





Prophetic Enlightenment

[Isaiah 55:8-9] 8 "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord. 9 "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts. (NIV)

It's easy to get wrapped up in our own logic and thinking. Sometimes, we might feel we can guess what is going to happen next because of our experience in a given situation. This might be useful on the job while utilizing our expertise in various situations – but it doesn't work very well with God.

We don't fully understand God, and often times what we think is going to 'happen next' can turn out to be something different altogether. I am fond of a particular Scripture that highlights this concept. You may read Matthew chapter 16 for the full context. Jesus encourages Peter that it is God who revealed to him that Jesus is the Christ.

In Matthew 16:17-19, Jesus encourages Peter for having the revelation from God that He (Jesus) is the Christ.

Jesus then explains that He must go to Jerusalem to suffer and be crucified. Peter exclaims that such a thing shall never happen to Him! In the next breath, Jesus rebukes Peter by addressing Satan within him. I wonder how Peter might have felt, going from high praise to a sharp rebuke in a matter of two yerses.

Sometimes we get a really good prophetic word and it might go to our head. Its intention is to encourage us to keep going forward and not give up – but we don't always see God's intention. Like Peter, we might become a little too bold after a good word. It doesn't mean there isn't some evil lurking within us. It doesn't mean God condones our sin. God still sees our sin and shortcomings. The truth is never 'on pause' it's just not being brought out at the moment.

Too many times we ride the roller coaster of prophetic glory. We listen to other people's words and condemn them, or grow jealous of them. This shouldn't be so, and there could be a strong rebuke right around the corner.

We should take everything God says and discern His truth that He is speaking to us. Let's be encouraged by His goodness, but not get lost in it. We can stumble and fall as easily as the next person, but if we're working on our own problems with God and praying for others struggling there is less room for the enemy to come in and work.

Sometimes big brother or big sister needs to step in and fight on your behalf. This is a hard call to make because we never really know aside from the Spirit what is really going on in a person's heart.

There are some things on this earth that we will just never understand because we are unable to see them from the perspective of God. We cannot get bogged down with these things. We just need to take a step back, self-evaluate, and then figure out where the next opportunity is for us to offer aid and comfort to those in the Body of Christ. A Hope Story

Recently I ran across a story of a young women who had a massive stroke and wasn't expected to live by the end of the night. Her husband came home in between classes (law school) and found her, which he was able to call 911. She was conscious while getting on the stretcher, feeling embarrassed thinking everyone was probably over thinking it, but found herself losing consciousness on the stretcher. She woke up 2 ½ months later in the hospital unsure as to what happened to her.

Yes, she was in a comma like state due to a massive bleeding on the brain. The morning of her stroke, she woke up feeling funny, but she had been feeling funny for 6 months. At that time, she had her first child 6 months ago and thought nothing of it. When she reached the hospital, the doctor told her husband she had AMV, which is like a brain aneurysm, and this was the worst case the doctor had ever seen. Apparently, she had this from birth, but it went undetected until the age of 26, when this scary event took place. The growth grew and exploded leaving her life in the hands of the doctor.

The doctor was scheduled to have an 8-hour operation, but it took 16 hours to move some things around in her body in hope of saving her life. While waiting through the surgery, her husband and church family worship the Lord in the waiting room, believing she would make it through. The doctor came out and said to her husband and church family, she's alive. He wasn't sure how her life would be after surgery but at least she still has life.

She came out of the surgery forever changed. She had to learn life all over again. The stroke changed the features of her body, she talks from the side of her mouth, she had to learn how to walk again in which she hardly can stand. She was in a lot of pain. It was horrific for her. However, as time went on, she knew God didn't make a mistake by leaving her here on the earth. She understood the great physician made a sacrifice in order that she may live.

Isn't that just like God? Sending Jesus to earth as a sacrificial lamb, so that we might live? Her story is so profound. She has sorrow and joy in her pain. Her life was forever change but she knows that she has to live a life worthy of her calling and if God allowed for her to live in such a way, she believes God called her to this state and it's up to her how her story plays out.

are some of them: you fear the offense will be repeated; hanging onto the grudge gives you a sense of control in an unfair situation; The pain you experienced altered your life, and yet no one has ever validated that what you went through was wrong; Forgiveness feels like it trivializes, minimizes, or worse yet, makes what happened as no big deal; You still feels hurt; you're not ready to forgive; you can't possibly forgive when you still feel hostile towards the one who hurt you; the other person hadn't apologized or even acknowledge their wrong doing; you don't think any good will come from forgiveness, these are just some of the reasons that people don't forgive, but all they are really doing is keeping themselves in a

pit of their own making because of unforgiveness. When your heart has been shattered and reshaped into something that doesn't quite feel normal inside your own chest yet, forgiveness feels a bit unrealistic. At first you

say it is to soon, and years later, it is to late.

There are many feelings that will hold you back from forgiveness, here

Romans 8:18-32, 37

For I consider [from the standpoint of faith] that the sufferings of the present life are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is about to be revealed to us and in us! For [even the whole] creation [all nature] waits eagerly for the children of God to be revealed. For the creation was subjected to frustration and futility, not willingly [because of some intentional fault on its part], but by the will of Him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will also be freed from its bondage to decay [and gain entrance] into the glorious freedom of the children of God.

For we know that the whole creation has been moaning together as in the pains of childbirth until now. And not only this, but we too, who have the first fruits of the Spirit [a joyful indication of the blessings to come], even we groan inwardly, as we wait eagerly for [the sign of] our adoption as sons—the redemption and transformation of our body [at the resurrection]. For in this hope we were saved [by faith]. But hope [the object of] which is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he already sees? WHAT CAUSES BAD BREATH

SNORING – Your mouth can get dry if you snore or sleep with it open and that makes it an even better home to bacteria that cause "morning beath." You're more likely to snore if you sleep on your back. Snoring can be a sign of sleep apnea. Not flossing or brushing your teeth before bed can cut down on food in your teeth which causes bacteria to grow.

GUM DISEASE – If your breath has a metallic smell, you might have bacteria growing under your gum line that can lead to inflammation and infection called periodontitis. You're more likely to have it if you smoke or don't brush and floss regularly.

ACID REFLUX – This condition makes stomach acid flow back into the tube that connects your throat to your stomach (esophagus). It can give your breath a sour smell and bring up bits of food or liquid into your mouth. The acid can damage your throat and mouth, and that can make a breeding ground for more smelly bacteria.

DIABETES – Fruity breath can be a sign that your body is using fat for fuel instead of sugar (glucose). That means you're running very low on insulin.

H. PYLORI – This kind of bacteria is linked to stomach cancer and ulcers. It can cause bad breath and you may have nausea, heartburn, stomachache or indigestion too.

RESPIRATORY INFECTIONS – Colds, coughs and sinus infections can send mucus filled with bacteria through your nose and mouth. That can affect your breath. It usually goes away once you get over your cold.

MEDICATION – Some meds cause bad breath because they dry out your mouth. Other drugs like nitrates and heart conditions, chemotherapy for cancer and some sleep aids, release chemicals that can make your breath smell when they break down in your body. This can also happen if you take a lot of vitamins

TREATMENT

- * Brush your teeth at lease twice a day, after every meal and before bedtime.
 - * Floss your teeth everyday
- * Use a toothpaste that contains fluoride
- * Arrange for an appointment with your dentist for cleaning at least twice a year
- * You can get over-the-counter toothpastes, mouthwashes and moisturizers just for dry mouth

Because Satan wants to outdo God, he is constantly looking for anything he can use against anyone and looking for ways to have a legal right – a way to have an authority over you, to keep you away from God and to take you to hell with him.

Satan does not hesitate to go to the Courts of Heaven and accuse you of all the mistakes, flaws, sins, and even your ignorance in areas to God. He wants God to have to hand over the right or authority to do what he wills. This is why it was so important for Jesus to be our advocate in the Courts of Heaven. Jesus speaks against these actions and when we repent, change our ways, and even study the Word of God this gives Jesus more "evidence" to use against the enemy and have the rulings go in your favor.

So what are some of these authorities that Satan has since Jesus took all authority from Satan? First, Satan, himself, has been given a temporary limited authority over different things of the world – things that are NOT of God -, but it has not changed the fact that he has been judged, and he WILL serve his sentence – not in hell – but the ETERNAL LAKE OF FIRE. Satan knows this but his pride keeps him in the delusion that he will overdo God. But just like he found out on that Resurrection day when JESUS DEFEATED HIM – he will see he had already lost a long time ago and the time will be up and it will be time for him to serve out his sentence.

So where is the enemy's true authority at? There are a few places. But first, I wanted to show you something to understand how to take that authority away and KEEP it away.


When you become born again, this takes the authority of Satan's hands of being of the world. You become believers and followers of Christ through salvation won for you at the cross. Satan becomes defeated in your life and his only weapon is WHAT HE THROWS AT YOU!

This is why you find the key to fighting the enemy each and every day is found in Ephesians 6. That as you stay strong in the Lord, it is in HIS STRENGTH that you are able to fight off these attacks. Ephesians 6:10 10Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might.

That is what your battle is. You are fighting the fiery darts of the enemy, including the principalities, powers, rulers of darkness, and spiritual wickedness in high places—all which are at the hand of Satan. BUT God has given you the armor to defeat these attacks and it is very important to use this weapon EVERY day to keep areas closed so that access cannot be attained by the enemy.

Ephesians 6:11 Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.
