APPRENTICESHIPS

There has never been a better time to recruit an apprentice with support from the Construction Industry Training Board, known as CITB. This booklet will explain all you need to know about the process of hiring an apprentice, and how CITB can support you along the way.

What is an apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship provides the perfect blend of learning at a college or training provider, with on-site experience. This gives apprentices the right mix of learning and technical skills, quickly adding value as an employee to your construction business.

New apprenticeship qualifications, written by Welsh construction employers, were launched in September 2022. Aiming to reduce complexity, improve learning, and ensure learners are fit for the modern workplace.



Apprenticeships help future-proof the industry and provide an excellent way to secure a skilled, diverse future workforce.

CITB Financial Support

A 'levy return' is completed by ALL construction companies registered with CITB.

This funding is then redistributed to construction firms as grants, funding and support available through CITB.

If your wage bill is below £120,000 (PAYE and Net CIS) you will pay no levy, but still have access to all of the following grants and additional funding.

- CITB attendance grant of £2,500 per apprentice per



TYPE OF GRANT	DESCRIPTION OF FUNDING
APPRENTICESHIP GRANT	£2500 per year attendance grant paid every 13 weeks £3,500 achievement grant on successful completion *Additional funding for a Drylining Apprenticeship Click here
INTO WORK GRANT	Grants for completed work experience for an individual on an approved further education course, where work experience started after September 2023 and subsequent grant for 3 months completed direct employment. Click here
SKILLS & TRAINING FUND	Supports employers with their training programme including Leadership & Management Small & Micro sized company - click <u>here</u> Medium sized company - click <u>here</u>
SHORT COURSE GRANTS	Grants for the achievement of approved short courses, which last from 3 hours to 29 days including Leadership & Management. Click <u>here</u>
SHORT QUALIFICATION GRANTS	Grants for the successful completion of approved short qualifications (NVQ, NEBOSH etc) which take less than one year. Click <u>here</u>
LONG QUALIFICATION GRANTS	Grants for approved higher level qualifications (HNC, HND, degree etc) which take more than one year to complete on a part time basis. Click <u>here</u>
TRAVEL TO TRAIN GRANT	Travel - pay grant when the travel costs are more than £20 per week Accommodation - reimbursed at a rate of 80% of the total cost. Click here

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Apprentices paving the way for business growth

V & C (SW) Ltd are a leading South Wales based family run company, specialising in quality interior finishing systems including drylining, wall and floor tiling and painting and decorating. The company considers apprenticeships in all three trades as being a key component of its continuous growth.

V&C registered with CITB in 2014 with less than 10 staff, classing themselves as a micro company. Over the years, their commitment to skills development and training, has helped transform them into an industry leading SME in South Wales.

Boasting a number of awards, including 'Apprentice Contractor of the Year' and recently celebrating one of their tiling apprentices representing Wales at the Skill Build National Final 2023, V&C now have a workforce of over 100 employees. This allows them to tender for and manage contracts on new build sites across the South Wales M4 corridor.

Richard Mansfield, Operations Manager of V&C (SW) Ltd said:

"V&C (SW) Ltd introduced its apprenticeship program over 5 years ago after recognising that one of the biggest constraints to growing the business was going to be sourcing suitably qualified and skilled tradespeople that could develop with the business.

This program has subsequently developed to V&C (SW) Ltd employing as many as 25 apprentices at any one time across the three trades. Something that would not have been possible without the support of the CITB Team, the financial



support received through the apprentice attendance grants and then the ongoing skills and personal development of individuals through the Skills and Training Fund and employers network.

At V&C (SW) Ltd we believe in actively participating in college presentations and employer open days, being a valued member of the local training group, and being a proactive advocate for ensuring high standards in training provision at local colleges.

This helps to ensure apprentices are supported and receive the right levels of training throughout their course. This in turn then ensures the best candidates progress through the industry.
