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JOSIAH DE DISCIPLE Love, Spirit, and the Future of Amapiano

From the township streets of Alexandra to the global stages of Amapiano, Josiah De Disciple has carved out a reputation as one of the genre's most soulful and innovative pioneers.

Blending the pulse of tribal beats, the depth of jazz, and the energy of township "Clap & Tap," Josiah's sound goes beyond the club—it speaks to spirit, love, and identity. With acclaimed projects like Spirits of Makoela Vol. 2, Back To Basics, and Satori, and now his 2025 release uThando noMoya, he continues to expand the boundaries of Amapiano while collaborating with both legends and emerging voices.

In this interview, Josiah reflects on his journey, the inspiration behind uThando noMoya, and his vision for the next chapter of South Africa's most influential sound.





For those who might be discovering your work for the first time, who is Josiah De Disciple, and how would you describe your journey from Alexandra's streets to becoming one of Amapiano's most respected innovators?

Josiah De Disciple is one of the pioneers of the amapiano Genre. My journey with music started during the tribal music era. As a young producer then I began to move with the trends that were big at the time and mainly because I was still trying to find my style of producing(sound).

Piano came when I had already established the sound that I liked producing and it was of a mix of tribal and African jazz. I then started producing Amapiano in 2014 when it was still just instrumentals without the base/log drum. I then met Maero & Force (MFR souls) and started producing with them.

Your music is known for its soulful depth, often blending piano, atmospheric basslines, and Afro-jazz influences. What drives you to take this more spiritual and melodic approach in a genre that's often dominated by club hits?

My musical influences are deeply rooted in Jazz, which has always inspired me to experiment with different sounds and rhythms. I've been influenced by the 'Clap & Tap' genre, which is a high-energy style popular in townships and some churches. This genre's infectious beats and community-driven vibe have had a lasting impact on my approach to music production.





Your latest release, uThando noMoya, has been highly anticipated. What's the story or message behind the title, and how does it reflect the overall theme of the album?

The anticipation surrounding "uThando noMoya" has been building up, thanks to

snippets and teasers I've shared on social media. The title, which translates to "Love and Spirit", reflects the EP's themes of love, spirituality, and positivity.

The songs are carefully curated to take listeners on a journey of self-discovery and introspection, with some tracks focusing on romantic love and others exploring deeper spiritual connections.

Within uThando noMoya, you've created a rich mix of sounds and emotions. Can you tell us your creative process when putting this project together?

One of my goals with
"uThando noMoya" was to
collaborate with emerging
producers who bring fresh
perspectives and ideas to the
table. By working with young talent,

table. By working with young to I aimed to create an EP that sounds modern, diverse, and exciting.

Each song has its unique flavor, showcasing the versatility of Amapiano and the creativity of the producers involved.



Which track from uThando noMoya is most personal to you, and what makes it stand out from the rest of your catalogue?

"Amasango" holds a special place in my heart because it reflects my personal journey as an artist. The song's themes of perseverance and faith resonate deeply with me, as I've faced my share of challenges and setbacks in the music industry. The lyrics capture the essence of my struggles and the hope that drives me to keep pushing forward.

2024 saw you drop Satori, and now in 2025 you've delivered uthando noMoya. How do you feel your sound has evolved between these two releases, and what new territory did you explore on the latest album?

With "uThando noMoya", I'm venturing into new sonic territories that appeal to a younger audience. The sound is inspired by producers like Muzical Chef and Stixx, but with my own unique twist. I'm excited to experiment with fresh sounds and styles that will resonate with the youth and take Amapiano to new heights.















crazy energy — and Proaudio was right in the middle of it all, powering the music and keeping the party alive at the **Incredible Connections** stand. From Day 1 through Day 4, our decks never went quiet, our DJs never stopped switching, and the crowds never stopped vibing.





Day 1,

kicked things off with a bang. Security was tight, the energy was safe but electric, and everywhere you looked there were cosplayers in full force.

Our team rotated DJs throughout the day, keeping the soundtrack fresh and making sure the stand stayed a magnet for anyone walking by.

The Incredible Connections competitions and money machine had people rushing over every two hours, while curious fans lined up to try their hands on the DDJ-FLX4 — sparking hot debates about how it stacked up to the legendary DDJ-400.









By Day 2,

things had levelled up. More traffic, more costumes, more energy. Cosplayers were stepping up to the decks and drawing massive crowds with every mix.

The competitions were buzzing with entries, the collab between us and Incredible Connections felt seamless, and by late afternoon our stand looked less like a demo space and more like a mini dance floor.

A special highlight? Lady Lea stopping by — and her daughter absolutely stealing the show when she jumped on the decks.





Day 3,

cranked it up again. The crowds thickened, competitions shifted to every hour, and the hype around the money machine created waves of excitement.


People weren't just watching
— they were cheering, vibing,
and pouring into our space
nonstop. The synergy between
our Proaudio crew and the
Incredible Connections team
was locked in tight.

Music dropped smoothly when announcements went live, the mic work was sharp, and the energy never dipped.









And then came Day 4.

The final stretch. The vibe was still alive, though a little more chilled, which gave us time to really connect with the crowd. Hourly competitions kept the energy high — and four lucky winners walked away with brand new PlayStation 5s.

Each prize moment was celebrated with a track drop on the decks, turning giveaways into mini parties. By this stage, it felt like we weren't two teams anymore but one fully fused crew.




Dancing the World Into His Afro



South Africa has always been a breeding ground for groundbreaking sounds, and few artists embody that spirit more than Jnr SA (Lesego Junior Nkooe). From his roots in Mabeskraal village in Rustenburg to the global stage, he has carved out a place as one of the country's most exciting musical exports.

A multi–SAMA Award-winning DJ, producer, and pioneer of the 3 Step sound, Jnr SA has worked with heavyweights like Shimza, Darque, Kabza De Small, and Sun-El Musician, all while keeping his unique voice at the forefront of Afro House. His remix of Candi Staton's "Hallelujah Anyway" on Defected Records confirmed what many already knew — he's a visionary artist capable of taking South African rhythms and making them resonate worldwide.

Now, with his debut album Dance To My Afro in the works and international performances lined up across Europe and Africa, Jnr SA is proving that his journey has only just begun.





For those who might be discovering you for the first time, who is Jnr SA and how would you describe your journey into music?

Lesego Junior Nkooe, professionally known as Jnr SA, is a celebrated South African artist, DJ, and multi–SAMA Award-winning producer born in Rustenburg (North West) Mabeskraal village. My journey into the music industry started when I did an Afro Remix of a well known amapiano song ,titled Abalele by Kabza De small which cemented my sound and growth in the game.

You've become a celebrated figure in Afro House and a pioneer of the 3 Step sound - how did that unique style come about?

As much as there were songs that are 3 step which were released some time ago I have to give credit to Thakzin for making it popular which actually made me join him and help flood the market alongside Dlala Thukzin who commercialized the sound and it's such an honor to be recognised as one of the producers that contributed towards it.



Your career includes collaborations with big names like Shimza, Darque, Kabza De Small, and Sun-El Musician. What have you learned from working with these industry giants?


Having to work with the likes of Darque , Shimza , Kabza De small and

Sun -El taught me a lot of things because each and every one of them have their own way of doing things musically and it actually opened a lot of doors for me just by being surrounded by these industry giants and them playing my music on global stages brought the attention from both local and international audiences but mostly I learned to be humble at all cost and never downplay my hard work and achievements.

internationally through my music and the kinda sound I make, seeing people receiving it so well and asking for more made me grow musically and I got to understand what the people want to hear and I'm here for it.


Your upcoming debut album is highly anticipated. Can you share a little about the sound, influences, and stories we can expect?



From Ultra South Africa to intimate club nights, Minx thrives on connection, creating unforgettable moments that remind audiences why music truly is life.



Minx, For those who may not know you yet - how would you describe yourself as an artist?

MINX – I was beyond blessed growing up in a high-energy environment as a child

where music was always at the forefront of our household, this in turn nurtured my passion and inspired me to become the artist I am today.

My versatility and connection I have with various genres helps me to create that top tier engagement with my audience which I portray during my sets. I thrive on interacting with the crowd, delivering a unique vibe and atmosphere that leaves a long lasting impression on both myself and my fans – creating memorable moments that linger long after my

MINX – "Musica es Vida"
which means Music is Life –

You studied at the Soul
Candi Institute of Music how did that experience
influence your sound and
technical approach to music
production and performance?

MINX – Ryan Murgatroyd, one of our renowned industry leaders and owner of Soul

Candi, was a major inspiration for me upon starting my journey as an artist. As for my tutor, Blanka Mazimela, he guided and challenged me to grow both mentally and technically which helped to shape my abilities as a true performer.

My experience at Soul Candi wasn't just about learning how to use software or equipment, it also helped me to better understand music theory, sound design and the art of telling my story through sound.

You've performed across
Africa and internationally in
places like Australia, New
Zealand, and Bali. How have
those global experiences shaped
your identity and sound as a DJ?

MINX – Expanding your knowledge on a global scale is crucial for learning and

acquiring new skills. There is such a vast world out there beyond our local stages. These experiences humbled me, it allowed me to genuinely appreciate my growth and to respect constructive feedback from the international agencies I had the opportunities to perform for.

You learn to adapt, you learn to respect the scene on a whole different level, yet stay true to yourself and the sound you wish to bring into your sets.







You've played at major
events like Ultra South
Africa. What has been one of
your most memorable gigs so far,
and why did it stand out?

MINX – I have truly been blessed beyond measure to have performed at numerous events and festivals, both local and international, but Ultra South Africa will always be the most memorable one for me. I had the opportunity to dedicate a few words in memory of a dear friend we had lost the year before.

As I finished the speech a small flock of birds flew over that massive stage cutting through the sunlight, while I played a track that will forever remind us of him. Thinking back on that moment still gives me goosebumps, it was incredibly special to share something so personal with a crowd that size.

As a woman in the music and DJ industry, what challenges have you faced, and how have you overcome them to build the strong presence you have today?

MINX – The DJ industry definitely comes with its own set of challenges, whether

it's facing stereotypes, being underestimated or having to work twice as hard to be respected on a serious level. You feel the pressure to constantly prove yourself technically and creatively.

I always had to remind myself that instead of letting these factors discourage me, I used it as feul. I would sit and prepare my sets each and every time (I still do that to this day), focusing on refining my craft and building a sound that is true to who Minx is. I also make sure to make a point by surrounding myself with a supportive fan base and community - working with individuals who uplift rather than compete.

I always have my work cut out for me, but I am very proud to be part of a generation that's pushing for more representation in the scene.





THE UNTOLD STORY of Our First DDJ Controllers



Back in 2011, Pioneer DJ took its first step into the world of controllers, and it was a time of both excitement and uncertainty. The DJ world was buzzing, not just about the music being played, but about how it was being played. Vinyl, USBs, laptops, controllers, CDJs — DJs and venues were still trying to figure out what the future would look like, and audiences weren't always sure what to make of it either.

International heavyweights

like Richie Hawtin captured the spirit of the era when he said. "We are in the century of customisation, of personalisation, in hardware and performance." But with all that possibility came chaos. Venues often struggled with changeovers between DJs using totally different setups. Cables everywhere, laptops crashing, and the occasional awkward silence on the dance floor were part of the growing pains. Even audiences had to adjust, with glowing laptop screens in DJ booths drawing mixed reactions.





But, as former product planner Takafumi Nitta later admitted, the response was not what the team had hoped for. They looked the part, but they were bulky, not really suited for the DJ booth, and limited by the software they shipped with. It was a rocky start for what would later become one of the most important product families in DJ history.

To understand why, you have to go back a little further. The early 2000s was a decade of seismic change for DJ technology. Final Scratch appeared in 2001, blowing minds with the idea of controlling digital files through vinyl. Ableton Live opened up the possibility of DJing with loops and productionstyle tools.

The MP3 format turned music collections into something you could carry in your pocket. And controllers like the Vestax VCI-100 began to show DJs a new way of performing. But these innovations also split opinions. While techno artists like Richie Hawtin, Carl Cox, and Adam Beyer embraced digital setups, others mocked DJs for "checking their email" behind laptop screens.



It was in this atmosphere of exploration and tension that the term "controllerism" was born. Inspired by turntablism, it described the new movement of DJs who treated controllers as instruments — chopping, triggering, and re-shaping tracks in ways that vinyl alone could never allow. It was raw, experimental, and controversial, but it was also the start of something big.



Vestax VCI-100



It was in this atmosphere of exploration and tension that the term "controllerism" was born. Inspired by turntablism, it described the new movement of DJs who treated controllers as instruments — chopping, triggering, and re-shaping tracks in ways that vinyl alone could never allow. It was raw, experimental, and controversial, but it was also the start of something big.

Pioneer DJ, known for defining the CDJ and DJM experience, was not going to sit on the sidelines. The DDJ range needed direction, and in 2012 that direction arrived with the DDJ-SX. Built specifically for Serato DJ, the SX embraced performance pads, integrated FX, and a design made for professionals. It set a new standard and paved the way for controllers to be taken seriously.

Soon, the DDJ-SZ followed, giving DJs a true "CDJ + DJM" feel in a single unit and even allowing for smooth backto-back sets with dual laptop inputs.

The insight that changed everything came from listening to the users themselves. Research showed that it wasn't just bedroom hobbyists buying controllers.



DDJ-ERGO

Mobile DJs — the kind we know well here in South Africa, playing weddings, corporate events, and bar residencies — were the real driving force. They needed flexibility, portability, and professional features all in one, and controllers gave them exactly that. The DDJ-SX and SZ answered that call, and suddenly controllers were no longer seen as a compromise but as a serious choice.

From there, the story unfolded quickly. Entry-level gear like the WeGO series and later the DDJ-400 and DDJ-FLX4 gave beginners a way to learn with professional tools at a price







High-end controllers like the DDJ-1000 and DDJ-REV7 pushed the boundaries of what was possible, blurring the lines between standalone setups and traditional CDJ rigs. And with rekordbox DJ performance mode, Pioneer DJ's own software platform stepped up to meet the needs of DJs everywhere.

Looking back, the early missteps were necessary. They taught Pioneer DJ to listen, to collaborate, and to innovate with courage. As one product planner put it, the DDJ-SX reminded the company of "the importance of shared vision, collaboration, and perseverance." That spirit laid the foundation for an entire generation of DJs.

In South Africa, that impact is clear. The DDJ series has opened doors for thousands of young

DJs — from teenagers mixing at home to performers filling clubs, festivals, and weddings across the country.

Platforms like YouTube and TikTok have only accelerated the movement, making it easier than ever to learn, share, and grow.






























Headphones, monitor speakers, and every tool you need to build a flawless set are right there, waiting to be experienced.









For producers, there's the Music Production Section, a space that introduces a new way of thinking about creativity.

BeatBangaz DJ Academy

Where Talent Meets Opportunity

Founded in 2000 by legendary South African DJs Ready D, E-20, and Azuhl, BeatBangaz DJ Academy began as a bold vision to uplift communities through the art of DJing. Originally launched as The ScratchLab, the project quickly evolved into a full-fledged academy - offering a lifeline of skills development for youth who might otherwise be left without direction.

At BeatBangaz, students are not just taught how to mix music - they are taught discipline, creativity, and employable skills. Courses merge traditional DJ techniques with cuttingedge music technology, preparing students for careers in the global entertainment industry. With access to manuals, audio-visual resources, fieldwork, and one-on-one mentorship, learners walk away with more than technical know-how: they gain confidence, resilience, and community.

The Academy's reach extends far beyond Cape Town. Alumni have gone on to perform internationally, produce music, and create cultural movements of their own.



What began as a grassroots initiative has now grown into an internationally respected institution - proof that music can truly transform lives.

Kids Music Fun (KMF)

KMF is more than just a youth festival. It is a holistic music and arts initiative that fosters creativity, self-expression, and entrepreneurial thinking. Young people are not simply participants - they are leaders. They plan, organise, and run the annual festival, gaining hands-on experience in event management, performance, and production.

This model of youth-owned development does more than create memorable events - it builds resilience, confidence, and job readiness. By empowering young people to take ownership, KMF opens pathways into the entertainment industry and beyond, giving them a chance to shape their futures on their own terms.



Through KMF, young South Africans learn to see themselves not just as consumers of culture but as creators, innovators, and entrepreneurs - a powerful shift in mindset that can transform entire communities.







Safer Roads for All (SR4A)

Driving Change Beyond the Streets

The third cornerstone of G-CAP's work is Safer Roads for All (SR4A), launched in 2017 to combat South Africa's alarming road fatality rate. With nearly 17,000 road deaths annually, including 3,000 children, SR4A uses the universal appeal of autosport and Hip-Hop to promote road safety in a way that resonates with the youth.

Through drifting, spinning, advanced driving experiences, and cultural events, SR4A creates safe spaces where young people can learn about responsible driving while enjoying the thrill of car culture. Beyond the adrenaline, the message is clear: road safety is a collective responsibility that starts with the individual.







Culture, Community, and Collective Upliftment

G-CAP's projects are different in focus, but united by a single thread: the transformative rhythm of Hip-Hop.

From the turntables of BeatBangaz to the festival stages of KMF and the spinning tracks of SR4A, each initiative builds skills, instils values, and creates opportunities for youth who need them most.

As CEO and co-founder Grand
Master Ready D leads with lived
experience in Hip-Hop culture and
activism, alongside Chairperson
Malikah Daniels, who drives the
organisation's community-centered
approach. Together with a
committed team, they ensure G-CAP
remains true to its roots:
empowering South Africa's youth to
find their voice, master their craft,
and uplift their communities.

Inspiration from my dad came from a young age because almost all of the music that he played had scratching in it, and he would always let me mess around on the turntables whenever he was busy.



What's your favourite song or beat to scratch with right

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My favorite beat to scratch to is from a record called Needle Thrashers Vol 4 side A1. The

beat has a simple pattern and it's just a really easy beat to scratch to.

How does it feel being part of the Beatbangaz crew and representing Cape Town?

It's mind-blowing because now I'm a part of one of Cape Town's most legendary DJ

crews and these were also the people that I grew up watching and looking up to.
