

Winchelsea Heart Foundation Walking Group

The squawk of the cockatoo rings out through the frosty morning, closely echoed by bursts of laughter and excited voices. The noise disrupts the peace of the river valley, flanked by giant gums and wattles. It is not an unwelcome disruption as the peaceful effect is more reliant on the visual - which, as it appears, could have been undisrupted for centuries. The women who are meeting at the edge of this valley have ancestors who would have seen the same view hundreds of years ago and some even thousands of years ago.

Of course there have been changes. The cars crossing the new bridge are a testament to that. The old bluestone bridge beyond the bend is an indicator of a prosperous past.

Some of the indicators of the past are not clear to the untrained eye, such as the boundary tree showing a circular shape formed by hand in the young boughs of a now ancient gum, delineating the Wadawurrung lands from the Gulidjan lands.

Changes may be inevitable, but the river and its protective gum trees seem to withstand the test of time.

The bursts of laughter subside as the group check in with each other. This moment is when the most pressing issues are shared. A beloved pet has passed away, a family member has moved interstate, a relative is in palliative care. The check-in is genuine and responses are filled with concern and kind offers of help.

As a newcomer to this group, I am immediately accepted and trusted with personal stories and local knowledge.

I can see why this group brings connection to these women. Whether you have centuries of association to the land or are just passing through,



stopping to inhale the fresh air for a few years, these women make each other welcome.

The group begins walking the rough pathway alongside the river. There is no particular leader, just a quick check-in about which direction to take and then we are off. I have underestimated the fitness and stamina of these women of the land.

The pace is set and does not diminish for the full hour. Small groups form and disband as the walk progresses down trails, crosses bridges and enters streets.

The conversation flows uninterrupted with topics jumping from land subdivision, to palaeontology, to local murder mysteries and personal reflections. The information shared during this hour builds a strong community.

It includes what is happening at the community centre, local art groups, where to buy eggs, what the health service offers, what courses are running at the U3A, where the Probus club are meeting, where to get the best coffee – all the important stuff!

As part of fulfilling my new role in community health, I ask the group what else they would like to see offered in

town for women.

There is talk of Tai Chi, Laughing Yoga, fun dance classes – I am inspired! Some of these women live alone, manage land, battle illness, are discovering hidden heritage or caring for others.

Yet they understand the need for this social support. It is apparent to me that this walking group gives more to its participants than just physical fitness. It is creating a connection, a bush telegraph, a helpline, a support service.

As the women wave their farewells and disperse to continue with their day, I believe their ancestors would be proud. I hope the tradition of women supporting women continues on throughout the ages.

The Optus data leak – should you be worried?

In a word – yes.

Even people living under a rock (which at least wouldn't require an internet connection and a password) will have heard about the millions of Australians included in a very large theft of data from Optus.

While the details of how it happened are yet to (and may never) be published, at the end of the day that's for someone else to worry about. In the meantime, if you are or have been an Optus customer over the past few years, there is a distinct possibility that your personal details are 'out there' in internet-land.

Of course, we are all constantly handing over personal details. Think social



media, bank accounts, utilities, job applications, loans, credit cards, holidays, government benefits and services... Even if you wanted to, you couldn't avoid it unless you're happy living like a hermit – and even then, there are situations where you absolutely have no choice in this self-service internet-powered world.

Not on Optus customer? All this still applies to you, because this is very unlikely to be the last time there's a data breach like this.



There are 2 aspects to consider. How to protect yourself before a data breach. How to protect yourself after a data breach.

The first aspect, how to protect yourself before a data breach, is all about being careful with your data and being reasonably suspicious of everything. Received a text-message from the ATO asking to update your info or face fines? That's a hard "No!". Phone call from someone who wants to fix a virus on your computer? "No!". Be very (very) careful when people contact you unexpectedly. Treat text messages, phone calls, emails and other such interactions exactly how you would if someone rocked up at your door out of the blue and started yammering at you.

The second aspect, how to protect yourself after a data breach, is very similar but a whole lot more aggro and lost time. The scumbags that have your data can use it either to trick you into giving access to sensitive stuff (eg. your bank account) or they can use your details to independently get stuff (eg. a loan, online purchases, airline tickets to get refunded, etc). Imagine – a phone call from someone saying they're from Centrelink, they know your full name, your date of birth, your driver's licence number, your home address, your email address...

A comprehensive list of what details of yours may be taken, how they could be used against you, and what you can do to avoid or rectify issues, can be found on the IDCare website at idcare.org/ optus-db-response. It's worth a read whether you are affected by the Optus data breach or not.

Where once upon a time the scammers operated in town centre markets or doorto-door and so were few and far between, now they operate all over the world with instant access to anyone anywhere. Your shields of cynicism need to be raised, alas, and your trust in people needs to be lowered. Sad, but a fact of modern life.

So educate yourself, and be alert but not alarmed. We already have plenty of larmeds in Australia.....

Am I not a man and a brother?

Amongst a handful of coins that have come down through my family, one has always intrigued me.

It is rather worn and is a little less than the size of a twenty-cent piece. It has no date nor image of a monarch to place it in time. I thought it came from the middle of the nineteenth century.

On one side is a pair of clasped hands with the inscription around the edge: 'May slavery and oppression cease throughout the world.'

On the other side is a man in chains, in a half kneeling posture, with the inscription: 'Am I not a man and a brother?'

I took it to St Thomas' Anglican Church recently, as we were looking at the letter to Philemon that Sunday. This letter was written by the apostle Paul to his friend Philemon. Paul was in prison in Rome at the time, and had met and befriended Onesimus, a young man who had stolen from and escaped slavery in Philemon's house, in what we now call Turkey. This was almost two thousand years ago, in the Roman Empire, where more than half of the population were slaves. Legally, Onesimus, whose name means 'Useful', remained Philemon's property.

While he was with Paul, Onesimus became a Christian and knew he must



return to Philemon. Paul wrote a letter which he took with him, commending Onesimus to Philemon: 'No longer as a slave, but better than a slave, as a dear brother. He is very dear to me, but even dearer to you, both as a man and a brother in the Lord.' Paul undertook to pay back to Philemon anything that Onesimus owed him.

We know that the letter was not tossed into the fire. It was treasured and passed around for others to see, so much so that it became part of the Bible.

We also know that a few decades later a man called Onesimus was the bishop, or church leader, of that district.

What a wonder is this little bit of history. It tells of the transforming nature of trust in the Lord Jesus Christ, of forgiveness, of restoration, of freedom and of hope.

Roger, who attends St Thomas' and loves to research things, discovered more about my little coin. It was minted



in 1787, when Christians were leading outrage about slavery in Britain, so that when many people realised that their sugar was produced by slaves, boycotted it, and sales reduced by half.

The words on the token came directly from Paul's letter to Philemon. 'Am I not a man and a brother?' It was a 'halfpenny token' and from the wear we can see it was much used, always reminding people of their unity, of acceptance, and of love.

It still has a message for us today. In spite of much progress, slavery has not yet ceased throughout the world. Its results still haunt us.

What, in society generally, in Winchelsea, and in our lives, still needs the transforming power of God's love in Jesus? What can we do about it?







Voluntary Assisted Dying Accredited Doctor numbers low in Western Vic

Stuart Grimley MP has raised concern with the lack of voluntary assisted dying (VAD) accredited doctors and specialists in regional areas, especially Western Victoria.

This poses significant issues if a terminally ill person is too unwell to travel or needs to see a specialist due to their condition and to satisfy the VAD Act's checks and balances.


The Voluntary Assisted Dying Review Board Report of Operations 2021-22 was tabled in Parliament last week and stated: "There are very few practitioners in Western Victoria." Victoria was the first state to legislate VAD, with WA commencing their scheme shortly after. The scheme will commence in Tasmania next month and in South Australia, QLD and NSW in 2023.

Mr Grimley introduced a Private Members' Bill last year to fix two issues:

- To allow telehealth for all but the first VAD appointment; and
- To change the definition of permanent resident so people who have lived in Victoria for more than 3 years can access VAD, rather than to hold a permanent residency visa.

The Government response was that they wouldn't alter the scheme before the legislated review in 2023.

"Especially after COVID and all the lockdowns, a lot of children haven't really had the chance to get physically active and explore sports.


"Mini Movers is a great opportunity for these children to develop fundamental skills like running, catching, throwing, and striking, which is so important moving into primary school.


