


Each lesson we are going to present a story from the bible. It may come from the Old Testament (before Jesus was born) or from the New Testament (after Jesus was born).

Joseph hated by his brothers



The Saints



Saint John Bosco

Saint John Bosco lived in northern Italy as a priest who loved children. He started a Religious order called the Salesians, who spent their lives helping and working with children.

St Bosco had a great devotion to Our Lady, under the title of "Mary, Help of Christians. In fact, he built a huge basilica in her honor.

He could read the souls of the boys he taught. If they committed a mortal sin, he could read it on their foreheads.

Everywhere he went, there were great miracles; people were being converted, broken bones being mended, raising people from the dead and much more.

He also had many dreams, these dreams were actually messages from God and Our Lady telling Don Bosco what to do. His first 'dream' was when he was nine years old. In this dream, Mary told him that his life was to look after boys, to make the bad boys good. He spent his whole life doing this. Among his students was Saint Dominic Savio.


Don Bosco also took care of girls, he also started up the Salesian Nuns (daughters of Mary) to look after them.

The Rosary

In Level two, we are going to study the Holy Rosary in depth.

We are going to look at its history, how to say it and why we should say it every day.

We are going to see why it pleases Our Blessed Mother so much.

By learning about the Rosary, we are learning about Mary.







In this first lesson, we are going to learn about the history of the Rosary and where it came from.

Over 800 years ago, a man named Dominic was born. He was sent to become the great Saint Dominic. When Saint Dominic was a young man, there were many evil men who hated Jesus and hated truth. They were called Albigensian. They destroyed homes, they burned churches and they killed Catholics, especially priests and nuns.

St Dominic fought against the Albigenses by starting a religious order called the 'Order of Preachers'; they are usually referred to as Dominicans.

To help Saint Dominic, Our Blessed Mother appeared to him and gave him a most powerful weapon, a spiritual weapon, the Holy Rosary. Our Lady taught him to pray the Rosary and now because of Saint Dominic, the Catholic world now prays the Rosary of Our Lady.

There have been so many miracles through the Rosary over the years, which we will learn in later lessons.

The Chasuble

The Chasuble is the outer vestment we see priests wear during Mass. Chasuble comes from the Latin word *casula* which means a *little house*.

There are two types of chasuble. The illustration on the next page is of a Gothic chasuble which is long and flowing.

The other type of chasuble is called a Roman Chasuble. This type of Chasuble is smaller and gives more freedom to the arms.

Depending on the feast, the priest wears different color chasubles. The colors he uses are as follows:

White — Worn on the feasts of Our Lord and Our Lady, confessors and Popes.

Violet (purple)→ Worn during Lent

Green — Worn on Sundays after Pentecost

Black — Worn on Good Friday and masses for the dead.

Rose (pink) Worn on the 4th Sunday in Lent and 3rd Sunday in Advent

Gold — Used on great feasts in the place of white and red.

The child will learn prayers such as the "The Angelus" . The student will become more familiar with Old and New Testament bible stories, such as the trials of Joseph and Moses. They will learn about the Rosary, it's mysteries, history and Our Lady of Fatima, and introducing more wonderful lives of the saints. The Seven corporal works of Mercy are presented and explained in this Level. The Catholic Teaching Manual is a perfect continuation of Level 1, by expanding on the truths learnt in Level 1. It is full of illustrations and high quality photographs to help express the faith in its full glory while educating the child.
