#### MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

This year has marked the end of our large Start Strong UK Aid Match programme but also the beginning of our Girls Empowerment programme in Rugin, the continuation of our support for 4 key health posts - Rugin, Bichyya, Jair and Manbu. I was also able to get to the Far West and visit several of the PHASE Worldwide supported and PHASE Nepal run health posts. It was a privilege and a motivator to do more, better and stronger.

We continue to be work alongside Ciné Schools to deliver film programmes for underprivileged children in the UK, and this year our work was recognised by the National Lottery, funding the programme so we have been able to continue to strengthen this programme in Rotherham, the birthplace of PHASE Worldwide.

With some outstanding achievements including increasing births in health posts from 57% to 79% now more mothers and babies have better access to emergency care should they need it. #### **HEALTH 24/25**

This year our work has focused on funding 4 health posts in Rugin, Bichyya Jair and Manbu in Nepal as well as supporting other health posts with GP mentors. We are pleased to have provided these communities with healthcare access that they may otherwise not have had, giving people the opportunity to get on with their lives and be empowered to achieve more.

We have monitored (and treated if required) **4,620 children** under 5 for malnutrition. Addressing needs at the most critical time in life.

# HEALTH EDUCATION

PHASE Worldwide believes that if you provide knowledge and skills to a community they will take this knowledge and use it in a way that is more empowering to them, improving health, education levels and increased livelihood opportunities.

### STREET DRAMA

6 times

Street dramas are performed by the PHASE Nepal team to provide health information that is accessible to the **347 people** that attended.

### SUPER FLOUR MAKING

41 times

Super flour making sessions were held to show **159 carers** a simple way to make a locally available porridge that ensures their babies get the nutrients they need during weaning after 6 months.

## SCHOOL HEALTH

84 times

Reaching **2,287 students** (boys 979; girls 1,308) To talk about topics such as personal hygiene, menstrual hygiene and healthy eating.

#### **AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMMES 24/25**

Our agricultural programmes work alongside our health programmes addressing the underlying causes of malnutrition within communities. Support includes training on how to make the best use of resources such as space, water and seeds, alongside helping families plan how they will manage and develop their stock (animals or vegetables) and connecting them to markets where they can sell produce thereby improving long term outcomes.

### **GIRLS EMPOWERMENT**

115

In Rugin we have trained 11 Girls Empowerment facilitators who have worked with 115 young people to change the outlook for girls. Covering topics such as increasing confidence and menstruation.

This programme has come about as our health posts continue to see young girls having early pregnancies and harmful cultural practices continuing. Staff and mentors work with the whole community through a series of workshops, streets drama and teacher training.



"I am very thankful to PHASE for supporting me during a critical time. Without their help, I could not have reached the hospital or received treatment. I hope PHASE continues its services so that others in need can also be helped."

**6 new ultrasound machines** in remote health posts along with **6 staff trained** to use them. These machine are critical, not only do they identify potentially life threatening risks for mother and baby they also provide hope and reassurance. Nurses are able to be proactive and save lives.

Thank you to PHASE Nepal with whom we would not be able to achieve so much.



### PHASE IN THE UK

At the core of PHASE Worldwide's values is the belief that everyone has their basic needs met, and a range of opportunities available so we can enable empowerment of anyone, wherever they are in the world. We have continued to make a difference in the UK with thanks to the National Lottery in partnership with Ciné Schools.

122 young people were given the opportunity to make film that would otherwise have not been able to. **53 of those young people were in South Yorkshire.** 30 were able to travel to London for the first Children's International Film Festival.
