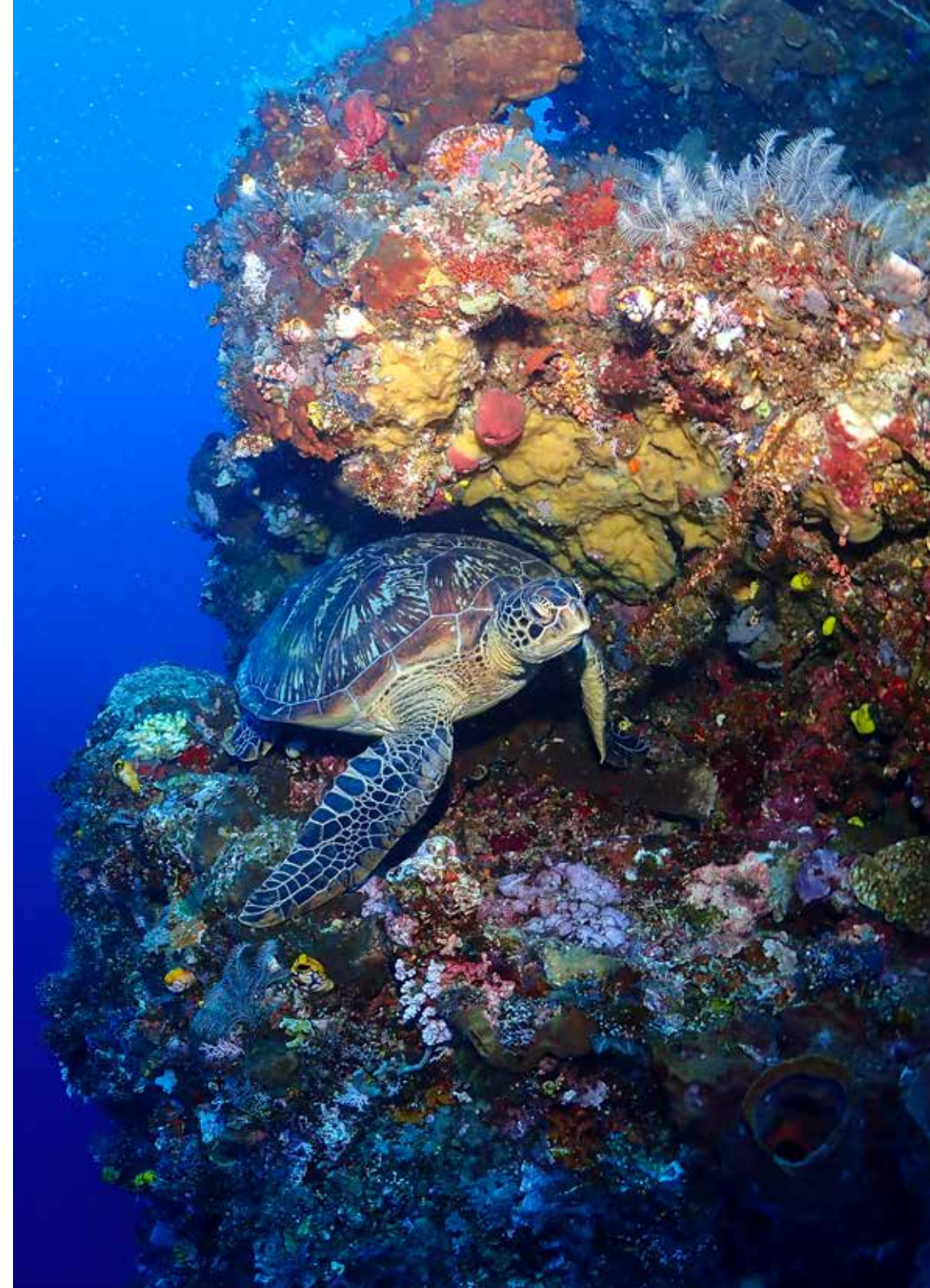

## BEGINNER, NOVICE, AND TIMID DIVERS



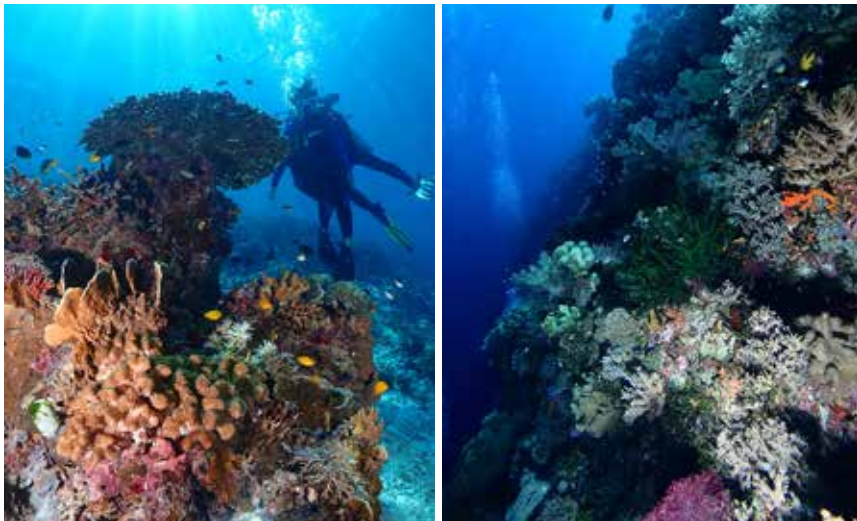

Ideal beginner dive sites offer depths of 12 - 18 meters, calm and sheltered conditions, clear visibility, and tropical temperatures. Sandy bottoms provide safe areas to practice skills, while minimal boat traffic creates a more relaxed setting. Combined with vibrant marine life, these sites serve as perfect gateways into the underwater world.

Instructors aim to build confident, capable divers, and selecting easy, comfortable sites is key to a positive learning experience.

## HOUSE REEF DIVING



A house reef is a dive site located just off the shore of a resort, easily accessible without the need for boat transfers. Perfect for divers of all levels, a quality house reef offers a rich array of marine life and calm, manageable conditions. Following an initial guided orientation, experienced buddy teams can often explore independently, making house reefs a flexible, convenient, and highly rewarding diving option.

## DRIFT DIVING



Drift diving is accessible to all certified divers, though beginners should start with gentle currents. For stronger conditions, additional training—such as the Advanced Open Water or Drift Diver Specialty—is highly recommended. Once mastered, drift diving lets you ride the current effortlessly, enjoy longer dives, cover more reef, and reach sites that were once outside your comfort zone. It's all about learning to go with the flow.

## DEEP DIVING



Divers should always respect the depth limits of their certification—18 meters (60 feet) for Open Water and 30 meters (100 feet) for Advanced Open Water. Depths beyond 30 meters are reserved for those with deep or technical diving certifications. Deep diving involves additional risks, including pressure effects and decompression considerations, so proper training is essential. In Indonesia, venturing deeper can improve your chances of encountering rare species like mola-mola, hammerhead sharks, and marble rays—though sightings are never guaranteed.

## WRECK DIVING



Wreck diving offers a uniquely captivating experience, blending history with underwater adventure. Non-penetration dives are suitable for all certified divers, but additional training significantly enhances both safety and enjoyment. Advanced and specialty courses cover key skills such as wreck navigation, hazard awareness, safe penetration techniques, and emergency procedures.

## NIGHT DIVING



As the sun dips below the horizon, the underwater world transforms. While some marine creatures settle in for the night, others emerge from their hiding places. Indonesia's waters come alive after dark with fascinating nocturnal species—think tiny octopuses, hunting moray eels, and even elusive walking sharks. Many of the best night dives take place at muck sites, where the seafloor teems with nocturnal activity and stealthy predators on the prowl.

## BLACKWATER DIVING



Blackwater diving is a one-of-a-kind night dive conducted over deep, open ocean—far from the reefs. Powerful lights are suspended from a drifting boat to attract plankton, which in turn draws in rare and alien-like juvenile creatures carried by the currents. Divers drift alongside the boat, staying close to the lights to witness this vertical slice of the ocean's food chain.

This specialized diving requires excellent buoyancy control and strong night diving skills. While still relatively new in Indonesia, a growing number of operators now offer this extraordinary experience.

## WALL DIVING



Wall diving depends on the site's topography and is only found in select regions of Indonesia. These dives usually begin on a shallow reef before descending along a dramatic vertical coral wall that plunges into the depths.

Good buoyancy control is essential, as there's often no visible bottom. Divers stay neutrally buoyant, drifting or swimming alongside the wall while observing its rich marine life - always remembering to glance out into the blue for unexpected pelagic encounters.

## MUCK DIVING



Muck diving is all about the thrill of discovering rare and unusual critters in sandy, low-coral environments—often over black volcanic sand. These creatures are masters of camouflage, making the search part of the excitement, especially on night dives.

Highly popular among macro photographers, muck diving draws divers of all levels to Indonesia's world-renowned sites, offering a chance to spot some of the ocean's most elusive and fascinating species.

# SHORE DIVING



While many dive sites in Indonesia offer shore access, only a few stand out for their easy entry and rich marine life. Shore diving isn't always possible—cliffside coastlines or rough sea conditions, like strong waves, can make entry unsafe. Divers typically wade in fully geared (minus fins), swim out, and then descend; exits follow the same process in reverse.

Some of the best shore dives are found on house reefs—vibrant sites located just off resort beaches. These allow guests to dive at their convenience, without relying on boat schedules, making them ideal for flexibility and frequent underwater exploration.

# CAVE DIVING



Cave diving is an advanced form of scuba that involves exploring underwater spaces with overhead barriers and no direct access to the surface or natural light. It requires specialized training, strict safety protocols, and a disciplined mindset.

Due to its risks, cave diving is only suitable for certified professionals who understand their limits and the capabilities of their equipment. Indonesia's volcanic and geological diversity offers a diverse range of cave types, including sinkholes, springs, gypsum caves, and sea caves. While not all are diveable, a few select sites provide truly exceptional cave diving experiences.

## TECHNICAL DIVING



Technical diving extends beyond recreational limits—typically deeper than 40 meters—and involves decompression stops and access to more challenging environments, such as caves and wrecks. It requires specialized equipment such as rebreathers, sidemount systems, multiple tanks, and advanced thermal protection for longer, colder dives. Tech divers must undergo rigorous training, with a solid understanding of gas mixtures, decompression procedures, and risk management. This level of diving is only for those with the proper certifications and experience.

Indonesia is a rising tech diving haven, offering deep-sea biodiversity and challenging sites. A region's success as a technical diving destination depends on two key factors: suitable dive conditions (depth, topography, accessibility) and proper support infrastructure (gear, gases, boats, trained crew, and instructors). Where both exist, tech diving thrives—where they don't, potential remains untapped.

# Indonesia's Living Reefs Located in the Heart of the Coral Triangle

## Indonesia's Coral Reefs

Indonesia offers a stunning variety of coral reefs, including fringing reefs, barrier reefs, and atolls. Dive sites range from shallow lagoons with calm waters to deep-sea pinnacles with strong currents. Indonesian reefs are home to over 500 coral species, 10,000 invertebrates and sea plants, and more than 3,000 fish species. They host 6 of the world's seven turtle species and are vital migration routes for over 30 marine mammal species, including a third of all whale and dolphin species. In short, Indonesia's reefs support the planet's most diverse and abundant marine life.

## Fringing Reefs

Fringing reefs in Indonesia are shallow coral reefs that grow along the edges of islands or landmasses. These reefs typically feature a flat area at depths of 1 - 10 meters, dropping into sloping or vertical walls. While they host mainly robust branching corals, wave action often causes coral damage and rubble, which is a natural occurrence. Fringing reefs are rich in marine life, attracting pelagic species such as sharks, rays, and molas due to the nutrient-rich currents that flow through them. They are widely distributed across Indonesia and can be accessed by boat or shore.

## Barrier Reefs

A barrier reef is a fringing reef where the back reef forms a large lagoon. The Great Barrier Reef in Australia is the most famous example, stretching 2,000 kilometers and featuring lagoons that are up to 100 kilometers wide. Barrier reefs often surround islands in a ripple-like formation, with the lagoon harboring smaller patch reefs. Charles Darwin theorized that barrier reefs start as fringing reefs that grow outward, leaving a lagoon, and if the island subsides, an atoll forms.



## Atolls

Atolls are stunning, circular coral formations with central lagoons that rise from deep waters. Indonesia's largest atoll, Taka Bonerate in Southern Sulawesi, is the third largest in the world, spanning 72 by 36 kilometers and containing over 20 islands. Atoll lagoons are nutrient-rich due to deep ocean water filtering through the coral walls, making them highly concentrated and unaffected by land-based pollutants. This allows atoll lagoons to support a diverse array of marine life. While Darwin's theory suggests that atolls form from fringing reefs growing outward, recent geological evidence supports an alternative theory involving the erosion of limestone islands and rising sea levels, leaving only a coral rim behind.

## Coral Reef Marine Life Conservation and Marine Protected Areas



Coral reefs worldwide, including those in Indonesia, are under increasing pressure from various threats. Overfishing, destructive fishing practices such as cyanide and dynamite fishing, and irresponsible tourism are significant concerns. Anchors also contribute to reef damage. While Indonesia boasts many pristine reefs, these global issues affect parts of the archipelago. To support conservation, divers should choose operators with strong sustainability policies.

The Indonesian government has made significant strides in coral reef conservation, establishing numerous national parks and marine protected areas (MPAs) across the country. Most MPAs are no-take zones, prohibiting fishing, turtle egg harvesting, anchoring, and shell collecting. Some MPAs have designated zones for different activities. While these efforts are positive, enforcement remains a challenge. Visitors can help by diving, snorkeling, or freediving in MPAs, where fees from entry tags support conservation projects. Always inquire about purchasing a marine park tag when diving in these areas.

Indonesia has established 411 Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) across the archipelago as of 2023, covering around 9% of its territorial waters (over 28 million hectares). Notable MPAs include:

- Komodo National Park (Eastern Nusa Tenggara)
- Bunaken National Park (Northern Sulawesi)
- Raja Ampat MPAs, including Fam Islands, Kofiau, Boo Islands, Misool, Southeast Misool, and Dampier Strait (Papua)
- Nusa Penida MPA (Bali)
- Taka Bonerate National Park (Southern Sulawesi)
- Karimunjawa MPA (Java)
- Togean Island National Park (Central Sulawesi)
- Kepulauan Seribu National Park (Java)
- Wakatobi National Park (Southern Sulawesi)

Alongside these parks, numerous independent conservation projects, such as turtle hatcheries, manta ray identification databases, artificial reefs, and coral monitoring, are underway throughout Indonesia. Many of these initiatives welcome support and offer educational opportunities. Check with dive operators for conservation projects in your visit area.

# SUMATRA

## The Natural Beauty and Exceptional Wildlife

Sumatra, Indonesia's westernmost and largest island, spans over 473,000 square kilometers and ranks as the sixth-largest island in the world. Known for its dramatic landscapes, the island features active volcanoes, crater lakes, dense jungles, and some of the world's most pristine beaches.

Its natural beauty is matched by rich biodiversity, home to critically endangered species such as orangutans, tigers, rhinos, and elephants. Sumatra is also a top destination for world-class surfing and eco-adventures.

Culturally, Sumatra is remarkably diverse. From the devout Muslim communities of Aceh to the Batak Christians around Lake Toba, their people are deeply rooted in tradition and united by a strong connection to the land. Agriculture, including coffee, tea, palm oil, and spices, remains a central component of local livelihoods.

Despite the devastation of the 2004 tsunami, particularly in Aceh and Pulau Weh, the region has made a remarkable recovery, standing today as a testament to the resilience and spirit of its people.

For marine megafauna, Pulau Weh in Banda Aceh is a top choice, home to manta rays, whale sharks, turtles, napoleon wrasse, barracuda, and reef sharks. Macro enthusiasts will find a haven in Belitung, renowned for its diverse array of nudibranchs and cryptic species. Belitung offers optimal conditions for underwater photographers, featuring gentle currents, exceptional visibility—particularly from May to September—and vibrant reefs.

For those in search of a hidden gem, the Anambas Islands in the Riau Archipelago offer pristine reefs, crystal-clear waters, and thriving marine life. Divers can explore untouched coral gardens, encounter large pelagic species, and discover an abundance of macro life in this secluded paradise.



## Diving Conditions

Sumatra offers thrilling dive experiences across Weh Island, Belitung, and Anambas Islands. Weh Island is known for its adrenaline-pumping drift dives and strong currents, especially around the full moon, providing great sightings of schooling fish and pelagics. Belitung boasts diverse dive sites, including pinnacles, granite formations, and vibrant coral gardens, with drift dives for experienced divers. Anambas, with its pristine reefs and rich marine life, offers crystal-clear waters, stunning coral gardens, and exciting drift dives, making it a top destination for adventurous divers.



## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in SUMATRA

Sumatra is a marine biodiversity hotspot, home to a wide range of species including reef fish, molluscs, crustaceans, and cephalopods. At Weh Island, divers can encounter large pelagic species, including reef sharks, barracuda, Napoleon wrasse, manta rays, and whale sharks, alongside excellent macro life. The island's varying currents offer thrilling dives but require caution at depth, where schooling fish and big species are often spotted. Freedivers will also appreciate the rich marine life and excellent visibility.

Belitung is renowned for its vibrant coral ecosystems, tranquil waters, and diverse marine life, including nudibranchs, reef fish, sea turtles, and rare macroalgae species. Its gentle conditions make it ideal for underwater photography, while deeper drop-offs are well-suited for freediving, especially with the support of a boat.

The Anambas Islands offer crystal-clear waters, pristine reefs, and diverse dive sites, ranging from colourful coral gardens to drift dives. Divers can expect encounters with pelagic species such as reef sharks, as well as a thriving macro scene, making it a true hidden gem for underwater exploration.

# WEH ISLAND

Weh Island has long been a favourite among divers and backpackers, cherished for its remote location and unspoiled charm. Getting there is part of the adventure, with the reward of tranquil beaches, lush jungle, and crystal-clear waters—or simply the chance to unwind in a hammock.

Below the surface, vibrant sea fans, deep canyons, and dramatic rock pinnacles await. Divers and snorkelers can encounter majestic manta rays, whale sharks, and a wealth of marine life. As the northernmost point of Sumatra, Weh Island offers a memorable and fitting finale to any island journey.

Fast boat (45 minutes) or ferry (1.5 hours) to Weh Island (Balohan Jetty)



## Diving Conditions

Weh Island offers some of Indonesia’s finest off-the-grid diving, perfect for those seeking uncrowded sites and rich marine life. The island caters to all experience levels, from beginners to advanced divers. Highlights include drift dives, deep wrecks, and even an underwater volcano. Strong currents bring vibrant marine activity, including both pelagics and macro species, making for challenging yet rewarding dives.

## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Weh Island

Weh Island boasts remote dive sites rich in marine biodiversity, featuring sharks, manta rays, and whale sharks, as well as schooling pelagics, diverse critters, and vibrant coral reefs nourished by nutrient-rich currents. Its variety of dive environments—including sloping reefs, drop-offs, sandy bottoms, drift dives, and wrecks—caters to divers of all experience levels.

Notable sites include *The Canyon*, with its cave, swim-through arch, and abundant fish life; *Pantee Peunateung*, known for dramatic topography, colourful sea fans, and macro species; and the *Sophie Rickmers* wreck, a 1920s cargo ship now thriving with coral and marine life. *Arus Balee* impresses with its vibrant colors and diverse fish, while *Batee Tokong* remains a favorite for its rich marine variety. Freedivers will also find excellent opportunities to encounter large species and explore these dynamic underwater landscapes.

## Areas to visit in Sumatra

# BELITUNG

Belitung, part of the Bangka-Belitung province in Sumatra, spans 4,800 km<sup>2</sup> (1,853 square miles). The island is characterized by its sandy beaches, coral reefs, marshes, and low-lying terrain, with most areas situated below 40 meters above sea level. The Cerutuk River, navigable for 11 km, serves as the main waterway. Tanjungpandan, the island's main town, port, and airport hub, connects visitors to the rest of Indonesia.

Once known for tin mining, Belitung has transformed into a tranquil island escape. Its pristine beaches, coconut-lined shores, and the crystal-clear waters of the South China Sea offer a serene tropical experience.

Dutch colonial influences are still evident, and the island's friendly and inquisitive locals further enhance the island's peaceful atmosphere. Minimal commercial fishing allows for sustainable, fresh seafood to feature prominently in local cuisine.

Beyond diving, visitors can explore wildlife-rich forests, hike in search of tarsier monkeys, or relax at Tanjung Kelayang—Belitung's most iconic beach, renowned for its breathtaking views and laid-back atmosphere.

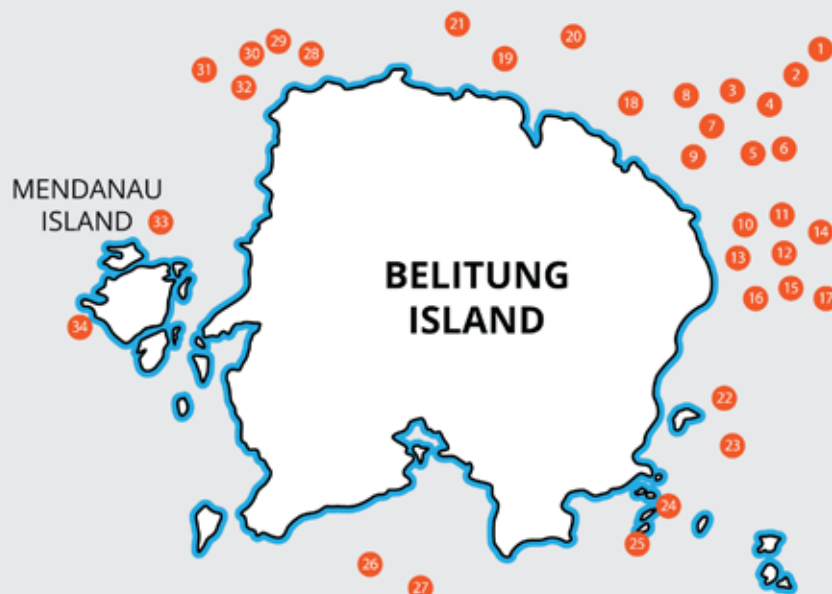

Healthy coral ecosystems support an abundance of reef fish, crustaceans, and vibrant macro species, making the region especially appealing to underwater photographers.

In Belitung, Cepor Cepor features a colorful coral garden framed by granite boulders, attracting a variety of reef fish, sea urchins, and anemonefish. The Lighthouse Wreck, now richly encrusted with coral, is home to moray eels, nudibranchs, and occasional reef sharks, offering excellent opportunities for exploration.

Freedivers will appreciate the region's dramatic drop-offs and steep slopes, though caution is advised due to currents, and boat support is recommended for safety.

# RIAU ISLANDS

The Riau Islands—comprising Bintan, Batam, Karimun, the Lingga Archipelago, and the Anambas Islands—offer exceptional diving in clear, warm waters with visibility reaching up to 30 meters (100 feet). Vibrant coral reefs filled with sea turtles, rays, and colorful reef fish provide captivating sites for divers of all experience levels.

Popular spots like Penyengat Island (Bintan) and Abang Island (Batam) feature a diverse mix of hard and soft corals, sponges, and macro life, including nudibranchs and octopuses. For more advanced divers, the underwater pinnacles and dramatic drop-offs around Pulau Bawah and Sintang Island attract predatory fish and seasonal pelagics, including manta rays and whale sharks.

Wreck diving is also a highlight, with sunken ships transformed into thriving marine habitats. Whether exploring shallow coral gardens or drifting along deep reef walls, the Riau Islands promise a rich and varied underwater experience.

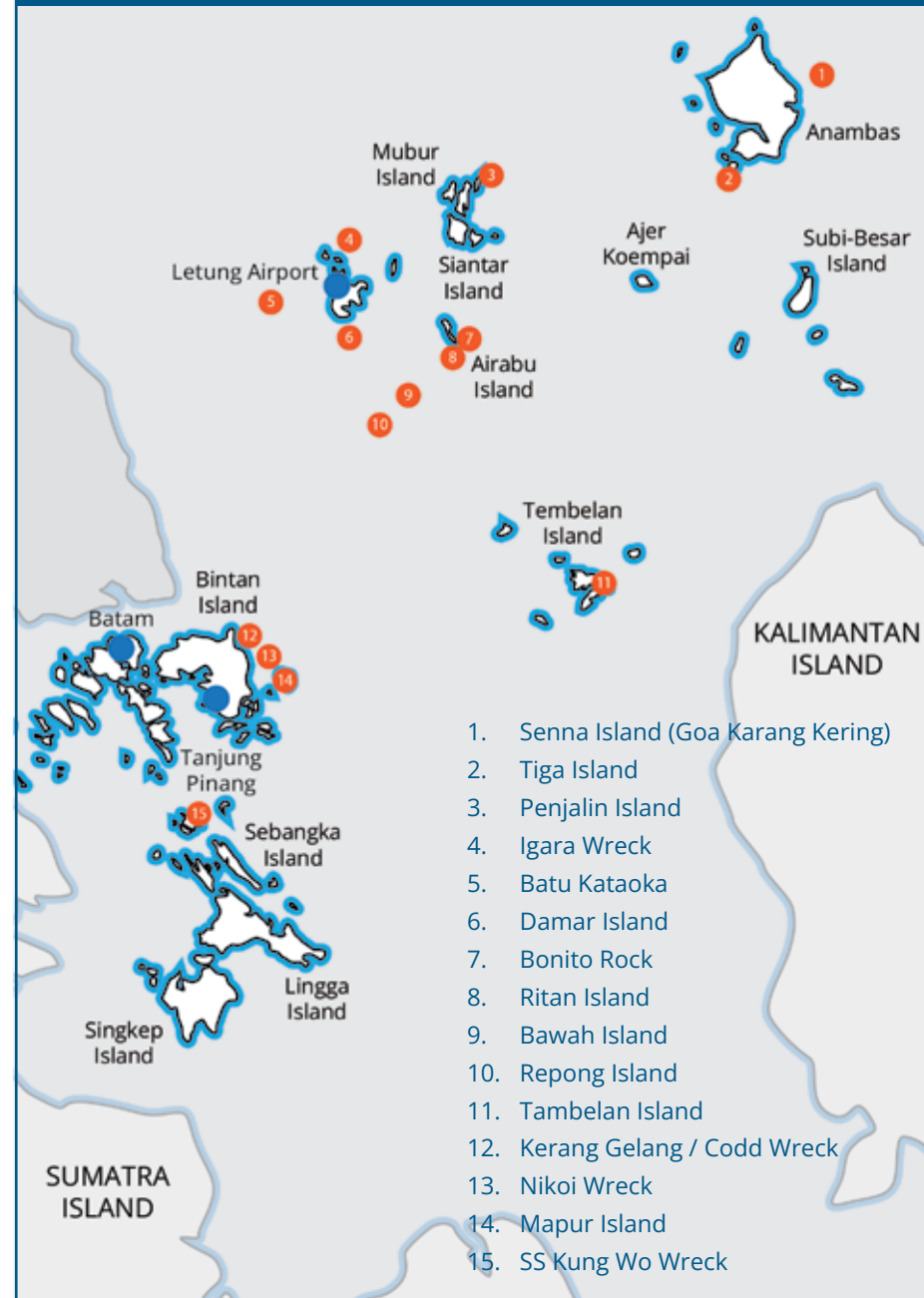

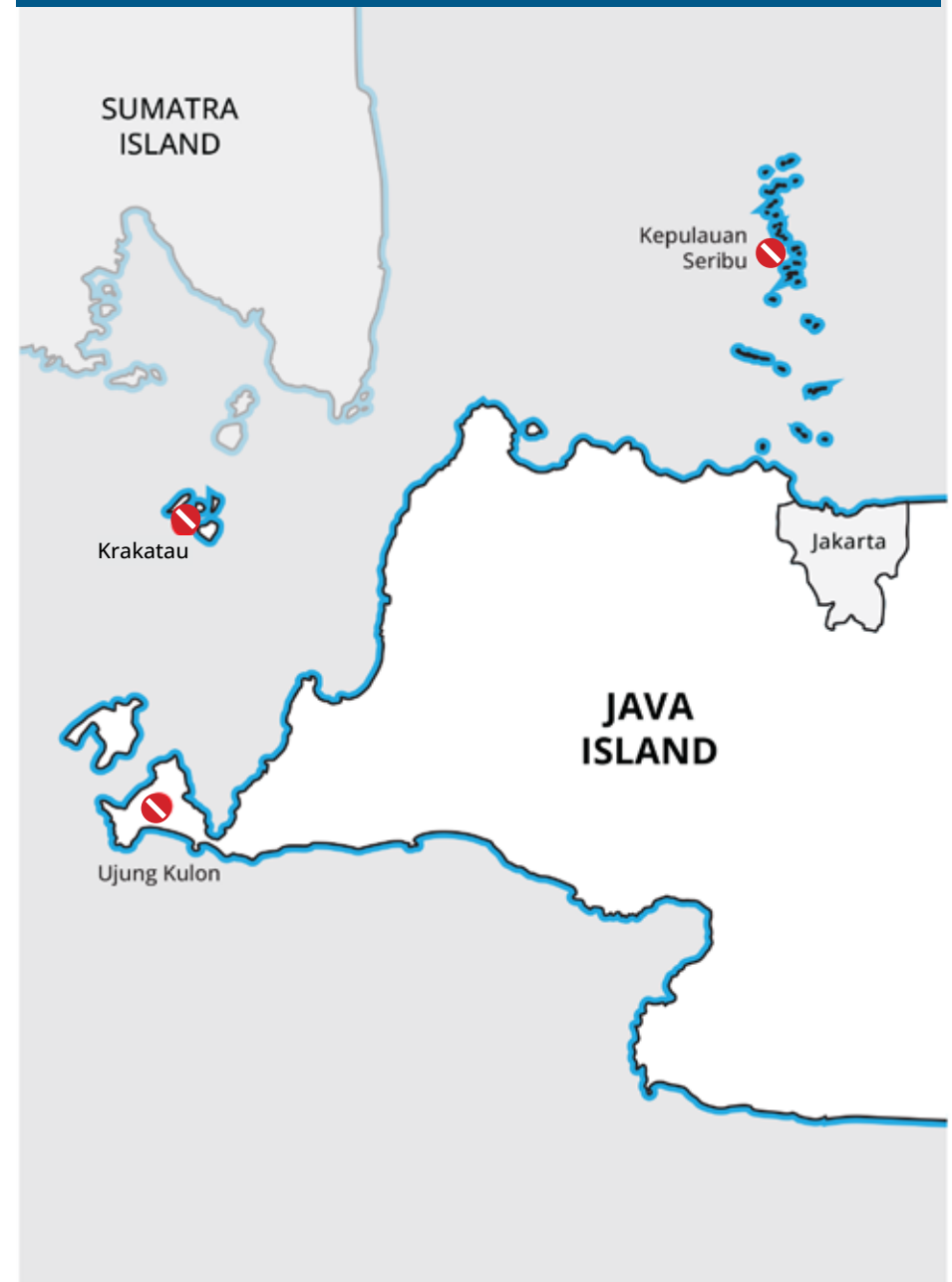
## The Land of Fertile Soils

Java, Indonesia's fifth-largest island, is the world's most populous, with over 145 million residents. Located between Sumatra and Bali, it features a volcanic landscape of rainforests, fertile highlands, active volcanoes, and coastal cliffs. Diving in Java may lack the world-class visibility of other Indonesian sites—typically 5–10 meters, with less visibility during the rainy season—but it still offers unique experiences. Kepulauan Seribu near Jakarta provide tranquil dive spots, while Anak Krakatau offers a rare volcanic dive. Ujung Kulon National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, features rich marine biodiversity and is home to the endangered Javan rhinoceros.



## Diving Conditions

Dive sites near Jakarta have limited visibility, which improves farther from shore but is often reduced by rain. Currents are generally mild, but they strengthen around the full moon. Kepulauan Seribu offer gentle drift dives suited for beginners, while Krakatau presents more challenging conditions for experienced divers.

Dive sites near Jakarta host a diverse array of marine life, including sweetlips, batfish, moray eels, stingrays, angelfish, and parrotfish. Larger species—such as reef sharks, hawksbill turtles, tuna, and barracuda—are seen occasionally. Anak Krakatau stands out for its volcanic topography, featuring lava boulders, swim-throughs, and caverns that offer a unique geological dive experience. Wreck dives are available at both Kepulauan Seribu and Krakatau. Ujung Kulon National Park boasts a rich biodiversity, featuring diverse ecosystems such as coral reefs and mangroves. The main draw of these sites is their easy access from Jakarta, ideal for weekend divers.

# KEPULAUAN SERIBU

Kepulauan Seribu is a chain of around 342 islands located 45 km north of Jakarta, stretching into the Java Sea. Easily reached from Marina Ancol, it's a popular weekend dive spot. Sites range from shallow reefs to deeper areas around 18 meters, where coral and marine life thrive. Visibility and biodiversity improve further as you move away from shore. With calm conditions and varied underwater terrain, it's ideal for divers of all levels.

Kepulauan Seribu offers calm conditions and sandy bottoms, making it an ideal location for training, suitable for all skill levels. Depths rarely exceed 30 meters. Currents intensify around the full moon, allowing for enjoyable drift dives along longshore reefs. The best diving season is July to September, outside the wet season.

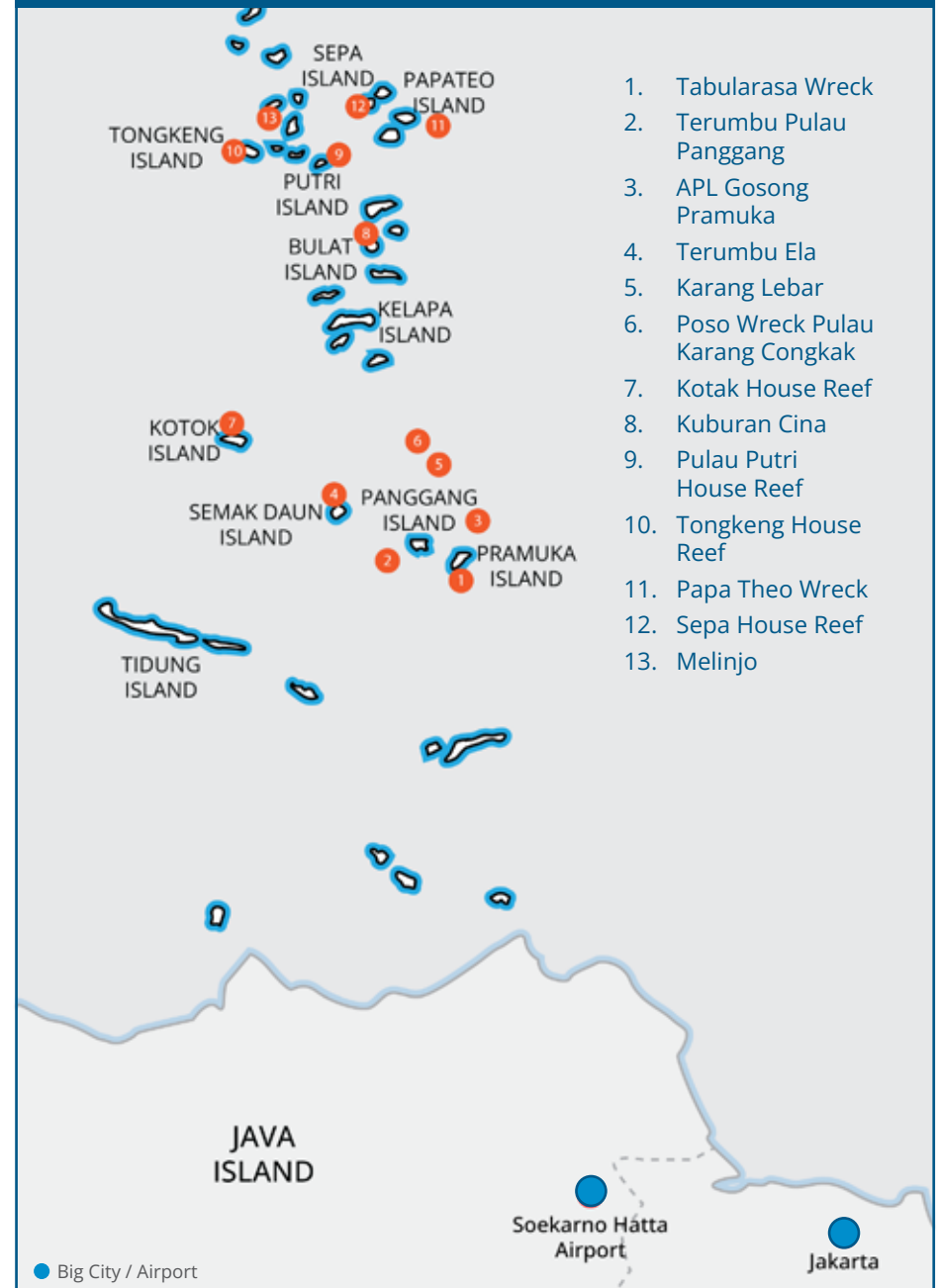
## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Kepulauan Seribu

Kepulauan Seribu offers diverse, though moderate, marine life compared to other Indonesian regions. Common sightings include parrotfish, butterflyfish, angelfish, anemonefish, moray eels, stingrays, and crustaceans, as well as occasional reef sharks and turtles.

Wreck dives include the Papa Theo a 32 meter deep cargo ship home to groupers, boxfish, and morays and the Poso near Pulau Karang Congkak, where divers can spot fusiliers, barracuda, shrimp, and nudibranchs. Kotak House Reef is a training site featuring an artificial reef that is home to butterflyfish, gobies, and blue-spotted stingrays. The KM Tabularasa wreck off Pramuka Island hosts schooling fusiliers and a mix of hard and soft corals. At Pulau Bulat, a sloping reef supports healthy coral and attracts turtles, snappers, morays, and butterflyfish.

# KRAKATAU/ UJUNG KULON

Krakatoa (also known as Krakatau) is a volcanic caldera located in the Sunda Strait, part of an archipelago that includes Lang, Verlaten, and Rakata—the latter being a remnant of the island destroyed in the catastrophic 1883 eruption. Anak Krakatau (“Child of Krakatau”) emerged in 1927 and remains active, including the 2018 eruption that triggered a deadly tsunami.

Diving here draws those fascinated by lava rock formations, caverns, and swim-throughs. While fish life is abundant, the coral is less vibrant than in other Indonesian dive spots.

Transfer by car to Carita (3 - 4 hours)



From Carita take a speedboat to Krakatau. To Ujung Kulon National Park take a speedboat from Sumur Village.

Diving in Ujung Kulon varies by site, with some areas better suited for experienced divers due to strong currents and remote access. Conditions are generally easier than those at Anak Krakatau. Popular sites feature black lava boulders and volcanic formations.

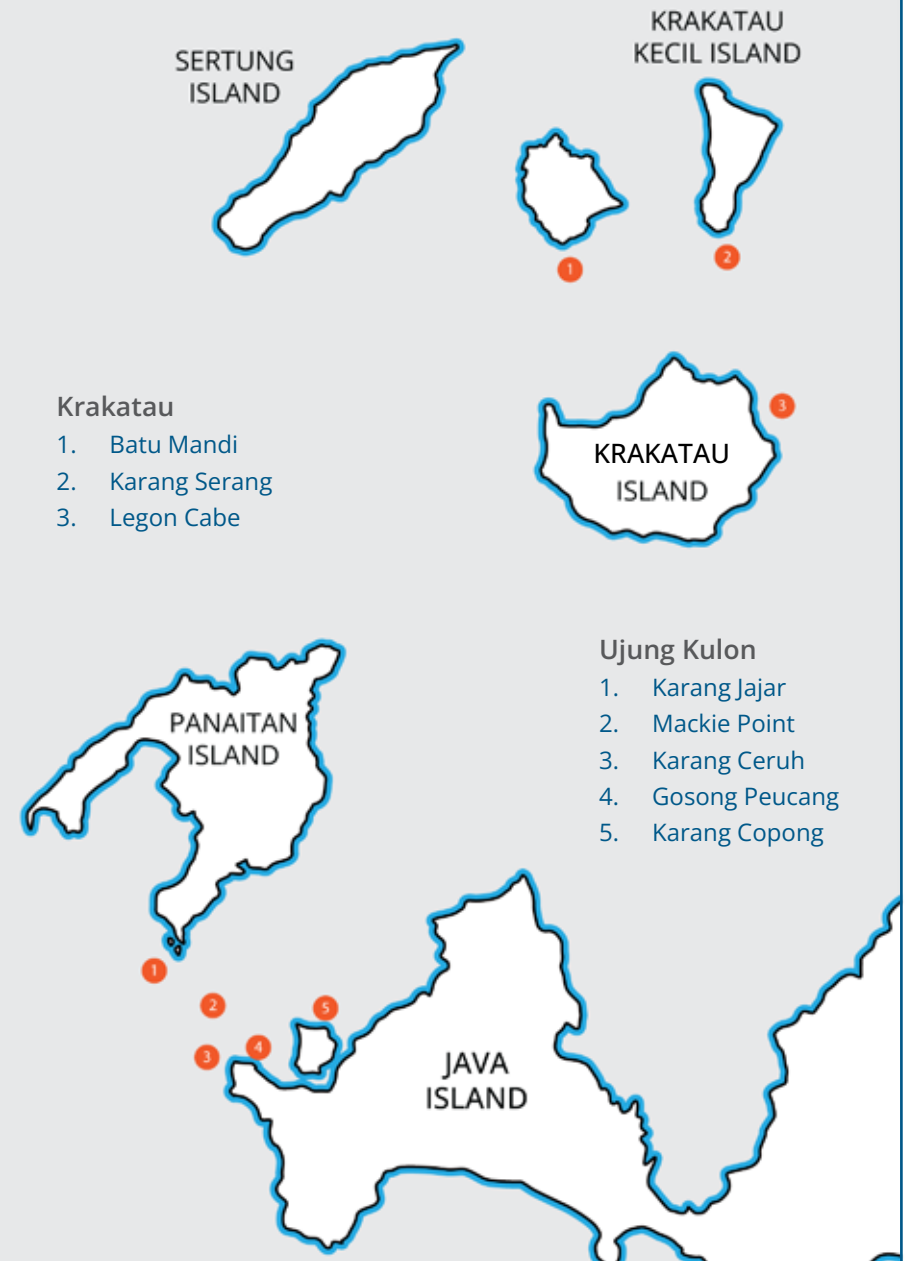


## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Krakatau/Ujung Kulon

Karang Serang is characterized by strong currents and thermoclines that attract tuna, barracuda, and large angelfish. At Moray Point divers can spot moray eels tucked into wall crevices, while Sangiang offers a rock canyon surge dive. The Sunda Strait hosts several wrecks, including the USS Houston and HMAS Perth. At Tanjung Layar Lighthouse, visibility can reach 20 meters, with large barracuda among the boulders. Karang Copong offers a tunnel dive that leads to massive caves, and Karang Jajar, located off Panaitan Island, is popular for drift diving, with frequent sightings of turtles and rays.

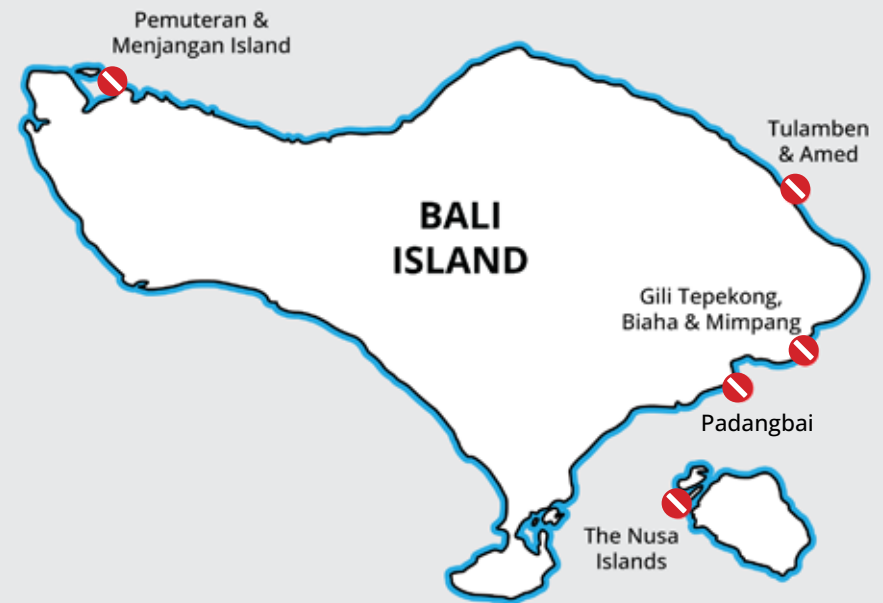
## The Land of Gods

Bali, a compact island of 6,000 km<sup>2</sup>, is rich in culture and natural beauty, stretching 153 km east-west and 112 km north-south. Home to over 4.3 million people (as of 2024), primarily Hindu, its culture blends Indian, Chinese, Hindu, and Buddhist influences, tracing back to the Majapahit Empire.

Balinese Hinduism, rooted in Indian traditions, emphasizes balance between good and evil, shaping daily rituals and ceremonies. The island is also renowned for its traditional arts, including painting, sculpture, wood carving, and mask-making.

Bali has a tropical climate, characterized by warm temperatures year-round, with an average temperature of 27°C. The wet season typically occurs from November to March.

These areas are ideal for divers of all levels, including beginners.

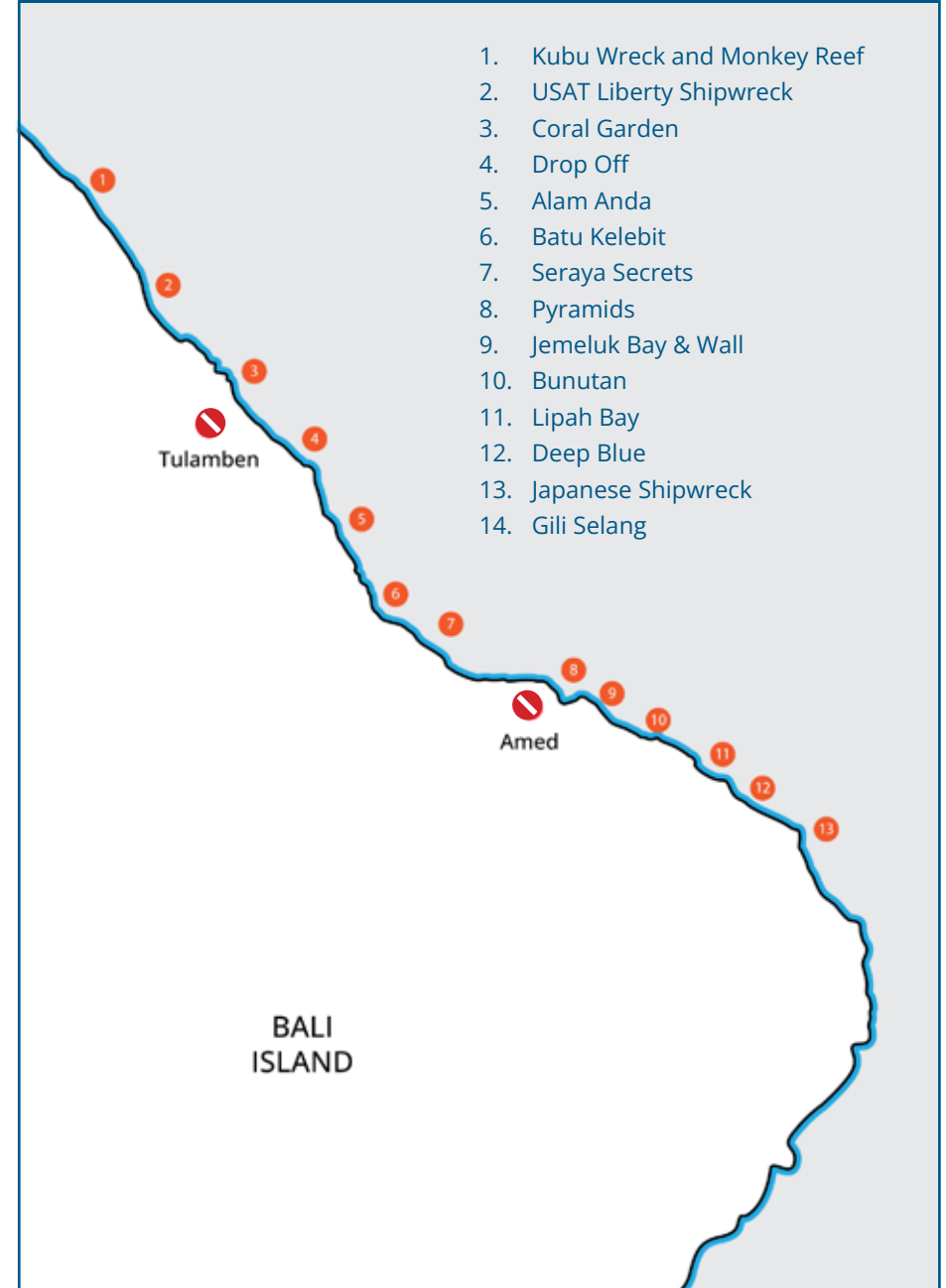
## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Tulamben And Amed

The USAT Liberty Shipwreck, resting between 5 - 30 meters deep, is a must-dive site in Tulamben, famous for its haunting silhouette and vibrant marine life. Divers can spot nudibranchs, scorpionfish, pygmy seahorses, barracuda, and turtles. Night dives reveal bumphead parrotfish and rare crustaceans.

Other notable sites include the Drop-Off wall, the Coral Garden featuring anemones and Balinese statues, and macro-havens such as Seraya and Emerald. In Amed, wrecks such as aircraft, ferries, and tugboats are teeming with reef fish. Jemeluk Bay is ideal for beginners, offering calm waters, rich marine life, and rewarding night dives. Blackwater dives and freediving on Liberty's superstructure are also available.

# PADANGBAI

Padangbai, a small port town and ferry gateway to Lombok and the Gili Islands, is popular among backpackers for its white-sand beach and relaxed atmosphere. As a dive hub, it features sloping coral reefs, muck diving, the well-known Blue Lagoon, and a boat wreck, offering rich marine life and top-notch critter dives that make it a must-visit for divers.

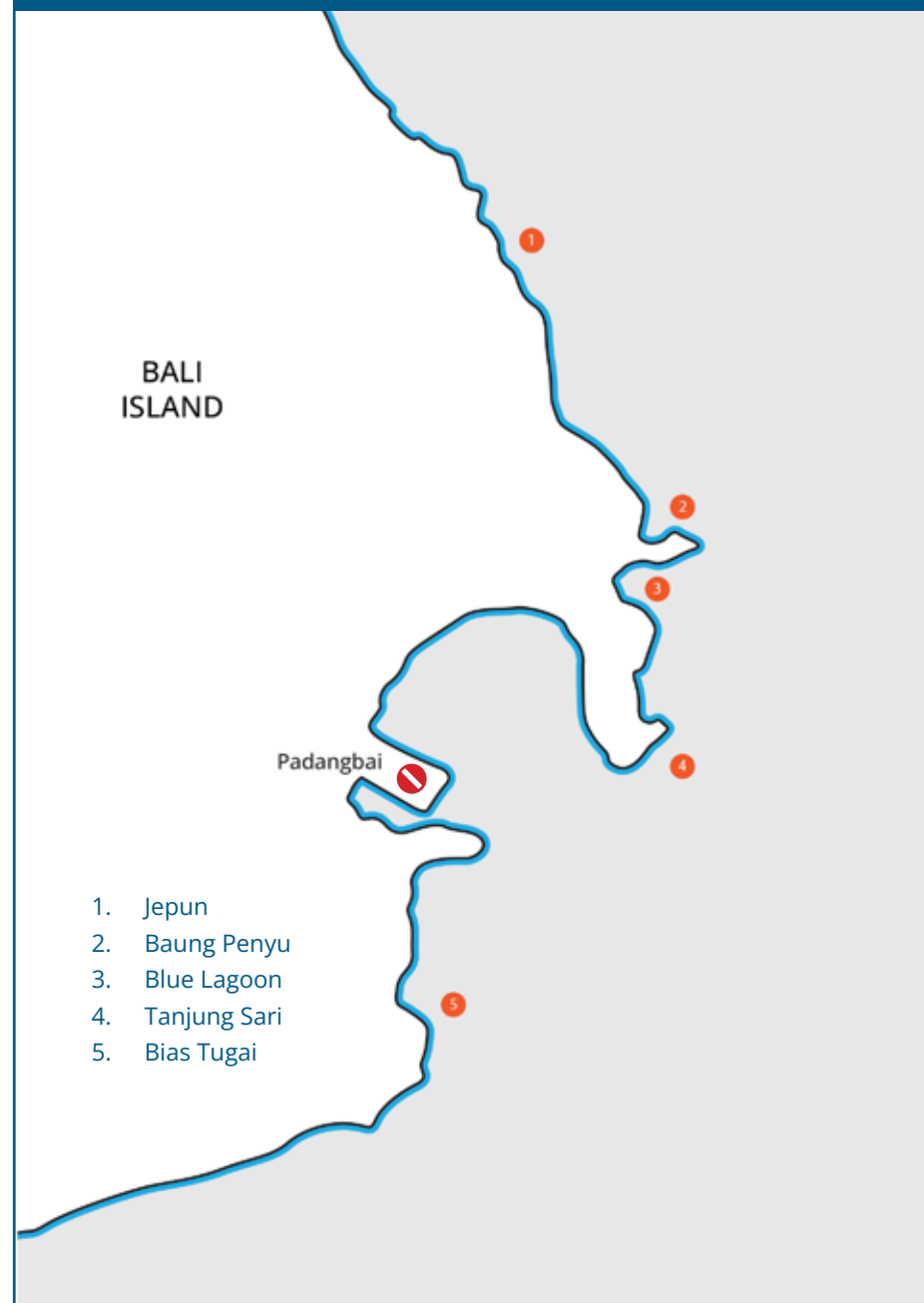
The Blue Lagoon is a must-dive site, featuring a vibrant coral garden and steep slope where turtles and occasional white-tip reef sharks can be spotted. Nearby, Jepun is a favorite for macro photographers, with critters and a wreck attracting yellow snappers, Moorish idols, and more.

The Jetty is known for its rare finds, including frogfish, ghost pipefish, and stingrays. However, not all dive operators visit there, so it's best to confirm in advance. Other marine life includes moray eels, octopus, pygmy seahorses, and a variety of crustaceans.

For freedivers, the lagoon's edges offer depth, but caution is needed due to strong currents and surface boat traffic.

# The Nusa Islands (Lembongan, Penida & Ceningan)

The Nusa Islands—Nusa Penida, Nusa Lembongan, and Nusa Ceningan—are located 12 km east of Bali and offer a relaxed atmosphere with growing tourism. Lembongan and Ceningan are linked by the Yellow Bridge, rebuilt after its 2016 collapse. While Penida is newer to tourism, it now features dive centers, restaurants, bars, and wellness spots. Speedboats from Sanur take approximately 45 minutes and operate only during daylight hours, typically including hotel or airport transfers.

### Diving Conditions

The Nusa Islands are known for strong currents, especially during full moons, due to the Indonesian Throughflow. Drift dives are common along the north coasts of Nusa Penida and Lembongan, with currents ranging from mild to intense. The south coast of Penida (Manta Point I & II) is prone to surges and may be inaccessible during large swells. The channel between Ceningan and Penida has unpredictable cross currents and updrafts.

## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Nusa Islands

Whether you stay on Nusa Lembongan, Ceningan, or Penida, you will dive the same sites, as the islands are close together. For big fish encounters, the Nusa Islands deliver. Nusa Penida features two manta ray sites: Manta Point (cleaning station) and Manta Bay (feeding ground). Crystal Bay is famous for seasonal mola sightings, vibrant reefs, and a bat cave. The north coasts of Penida and Lembongan offer drift dives with rich coral and seasonal pelagics, such as barracuda and jacks.

Stronger current sites, such as Toyapakeh Bay and Ceningan Wall, attract large fish schools. Blue Corner, suited for advanced divers, offers sightings of rays, barracuda, and tuna. On the East Coast, Sampalan is known for its fire corals and diverse marine life. Lembongan Bay, especially farther out, provides excellent conditions for freediving and training.

# GILI TEPEKONG, BIAHA & MIMPANG

The rocky islets off Bali's east coast are known for rugged terrain, rich macro life, and impressive pelagic sightings. Divers can encounter white-tip reef sharks, mola-mola (Aug–Nov), and occasional manta rays. The main draw is the big fish, strong currents, and spectacular reefs capes.

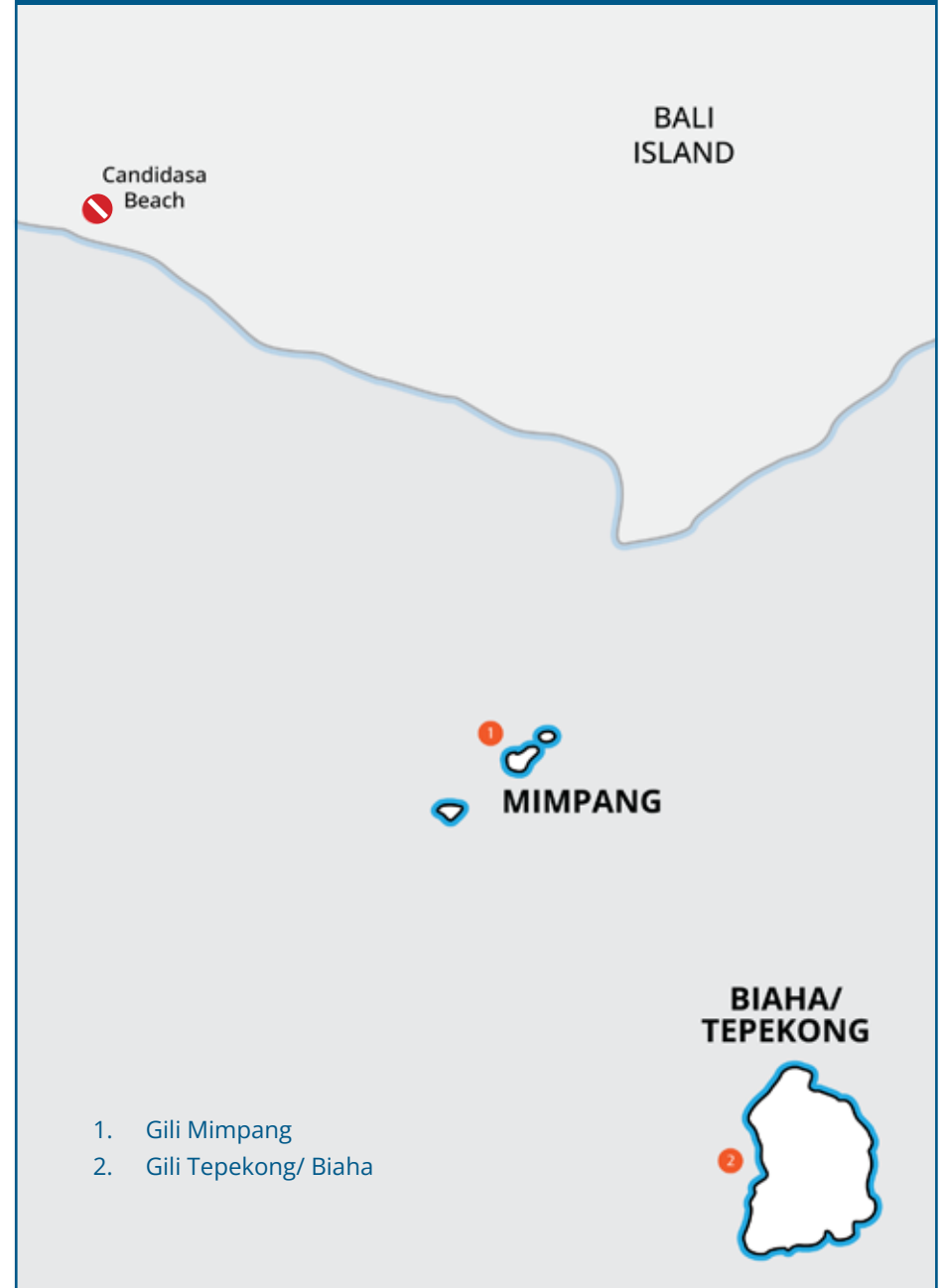
Gili Tepekong features walls, slopes, and drop-offs with strong currents. It's home to leaf scorpionfish, nudibranchs, frogfish, and schools of silver fish, with frequent sightings of barracuda, reef sharks, and mola-mola in season.

At Biaha, the famous Shark Cave (12 meters) hosts white-tip reef sharks and spiny lobsters, along with moray eels, turtles, and cuttlefish.

Gili Mimpang has three rock pinnacles and varied terrain. Shark Point is a highlight, known for its white-tip shark and mola sightings, although strong currents make it best suited for experienced divers.

# PEMUTERAN & MENJANGAN ISLAND

Pemuteran, a peaceful coastal town located near Bali Barat National Park, is renowned for its natural beauty, black-sand beaches, and crystal-clear waters. Less touristy than southern Bali, it still offers a range of accommodation and dining options. Nearby Menjangan Island, accessible by boat, requires permits and guides and is home to the rare Javan deer, as well as cultural sites like the Ganesh statue at the Segara Giri Dharma Kencana Temple. With diverse dive sites and a tranquil setting, the area is ideal for relaxation and nature-focused exploration.

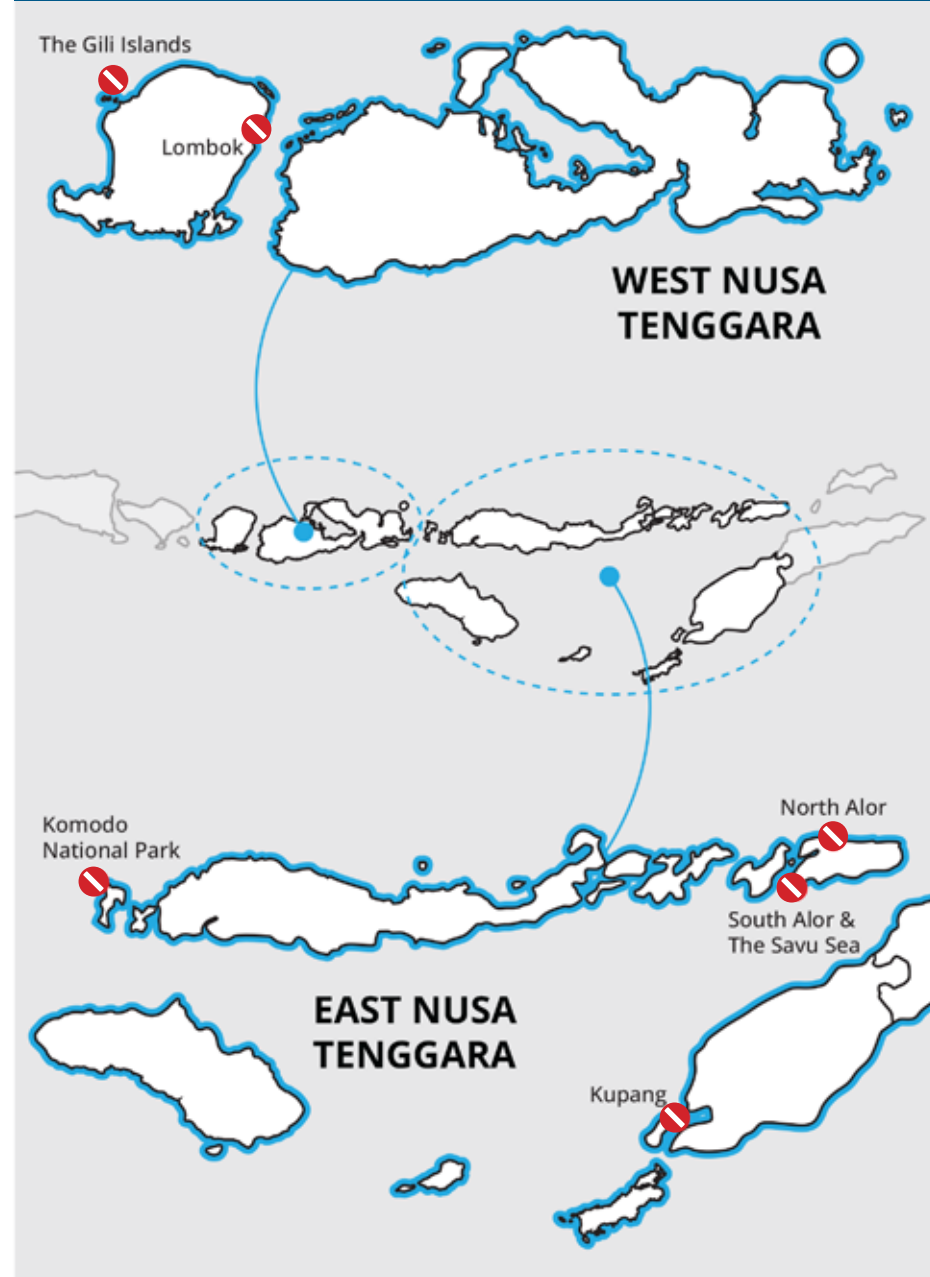

Nusa Tenggara, stretching from Lombok to Timor, boasts a diverse range of landscapes—from tropical forests to dry scrubland and varied underwater environments. Known for its endemic species, such as the Komodo Dragon, the region has a dry southern climate that supports farming and fishing, with minimal industry and mass tourism.

The northern islands grow rice, while the south relies on drought-resistant crops. The main cities are Mataram and Kupang, with travel between islands accessible by plane or boat.

# Western Nusa Tenggara Diving Overview



Western Nusa Tenggara offers a wide range of diving conditions—from calm, beginner-friendly waters in the Gili Islands to strong currents in South Lombok and Alor. With its diverse topography and rich marine life, the region suits divers of all levels. Conditions vary by location, so refer to area-specific guides for details.

In remote areas, dive gear may be limited; bring your own or notify the operators in advance. Most dives are non-decompression, with depth limits of 25–30 meters and typical durations of 60 minutes. Some liveaboards require Nitrox certification. Visibility and temperature can vary, so check with local operators and pack extra thermal layers if needed.



## Diving Conditions

Western Nusa Tenggara is famed for exhilarating drift dives in the strong currents of the Komodo and Sape Straits. Divers encounter vibrant coral walls, pinnacles, reef flats, and pelagic-rich cleaning stations. While many sites suit experienced divers, sheltered areas around the Gilis and northern Komodo offer ideal conditions for beginners and training.

The Gili Islands offer crystal-clear waters, vibrant corals, and abundant reef life—perfect for divers of all levels. For more advanced dives, Shark Point and Deep Turbo offer deeper and more challenging conditions.

Lombok boasts a diverse range of sites, from serene reefs and muck dives to pinnacles teeming with hammerhead sharks and mobula rays, catering to every diver's preference. Western Nusa Tenggara is also excellent for freediving, with the Gili Islands hosting schools for all levels. Gili Islands offers freedivers a chance to swim with manta rays, while Sekotong features colorful, beginner-friendly reefs.

Sekotong offers relaxed, biodiverse reefs, while remote Belongas Bay—known for its calm waters and friendly atmosphere—draws divers with encounters of big fish. Lombok's easy access by boat, domestic, and international flights makes it a prime destination for marine life without the crowds.

## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Lombok

Lombok is rich in pelagic marine life, with frequent sightings of hammerhead sharks, mobula rays, tuna, trevally, barracuda, reef sharks, and turtles, alongside a variety of other creatures, including nudibranchs, frogfish, and octopus. In Belongas Bay, The Magnet is a standout site, attracting large pelagics like hammerheads, reef sharks, and barracuda.

The Lighthouse is known for its vibrant marine life, including schools of sweetlips and white-tip reef sharks. Stairs to Medang offer a vibrant coral garden and seasonal sightings of manta rays, reef sharks, and hammerheads. At the same time, Cathedral features eagle rays, hunting trevally, and a rich array of macro life. Gili Sarang occasionally hosts mobula rays, and Small Gili Ringgit is a favorite for macro photography, with ghost pipefish, crustaceans, and blue-spotted stingrays.

For freedivers, these sites offer excellent conditions, combining clear water and vibrant reef life with the opportunity to encounter pelagics at various depths. The region suits both beginners and advanced freedivers, with many calm and accessible locations perfect for minimal-equipment exploration.

# THE GILI ISLANDS (Trawangan, Air & Meno)

The Gili Islands—Gili Trawangan, Gili Meno, and Gili Air—are known for their white sand beaches and turquoise waters. Gili Trawangan is the most vibrant, Gili Meno the quietest, and Gili Air offers a laid-back vibe with the largest local population. Once pristine mangrove habitats, the islands began developing in the 1970s, with tourism expanding in the 1980s.

Today, Gili Trawangan attracts beachgoers and nightlife seekers, Gili Meno offers seclusion, and Gili Air is popular with honeymooners. The islands have a dry microclimate, with most rain falling between November and April. Car-free and tranquil, transport is by bicycle or pony cart. Access is easiest by boat from Bali, though connections from Lombok are also available.

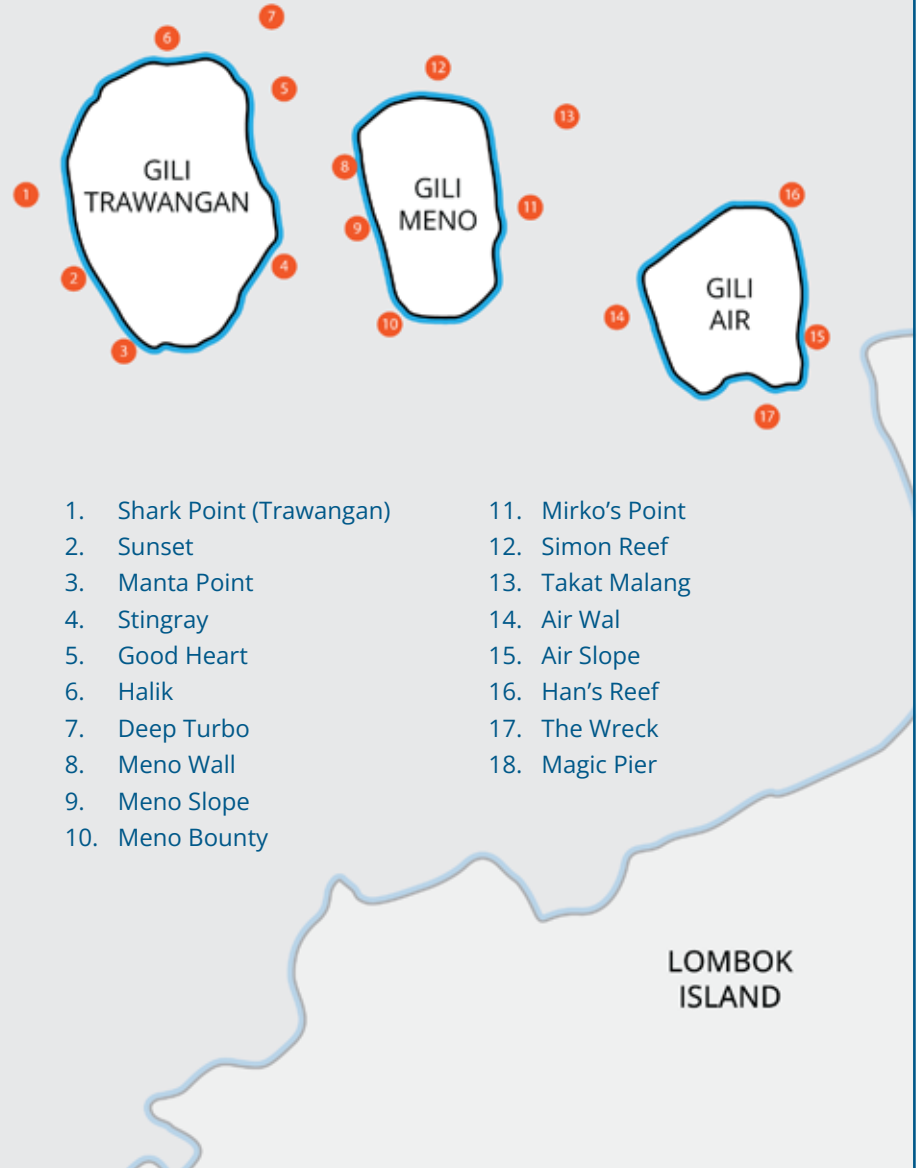

Notable dive sites include Shark Point, known for large marine life; Turtle Heaven off Gili Meno; and Deep Turbo, with rich coral gardens and occasional blacktip reef sharks. Sites like Simon's Reef and Sunset also showcase vibrant coral and a diverse array of species.

Snorkelers and freedivers will appreciate the abundant turtles and clear, shallow waters, perfect for drift snorkeling. The islands are also a hub for freediving, with schools offering courses and guided trips for all skill levels.

# Eastern Nusa Tenggara Diving Overview

Eastern Nusa Tenggara offers a more remote travel experience, with dive resorts typically requiring advance booking. Liveaboards, ranging from budget to luxury, operate across Nusa Tenggara—some covering Raja Ampat and Maluku, while others focus on Komodo, with trips lasting 3 - 14 days.

Komodo National Park is a premier dive destination, home to manta rays, sharks, and vibrant reefs. While some sites have strong currents, there are also calmer spots suitable for all levels. The best time to dive is during the dry season (March to December), with October and November often providing the best conditions.



## Diving Conditions

Eastern Nusa Tenggara offers dramatic topography and powerful, shifting currents. Alor is a highlight, known for pristine reefs, large fish, and rare critters like rhinopias. Most sites are suitable for intermediate to advanced divers, although sheltered spots are also available for beginners.

The Alor Archipelago boasts remote dive sites teeming with marine life, ranging from coral seamounts and muck dives to walls and drop-offs. For snorkelers and freedivers, North and South Alor offer pristine beaches and quiet snorkeling spots far from typical tourist crowds.

# KOMODO NATIONAL PARK

Komodo, famed for its rugged beauty and adventure, is one of Indonesia’s top diving destinations, offering encounters with manta rays, sharks, vibrant reefs, and rich marine life. Komodo National Park—encompassing Komodo Island, Rinca Island, and Padar Island—is home to the iconic Komodo dragon and other unique terrestrial species. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, the park blends natural wonders above and below water.

Though remote, Komodo is accessible by liveaboard or via land-based stays in Labuan Bajo, which offers scenic sunsets and growing tourist facilities. The local fishing culture, rooted in the Bajo ethnic group, adds to its charm. Visitors are advised to dress modestly in non-tourist or religious areas.

Komodo diving is renowned for its strong currents and seasonal cold water, but offers sites for all skill levels. Advanced sites include seamounts, ocean pinnacles, and narrow channels that often require negative entries and rapid descents due to vertical currents. Gentler options feature sloping reefs in sheltered bays and coves.

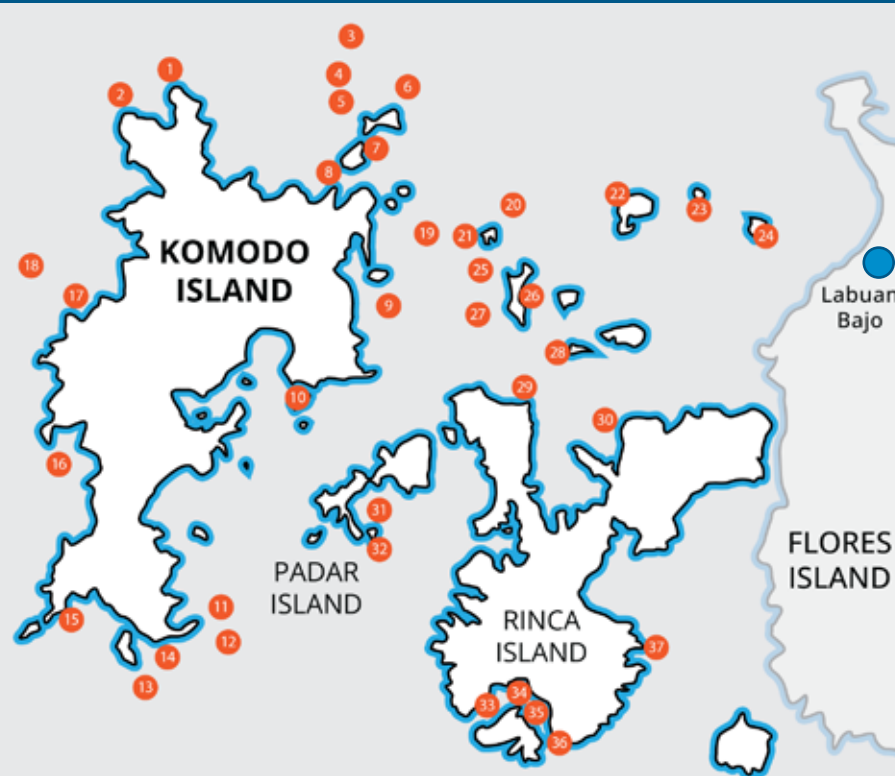
## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Komodo National Park

Komodo boasts a large variety of marine life, including manta rays, sharks, and tuna, alongside a rich assortment of smaller fish. Notable dive sites include Tatawa Kecil, renowned for its diverse fish life, Cannibal Rock, known for its vibrant macro subjects, and The Cauldron, which offers encounters with big fish and dense schools. Batu Bolong teems with marine life, while Pillarsteen offers caves, swim-throughs, and a high level of macro diversity.

Snorkelers and freedivers are drawn by the chance to swim with manta rays, especially at the Airstrip. While strong currents make surface support essential for freediving, protected bays provide calm conditions for relaxed snorkeling and freediving. The famous Pink Beach offers vibrant marine life, including turtles, parrotfish, and moray eels.

# NORTH ALOR & KUPANG

Alor Island, the largest in the archipelago, spans 2,800 square kilometers and is accessible via flights from Kupang on Timor Island. Kalabahi, its main town with around 18,800 residents, offers basic amenities like shops, street vendors, and warungs, but lacks luxury facilities. While some dive resorts exist, most visitors arrive by liveaboard; however, land-based operations are also expanding.

Alor's economy is driven by pearl farming, agriculture, and fishing. Locals speak Alor-Malay, and basic English is understood in tourism areas, but not widely spoken. Kupang, though more developed with malls and hotels, offers only moderate diving compared to Alor's world-class sites.

The north of the Alor Archipelago offers world-class coral reefs, stunning walls, vibrant sea mounts, and visibility exceeding 40 meters. It's known for abundant fish life, thrilling currents, and big pelagic sightings, including dolphins and orcas. Notable dive sites include The Fish Bowl, with vibrant marine life and a colorful coral wall, Kal's Dream, featuring sweeping currents and large pelagics, Mike's Delight, a diverse reef with pelagic sightings, Paradise Point, an exhilarating drift dive with reef sharks and eagle rays, and Pantar Wall, a breathtaking site with abundant fish schools.

The region also offers exceptional snorkeling and freediving opportunities, featuring rare critters and pristine coral reefs, particularly at Ribbon Eel Reef, Clown Alley, and Feather Star City. Current conditions should be noted for freedivers, with boat support recommended for longer dives.



## Kupang's Fresh Water Cave Diving

Kupang offers some of Indonesia's rare cave diving experiences, with two notable systems: Crystal Cave and Oehani Cave. These highland sinkholes feature limestone tunnels, halocline layers, and air chambers, with visibility reaching up to 50 meters. Oehani Cave extends 500 meters and contains three air chambers, while Crystal Cave has a 100 meter tunnel and a halocline chamber. Both sites are suited for certified cavern divers only, as there's no access to air or the surface within the tunnels until reaching designated chambers.

## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in South Alor & The Savu Sea

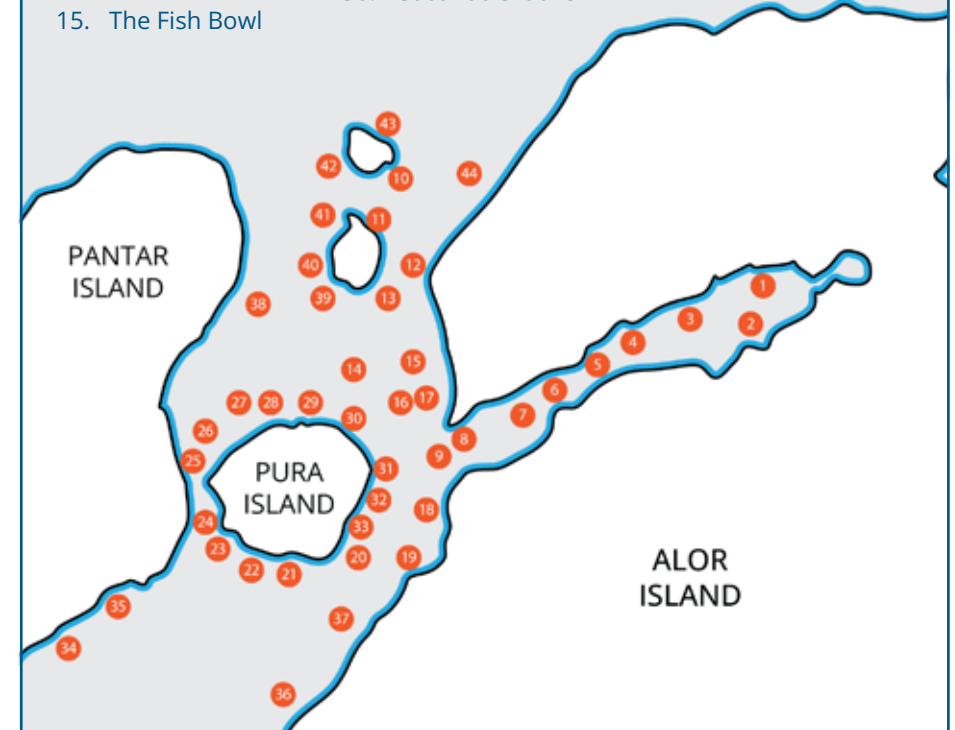

Pelagics such as thresher and hammerhead sharks, oceanic sunfish, dolphins, and orcas are found here, alongside critters like frogfish, rhinopias, blue-ringed octopus, and nudibranchs. The Cathedral is known for its swim-through and abundant life, while Andy's Bus Stop offers dramatic wall diving with dense fish swarms. Beangabang Bay is a standout for macro lovers, offering pristine muck diving with ghost pipefish, seahorses, and more.

South Alor also appeals to snorkelers and freedivers, thanks to its vibrant corals, clear waters, and calm bays. While some areas require boat access, the journey is often rewarded with sightings of dolphins and whales.

Kakaban stands out with its one-of-a-kind stingless Jellyfish Lake and thrilling pelagic encounters. Maratua offers exhilarating drift dives, dramatic drop-offs, and the opportunity to see large marine species, including barracuda, reef sharks, and even seasonal whale sharks.

Snorkelers and freedivers will find plenty to love here too—calm coral gardens, surface-level manta encounters, and Kakaban's surreal jellyfish lagoon.

# EASTERN KALIMANTAN

(DERAWAN, SANGALAKI,  
KAKABAN & MARATUA)

Eastern Kalimantan, on the eastern coast of Borneo, is rich in Dayak heritage, lush rainforests like Kutai National Park—home to wild orangutans—and the remote diving paradise of the Derawan Islands. This offshore archipelago includes Derawan, Sangalaki, Maratua, and Kakaban, each offering world-class diving in pristine waters.

Sangalaki is renowned for its resident manta rays, often seen year-round at cleaning stations. Kakaban features the surreal Jellyfish Lake, where snorkelers can swim among four species of non-stinging jellyfish. The region also offers turtle nesting beaches, whale shark encounters, macro dives at Derawan and Samama, dramatic wall dives at Maratua, and even tiger shark sightings near Pulau Sambit. Accommodations range from shore-based resorts to liveaboard expeditions.

With its equatorial location just 2° north of the equator, Sangalaki enjoys year-round stable diving conditions, largely unaffected by Indonesia's monsoons. Kalimantan experiences a wet season from December to March, with dry conditions prevailing for the remainder of the year and consistently warm temperatures between 28°C and 30°C. Offshore breezes help keep humidity lower than on the mainland.

## Diving Conditions

Waters around Kakaban and Maratua are generally clearer, while Sangalaki typically offers better visibility than Derawan. With calm coral gardens, surface manta encounters, and the surreal experience of snorkeling in Kakaban's Jellyfish Lake, the archipelago is ideal for divers and freedivers of all levels. Its remote, uncrowded nature adds to its appeal as one of Indonesia's hidden marine treasures.

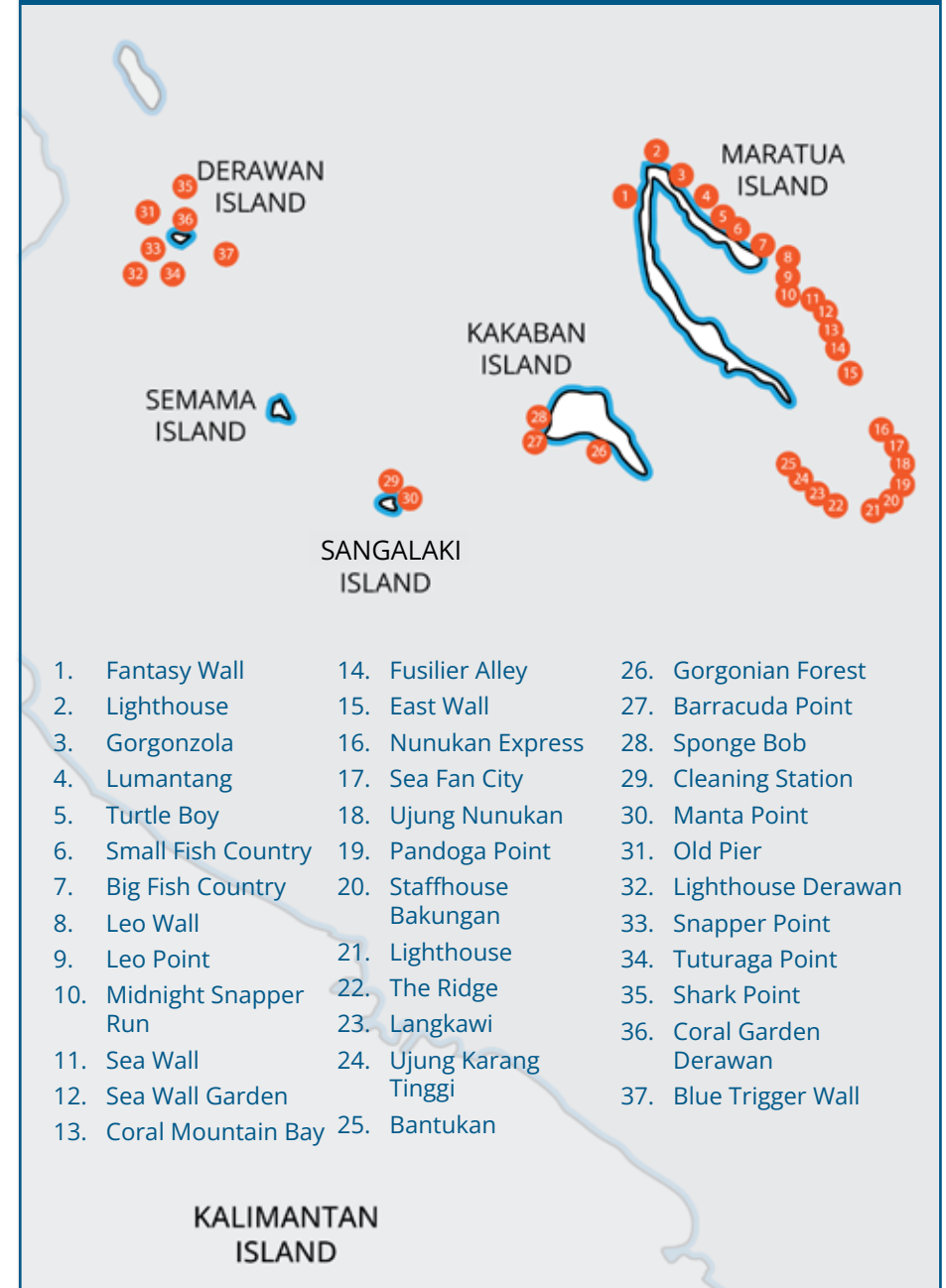

Snorkeling and freediving in Central and Southern Sulawesi reveal pristine reefs, warm waters, and encounters with turtles, rays, and even whale sharks. Though remote, these uncrowded sites offer a truly off-the-beaten-path underwater experience.

# WAKATOBİ

## (THE TUKANGBESI ARCHIPELAGO)

Wakatobi, located in the Banda Sea southeast of Sulawesi, is famed for its pristine fringing, atoll, and barrier reefs. Named after its four main islands—Wangi-Wangi, Kaledupa, Tomia, and Binongko—it offers world-class diving once hailed by Jacques Cousteau.

The best diving can be found around Tomia and Wangi-Wangi, where Wakatobi’s fossilized reefs remain pristine within a protected marine park, supported by the seafaring Bajau community. Remote and uncrowded, Wakatobi continues to unveil new sites, making it a prime destination for vibrant reefs and authentic culture.

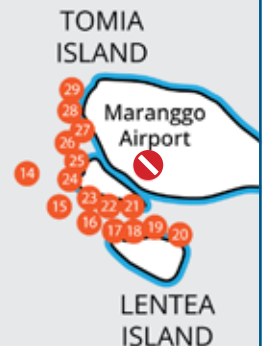

# THE TOGEAN ISLANDS

## (CENTRAL SULAWESI)

The Togean Islands in Central Sulawesi offer secluded and uncrowded diving, featuring vibrant wall dives off Kadidiri, a rich marine biodiversity around Una Una, and excellent muck diving for macro enthusiasts.

Access is via ferry to Wakai from Gorontalo or Ampana, with most dive resorts on Kadidiri providing pickup services. With very few operators in the area, diving in the Togean Islands offers an exclusive experience.

Though remote, the journey is well worth it—white sand beaches, turquoise lagoons, and pristine coral reefs await. With dramatic walls, caverns, and dense coral cover, the Togeans remain a hidden gem in Indonesia's dive landscape.

Snorkelers and freedivers are drawn to the Togeans for their clear waters, thriving reefs, and occasional pelagic encounters. Still remote and uncrowded, the region offers a tranquil diving experience, with stronger currents near Una Una best navigated with boat support.

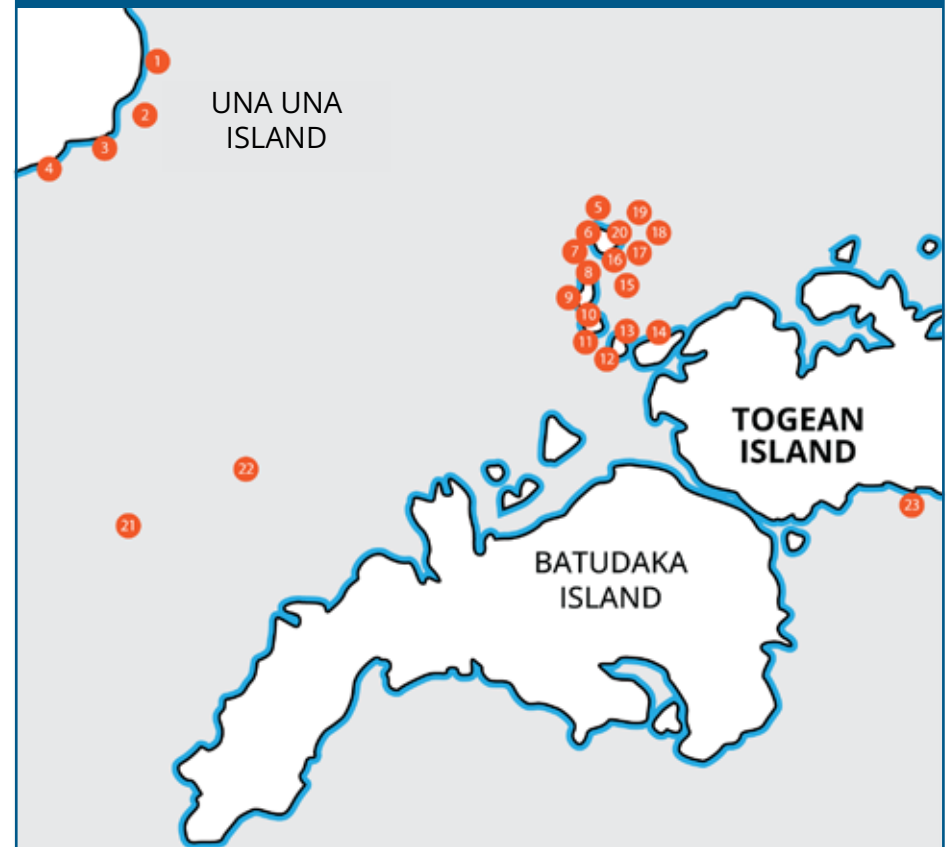

## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in the Togeian Islands

North of Kadidiri, sites like the Labyrinth, Catacomb, and Mini Canyon offer coral-rich seamounts with caverns, boulders, and a diverse array of marine life, ranging from eagle rays to nudibranchs. Una Una delivers fish-filled dives at deep-wall sites such as The Pinnacle and Menara Dua, where fusiliers, turtles, and barracuda are common. Just north of Kadidiri, Little Lembeh is a top muck diving site, renowned for its diverse array of critters, including seahorses and cuttlefish.

# SELAYAR ISLAND & BIRA

Selayar Island and its nearby Bira are located in the southern part of Sulawesi. They offer spectacular diving, featuring vibrant coral walls, abundant macro life, turtles, and pelagics, including rays and sharks. Selayar's top dive sites lie within a protected marine park managed by Selayar Dive Resort, reachable via a 2.5-hour speedboat trip from Bira or limited domestic flights from Makassar.

Bira, renowned for its traditional Phinisi shipbuilding, is a coastal town approximately 4 - 5 hours by road from Makassar. It features beautiful beaches and provides dive access to nearby Pulau Kambing and Pulau Pasi, though strong currents are common.

Selayar's undeveloped east and southern coasts reveal a rugged natural beauty, featuring waterfalls, forested peaks, and turquoise bays. The diving season runs from October to May, while rough seas and resort closures typically occur during the May–October period, when the prevailing winds are from the east. Transfers require careful planning, and using your dive operator's assistance is highly recommended for reaching this remote, rewarding destination.

In southeast Selayar, dive conditions vary from calm to challenging drifts depending on the tides. The protected marine area, managed by Selayar Dive Resort, features dramatic walls with overhangs, caverns, and swim-throughs, all teeming with coral diversity and a rich array of pelagic life.

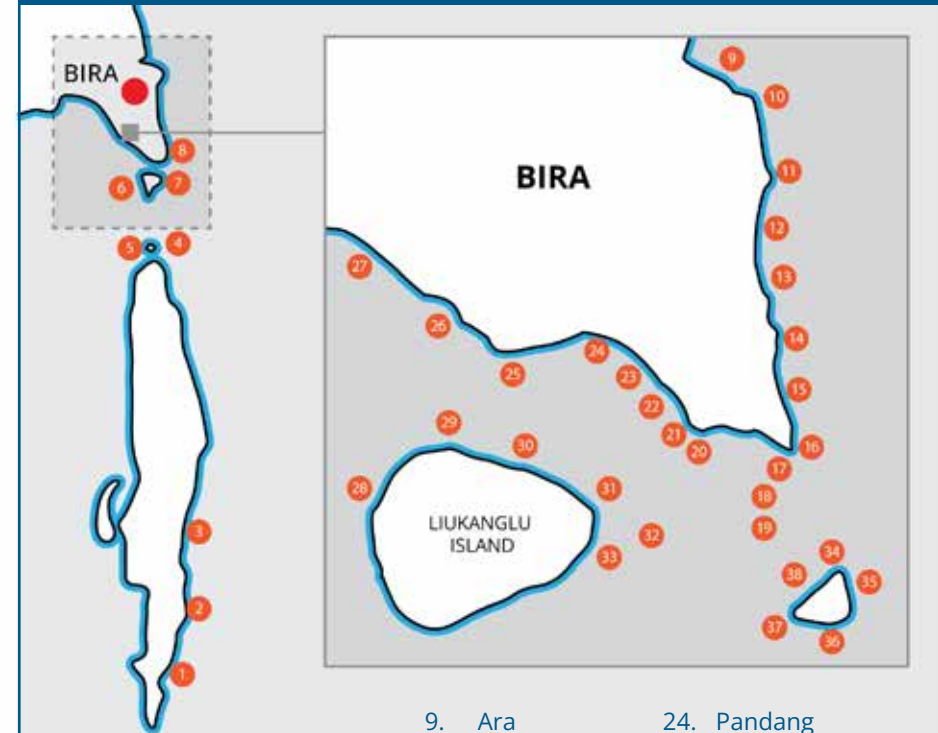

Complemented by rich macro life and colourful, scenic reefs, it's a destination that rarely leaves divers unimpressed.

# Northern Sulawesi Diving Overview



Northern Sulawesi offers some of Indonesia's most diverse and rewarding diving, from the world-renowned muck sites of Lembeh Strait to the dramatic walls of Bunaken and the vibrant coral reefs around Bangka and Gangga.

Situated along a migratory route, the region also offers whale sightings and frequent dolphin encounters, alongside a diverse array of marine life that spans from tiny critters in Lembeh to large pelagics in Bunaken. Shipwrecks in Manado Bay adds further variety, making this a top destination for both macro and wide-angle underwater photography.



## Diving Conditions

Diving in Northern Sulawesi is generally calm and beginner-friendly, offering a range of sites that vary from steep walls to gentle sandy slopes. While most areas offer easy conditions, currents can pick up around Bunaken, Bangka, and Gangga, especially during full moons. Lembeh Strait and Manado Bay are typically sheltered, though wind and swell may occasionally affect shore dives. Bunaken's geography ensures that at least one side remains diveable in most weather. Visibility is consistently good on reefs and walls year-round but can drop at muck sites like Lembeh during the rainy season due to runoff. Bunaken also offers excellent snorkeling and freediving, with frequent sightings of turtles, sea snakes, and vibrant coral gardens. Lembeh's critter-rich waters often have lower visibility, though the north and east sides tend to be clearer. Bangka and Gangga deliver strong visibility and rich marine diversity, making them ideal for divers of all levels.



## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights Northern SULAWESI

Northern Sulawesi is teeming with marine life, offering encounters with dolphins, pilot whales, seasonal sperm whales, and dugongs, particularly around Bangka and Bunaken. Bunaken is primarily known for its abundant green sea turtles. At the same time, Lembeh Strait has earned global acclaim for muck diving, revealing rare and elusive critters such as blue-ring octopuses, pygmy seahorses, hairy frogfish, and flamboyant cuttlefish. The region is also home to unique endemic species, including the Lembeh sea dragon and the Banggai cardinalfish.

# BUNAKEN NATIONAL PARK

Bunaken National Park, established in the early 1990s as one of Indonesia's first marine protected areas, sits at the heart of the Coral Triangle. Spanning 891 km<sup>2</sup>—97% of which is ocean—the park encompasses sea grass beds, vibrant coral reefs, and dramatic walls that drop over 1.5 kilometers deep. It's home to 390 species of coral and a wealth of marine life, including the islands of Bunaken, Manado Tua, Siladen, Mantehage, and Nain.

## Diving Conditions

Most dive sites in Bunaken National Park are clustered around Bunaken Island, with additional spots off Manado Tua and Siladen. Visibility is excellent year-round, and currents are generally mild, becoming stronger only around the time of the full moon. Diving is rarely affected by weather, as the islands lack major rivers and runoff, and Bunaken's geography offers natural protection from wind. With shallow reefs ideal for beginners and deep walls for advanced divers, the park caters to all skill levels.

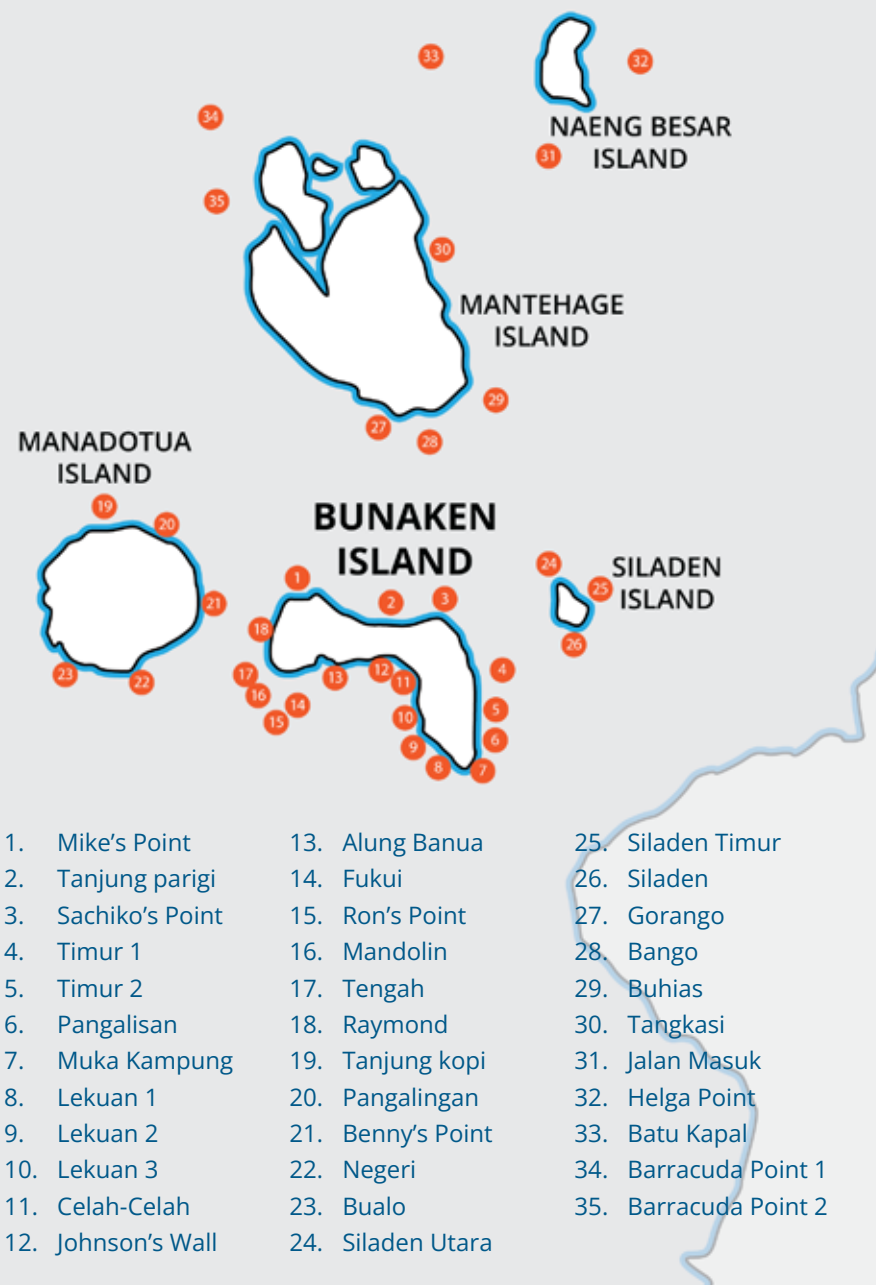
## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Bunaken National Park

Bunaken's dive sites are renowned for their steep coral walls, crystal-clear visibility, and rich marine life. Divers frequently encounter reef sharks, eagle rays, sea snakes, schooling fish, and an abundance of turtles, with seasonal appearances by dolphins, dugongs, and even sperm whales. The iconic Lekuan I, II, and III walls are draped in massive sponges and both hard and soft corals, offering a visual feast for wide-angle and macro photographers alike.

The vibrant reef tops burst with color and fish activity, while the walls harbor pygmy seahorses, orangutan crabs, frogfish, and a variety of shrimps and nudibranchs. Nearby Sachiko's Point is famous for its gorgonian sea fans and regular sightings of barracudas, blacktip reef sharks, and Napoleon wrasse. Ron's Point, renowned for its deep drop-offs and strong currents, attracts large pelagics, including tuna and jacks—ideal for advanced divers. Siladen Jetty features a lush reef wall with caverns and overhangs that shelter macro life, while Pangulingan, off Manado Tua, offers exhilarating drifts with batfish, jackfish, and barracuda. For a more high-adrenaline dive, Barracuda Point off Montehage delivers fast currents, excellent visibility, and large schools of barracuda and bumphead parrotfish. On the mainland fringe of the marine park, Tanjung Kelapa (Poopoh) adds diversity with black sand muck diving, seagrass beds, and coral-covered walls rich in marine life.

# MANADO BAY

Manado Bay is gaining recognition for its outstanding muck diving and rare macro marine life, with black and white sand slopes that provide ideal conditions for underwater photography.

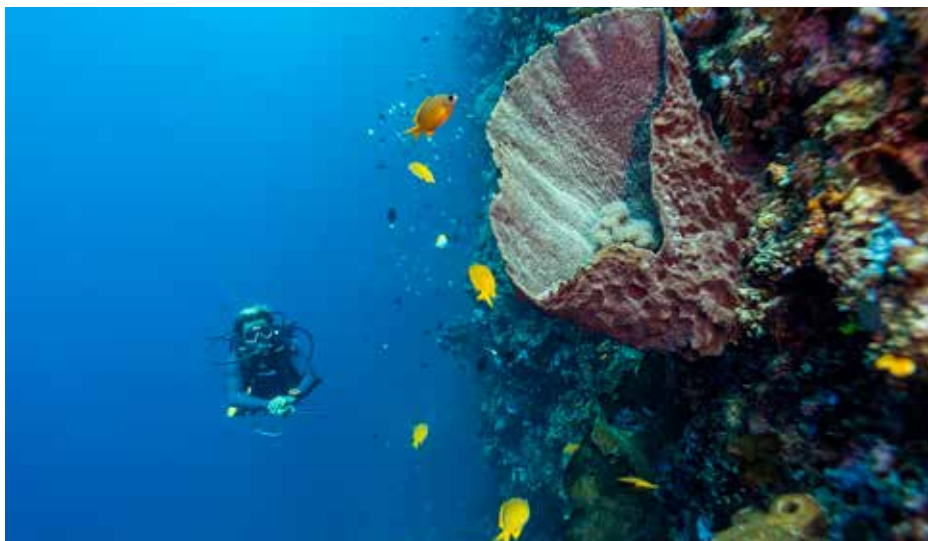




## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Manado Bay

Tiwoho and Wori Bay are renowned muck diving hotspots in Manado Bay, home to iconic critters like ghost pipefish, frogfish, ribbon eels, nudibranchs, and various cephalopods—making them a haven for macro photography enthusiasts. City Extra features seagrass beds with seahorses and a sandy slope frequented by frogfish, flamboyant cuttlefish, and mimic octopuses.

The Molas Wreck, believed to be a Dutch World War II cargo ship, rests at a depth of 24 to 42 meters and is often visited by white-tip reef sharks and Napoleon wrasses. At Tanjung Papaya, an artificial reef constructed from coral-covered motorbikes attracts lionfish, moray eels, nudibranchs, and other bottom-dwelling creatures. While less vibrant than neighbouring Bunaken, Manado Bay offers easily accessible snorkelling and freediving over its shallow reef-and-sand habitats.

# THE LEMBEH STRAIT

The Lembeh Strait, located between Lembeh Island and the mainland of North Sulawesi, is world-renowned for its muck diving on volcanic black sand. Nicknamed the 'Critter Capital of the World,' it boasts an extraordinary array of rare and camouflaged species, drawing underwater photographers, scientists, and macro enthusiasts from around the globe.

While best known for muck diving, the Strait's northern end also features coral reef sites, and the seldom-explored east coast of Lembeh offers vibrant soft corals, schooling fish, and occasional pelagic encounters.

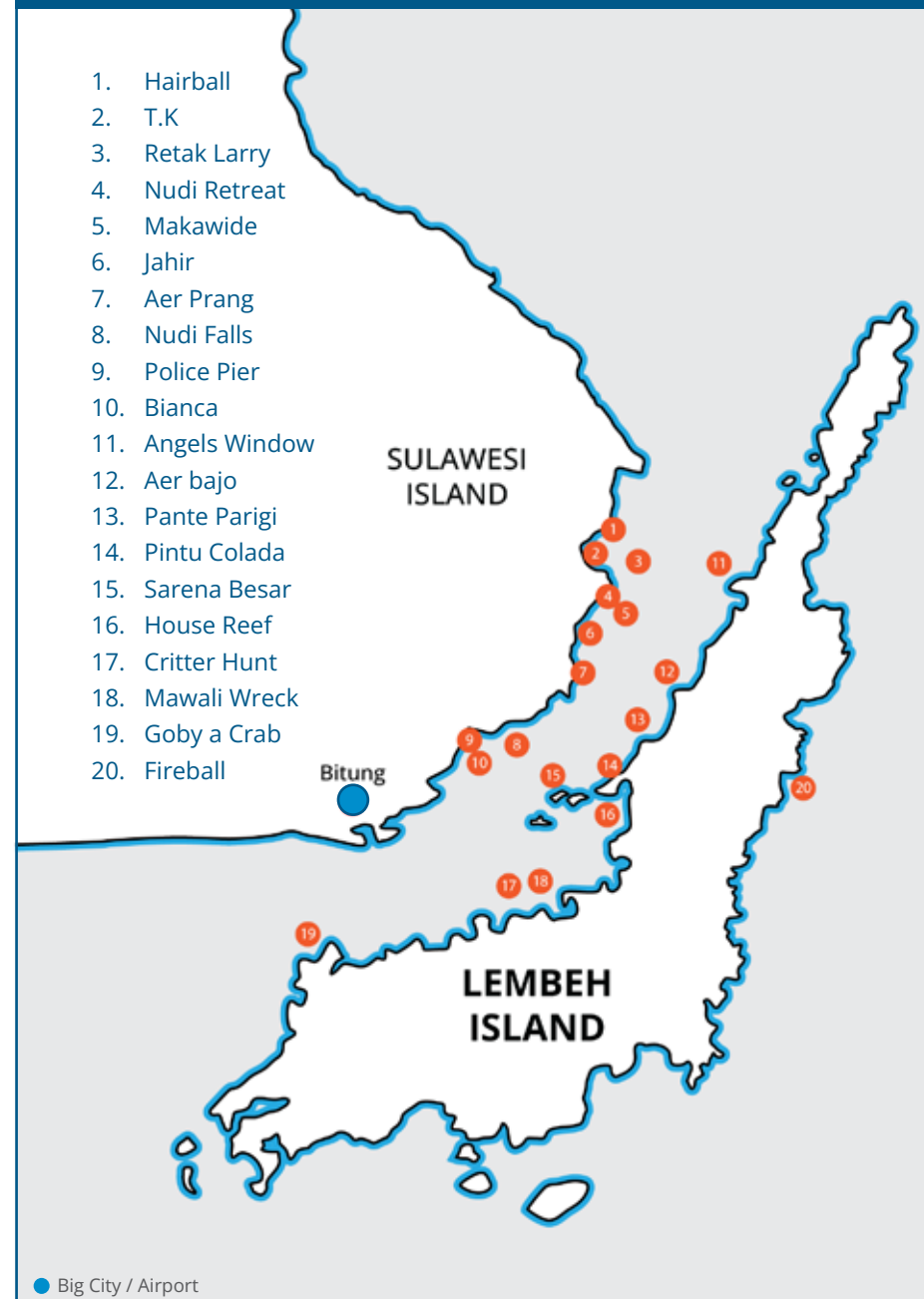
The Lembeh Strait is renowned for its exceptional macro life, boasting one of the world's richest collections of rare critters—including pygmy seahorses, frogfish, flamboyant cuttlefish, blue-ringed octopuses, and rhinopias. Iconic dive sites like Hairball, TK, Jahir, and Air Bajo are favourites for muck diving, while combination reef-sand sites such as Nudifalls and Serena offer added variety. The WWII-era Mawali Wreck adds historical intrigue and wide-angle photography opportunities.

Beyond muck diving, Lembeh's north and east coasts feature colourful coral reefs, schooling fish, reef sharks, and occasional sightings of rays or cetaceans. Notable sites include Angel's Window and Fireball. While visibility can be limited for snorkelers, sites like Nudi Falls and Batu Angus provide vibrant coral, abundant marine life, and even birdwatching opportunities from the boat.

# BANGKA & OUTLYING ISLANDS (GANGGA, TALISEI & LIHAGA)

Bangka Island, located just off the northern tip of North Sulawesi, offers a remote tropical escape characterized by small village communities and minimal development.

The islands of Bangka, Gangga, Talisei, and Lihaga are known for their stunning coastlines, white sand beaches, and vibrant coral reefs. Divers and snorkelers can explore dramatic rock pinnacles, sea mounts, and coral-filled coves teeming with a diverse array of marine life.

Migrating whales, dolphins, pelagics, and dugongs are frequently spotted, while macro enthusiasts will find Lembeh-style critters in more colorful surroundings. Nutrient-rich currents support abundant fish life and flourishing soft coral gardens—perfect for wide-angle photography.

The region combines thrilling drifts with plenty of gentle sites ideal for beginners.

Batu Pendeta's rugged topography attracts large fish species, while Batu Mandi is a haven for critter enthusiasts—think frogfish, pygmy seahorses, and cuttlefish.

Advanced divers will relish the colorful reefs and frequent pelagic encounters with Napoleon wrasse and tuna at Tectonic and Tanjung Arus. On Lihaga Island, dusk brings the unforgettable spectacle of mandarin fish mating displays.

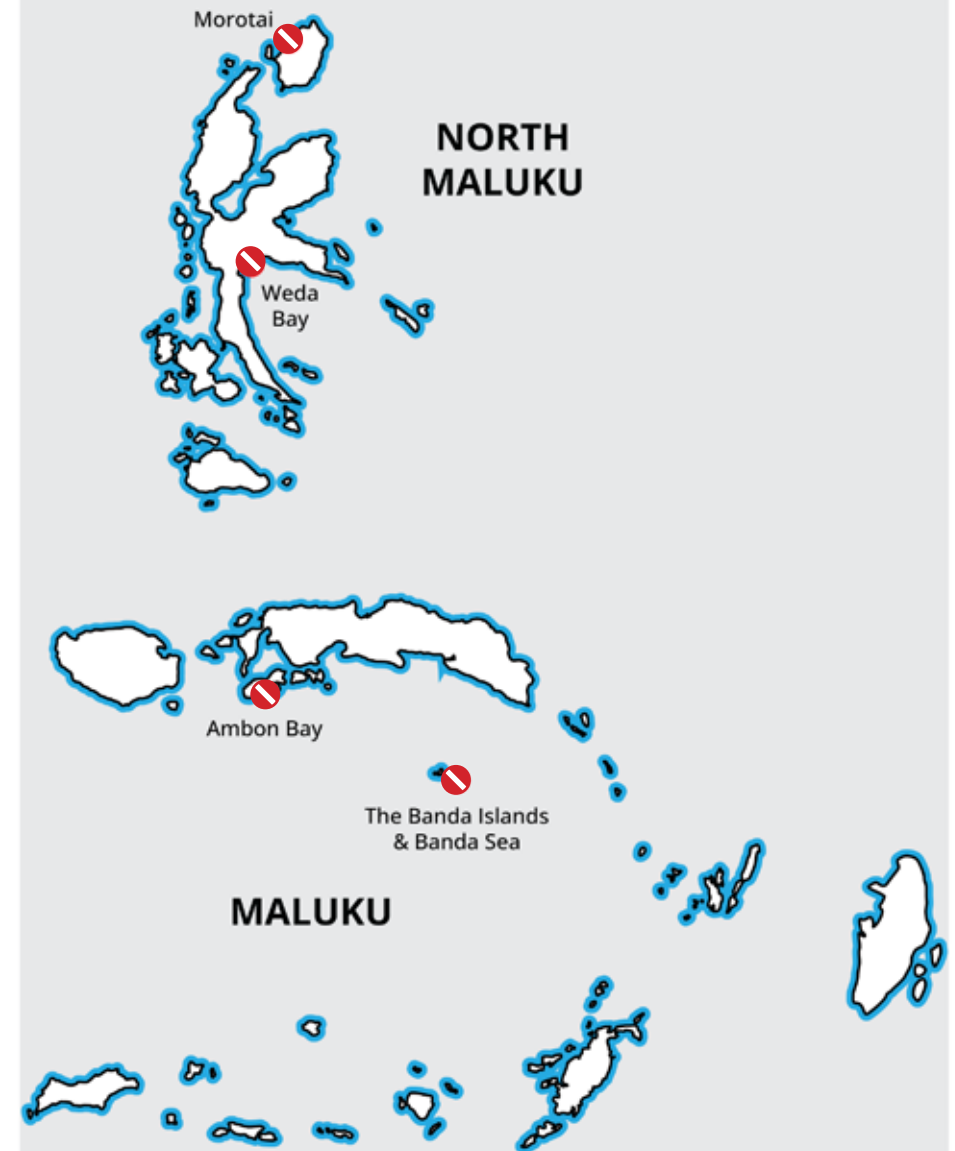
## The Land of Spices

The Maluku Islands, also known as the Spice Islands, lie between Sulawesi and Papua, spanning over 850,000 km<sup>2</sup>, mostly ocean. Shaped by tectonic forces, the region boasts volcanic peaks, rainforests, coral reefs, and a rich biodiversity, featuring many endemic species.

Historically prized for nutmeg and cloves, Maluku was a center of colonial rivalry before becoming part of Indonesia. Now divided into North Maluku and Maluku provinces, the region is home to approximately 3 million people living in harmony.

With its varied climates and fertile land, agriculture remains vital, producing a range of products including spices, sago, rice, and seafood. Papeda with fish soup is a well-known regional dish.

# Diving Overview



Diving in the Maluku Islands requires more planning than in established destinations like Bali, but the rewards are substantial. With few dive centers and resorts, early arrangements are essential to access the region's remote and pristine underwater sites.



## Diving Conditions

Dive sites vary widely, from deep atoll walls in Halmahera to shallow muck slopes in Ambon, featuring both vibrant reefs and rare macro life. Some operators pause between June and September due to reduced visibility during the wet monsoon season, so it's best to check ahead if you plan to visit during this time.



## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in MALUKU

Maluku offers a remarkable diversity of diving experiences for all skill levels and interests. Ambon Bay is renowned for macro photography, home to rare species like the psychedelic frogfish. In contrast, Weda Bay in Halmahera features dramatic walls, giant gorgonians, and regular pelagic sightings—perfect for wide-angle enthusiasts. The Banda Sea, a favorite destination for liveaboards, showcases pristine reefs, schooling hammerhead sharks, and frequent encounters with whales and dolphins.

From May to September, North Halmahera's islands, including Rao and Morotai, reveal varied underwater landscapes—from shallow coral gardens to deep walls teeming with marine life. Snorkelers and freedivers will enjoy the clear, vibrant waters of Weda and the Banda Sea. Though more challenging, snorkeling in Ambon Bay can yield sightings of Indonesia's rarest marine species.

With low visitor numbers, sites like Weda Bay, Morotai, and the Banda Sea offer tranquil, crowd-free diving in some of the country's most untouched waters.

# AMBON BAY

Ambon Island, situated southwest of Seram and spanning 51 km in length, is characterized by lush rainforests, fertile terrain, and a bay that nearly divides the island in two. Ambon City sits on the northeastern coast, while rural villages are scattered across the western and southern regions. Agriculture, particularly nutmeg and cloves, and fishing are the island's primary industries, with tourism still emerging.

Ambon is also a key liveaboard hub for trips across the Banda Sea and Maluku region. Most dive resorts and liveaboards provide transfer services. Bahasa Indonesia is widely spoken, and basic English is commonly used in tourism and business.

### Diving Conditions

The best diving season in Ambon runs from November to May. Monsoon conditions in July and August can reduce visibility, and some operators may close during this period. Most dive sites are shallow, around 15 meters, with minimal currents, making them suitable for divers of all levels. The Duke of Sparta Wreck offers a deeper option for wreck enthusiasts. For reef diving, Weda Bay, Morotai, and the Banda Sea are excellent alternatives.

## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Ambon Bay

Ambon Bay is a world-class muck diving destination, renowned for its rare macro species, including frogfish, mimic and blue-ringed octopuses, rhinopias, flamboyant cuttlefish, and mandarin fish. Most dive sites are shallow, calm, and ideal for macro photography.

Key sites include Laha, known for its diverse critters and mandarin fish at sunset; Tawiri, with sandy slopes that host frogfish, ghost pipefish, eels, and octopus; and Air Manis Jetty, offering a wealth of macro life alongside coral patches and schooling reef fish. Rhino City is famous for rhinopias and colorful anemones, while the Duke of Sparta Wreck, at 137 meters long, provides a deeper wreck dive experience.

While coral cover in the bay is limited, the outer coast features wall dives and caves. Snorkeling and freediving are possible, though visibility is variable and coral growth is sparse.

# WEDA BAY (HALMAHERA)

Halmahera is characterized by dense rainforests and striking mountainous terrain, particularly in the southeast, around Weda Bay. Most residents live in coastal villages, relying on fishing and farming, while mining plays a growing economic role.

The main gateway is Ternate, followed by a 30-minute speedboat to Sofifi and a 4-hour rainforest drive to Weda Bay. Travel relies on roads and sea, with remote routes often requiring a 4WD vehicle. The fertile land produces coconuts, sago, and nutmeg.

Ternate is mainly Muslim, while rural areas are more diverse. Modest dress is recommended, and with little English spoken, basic Indonesian is both helpful and appreciated.

Continue by fast boat to Sofifi (30 minutes), followed by a 4-hour drive



### Diving Conditions

Weda Bay features warm, clear waters and uncrowded sites ranging from shallow coral gardens to deep walls and sea mounts. Conditions suit all levels, although some operators close from June to September during the monsoon season, so check ahead. Many sites are remote, reached by GPS, and offer a truly exclusive experience—often with no other dive boats in sight.

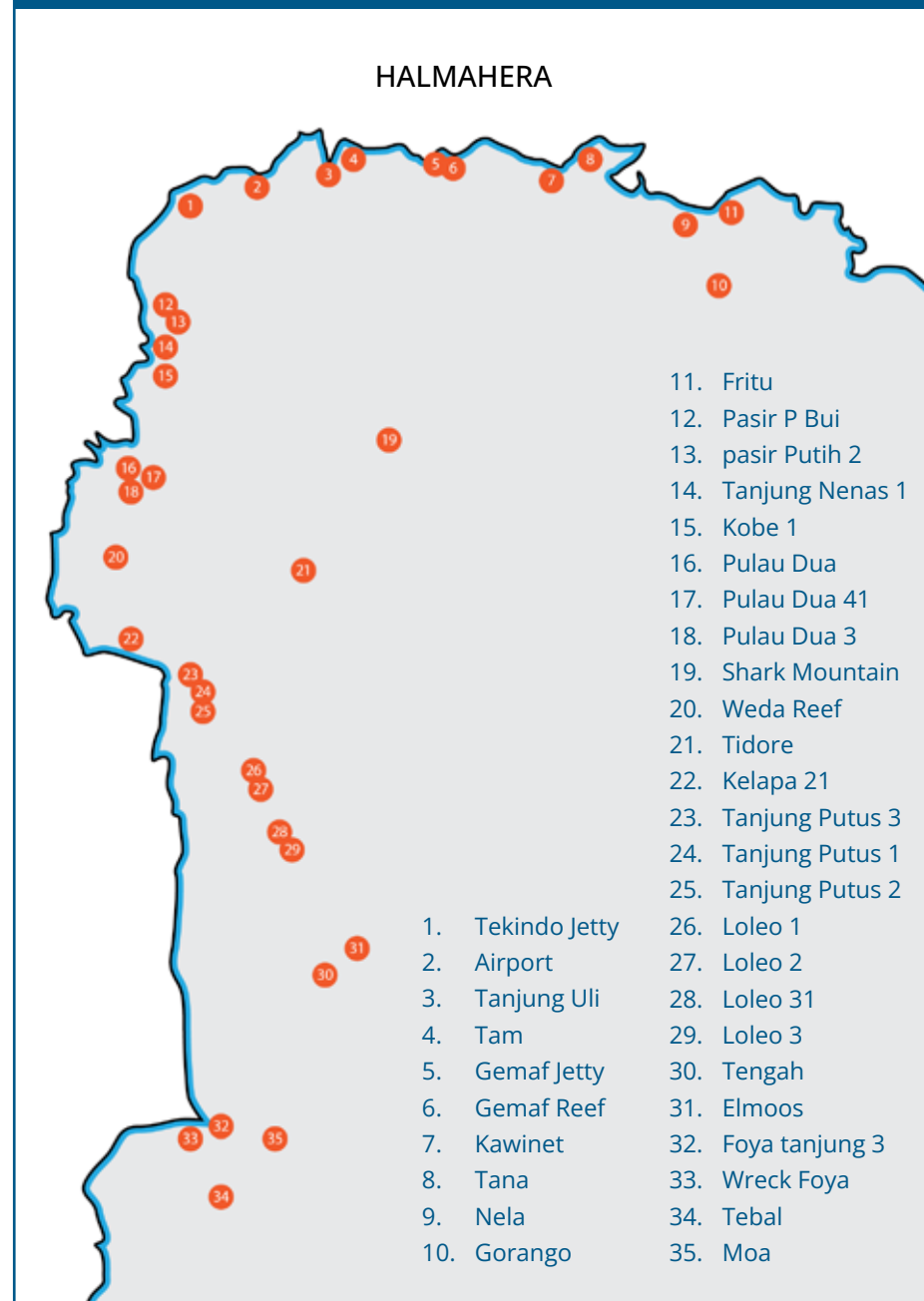


## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Weda Bay

Topography is dramatic and reefs are pristine, with standout sites like Elmoo's Reef, Shark Mountain, and Gorango. Divers can expect to see vibrant corals, a variety of macroinvertebrates, reef sharks, and occasional pelagic species. Snorkelers and freedivers will enjoy vivid reefs, though fish density is moderate. Due to the area's remoteness, proper boat support and caution are essential.

Above the surface, vast rainforests and rare birdlife—such as Birds of Paradise—add to Weda Bay's off-the-grid appeal.

# THE BANDA ISLANDS

Once the center of the global spice trade, the Banda Sea now draws divers with its pristine reefs, historic islands, and exceptional marine life. With little human impact, its nutrient-rich waters are home to schooling hammerheads, mobula rays, Napoleon wrasse, and dogtooth tuna. Top dive sites include Batu Kapal and Gunung Api.

Most trips are liveboard-based and often combined with destinations such as Alor, the Spice Islands, or the Forgotten Islands, offering an immersive journey through Indonesia's central seas.

### Diving Conditions

The amazing dive sites of the Banda Islands are best visited in March and April, as well as during the period from September to December. These two periods offer more consistently calm conditions. Snorkelers and freedivers will enjoy pristine reefs, calm conditions, and warm, clear waters. The area suits all levels, although experienced freedivers should ensure they have surface support due to its remoteness. Liveboards offer the most comprehensive access, though select land-based resorts also serve the region well.

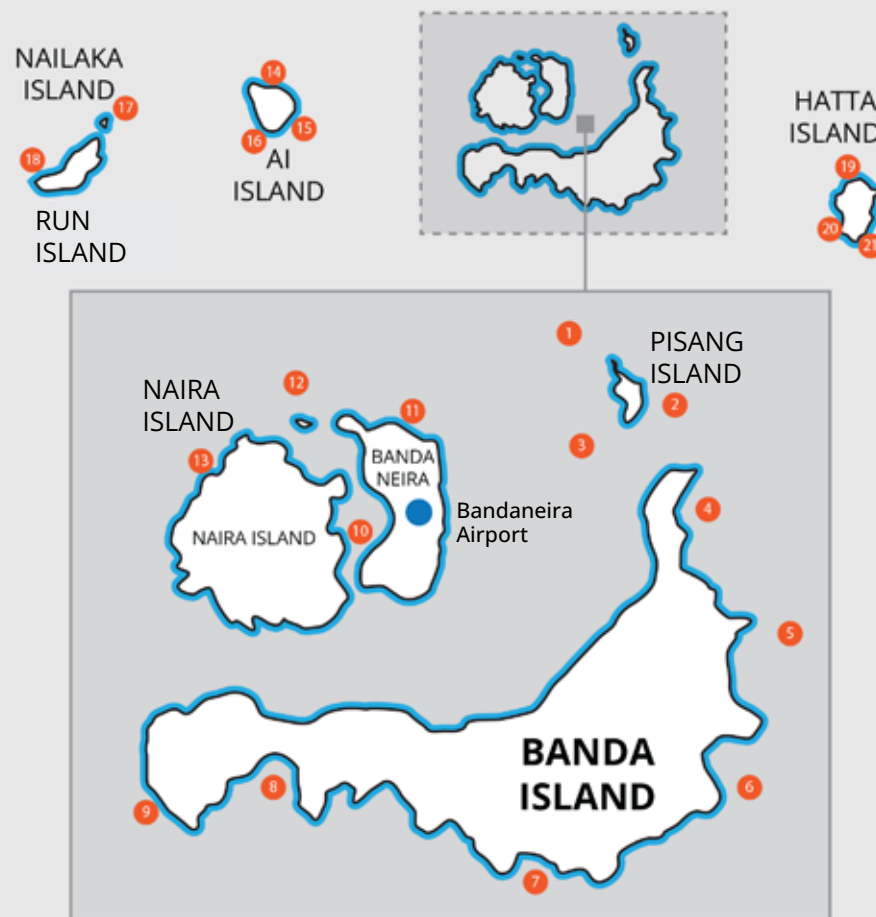

Batu Wali, located within a marine protected area, boasts spawning grounds and healthy reefs, while Batu Kapal is renowned for its striking pinnacles and sea fans.

In the broader Banda Sea, top sites include Koon Island's drift wall with barracuda and jacks, Nusa Laut's diverse reef life, Pombo Boi's idyllic tropical diving, and the action-packed, fish-rich waters of Soangi.

# MOROTAI

Morotai Island, one of Indonesia’s northernmost islands, sits just above the equator near the Pacific. Rugged and forested, it covers 2,476 square kilometers, with Daruba as the main town and most communities residing in traditional coastal villages.

Morotai holds historical importance from World War II, when General MacArthur used it as a base to launch the Philippines campaign. Over 61,000 U.S. troops were stationed here, leaving behind sunken military equipment and occasional wartime relics still discovered on land

### Diving Conditions

Diving in Morotai is possible year-round, with the calmest conditions from late March to early July. The island’s shape provides natural shelter, ensuring diveable sites in most seasons. Sites include walls, drop-offs, and gentle coral gardens, offering options suitable for both beginners and experienced divers.

## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Morotai

Morotai is emerging as a top shark diving destination, with regular sightings of blacktip, whitetip, and grey reef sharks at nearly every site. The waters are rich with marine life, including fusiliers, barracuda, tuna, devil rays, turtles, wrasse, and the occasional manta ray. Adding to its underwater allure are World War II wrecks—planes, tanks, and trucks—scattered near the old wartime airfield, some at depths suited to advanced divers.

Top shark sites include Terminal Gorango, Blacktip Point, Grey Shark Point, and Rifky Point near Tabailenge Island. Aru Point features colorful walls and healthy coral, while Rifky Point is a macro hotspot with a variety of critters and schooling fish.

Snorkelers and freedivers will enjoy coral-rich fringing reefs with easy access and sightings of turtles, rays, and reef sharks. Best visited from March to July, Morotai offers raw natural beauty and warm local hospitality, with basic facilities that cater to travelers seeking authenticity over luxury.

# Diving Overview

Raja Ampat ranks among the world's premier dive destinations, renowned for its untouched reefs, high fish biomass, endemic species, and exceptional encounters with pelagic species. Its varied underwater topography—walls, slopes, canyons, and sheltered lagoons—offers something for all skill levels.

Divers are treated to vivid coral gardens, dense schools of reef fish, and frequent sightings of sharks and tunas. The prime season runs from October to June. Its remote location has helped shield it from mass tourism, keeping the reefs intact. Approximately half of the region falls within Marine Protected Areas, which are funded in part by a conservation tag system linked to tourism. Due to limited capacity, early booking is essential for both liveaboards and resorts.



## Diving Conditions

Papua's remote location results in limited phone service and slow, often unreliable internet access. While the region boasts exceptional natural beauty and marine biodiversity, certain areas have been affected by destructive fishing practices. Diving in Papua offers warm water and excellent visibility year-round, particularly in regions like Raja Ampat.



## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in PAPUA

Papua offers unmatched marine diversity, featuring manta rays, reef and walking sharks, turtles, wobbegongs, pygmy seahorses, nudibranchs, and untouched coral reefs. Signature dive sites such as Blue Magic, Manta Sandy, Sardine Reef, and Cape Kri showcase the region's biodiversity, while Misool's iconic sites like Boo and Magic Mountain stand out for their dramatic topography and thriving marine life.

# THE DAMPIER STRAIT (RAJA AMPAT)

Raja Ampat is the most biodiverse marine region on Earth, home to the highest number of fish, coral, and mollusc species globally.

The Dampier Strait showcases an exceptional variety, with distinctive islands, steep rock walls, and sandy bays that are ideal for exploration. Easily accessible from Sorong, it is one of the most popular areas for both liveaboards and land-based resorts.

Diving and snorkeling in the Dampier Strait are good year-round, with no distinct dry or rainy season. Currents are constant, bringing abundant marine life but requiring dive planning for all skill levels. Some southern resorts close during windier summer months due to rough conditions.

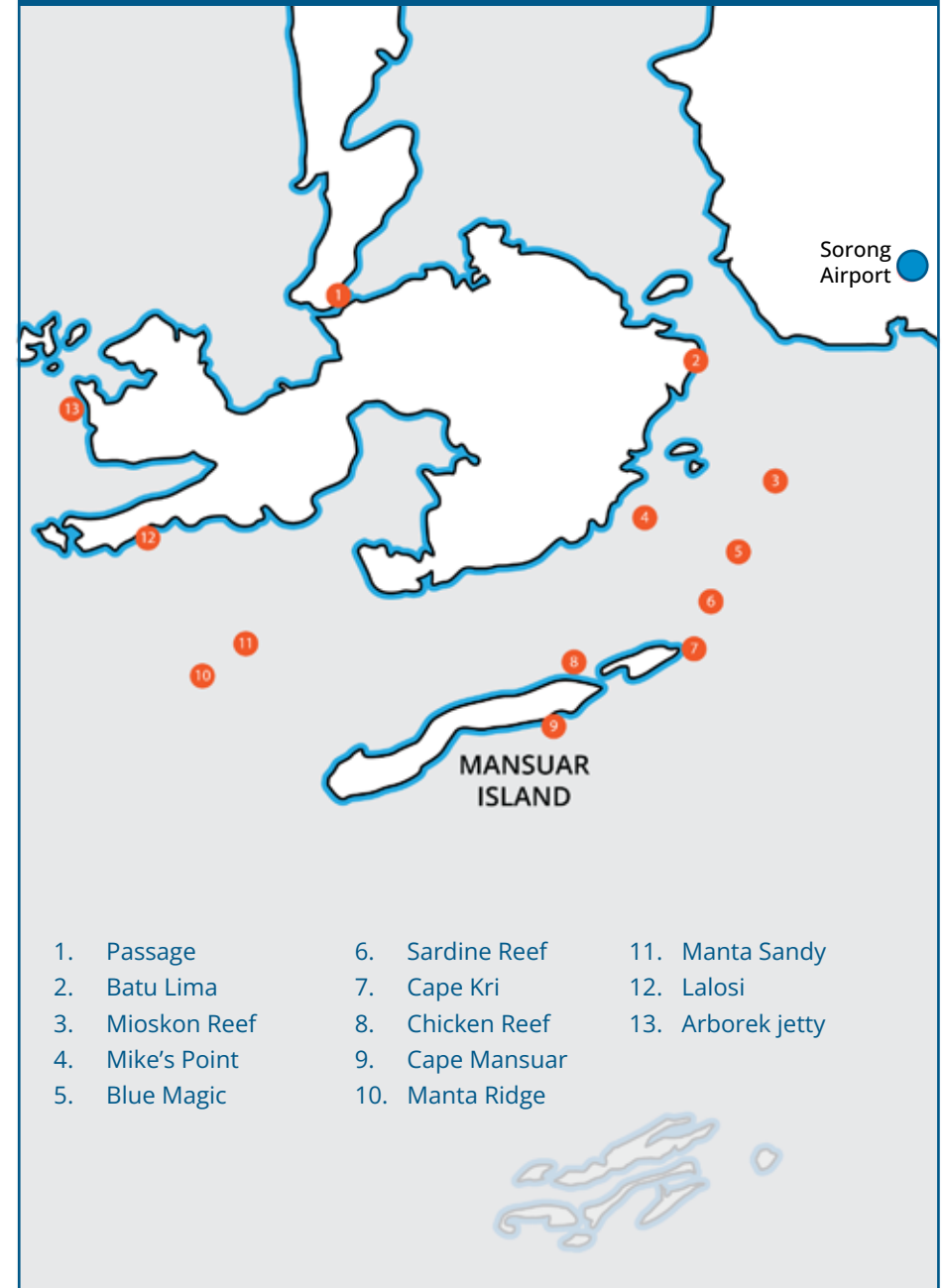


## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Dampier Strait

Manta rays are a highlight in the Dampier Strait, with sites like Manta Sandy and Blue Magic offering near-guaranteed encounters. Top dive sites include Sardine Reef, Cape Kri—known for a record 374 fish species in a single dive—The Passage, a jungle-like channel with mangroves and an underwater cavern, Mike's Point with strong currents and dense marine life, and the scenic Fam Islands featuring limestone cliffs and vibrant coral gardens.

Snorkelers and freedivers enjoy rich marine life at Manta Sandy's shallow cleaning station and the striking landscapes of The Passage and Fam Islands.

# MISOOL (RAJA AMPAT)

Misool Island, one of the largest and most remote islands in Raja Ampat, is known for its lush forests, limestone pinnacles, white sand beaches, and vibrant marine life. The island is also home to ancient petroglyphs estimated to be 5,000 years old.

Misool is primarily accessed by liveaboard boats, with limited land-based options such as Misool Eco Resort. Liveaboard itineraries often combine Misool with the Dampier Strait or the Banda Sea.

Misool is home to world-class dive sites, including Boo Windows, Magic Mountain, Fiabacet, and Yillet, all renowned for their vibrant marine life and dramatic topography.

Boo Windows is famous for its scenic swim-through and vibrant fish life, featuring unicornfish, octopuses, and green turtles. Fiabacet delivers dense fish populations, clear waters, and regular sightings of hammerheads, barracuda, reef sharks, and bumphead parrotfish. Magic Mountain features a manta ray cleaning station frequented by reef and oceanic mantas, as well as sharks and large pelagic schools. Yillet offers a sloping plateau with caves and ledges that shelter various critters, including barramundi cod, turtles, and schooling barracuda.

Snorkeling and freediving in Misool are equally impressive, with pristine reefs and thriving biodiversity accessible to all levels. Highlights include manta rays, sharks, and reef fish across varied underwater terrain—from calm bays to steep walls like Gorgonian Passage—offering unforgettable encounters above and below the surface.

# CENDERAWASIH BAY

Cenderawasih Bay is remote and accessible only by liveaboard but offers extraordinary rewards—especially for those seeking rare, prolonged encounters with whale sharks. Unlike typical sightings, these gentle giants gather beneath fishing platforms to feed, allowing for extended interaction.

Known as “The Galapagos of Indonesia’s reefs,” the bay hosts rich biodiversity, including four turtle species, dolphins, dugongs, and vibrant coral ecosystems.

Dive sites range from macro-rich spots to rarely explored World War II wrecks. With its blend of marine megafauna, critters, pristine reefs, and historical relics, Cenderawasih is a must for adventurous divers.

## HOW TO GET THERE



Fly to Manokwari Rendani Airport (MKW) or Nabire Doue Aturure (NBX), where most liveaboards depart.



### Diving Conditions

With visibility ranging from 10 to 30 meters, diving in Cenderawasih Bay caters to divers of all levels, although deeper sites with stronger currents are best suited for advanced divers. Whale shark encounters in shallow Kwatisore Bay are ideal for beginners. Most liveaboards operate from June to October.

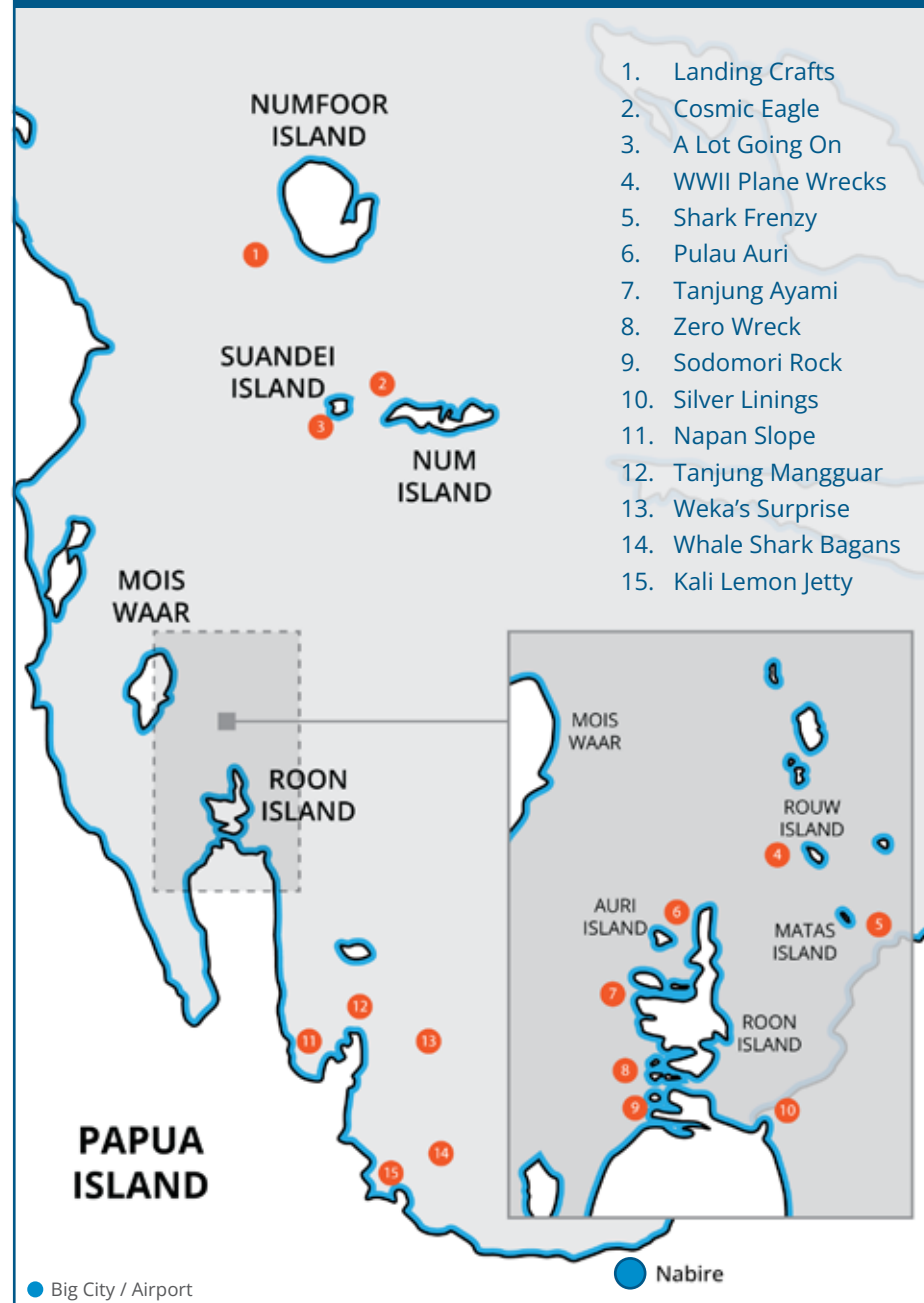
## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Cenderawasih Bay

Cenderawasih Bay's main attraction is the year-round presence of whale sharks in Kwatisore Bay, where divers of all levels can swim among multiple sharks feeding naturally beneath fishing platforms—an unparalleled experience.

Near Manokwari, the WWII-era Shinwa Maru wreck offers both recreational and advanced diving opportunities, rich in marine life and featuring preserved artifacts. Sungei Omiand features volcanic black sand and rare macroscopic species, such as pygmy seahorses and blue-ring octopuses. The bay also offers excellent snorkelling and freediving, particularly with whale sharks near the surface, which can be accessed via liveaboard or from shore.

# BIAK

Biak, the largest island in Cenderawasih Bay, is a tropical haven of white sand beaches, palm-lined shores, and dense jungle. Covering 2,455 km<sup>2</sup> and home to around 122,000 people—mostly Melanesians—its central hub is Biak City.

First charted by Portuguese explorers in the 1500s, Biak today has limited dive infrastructure, making liveboards the primary option for divers. Staying on the island provides access to local dive sites, while liveboards enable exploration of a wider regional area.

### Diving Conditions

Biak offers year-round diving suitable for all levels. Sheltered bays are ideal for beginners, while deeper, drift, and technical sites cater to advanced divers. Conditions are generally calm. Peak season runs from April to December. Liveboards typically operate between June and October, adjusting their routes according to monsoon patterns.

## Dive Site and Marine Life Highlights in Biak

Biak offers diverse and memorable diving, from the dramatic Wundi Cave and WWII-era wrecks, such as the Catalina bomber, to vibrant coral walls around Rurbas Island, teeming with a wealth of marine life. Encounters may include reef sharks, mantas, rays, turtles, and macro species such as nudibranchs and frogfish.

Shallow, colorful reefs just two meters deep make Biak ideal for snorkelers of all levels, including children, with frequent sightings of sea turtles and banded sea kraits. Freedivers can explore walls and drop-offs but should follow safety protocols, especially given Biak's remote setting.

## Misool Marine Reserve and No Take Zone

Established in 2005, the Misool Marine Reserve in Raja Ampat covers over 6,000 km<sup>2</sup> of coral reefs, seagrass beds, and mangroves, including a 1,200 km<sup>2</sup> No-Take Zone—one of the most biodiverse coral reef systems on Earth. All forms of fishing and extraction are prohibited, enabling significant biodiversity recovery and reef resilience.

Managed by the Misool Foundation, the reserve combines strict marine protection with community engagement, eco-tourism, and sustainable livelihoods. Local patrols deter illegal activities, while education and partnership programs foster conservation awareness and economic development rooted in environmental stewardship.

## StAR Project Powered by ReShark

ReShark is a global initiative focused on restoring endangered sharks and rays to their natural habitats. In Indonesia, the StAR (Stegostoma tigrinum Augmentation and Recovery) Project aims to address the critically low population of zebra sharks in Raja Ampat, which has declined due to habitat loss and overfishing. While the region benefits from strong marine protections, the slow reproductive rate of zebra sharks hinders their natural recovery.

Led by the Southwest Papua government and Indonesia's Research and Innovation Agency, StAR collaborates with global partners to reintroduce zebra sharks using genetically matched broodstock from accredited aquariums. Through science-based planning, captive breeding, and strong local engagement, the project aims to rebuild a thriving wild population of zebra sharks in Eastern Indonesia.

# Health & Safety for Divers in Indonesia

## Diver Personal Health and Safety Responsibilities

Responsible operators promote safety through dive insurance, certified crews, well-maintained boats and gear, and facilities for both training and recreation. They match sites to diver experience, keep groups small (max four per guide), and follow strict protocols—using DSMBs, respecting depth limits, and postponing dives in unsafe conditions. This lets divers focus on exploration and enjoyment.

## Dive Operator Health and Safety Responsibilities

Stay dive-ready by keeping fit, eating well, hydrating, and getting enough rest. Have dive accident insurance (e.g., DAN) and ensure your gear is serviced before trips. If you haven't dived recently, take a refresher course. Know your limits—stick to certified depths and skip dives if unwell. Also, protect the marine environment by using reef-safe sunscreen, shampoo, and soap, and bring your own eco-friendly products. Preparation and environmental care are key to safe, enjoyable diving.


## Indonesia's Commitment to Safe Diving Practices

Indonesia, home to some of the world's most spectacular dive sites, takes diving safety seriously. With thousands of local and international divers exploring its waters each year, the country has made significant efforts to ensure that safety remains a top priority. In doing so, Indonesia has partnered with several international organizations specializing in diving safety, including the Divers Alert Network (DAN)—a globally recognized leader in dive safety and emergency support.

DAN plays a vital role in supporting diver safety across the archipelago. It provides 24/7 emergency assistance, medical referrals, and training programs for dive professionals, helping to raise safety standards across the industry. Through its comprehensive dive accident insurance, DAN offers coverage for evacuations, medical treatment, and emergency support, available both globally and for divers operating solely within Indonesian waters.

Beyond insurance, DAN actively supports Indonesia's diving infrastructure. Its initiatives include maintaining a nationwide Recompression Chamber Network (RCN) with monitored operational readiness, deploying a local team of doctors trained in dive medicine, and organizing regular safety seminars for dive centers, professionals, and communities.

## DAN in Indonesia (Divers Alert Network)



DAN provides assistance on diving accidents, education and research on underwater activities—with a focus on safety, medicine and first aid, and offers short-term insurance and student coverage for dive centers, with protection extending across all forms of diving. In remote areas, DAN provides oxygen kits to dive operators, ensuring they are prepared even in the most isolated locations. In the context of strategic collaboration, Indonesia, through the Ministry of Tourism, has partnered with DAN for the Diving Safety 1000 Initiatives program, providing education and oxygen equipment assistance to diving communities in Indonesia.

These collective efforts underscore Indonesia's commitment to safe diving practices, ensuring that divers not only experience the beauty of its underwater world but do so with confidence and care.

## SAR in Indonesia (Search & Rescue)



In the event of a diving emergency, Indonesia's National Search and Rescue Agency (Basarnas) serves as the country's primary response force. Tasked with coordinating evacuations, airlifts, and missing diver operations across Indonesia's vast maritime territory, Basarnas maintains 24/7 readiness. The agency deploys helicopters, rescue vessels, and specialized teams to respond rapidly to incidents both on land and at sea.

Effective communication is critical during emergencies. Divers should always confirm that their operator has a reliable protocol in place and established contact with local SAR authorities—ensuring help can be summoned without delay if needed.

## Indonesian Diving Regulations

A quick guide for safe & responsible diving

### MoTCE Regulation No. 15/2014

Sets business standards for dive operators: certification, safety, service, supervision, and sanctions.

### MoT Regulation No. 07/2016

Provides official safety & environmental guidelines for all recreational dives, from planning to marine protection

## Practicalities for Those Visiting Indonesia



### Visas and Passports

There are 15 nationalities eligible for visa-free entry to Indonesia, with a validity of 30 days. Other nationalities can enter with a Visa on Arrival (VoA), which can be obtained upon arrival. The fee is IDR 500,000 (approximately USD 35) and is valid for a maximum stay of 30 days from the first day of arrival. The VoA can be extended for another 30 days, subject to the traveler's eligibility. Travelers are advised to contact the nearest local immigration office in Indonesia. Passports must have at least six months' validity, one blank page, and proof of onward travel.

### Air Travel in Indonesia

Arrive at least 1.5 hours before domestic flights, allowing extra time for potential traffic delays and check-in. For international flights, plan to arrive 2 to 3 hours in advance or follow the instructions on your ticket.



### Baggage Allowances

Domestic airlines typically allow 0–20 kg of checked baggage plus 7 kg of carry-on luggage. Confirm the allowance when booking and consider purchasing extra weight in advance to avoid any issues. Excess baggage fees typically range from IDR 20,000 to IDR 50,000 per kilogram.



## Booking Flights

Most Indonesian domestic airlines can be booked online using a credit card, and tourist flight centers in major cities can also assist. For connecting flights, use the same airline to ensure smoother assistance in case of delays. If changing airlines, allow at least 2 hours between flights.



## Booking Accommodation

Online booking platforms now feature not only high-end resorts but also budget hotels, homestays, and guesthouses, making it easier to secure reservations throughout Indonesia.



## Currency/ Money

The currency is the Indonesian Rupiah (IDR). The best exchange rates are generally found in Bali and Jakarta. Many operators require advance or partial payment, often by credit card (with a 3–8% fee). ATMs are common; however, travelers' checks are not accepted.



## Duty Free

Allowances include 200 cigarettes or 25 cigars or 100g of tobacco, 1 liter of spirits, and a reasonable quantity of perfume.



## Electricity

Indonesia uses 220V/50Hz with two-pin plugs. Power is generally reliable in cities but may be limited or generator-based in remote islands, with some eco-resorts using solar or wind power. Power cuts can occur—switch off unused appliances and carry a small torch.



## Internet Access

Wi-Fi is widely available in cities, resorts, and many hotels—often free but sometimes limited to reception or restaurant areas. Larger hotels may offer in-room access. In remote areas, Wi-Fi may be unavailable or incur extra charges, so check with your operator beforehand.



## Language

Bahasa Indonesia is the official language, though over 700 local languages are still spoken. English is widely used in tourist areas and by dive guides, with some also speaking French, German, Chinese, or Japanese. Many Western resorts employ multilingual instructors.



## Religious Holidays

Indonesia observes many religious holidays, with dates for Muslim and Balinese Hindu events changing yearly. Most operators remain open, but check in advance if visiting affected areas:

**Christmas (25 Dec):** North Sulawesi resorts remain open but may have reduced staff.

**Idul Fitri:** Dates vary; Java and Lombok may have limited services. Ramadan fasting takes place for 30 days before the holiday.

**Nyepi:** Balinese New Year; all activities, including flights and diving, cease. Guests must remain in hotels with limited services.



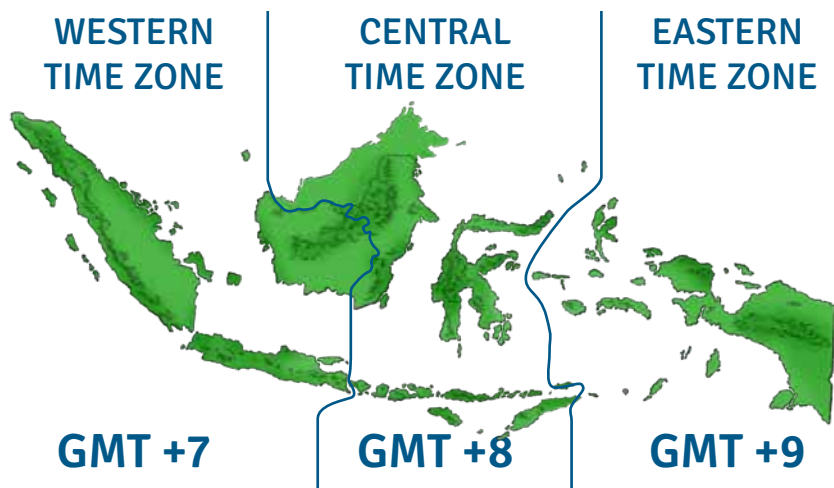
## Telephone Communications

Local SIM cards with prepaid credit (pulsa) are inexpensive and widely available—ensure your phone is unlocked. Ask your dive operator about the best network for their area. Remote regions and liveboards may have limited or no coverage. Many operators carry satellite phones for emergencies, enabling them to contact those who may be unreachable.



## Medication

Bring enough prescribed medication for your trip, along with receipts or prescriptions as proof. Access to doctors and specific medications can be limited. If you are learning to dive, please inform your operator of any medications you are currently taking.



## Time Zones

Indonesia uses three time zones:

**WIB (GMT+7):** for Sumatra, Java, and western/central Kalimantan

**WITA (GMT+8):** for Sulawesi, Bali, Nusa Tenggara, and eastern Kalimantan

**WIT (GMT+9):** for Maluku and Southwest Papua.



## Tipping

Some establishments include a service charge, while others do not; therefore, tips are appreciated, but not compulsory. Dive resorts often provide envelopes for staff tips—check your operator's policy.



## Water

Tap water is not safe to drink. Use bottled or resort-provided potable water. Bring a refillable bottle—many places offer free refills to help reduce plastic waste.



## Vaccinations

Consult your doctor at least two months before travel for recommended vaccinations. Some regions carry a high risk of malaria.
