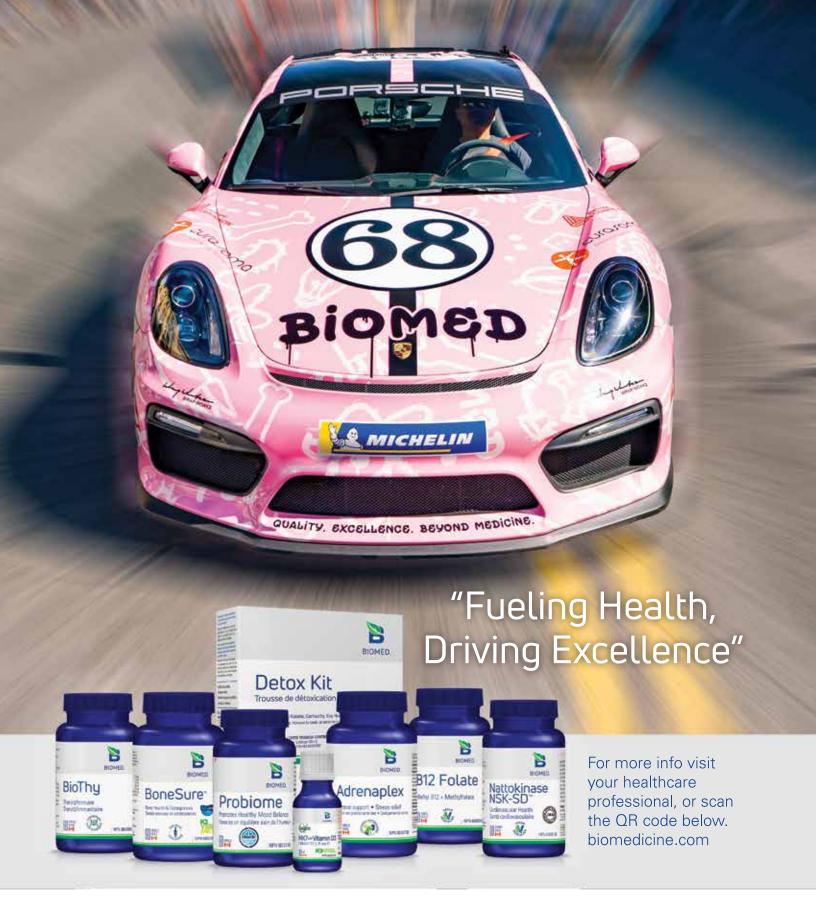

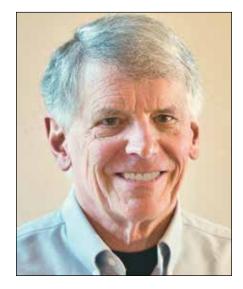

# Acquired by a much younger man

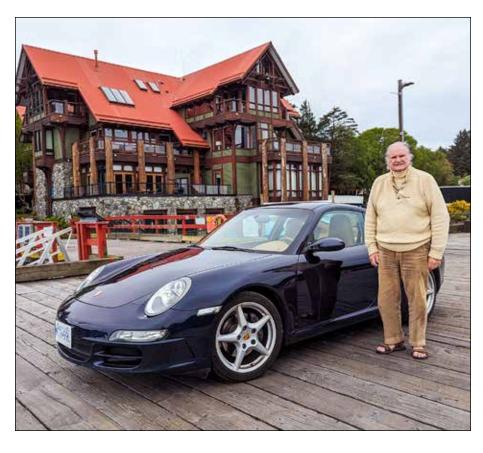
The bidding was furious.

aving spent the past 75 years "messing about in boats" all over the world, when my bride of 56 years informed me that she didn't wish to step aboard anything less than the Queen Mary II for the rest of her life, it became somewhat obvious that my life was about to change. What should I do?

If I "majored" in boats, my "minors" were retrievers (seven in all) and cars. I owned a red Porsche 356B during my military years, and in the '80s, I restored a Ferrari 400i and a '62 Vette. So, what should I buy? My Vette, although pretty, drove like a buckboard wagon, and the Ferrari experience was extremely costly. Ferraris are always bought retail and sold wholesale.

I have lunched for over 50 years with a group of "car guys", several of whom have won their class as well as judged at Pebble Beach (Bentley, Bristol, Lagonda, Alfa Romeo). Conversations always included either long technical dissertations ("grommet" building in their machine shops) or expensive non-existent replacement parts from the old



country, or breakdown experiences on a long drive to White Rock.

Having repeatedly burned myself on hot manifolds and suffered numerous cuts from hose clamps on my various boats, I had no desire to follow their classic car passion. So, remembering my carefree experiences in the red sled of my early years, I thought about an older Porsche. My favourite, the 993, was just too difficult for my 85-year-old frame to manage, but the first-generation 997 water-cooled model fit the bill, both in terms of size and reliability.

I decided that, even more importantly, the car should be midnight blue with tan leather. Little did I know that in the Porsche world, this was a tough find. But, as in all things, fate intervened. I was introduced to the Bring a Trailer website, and magically, when I first visited, a 2005 911 in midnight blue metallic/sand beige with a manual transmission popped up on auction five days hence. Not only was it the perfect colour and size, but it had only 11k miles on the odometer. I had to own that car.

I enlisted the help of my car guys to coach me on the necessary moves to play the auction game, arranged a standby computer, and when the day came, I was nervous yet ready. The bidding was furious (eight bidders), but when the dust settled, I was victorious (and paid \$10k over the market value).

When settling the accounts with the vendor, I learned that the low mileage was partly due to the owner being 84 and rarely driving the car during his 17 years of ownership. I informed him with great joy that the Porsche had been purchased by a much younger man of 82.

In the four years of my Porsche ownership, I have put on 17k miles, the majority of which have been club drives. We have driven almost all the paved roads on Vancouver Island and BC/Alberta from Vernon to Banff, the Waterton Lakes and "Going to the Sun" in Montana. It has also been a great joy to get to know the club's great members and officers. I hope to enjoy another four years with the gang.

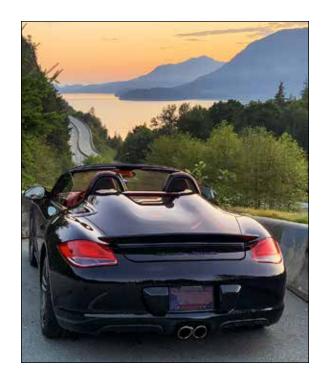

# **Black Rock Resort Tour**

We board at "zero-dark-hundred".

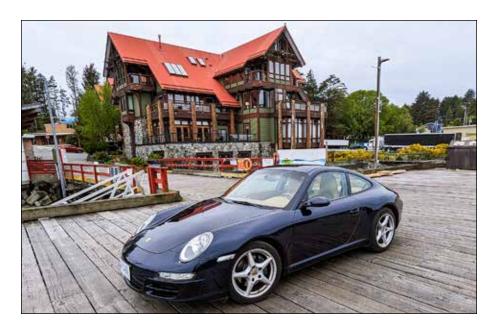

he Black Rock Resort tour began with 18 Porsches boarding the Vancouver Island ferry at "zero-darkhundred" in the morning. First stop was the Skywalk Malahat viewing attraction. 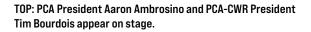

## **HPDE: Ridge Motorsports**

I expected a familiar experience, but I was wrong.

was hooked after my first PCA-CWR
High Performance Driver Education
(HPDE) event at Mission Raceway
Park, which I wrote about in the Winter
2024 edition of C2Sky magazine. The
thrill of pushing my Porsche Taycan 4S
in a controlled, safe environment left me
wanting more. So, when the next HPDE
event was announced, I signed up immediately. I expected a familiar experience.

I was wrong. This time, the venue was the Ridge Motorsports Park in Shelton, Washington. From the very first sighting lap, I knew I was out of my depth. The Ridge isn't just a step up from Mission; it's an entirely different league. The track is long, wide, and technical, featuring blind crests, dramatic elevation changes, and a straight so fast it makes Turn One more about nerve than mechanics. I came off the track at the end of the session flustered, wondering what I had gotten myself into.

Thankfully, my instructor, Steve Wu,

was calm and helpful. I admitted I felt completely lost, and that's when we reset. We 'walked the track', a method of mentally visualizing and rehearsing the track, corner by corner, to build focus and muscle memory. That, along with a few instructor-led laps, both with me driving and me riding shotgun, began to unlock the flow of the track for me.

And what a track it is. Each corner at the Ridge has its rhythm. One that stood out was just after a downhill section that demanded an understanding of weight transfer. The trick was to brake exactly when the car's suspension squats under load. Nail it, and the car settles perfectly into the turn. Miss it, and you're either braking too early or fighting a floaty front end.

But, this learning process came at a price of sweat. It was a hot day. After just 20 minutes in the car, I was drenched despite the air conditioning. I realized that the purists run their cars with the



A/C off to maximize power; this was a level of commitment I wasn't ready for. A pro tip I followed was to drink lots of water, even if you're not thirsty. Your mind and body need hydration to stay sharp. My Taycan needed attention, too. Tire pressures would rise four to six psi during a session, so we'd start at a surprisingly low 32 psi, which is well below the 40 psi on the door sticker.

By lunchtime, I was wiped out. I decided to skip the next session, drove 20 minutes to a fast charger, grabbed a quick bite, and returned refreshed with a recharged car and recharged brain. Back on track, we focused on refining specific





corners. I cleaned up my lines, improved my patience on turn-ins, and dialled in my braking.

Only one demon remained, which was Turn One at the end of the long straight. I was braking way too early purely out of fear. I couldn't shake the feeling that my Taycan, being heavier, couldn't do what my instructor's lighter Carrera T could. To prove his point, my instructor took the driver's seat in my Taycan. In the very corner, I was hesitating, he braked much later and carried speed with total control. The car didn't flinch, and it became clear to me that it wasn't the car; it was me.

In the next session, I held my nerve, ignored the inner voice urging me to brake, and let the car run. The result was a clean, fast corner and a grin that stretched from ear to ear.

By the last session or two, my instructor had little to say as I was making good progress. But I was also nearing the end of my energy. Then Scott Newbury, the ever-enthusiastic HPDE Chair, offered me a final ride in his Porsche 996. I couldn't say no. Watching him attack the track was like witnessing art in motion, fluid, fast, and composed. It was the perfect way to end the day.

Once again, the PCA-CWR team delivered an unforgettable experience—safe, structured, and endlessly fun. I left the Ridge tired but thrilled, with more knowledge, greater confidence, and with a whole new respect for both my Taycan and the track.

It passes through a huge mountainside snowshed as it ascends above the tree line to reach the windswept rocky summit of 1,244 meters.

To my right, several 18-wheelers with their hazard lights flashing were slowly crawling up the steep mountain highway in the right lane. I position my Porsche in the far-left lane with my left turn indicator on, effortlessly accelerating past them. Meanwhile, I stay alert for wildlife, such as grizzly bears, whitetailed deer, and bighorn sheep, that might suddenly enter the highway.

As I approached Merritt, I exited onto Hwy 5A eastbound, eventually connecting to Hwy 97C east and then to Hwy 97 north towards West Kelowna. My route took me across the William R. Bennett floating concrete bridge on beautiful Okanagan Lake into downtown Kelowna and continued north to Vernon. Driving my Porsche to Vernon for five hours marked the beginning of my luxury vacation.

I'm genuinely excited to spend the next four nights at the Sparkling Hill Resort and Spa, a four-diamond adults-only property. This is my first visit to this

During my stay, I learned that the resort displays over 3.5 million Swarovski crystals throughout common areas, 149 guest rooms, the KurSpa, restaurants, and banquet facilities.

The heart and soul of the resort is the KurSpa, a combination of the German word for 'healing' and the Latin word for 'water.' KurSpa embodies Sparkling Hill's wellness spa philosophy of 'healing by water.'

As British Columbia's largest luxury

spa, it offers a sprawling 3,716 sq. meters of relaxation, nearly double the size of the convention space beneath the iconic sails at Canada Place in Vancouver. 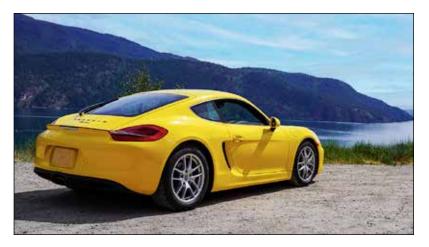
A network of hiking trails surrounds the resort, providing an opportunity to enjoy the outdoors and justify indulging in those delicious meals.

We had exclusive access to their event tent, a tasty charcuterie spread and a visit from the winery dog. A great end to a great event day.

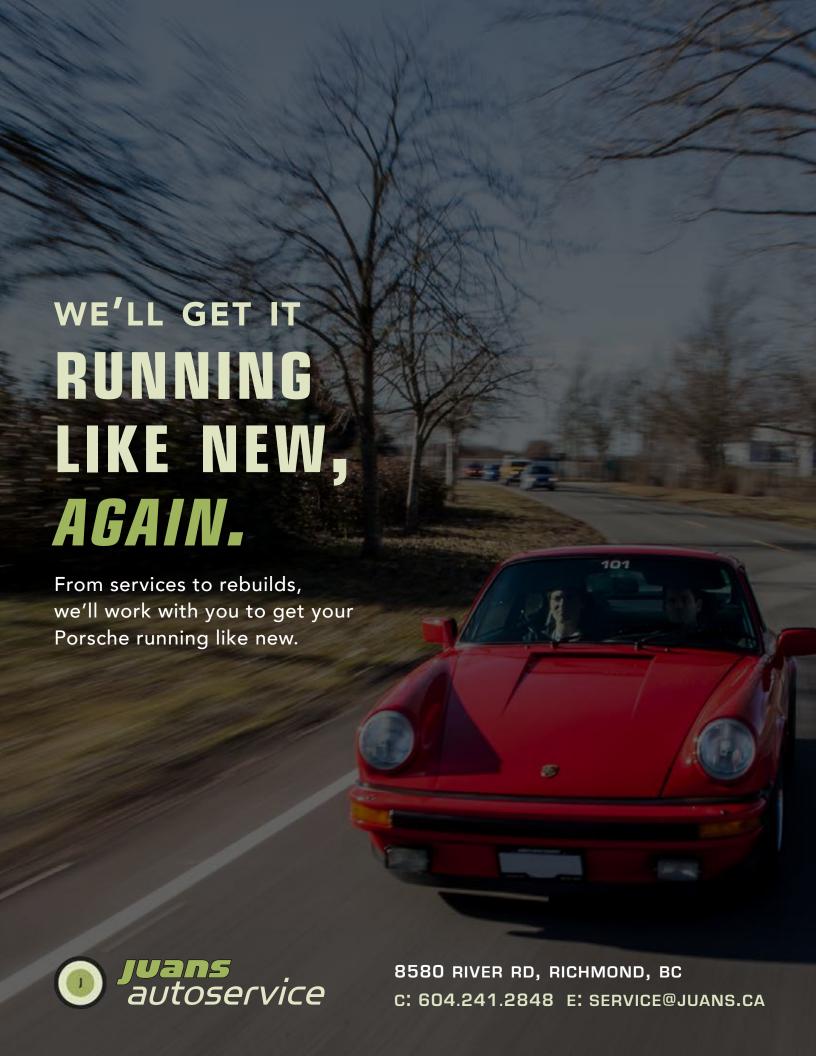

Looking forward to the next event I can attend.





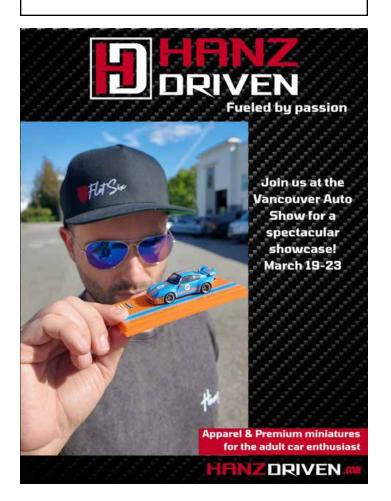

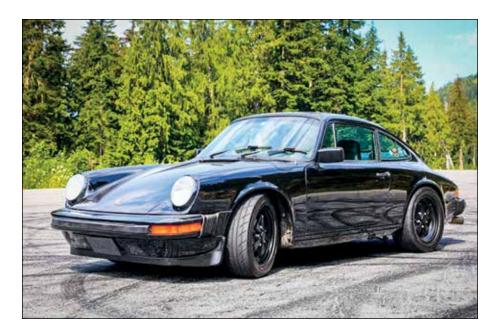

# 911: A legacy in the garage

n 1991, I stumbled upon my dream car—a stunning 1977 Porsche 911—at Eurotech Automotive, a small local dealership and repair shop. From the moment I laid eyes on it, I knew I had to make it mine. That first drive was nothing short of exhilarating, and it marked the beginning of a beautiful adventure with my beloved Porsche! They were bringing in clean cars from the U.S., and this one caught my eye. I think I was the third owner, but by that point, the car had already lived a full life. Still, it was solid and rust-free-just tired from its 14 years of daily wear. Later that same year, I tore it down for a body restoration... in a car park beside our building. Not exactly a state-of-the-art facility, but the spirit was there. I had it repainted black, which suited it better than any colour I could imagine.

Not long after, I had the opportunity to upgrade the engine and I swapped in a 3.2 from an '86. Unfortunately,

the paperwork didn't survive the years (or maybe one of my "organizational systems"), but the engine gave the car a whole new spirit. It was my daily driver, my fun machine, and our ticket to countless Porsche club events-autocross, track days, and the legendary Whistler Weekend.

In 1995, my wife and I drove it down to the Porsche Parade in Portland. We entered the concours and after many hours of detailing and polishing, we took second place—only beaten by a flawless garage queen. Ours had stories in the tires, and a few scars of a life well-lived, but it held its own.

By 2003, the car had been retired to our garage. I dreamed of fixing it up with my son, Connor, who was already racing go-karts and had a natural talent for speed. He was just ten years old at the time, but I believed that with a few years of dedicated work, I could have

the car in shape by the time he started driving. When he turned 15, he won a North American Karting Championship, proving that speed and driving skill were definitely in his blood. Meanwhile, the car still occupied space in the garage.

Well, you know how life goes.

I had a few bursts of momentumone in 2008, another in 2013. I even dropped the engine and sent it off for a rebuild. But each time, something else took priority. A job, a trip, a leaky roof. Connor moved out, and every now and then would ask, "What's going on with the 911?" And I'd sigh and say, "Still waiting." But I think the car knew it was still loved. It just waited patiently.

A fun side note: when Connor was born, I was editing Timberline, our local PCA magazine. I slipped in a little birth announcement that mentioned his weight-9 lbs, 11 oz. Naturally, we joked that he was born to inherit the 911.

Fast forward to earlier this year. My wife and I were in India for two months, enjoying a long-awaited journey. Three days into the trip, I get a photo on my phone. There's my little black 911, on the back of a flat deck. My heart jumped.

Turns out, Connor's birthday gift to me the year before was finishing the car. He didn't tell me when or how, just quietly got it done. It turned into a bigger job (and a much pricier one) than either of us expected, but he was committed. When we returned home, the car was back in the garage, clean, complete, and calling my name.

The day I sat in it again and turned the key—it had been 22 years—was a deeply emotional moment. All the memories flooded back: the road trips, the track days, the times his mom drove him to school in it, and how the other kids (and dads) would gaze at it. It was always his car, really. I was just the steward for a while.

It's not just a car. It's a family story. A timeline. A shared passion between father and son. And now-finally-it's back on the road where it belongs. Maybe it's time for a road trip.

# **Battery Banter**

critical but often overlooked component in our vehicles is the battery. Many owners never give a second thought about their batteries until they find themselves stranded somewhere with a dead vehicle, or late for work on a chilly morning because the engine won't crank. The power supplied by batteries to our vehicles is important for multiple reasons, not just starting the car. In this discussion, I will cover the basic functions of batteries and important maintenance practices for good health and maximum longevity.

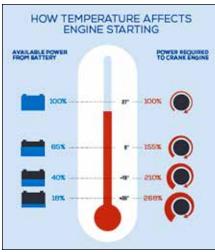
For clarity, I will only be referring to batteries installed in vehicles with internal combustion engines. Batteries used to store & supply power to hybrid electric or full electric vehicles are a different topic and would require a technical discussion all on their own.

#### **Battery Function**

At first glance, a car battery may seem like a simple component, but it holds a chemical concoction that's far more powerful than it looks. Without a reliable car battery, your car would have no source of power. The battery's ability to store energy and supply it on demand makes it the heart of the vehicle's power system. If your battery is low on power or deteriorating, other electrical systems will suffer.

The battery does not stop working once the engine is started and the vehicle is running. It keeps working all the while you are driving the car. The battery is busy storing and supplying power to various components whenever you need it. While the car is moving, there is a chance of a voltage spike due to the overuse of some of the components. The battery acts as a surge protector in such situations and absorbs the extra voltage, preventing possible damage to the electrical system.





Here are a few examples of components affected by your car's battery:

- · Headlights, taillights, and indicator lights
- · Power windows and seats
- · Heating & air conditioning systems
- · Wipers and window defroster grids
- · Audio and infotainment system
- Built-in cameras & proximity sensors
- Charging ports and other accessories
- · Restraint & air bag deployment systems

Suffice to say, without a properly functioning battery, our vehicles would struggle to meet the demands of the various electrical systems in place.

#### **Battery Trouble**

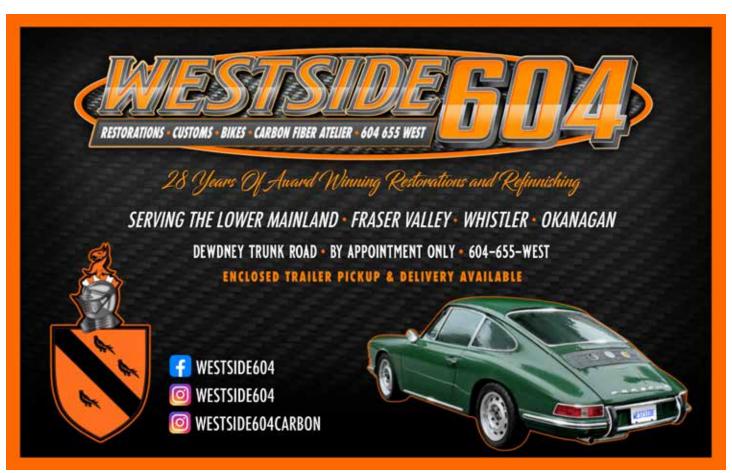
How many of us at one time or another

found ourselves dealing with a dead battery or a vehicle that just won't start? It usually happens at the worst possible time or location, and most of the time, there are no warning signs. Batteries have an amazing ability to seemingly work flawlessly one day...and have us scrambling for Roadside Assistance the very next day. How energy is stored and consumed can be affected by various external forces, including weather, electrical component draw, and driver error.

Let's say you decide a weekend at Sun Peaks Ski Resort would fit nicely over spring break. The SUV is loaded up, and an early start in Vancouver gives you no sign of the impending trouble ahead. After arriving at Sun Peaks and parking your vehicle for 2 nights, your vehicle battery is completely dead the morning of your return trip home. How can that be?

Let's start with the change of environment, namely, ambient temperature. When you leave Vancouver, the outside temp is 8C, but the morning of your return is a brisk -10C. A marginal battery at 8C can seem perfectly fine and will require less demand starting your vehicle, but while sitting in below oC temps, the electrical capacity diminishes greatly. Add in the load you are now asking from your battery to overcome the stiff fluids in your engine crankcase, and you might be lucky to hear a clunk from your starting motor...if anything at all. A boost will most likely get you going again, and by the time you get back to







the balmy coast, your battery seems fine, so no need for any further investigation, right? Wrong!

Regular battery maintenance & performance checks are just as critical as your tires or fluids. The absolute best thing you can do for your battery is DRIVE your car

regularly, 2-3 times a week minimum for optimal conditioning. The next best thing is NOT leaving your lights or any other accessories powered on until the battery is dead. There is no quicker way to diminish your battery's storage capacity than



higher if you plan on using your vehicle in extreme weather environments. Replacing your own battery isn't that difficult if you follow correct procedures, but keep in mind that most newer vehicles will need some programming done to let the computers know of the change. Today's vehicles can overcharge

> & damage a newly installed battery if the software is not reset. This would not be considered a warrantable failure by the battery manufacturer or reseller. so owner beware. Other issues, like radio security codes, could also be affected, so be sure to have this

info on hand if you plan on doing the job vourself.

Modern vehicles have batteries located in seemingly awkward or difficult places to access on the vehicle, sometimes under the rear seats or deep in the trunk compartment. It may seem like manufacturers are attempting to make servicing more difficult, but nothing could be further from the truth. Locating batteries deep in the chassis protects them from damage in the event of an accident or collision. If the vehicle is involved in a head-on collision, the battery is the only source of energy to activate all the safety devices (airbags, seat belt restraints, etc.) and send out SOS signals via integrated GPS systems. A damaged battery cannot perform these functions effectively and could mean the

difference between life or death for the occupants of the vehicle.

If you store your vehicle for extended periods of time, connecting and using a battery maintainer is paramount. I personally have several 10+ year old batteries in my vehicles due to proper maintenance and storage procedures. There are multiple manufacturers of battery maintainers, but I have found Battery Tender products to be the best bang for buck. I have been using their Battery Tender Junior model for over 20 years with excellent results. If you park your vehicle for longer than 30 days at a time and are currently not using a maintainer, do some research and find the best fit for your specific situation.



Following these simple guidelines should provide you with relatively trouble-free motoring. That said, sometimes our vehicle electrical systems have faults causing excessive battery drain, and these problems will need to be addressed to maintain the health of your battery. Don't ignore warning lights or troublesome electrical functions, as replacing batteries to mask other issues gets expensive in a hurry!

to deplete the stored energy completely. The number of times this happens, the greater the damage to the battery. If you have boosted your battery multiple times to recover from similar instances, you're living on borrowed time. It won't show up right away, and our moderate climate on the coast can mask the issue, but eventually you will find yourself soliciting a jump start...or worse.

#### **Battery Maintenance**

If your preferred maintenance technician is not already including a battery health report as part of your fluid change intervals, I would suggest requesting this service next time you are due for an oil change. If a battery change is recommended, stick to the minimum cold cranking amperage (CCA) requirements listed by the vehicle manufacturer, or

orsche unveils the new 911 Cup the latest evolution of its one-make cup racing car for the Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup, the various Carrera Cup championships, and other Porschesanctioned series. This new model will line up on the grid from the start of the 2026 season. Based on the 992.2 generation of the 911, the latest edition of the acclaimed predecessor features numerous detailed refinements.

Development efforts focused on enhancing performance, maintaining reasonable operating costs, and simplifying handling for both drivers and teams. The naturally aspirated 4.0-litre six-cylinder boxer engine now delivers an increased output of 382 kW (520 PS), a 10 PS increase.

This has proven highly successful: since production began at the end of 2020, Porsche Motorsport has built 1,130 units of the current 911 GT3 Cup. To date, a total of 5,381 Porsche 911 vehicles has been produced as one-make racing cars.

"Like its successful predecessors, the new 911 Cup pushes boundaries. It combines series components from our GT sports cars with pure

racing technology to create a coherent and performance-based overall concept," emphasizes Thomas Laudenbach, Vice President Porsche Motorsport. "Driving the 911 Cup has always been regarded as a challenge. And we want to keep it that way because it also serves as the training platform for our Porsche Juniors. The success of this concept is evident in its countless race and championship victories."

Michael Dreiser, Director Sales Porsche Motorsport: "The Cup race car based on the 911 is one of the best-selling racing cars in the world. Alongside the 718 GT4 RS Clubsport, it forms the demanding basis of our motorsport pyramid and is used globally in our one-make cup series. But its success extends far beyond that: the secret lies in its versatility. Cup cars regularly achieve strong overall results in endurance races, open GT competitions, and a myriad of other racing events."

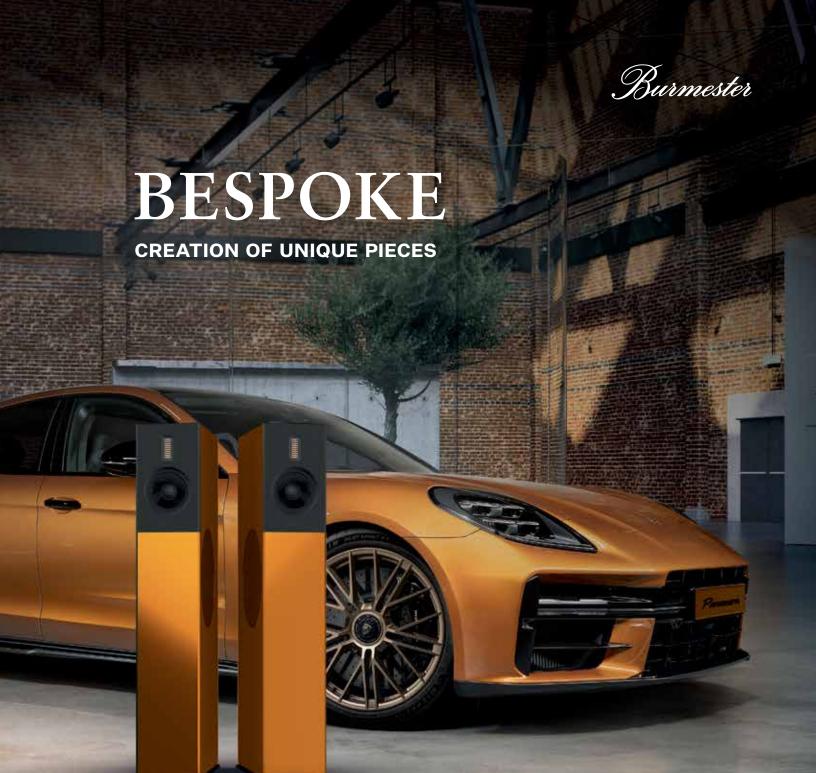
