AWLS an outstanding place to be.

BOARD MEMBER ELECTION RESULTS

Board members Kyle Miller and Mike Stamm were re-elected to their seats on the Board on November 4. They will serve a four-year term starting on January 1, 2026.

BOARD SEAT VACANCY UPDATES

The Board received an overwhelming response from applicants interested in serving on the upcoming open member position. Twenty-five residents submitted application materials.

The top four candidates were announced following a Special Meeting on November 20. Amy Barrett, Katie Carollo, Matthew Culling, and Troy Schalitz will introduce themselves at the December 8 regular meeting prior to interviews with the Board during an Executive Session.





The Board does not expect to make a final decision at this meeting; however, a vote on the selected candidate must be held between January 10 and January 30, 2026.

District stakeholders are encouraged to attend the December 8 meeting or view the live broadcast to learn more about the candidates. Updates will be provided as the Board moves through the selection process.
