NCEL confirm play-off dates

The dates for the NCEL Premier Division and Division One play-off have been scheduled.

In the semi finals for both divisions, the team finishing second plays at home to the team finishing fifth, whilst the team finishing third plays host to the team finishing fourth. For the final, the team that finished in the highest league position is

the home team.

The Premier Division semi-finals will be played on Saturday 12 April and the final on Saturday 19th April. The Division One semi-finals are on Saturday 19 April and the final on Saturday 26 April.

For our local clubs, this means that Hallam, whose victory last Saturday confirmed second spot in the Premier Division will be at home in

both the semi-final and the final should they get through.

In Division One, Wombwell Two are still in the running for the title with three games to play but they will at finish in the top three. Dearne & District have also confirmed their place in the play-offs. Worsbrough Bridge Athletic only have an outside chance of the play-offs. They are four

points behind Ilkley Town with two to play.

Meanwhile in other news, the League have confirmed that no clubs have failed ground grading for 2025-26 season. 37 clubs passed within the 31 March deadline whilst the remaining clubs were given extensions due to ongoing building works or summer pitch extensions on their grounds.

Will is selected for England Deaf

Will Palmer, 23, is part of a squad that is heading to Copenhagen for two friendlies against Denmark.

Will who plays for Kiveton Park has scored eight goals in 18 appearances in the three lions shirt.

The games will take place on the 25th and 26th of April.

Kiveton Park back in pyramid

A 3-1 victory at Parkgate Reserves guaranteed Kiveton Park a top three finish in the EVA2 Sportswear County Senior League Division One and with it promotion by to the Step 9 Premier Division.

It is the first time in 12 years that Kiveton have been in the pyramid system.

Their next aim will be to take the title – three clubs tie on 48 points. Kiveton currently lie third on goal difference with two to play but they face a huge game on Saturday when they host Sheffield Union who currently lie second.

It is Union's last game of the season. Kiveton then finish on 12th April with a trip to Athersley Recreation whilst current leaders Handsworth do not finish until a week later when they host Parkgate Reserves.

County FA sells offices

The Sheffield & Hallamshire County FA have confirmed the sale of their Meadowhall Road headquarters.

In a statement on their website, they stated “This strategic decision will unlock vital funds to reinvest in grassroots football, paving the way for the development of a state-of-the-art football facility designed to benefit the entire community.

“The proceeds from the sale, combined with a portion of our reserves, will contribute to the cre-

ation of a purpose-built Sheffield and Hallamshire County FA football facility — a long-term vision of the County FA to better serve players, coaches, match officials and everybody else involved in the game.”

In the near future, offices will be opened at Steel City Stadium in the Sheffield Olympic Legacy Park/

Chair of Sheffield & Hallamshire County FA, Brian Coddington, said: “This is a significant step in our long-term vision to develop a state-of-the-art football facility. Not only will it serve as the home of football for the oldest County FA in the country, but it will also become a welcoming community hub, accessible to everyone involved in the game.”

County Senior Premier goes to thrilling finale

A 1-0 derby defeat last night (Wednesday) for Oughtibridge WMSC at Stocksbridge Park Steels Reserves has taken the EV2 Sportswear S&H County Senior League title decision to the final day.

Matty Lee scored the only goal of the game which has left Oughtibridge on 55 points and a three point lead over Hemsworth Miners Welfare.

Oughtibridge travel to Penistone Church Reserves for their final game on 12 April where a point will be enough to see them clinch the title.

However, defeat for them and victory for Hemsworth playing at the same time at Jubilee Sports will see the title go the way of the Kinsley club.

There is just one goal difference between the two so defeat for Oughtibridge and victory for Hemsworth will see them top on goal difference.

Both games are scheduled to kick-off at 2 pm for their final games.

Rotherham Town CC future still in the balance

A decision on the future of Rotherham Town Cricket Club has been put back following a Committee meeting on 28 March.

As we reported last week, Town are in serious financial difficulties and need to raise £20,000 to complete this season.

Secretary John Whaling told the Rotherham Advertiser that there has been a couple of offers of help but nowhere near to enough for the club to meet its obligations.

A further meeting is due this evening (3 April).



It's the business end of the season, guv!

As we hit the business end of the season, here is a round up of the status in some of the leagues we cover as we approach the seasons end.

Northern Premier League – Division One East

With five games left to play, Stocksbridge Park Steels occupy the final play off place. In what is setting up to be an exciting end of season, there is just three points between 4th placed Newton Aycliffe and 8th placed Carlton. In what could be a pivotal round of fixtures on Saturday, Newton Aycliffe play host to 7th placed North Ferriby whilst Stocksbridge travel to 6th placed Belper Town.

At the bottom, Sheffield FC could be relegated if they fail to pick up any points at Pontefract Collieries and other results go against them. If the fight for the play off places is tight, then the

bottom of this division is incredible and whilst three clubs, sadly including Sheffield, look doomed, the fourth relegation spot is wide open with amazingly 3 points separating 8 clubs

Northern Counties East

The top three positions are decided with Silsden champions and Hallam and Golcar occupying the next two places and thus guaranteeing home ties in the play-offs. Who they are going to play is still up for grabs though with one point separating Albion Sports, Beverley Town and Thackley going into Saturday's final matches of the season. Phones at the ready!

At the top of Division One, Horbury, Wakefield AFC and Wombwell Town are fighting it out for the top spot. These three are all at least guaranteed play off spots. Dearne & District are also guaranteed to finish fourth whilst Ilkley Town look certain to take the

other play-off spot, although Worsbrough Bridge still harbour an outside hope. This will be over though if Ilkley Town beat bottom of the table Yorkshire Amateur or Worsbrough fail to take a maximum at Appleby Frodingham.

At the bottom, the third relegation space is still to be decided and it's a two way battle between Dronfield Town and Nostrell Miners. Nostrell are one point ahead of Dronfield with three to play, Dronfield have two left to go.

County Senior League

The championship will go to the final games of the season on 12 April. Oughtibridge MW, who have been favourites for much of the season, have had a late wobble and go into their last game at Penistone Church reserves still needing a point. If they lose and Hemsworth Miners Welfare win at Jubilee Sports then the title will be go

to Hemsworth. Intriguingly the final relegation place is a three way fight between Silkstone United, Jubilee Sports and AFC Dronfield. Silkstone are on 29 points but their season is finished. Jubilee have one point less and Dronfield two points, but both have two games left.

In Division One, Handsworth Reserves, Sheffield Union and Kiveton Park are all promoted and tied on 48 points leaving the title wide open. Handsworth and Union both have one game left and Kiveton two games but the pivotal game will be the game between Union and Kiveton on Saturday.

In Division Two, Bentley Village head the table but their season is over. Wombwell Town Reserves are two points behind but with two to play.

Analytics is not just for the pro's

When Sheffield United manager Chris Wilder said in his post-match interview, following the recent Sheffield derby, "Stick your data where you want to stick your data, we're here to win". Freddie Elam cast a wry smile. "You know he probably bases his whole game plan around data, don't you," said Freddie as we sat down to talk about his new individual football analysis business.

Over the last few years data has become big business in the professional football world. Brentford, Brighton and Hove Albion and Bournemouth in particular have driven their Premier League success on this analysis only signing players if their stats meet the club's requirements.

"A lot of clubs work their data on team information," says Freddie. "They concentrate on what the player can do for the team rather than what the individual player can do to improve his own game."

Freddie knows. A junior player at a senior level, he now has a Masters degree in Performance and Analysis and has worked with the Category A Leeds United Academy at both Under 18 and Under 21 level, as well as with York City's Under 15's. It is this training, education and experience that enables him to do the analysis.

Data is growing massively. Some professional clubs have up to 10 analysts. It is proven that it does work.

The world of data analysis is opening up to players and clubs at all levels. Clubs now film their matches using VEO cameras. These cameras film the whole pitch as well as following play, allowing clubs to look at what is happening off the ball as well as on it.

Freddie, with his Individual Player Football Analysis Tutoring business takes this further. "I examine supplied data to draw out individual player analysis, add appropriate graphics and give insight into Individual performances. I can compare with data from top academy players but also balance this against the level of opposition.

"When you speak to any kid these days, they all want to be an academy player but they don't actually watch a full game. They may watch highlights on YouTube and only see the action areas and critically not what is happening on the full pitch. But the best kids watch the full game and want to learn how they can improve and this is where individual analysis comes in."

I have a three year old Grandson, I tell Freddie. I have seen him run around, I am convinced (ok maybe with a small amount of irony) that he is going to be a future Rodri. "I think three may be a little too young to analyse," Freddie diplomatically replies. "But individual analysis would be perfect for anyone from Under 10 upwards who wants to learn and improve

their game.

"It is important, though, that I also have an understanding of the background of the club and responsibilities of the individual within the team so that I can ensure analysis fits with requirements of the Manager and coaching staff bringing everything together."

What Freddie offers is quite unique. He will take the data supplied but, if required, will also film the game using VEO technology, clipping as appropriate and he will then have

a one-to-one meeting to go through the clips with the player (and parent or guardian if under 16). From there a progress tracker is developed with future meetings and clips to show improvement. The data is also compared with others to build up a plan for that player on an individual basis. Obviously, it's not just going through the film, but understanding it, providing the qualified analysis and improving the player.

"It is all about individual tutoring," says Freddie. "Trying to improve every aspect of their game, linking it back to team targets, with a tactical understanding; improving mindset on tactics alongside on

the ball investigation to improve the way they play with the ball at their feet. Critical analysis into how to better improve themselves technically to make the right decision all linked to positional play."

Freddie also understands how this fits with the coaching side of the game. He is currently coaching YP Juniors and Ladies and continues his own learning ensuring alignment with latest information, for example, currently studying for his UEFA C Badge.

"I know from experience that clubs are all about team analysis. I am trying to expand that to individuals so that they can improve their game. And it's suitable for anyone but particularly from Under 10's upwards."

In the last 5 games, since Leeds beat us, we have picked up 13 points, Burnley have picked up 13 points and Leeds have picked up 6!

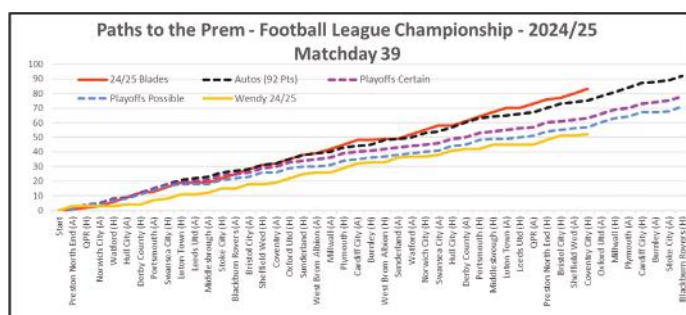
Can It really happen to them again?!

So, first of all, a great Friday night at a loud and proud BDTBL. Hamza, Sydnie and Gus were quite incredible. Gus's brilliant replay of Reece James' goal against Latvia set the scene, then Femi's cross to clinical Dr Ty and Brew Dog 's 2 in 2 and that was that. Conceding one late on was a bit disappointing – and if Wilder had just listened to me and brought big Kieff on instead of "Teacher's Pet" he might have stopped their goal (only kidding – maybe!)

Meslier's latest comedy show at Elland Road on Saturday afternoon put the icing on the weekend cake! A shame Bristol City couldn't get something out of Burnley - but I have to say that Burnley looked very good - apart from their finishing. Their goal from Flemming was a free kick as good as Gus's – but apart from that they only had 2 shots on target from 13 attempts but, as usual, restricted Bristol City to 1 on target from 4 attempts.

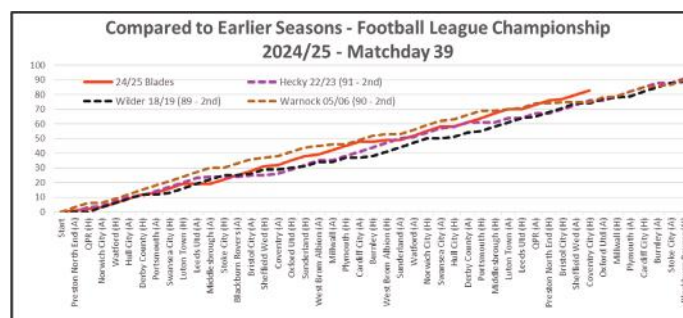
So now the graphs and charts that show factually where we are at present.

Graph 1 compares our progress against 3 benchmark sets of results which represent Automatic Promotion, Playoff Certainty and Playoff Possibility. My benchmarks take account of who our opponents are each week. On 83 points, comparing to my benchmarks, we are now a huge 8 points ahead of my Autos Promotion (92-point) schedule – and



that is with our 2 point deduction. I actually think now that we will probably need 95 for second place this year, but that's OK as my forecast for us is now 98-100 points and second place - maybe only just behind Leeds on Goal Difference.

Graph 2 compares this season against our last 3 successful promotions from this level (all in second place), in 2005/06, 2018/19 and 2022/23. On 83 points after 39 games (with the 2-point deduction) we are 9 points ahead of the 74 points that we had under Wilder in 18/19, now 7 points ahead of Hecky in 22/23 and 8 points ahead of Warnock in 05/06.



So we are 9 points ahead of where we were in that great 18/19 Wilder promotion season, even with the 2-point deduction.

I won't put the extra graph on this week, but we are also now 4 equivalent points ahead of what I regard as our best ever Level 2 season, under Reg Freeman in 1952/53. Legends beckon!

My current Matchday 46 forecasts are Leeds 100, Blades 100, Burnley 94, but you can fill in the gaps in Chart 1 for yourself to see what you think.

Yet again! Where will it end?



The push for the play-offs

The play-off push is on. Back in February, it seemed like any dreams of promotion for Stocksbridge Park Steels were over. A streak of losses where the Steels could not score for love nor money seemed to finish it off, especially with their rivals being in such good form.

But then as it often does in football, it all changed. Stocksbridge would win seven games in eight, firing them right back into contention for the top five.

And as they prepared to take on Pontefract Collieries for the second time in a month, they knew a win

with results going their way could return them into the play-offs.

The first half was a tetchy one as both teams were willing to attack. After all, Pontefract couldn't afford to lose. Failing to win could see them drop into the bottom four and face a return to the NCEL.

Stocksbridge had the first chance when Luke Rawson let off a snap shot. Heath Richardson in the Pontefract goal would respond with a solid save, though he'll have been thankful no one gambled on the spill. At the other end, a wayward shot from Jack Boyle almost turned into a goal with a reflex

header from Bailey Thompson, though Ben Townsend was able to claw it away.

The second half would be where all the goals came from. It felt like a game where Stocksbridge needed to score soon or else Pontefract would be able to take advantage.

Thankfully for the Steels, they got that goal. Townsend claimed a long throw and, fresh off a penalty save the previous week, he booted the ball far up the pitch. It would be a defence splitting pass that James Morris was able to get onto. He lobbed Richardson, the ball dipped underneath the bar, giving the Steels the lead.

Dunn from pulling the trigger. And just as the fans nerves started to build, they were eased by a Stocksbridge goal. An awkward cross entered the box and Morris was able to pull it down and let off a volley. Richardson made the save and the clearance got it to the edge of the box. Luke Rawson took control and he was able to fire it in.

This really did rip the spirit from the Pontefract players, and they moved like shells for the rest of the game. So it was no surprise that the Steels were able to finish the game off. A defensive mistake gave the ball right to Morris and he burst through. All he needed was the finish and that was what he got.

The game eased to an end, though Boyle almost spoiled the party with his effort hitting the post. It was certainly a game with contrasting emotions. Results elsewhere meant that Stocksbridge would move to 5th and stayed there after Pontefract bounced back on Tuesday with a 1-0 victory over North Ferriby to move them out of the bottom four. Talk afterwards were about what could happen come the end of the season. It's certainly an exciting thought.

Hallam will finish second 2 from 3 for remaining play-off spots

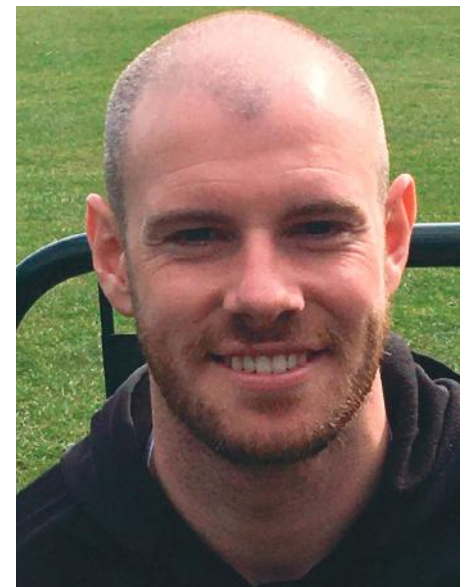

Para Ice Hockey

Sheffield showcases Para Ice Hockey with international tournament

On 29 and 30 March 2025, Sheffield hosted the Northwest European Para Ice Hockey League (NE-PIHL)

The NEPIHL is an annual para ice hockey tournament, which aims to promote the sport throughout Europe, and help the teams involved grow and develop.

The tournament has been run annually since 2021, and this is the first time it has been held in the UK.

Five teams from across Europe joined this year's hosts,



the Sheffield Steelkings, in competing for the coveted NEPIHL trophy. The competition started with the teams being split into two groups for a round-robin: Group A featured the Sheffield Steelkings (UK), Les Bisons Neuilly-sur-Marne (France), and the Amsterdam Tigers (the Netherlands), while Group B hosted SISU (Finland), the Antwerp Phantoms (Belgium), and the Dordrecht Lime Kings (the Netherlands).

The Steelkings started the competition strongly, winning both of their group stage games without conceding a single goal.

Coming top of their group meant that they had to face the Antwerp Phantoms, the runners up of Group B, in the semi-finals.



The Phantoms put up a strong fight, but the Steelkings managed to extend their winning streak to three games, and finished the first day of the tournament without conceding a single goal.

In the opposite semi-final, SISU beat Les Bisons to secure their place against the Steelkings in the final.

The second day of the tournament began with the Amsterdam Tigers taking on the Dordrecht Lime Kings, to see who would get the bragging rights in the Netherlands. Both teams put in good performances, and the game finished 7-4 in favour of the Tigers.



Next up was the Bronze Medal match. In a repeat of the 2024 fixture, it was the Phantoms facing Les Bisons. Last year Les Bisons lost out to the Phantoms on

their own rink so were sure to be seeking revenge; and sure enough they got it, beating the Phantoms 4-1 and claiming the Bronze Medals for themselves.

Finally, it was time for the grand finale. The reigning



champions, SISU, faced off against the hosts and 2 times gold medal winners, the Sheffield Steelkings.

The Steelkings fought bravely, but ultimately the speed and power of the Finnish team was too much for

them, leaving them the silver medallists, as SISU lifted the trophy for a second year in a row. The final game ended 8-1.
