



THE BORDERPLEX REGION


- THE LABOR FORCE INCREASED BY 3,347 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 4,382 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS DECREASED BY 1,035 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

- EL PASO, TX MSA UNEMPLOYMENT WAS AT 3.9%, WITH A TOTAL OF 16,662 UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS
- EL PASO, TX MSA ADDED 7,200 NONFARM JOBS SINCE APRIL 2024
- EL PASO, TX MSA ADDED 2,100 NONFARM JOBS FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

- THE LABOR FORCE INCREASED BY 202 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

The three Super Sectors with the **GREATEST** employment for the El Paso MSA in April 2025 were:


- 1. Trade, Transportation, and Utilities

- 3. Information


These three Super Sectors represented 9% of the total nonfarm employment.

EMPLOYMENT in April 2025












ACTIVE UI CLAIMANTS BY MONTH BORDERPLEX REGION












