Growth From Construction

Together we witnessed the culmination of the new South Medical Office Building, designed to streamline processes and create conveniences for both patients and staff. Faith Regional also expanded its footprint through a new family medicine clinic in Humphrey, filling a gap for primary care in our region.

Growth from Technology

One of the biggest changes in 2019 was the launch of EPIC, our new electronic medical record system, and One Chart I Patient portal. These titanic technological implementations not only improved the quality of care with the ability to instantaneously safely share information with medical providers across the nation but also greatly enhanced the overall patient experience.

Growth from Challenges

During the spring, the entire Midwest experienced unprecedented flooding. Faith Regional implemented its Incident Command Center, partnering with area agencies to ensure we could continue to provide for the medical needs in our region, especially those more vulnerable.

Medical Office Building South

Faith Regional completed construction of our Medical Office Building South in Fall 2019, with the first clinics moving into the space in December 2019. The building offers multiple related health care services all within a single, convenient area.

Growing In Northeast Nebraska

To provide quality, convenient healthcare to Northeast Nebraska, Faith Regional opened a family medicine clinic in Humphrey, NE. This clinic furthered our commitment of making sure our patients have access to healthcare right down the road. Michaela Small, APRN, provides exemplary medical services at our new clinic with Mary Pat Kuehler, APRN, offering psychiatric services twice a month.













Meet John, a local business owner in Madison, Nebraska.

When John began experiencing pressure in his chest, his experience as a volunteer with Madison Fire & Rescue led him to know something wasn't right, so he came to Faith Regional. John ended up having to have open-heart quadruple bypass surgery.

John shares, "People don't realize how lucky we are to have this nice of a facility. It's amazing all of the specialty doctors that Faith Regional has, that really put my mind at ease. Having a heart attack and open-heart surgery is a life-changing event. You have a different outlook on life. You appreciate your family, friends, and neighbors so much more than you ever did because they were there when you needed a hand."

Expanding Orthopedic Expertise.

DURING THE CHRISTMAS BLIZZARD OF 2009, MARCIA JOHNSON FELL.

Years later, we discovered that Johnson had actually broken her hip in that fall. But Johnson pushed on. Then, last year, she began experiencing consistent pain.

Johnson consulted with all the orthopedic surgeons in Norfolk, but her situation was very complex. The final consensus was that Johnson would need to go out of the area for this type of operation. Her orthopedic team tried everyone, but no one could get her in for a while.

Johnson was at the orthopedic office in Norfolk, getting an injection, when a Faith Regional physician let her know that there was a new doctor in town. The following Monday, Johnson met Michael Woodbury, DO. "He said, 'Marcia, I can fix this, and you'll only need one incision," she says. "When we walked out, I looked at my aunt who was with me and said, 'This is a God thing,'" Johnson says. "I will be able to have the surgery done in Norfolk, and it's going to be sooner.' In the time leading up to the surgery, Johnson kept coming across this term: Godwink. "It's when God knows where you are, what you are and what you need," she explains.

Johnson had the surgery on Oct. 3. Today, she is no longer in pain. "The hospital staff was all wonderful," she shares. "They were knowledgeable, caring – honest-to-God, genuine caring. This is what it means to have care at home. It's wonderful. I can't believe my luck." When it comes to Dr. Woodbury, "He's my Godwink," Johnson says.

Partnerships and Preparedness During Historic Flood

WITH REGION 11, EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT,
AND COUNTY AND CITY OFFICIALS AT THE
EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER.

FRHS Incident Command continually monitored the capacity of area designated evacuation centers, road and levee conditions, as well as internal resources such as staffing, facility capacity, and supplies.

Knowing and anticipating the disaster could further lead to a greater influx in patient volume, every effort was made to preserve our resources for the medical needs of the community to ensure we had the necessary and proper staffing, capacity and resources available.

The disaster plan worked as intended by preserving and utilizing reduced resources enabling us to continue to provide for the medical needs of our community, especially those most vulnerable.

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Carson Cancer Center Improvements

Improvements to the Carson Cancer Center were made possible by the Nucor Corporation and their donation of funds from one of their annual charity golf tournaments. The donation allowed for light remodeling and new furnishings including twelve recliners equipped with heat and charging stations, two bed suites; new flooring, paint, blinds, and amenities such as coffee bars for patients and families throughout.

EPIC

The healthcare experience at Faith Regional has been enhanced with the launch of a new, nationally-recognized electronic medical record (EMR) software, Epic. The implementation consolidates many of Faith Regional's electronic record systems into one, improving quality, enhancing the patient experience, and instantaneously safely sharing information with a myriad of medical providers across the nation. Epic's ability to immediately transfer records between facilities who share the system creates a seamless continuum of care for those patients, improving patient safety and reducing duplication of services.

In addition to providers, patients will also have easier, more convenient access to health record information through the One Chart | Patient Portal. One Chart | Patient replaced Faith Regional's previous patient portal, Health Connect, and will provide more services and convenience for patients such as the ability to view test results, update information, communicate with their care team, and manage appointments online.

Reputation Growth

Faith Regional was recognized for its commitment to ensuring stroke patients receive the most appropriate treatment by meeting specific achievement measures and benchmarks. Faith Regional Health Services received the American Heart Association/American Stroke Association's Get With The Guidelines® Target: Stroke Honor Roll Gold Quality Achievement Award. The measures align with evidence-based guidelines with the goals of speeding recovery and reducing death and disability for stroke patients.





Faith Regional was also recognized for the achievement of receiving an award as one of Healthgrades 2019 America's 250 Best Hospitals Award. This distinction places Faith Regional Health Services in the top 5 percent of more than 4,500 hospitals assessed nationwide for its superior clinical performance. Faith Regional was the only hospital in the state of Nebraska to be recognized with this distinction in 2019.

Surgery Center Celebrates 20 Years

On August 27, 1999, the first two surgical cases were performed at the then named Northeast Nebraska Surgery Center. In the year after the center opened, 1,945 surgeries were performed.

Last year, over 4,000 surgeries were performed at Faith Regional's Surgery Center. Board-certified surgeons from ten different specialties perform a variety of procedures here including breast, dental and oral surgery, gastroenterology, general, gynecology, ophthalmology, orthopedics, pain management, plastic and reconstructive, and podiatry. Currently, Faith Regional Surgery Center employs 25 individuals, five of whom have worked at the center since its inception.






