A Message From Our Senior Minister Rev. James H. Harry

Hello Everyone:

Grace and Peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. I trust this edition of the Saint Paul Epistle greets you

warmly. The word epistle simply means a literary form of writing, most notably, a letter. There are different literary genres included in the twenty-seven books of the New Testament. Of those 27 books, 14 are considered "epistles" attributed to the Apostle Paul. For the most part, these epistles are specific letters written to specific churches for a specific reason and deal with specific issues going on in the local church to which the epistle is written. When we read a Saint Paul epistle, we are eavesdropping in on a particular conversation the apostle is having with a specific church. This is precisely what our Saint Paul Epistle is meant to do.

This newsletter is an epistle, a letter, that is intended to relay specific information to you. In our Epistle, which is appropriately named for our namesake, Saint Paul, our Ministry Team members are reporting, inviting, sharing, informing, and announcing specific news and events to the members of Saint Paul Methodist Church [SPMC]. Our hope is that you use this letter to become immersed in the happenings of SPMC so that you are made aware of how your church is doing ministry and to provide you an invitation to grow in your faith by serving others in the name of Christ. I do my best to communicate with you regularly at Sunday morning worship, through my Rev. Jim Email Updates, and through the Saint Paul Epistle. I'm excited for you to read this edition of The Epistle and hear from your Ministry Team. 


















From Pastor Rick Winders

This amazing opportunity will allow our youth to give hope to the hopeless and experience God's grace through serving others.

From Our CHILDREN'S **Ministry**

As we return to the sacred pages of our Saint Paul Epistle, I am humbled to share that this past August marked one year as the Children's Director of Saint Paul. I want to take a moment to reflect on our journey together.

Before examining the current endeavors of our Children's Ministry, I want to emphasize that our mission for the children is a collective one. We are blessed with an extraordinary Children's who pray, dream, and execute the Children's Ministry's programs and events. The Children's Committee has formulated a mission for our children that stresses the importance of intentionality in our approach. I often say to our team that we must make this journey full circle and connect the dots for our children. It's about more than just instructing and setting an example. It's about providing them with opportunities to engage in ministry, as we did by providing a missional opportunity during VBS. By encouraging their involvement in helping and serving others outside of our church, and allowing them to discuss and plan, we made it a personal and meaningful experience. Their enthusiasm is a testament to the success of this approach. Our children raised an impressive \$5,000 in just one week for two different local non-profit organizations.

The Book of James beautifully articulates, "For the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also" [James 2:26]. This profound verse encapsulates the essence of what we strive to convey to our children. It reflects our commitment to nurturing their faith and guiding them



in their walk with Christ. Our mission is not only to teach them but also to equip them with the tools to breathe life into their faith through meaningful actions.

This leads me to a crucial point: We aim to nurture the seeds we've sown by connecting the ideals of service and community. Our goal is to teach them about Jesus, encourage them to ask profound questions, and have them fully engaged, not out of obligation, but out of genuine desire to serve others.

In today's fast-paced and often distracting society, maintaining their focus during our Sunday school and the new Pathfinders program on Sunday evenings can be challenging. While we don't wish to entertain, we acknowledge the responsibility to capture their attention and use the limited time we have effectively to share His Word. Our prayer is that the moments we spend with them plant seeds that will one day yield a bountiful harvest. We fervently hope that our efforts bring glory to our heavenly Father and align with His divine plan.


November is Backpack Buddies Month at Saint Paul
