should have flown south on her own. The ever-changing environment has affected the timing of bird migration patterns and this little girl missed her opportunity before northern temperatures fell. She arrived at the Sanctuary with such badly frostbitten feet that toes had to be removed leaving her unable to survive in the wild.

Black bears Tehya and Kiona were orphaned as young cubs when their mother was killed. As they were being raised in an urban environment where residents were feeding them, the girls had no fear of humans and weren't equipped for life in the wild. Life in



THE HUMAN CONNECTION

Almost 6,000 wildlife patients come to the Sanctuary annually, many due to harm inflicted by humans. Gunshot wounds, being hit by cars, tangled in fishing line, electrocution, kept illegally as pets, attacked by people's pet, the list goes on and on.

OUR WILDLIFE PREDICT OUR FUTURE

- Scientists use the health and welfare of our wildlife as indicators of the health and welfare of our environment. The American River Otter and American Crocodile are dying at a rapid rate in the wild. This means that their ecosystem (and ours) are headed for danger.
- 1,000 people per day are moving into Florida. Our natural wildlife habitats are shrinking as new homes and roads are built and traffic increases.
- Our food supply is dependent upon pollination, not only by butterflies and bees, but by bats, moths and several other animal species. When they and their habitats are threatened, so is the food we put on our tables.
- The introduction of exotic species, like iguanas and Burmese pythons, by humans to the Everglades, Florida's crucial water and wetland resource, has and continues to threaten the life and health of hundreds of our native species and can cause

serious economic damage.

SAVE OUR WILDLIFE - SAVE OUR PLANET

Did you know, when Bald Eagles, found in 49 US states, were mysteriously dying in the 1970s, it was discovered that the cause was the pesticide DDT, used to keep crops and livestock pest-free. Once DDT was outlawed, the eagles thrived and populations soared again. With all of our help, we can make a difference and help

our wildlife survive and thrive.

DOING OUR PART


