During that time, Cpl Bunch kept the area safe and ensured that his father was placed in the recovery position allowing fluid to drain from his airways. Cpl Bunch then prepared to administer CPR when he stopped breathing for a short period of time.

Cpl Bunch received the ACCT Praiseworthy Action Certificate for his actions and has also been recognised and presented with a Praiseworthy award from The Royal Humane Society in recognition of his quick r=thinking and actions

Cpl Bunch has also recently shaved his head for a cancer charity to support a school friend who is going through cancer treatment, again showing what a fantastic cadet he is.
