FROM THE PRESIDENT

2024 has been a ground-breaking and milestone year for the NSWAFUA. After years of toiling away through 2 interrupted seasons due to Covid, and a full season reboot in 2023, the hard work has started to pay off. With an expanded committee in place, and some fresh young faces stepping forward, we are beginning to experience some positive momentum. The contributions of the committee, and the increased engagement of the umpiring group has been the driving force for season 2024.

The season began with a \$5,000 donation from Life Member, Bob Tait, with the aim to develop young local umpires to the highest standard possible, and potentially reach AFL. This has been the foundation of our strong financial position, and we continue to press forward in keeping with the overall sponsorship objective. This has been made possible by the efforts and implementation of various distinct roles within the committee.

This season the association made the decision to reduce the membership prices, and offer a NSWAFUA logo boot bag for all new paid members in 2024. Alysha Ramsay was the engine room for this initiative and our paid member numbers went from 9 in 2023 to 67 in 2024. This is an outstanding success. The boot bag idea has been picked up by the Canberra and Queensland umpire associations and has been great for branding.

It's here that we acknowledge the efforts of our former presidents, Trav Stemper and Damian Anderson, and treasurer Nic Ford. Trav and Nic were almost lone hands in running the association for several years through very trying times. We now bear the fruits of their perseverance.



We would like to acknowledge the incredible efforts of our committee members, whose hard work and dedication have been instrumental to our success this year. Terry Southwell's insightful 2023 statistics breakdown was used by the AFL to inform policy and employment recommendations for 2024, exemplifying his commitment as our relentless "Stats Man." Amanda Ramsay excelled as Assistant Secretary and, alongside Theresa Shortt, served as a Female Umpire Well-being Liaison Officer, providing crucial support while also contributing through her administrative role. Theresa further united us with her ever-popular food nights, earning her recognition as our food extraordinaire.



This year also saw tremendous success in the national umpiring ranks. Aengus Taylor, Alysha Ramsay, Liam Ramsay, and Nathan Wrigley were all offered AFLW contracts for the 2024 season. The pathway programs have been successful through the tremendous support of the NSWAFUA, and another boundary umpire will most likely move into the VFL ranks for 2025.

Special recognition must go to Theresa Shortt and Amanda Ramsay who both received nominations from third parties for the 2024 Toyota AFL National Volunteer of the Year Award, with Theresa being announced as the winner for NSW. Both women are shining examples of selfless hard work, a can-do attitude, and always putting the good of others first. Theresa didn't stop there, she went on to become the National winner, taking home 2 AFL Grand Final tickets and National recognition for her tireless efforts. Amanda and Theresa, we tip the hat, and you both epitomise everything the Association stands for.

As we reflect on 2024, it's clear we have taken some very positive strides forward, yet there is still much to do. Pay negotiations loom in 2025, and we remain focused on building on this year's progress. Together, we can look ahead with confidence, knowing that the best is yet to come.

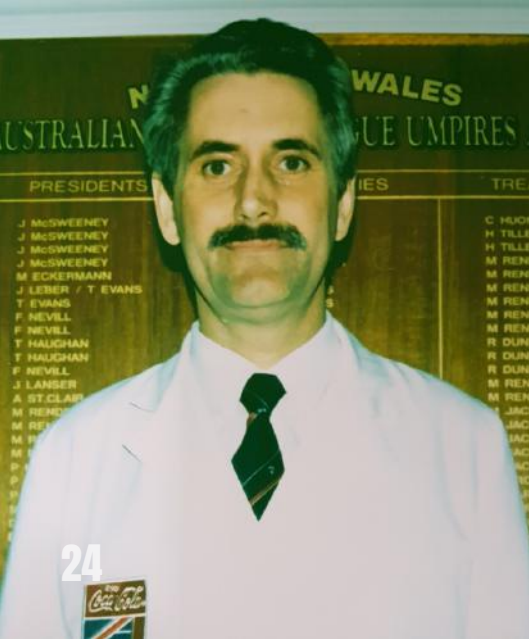

KEN HITS 1000!

The NSWAFUA proudly congratulates Ken Ray on his continued excellence and remarkable achievements in AFL umpiring. Since his journey began in 1989, Ken's passion for the game has remained unwavering, culminating in a historic milestone this year as he officiated his 1000th AFL Sydney match in a Men's Premier Division clash between Manly-Warringah and Pennant Hills. In no means a small feat, this milestone is a testament to his unparalleled dedication and commitment to the sport.

Ken's record-breaking career has been marked by numerous achievements, beginning in 2015 when he became the record holder for the most AFL Sydney Men's Premier Division matches umpired, at the time officiating 417 matches at the highest level of Sydney football. In 2022, he further cemented his legacy by umpiring his 600th Men's Premier Division match, solidifying his status as one of the most accomplished figures in AFL NSW/ACT umpiring history.

A tapestry of extraordinary accomplishments defines Ken's career. He has officiated seven AFL Sydney Men's Premier Division Grand Finals, with appearances in 1994, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2003, 2005, and 2013. Additionally, Ken has been recognised as the Association's Best Goal Umpire three times (1990, 1996, 2003).

Beyond his on-field excellence, Ken's influence as a mentor and coach has been transformative. Early in his career, he served as the AFL Sydney Goal Umpires Coach, providing guidance to hundreds of aspiring umpires. His mentorship has had a far-reaching impact, shaping the careers of umpires who have gone on to officiate at the AFL level. Recognised nationally for his coaching contributions, Ken has left an indelible mark on umpiring not just in Sydney but across Australia.

Ken's talent was evident from the outset. In just his second full season, he was appointed to the AFL Goal Umpires Panel in 1990, making his AFL debut in 1999 at the SCG in a match between the Sydney Swans and North Melbourne. He went on to officiate another eight AFL games before transitioning into the role of AFL Goal Umpires Coach and Observer for NSW/ACT in 2001—a position he held with distinction for over a decade.

A Life Member and Hall of Famer of the NSWAFUA, Ken has also been a tireless contributor to the association's committee, playing a vital role in shaping its future and improving umpiring standards across the board. His leadership, dedication, and vision have left an enduring legacy for the umpiring community.

Ken Ray's illustrious career is a source of inspiration for all who follow in his footsteps. As he continues to umpire and mentor the next generation of officials, his influence on the game remains profound. The NSWAFUA thanks Ken for his extraordinary service and congratulates him on his unparalleled achievements. With no signs of slowing down, we look forward to celebrating even more milestones in the years to come.
