Manager's Corner

Springettsbury Park Improvements

We are excited to announce upcoming improvements to Springettsbury Park. In 2026, the park will undergo a lighting and security improvements project. This project includes the replacement of lighting throughout the park, security camera system, and repaved parking lots and asphalt walking paths.

The new LED light fixtures will be more energy efficient and will provide better coverage throughout the entire park.

A new security camera system will be installed which will cover the high use areas of the park, including parking lots. While there will be areas of the park that will not have security cameras installed initially, all light poles will be camera ready and underground conduit will be installed during this project to easily allow for future camera additions.

The parking lots and most of the asphalt walking paths will be repaved.

In January 2026, the Board of Supervisors awarded the construction contract to Thomas H. Clingan Electrical Services, York Pennsylvania for \$2,041,384. The township received a \$1,000,000 grant from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development to be used towards this project.

Springettsbury Park is bustling with activity year-round. These safety improvements will enhance the experience for all park visitors pursuing recreational activities that the park has to offer.

Construction is expected to start in the summer of 2026 with an anticipated completion by the end of the year. This project involves trenching and excavation, therefore, visitors will experience disruptions and inconveniences. The township appreciates your patience and understanding while you navigate throughout the park during construction.

*Put a phone number on your check.

When using **bill pay** through your bank all payments must be made out to the tax collector and must include a parcel ID on payment. **Electronic payments are not accepted.** The township is not responsible for delayed payments if your payment is applied to an incorrect department account.

A \$50 service fee will be charged for returned checks **PLEASE PUT A PHONE NUMBER ON YOUR CHECK**

POSTMARK, NOT CHECK DATE, determines when payment is received. Your cancelled check will serve as a receipt unless **both halves** of your tax bill, along with a **stamped,** self-addressed envelope, are included with payment.

Cash payments must be exact change.

No postdated checks.

\$5.00 duplicate bill fee

Any taxes paid between Dec 15 and Dec 31 MUST be paid with guaranteed funds, personal checks not accepted after Dec. 15

All taxes are mailed to the homeowner. If your taxes are paid from an escrow account, it is your responsibility to send the tax collector portion of the bill to your mortgage company.

Real estate taxes billed on/before Aug. 31 must be paid by Dec. 31, 2026 to avoid delinquency.

Sewer Payment Options

Springettsbury Township provides multiple options for residents and property owners to make sewer bill payments, including by mail, in person, over the phone, ACH direct withdraw or online credit card/ electronic check payment. An envelope is included with mailed bills. The Township encourages all residents to make payment early to ensure it is received by the due date. Payments are posted on the date payment is received, not by the postmark date. Failure to receive sewer bills is not considered a reason for non-payment and does not extend the due date.

By Mail

The Township switched to a new lockbox service on April 1, 2026, requiring all mailed payments to be sent to PO Box 358, Souderton, PA 18964. This change aims to streamline the payment process. Residents maintain the option to drop off payments directly at the Township Building.

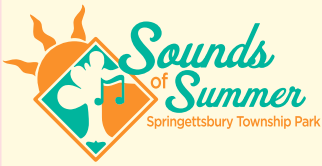

PARKS RULES

It is expected that all users of Township facilities will conduct themselves and their activities in such a way as will not obstruct or interfere with the use and enjoyment of the facilities by others. Respect for, courtesy to, and cooperation with other users will be the norm, and any failure to demonstrate these qualities may result in denial of use of the facilities.

Springettsbury Township Parks will be subject to the following rules and regulations:

- Springettsbury Township Park will open at 7 a.m. and close at 11 p.m. All other parks will operate from dawn to dusk. There shall be no trespassing on park property during closed hours.
- Smoking shall be prohibited at all times on any park property.
- The Township Manager, the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, the Chief of Police or the Director of Parks and Recreation may close the park(s) if hazardous conditions exist that endanger life or property. There shall be no trespassing on park property during such times.
- There shall be no littering.
- Vandalism and negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property is prohibited. Possession or use of a mineral or metal detector, magnetometer, side scan sonar, other metal detecting device or sub-bottom profiler is prohibited. All natural, cultural, and archaeological resources are protected and may not be removed or disturbed.
- Open fires or hot charcoals shall only be permitted in Township park grills. Grills are not to be left unattended and shall be thoroughly extinguished upon departure.
- Picnic tables are not to be removed from the picnic shelters.
- The solicitation, selling, or the distribution of any items or services unrelated to Township sponsored activities is prohibited.
- Posting of signs of any kind is prohibited.
- Alcoholic beverages and controlled substances are strictly prohibited.
- Use of explosives or explosive devices, fireworks, sparklers, hot air-balloons, rockets, remote control air planes or vehicles, air guns, bows, slingshots or any similar items for non-Park and Recreation sponsored events is prohibited. It shall be lawful for any person to discharge a firearm within the Township, except if discharged in violation of all local, state and federal laws, rules and regulations, including but not limited to the Air Rifles Law, Game Commission Rules and Regulations and the Game Law.
- Injury or killing of wild or domestic animals is prohibited.
- All dogs must be currently licensed and vaccinated. Dogs shall not be permitted on any playground, sports fields or in the amphitheater area. Dogs must be leashed at all times and the leash must not be longer than six feet (6'). Limit two (2) dogs per adult. Waste must be collected immediately. Dog owners are responsible for injuries inflicted by their dog to others. Aggressive dogs are not permitted.
- No hitting of golf balls.
- Use of any amplification devices and microphones is prohibited unless activity is sponsored by the Township.
- Motorized vehicles except those expressly authorized are prohibited except in designated parking areas.
- Facilities and equipment can only be used for the purpose intended
- Use of electrical outlets is restricted to Township only equipment or Township-sponsored events.
- Skateboarding, In-line skating and bicycling are prohibited in all picnic shelters, on the tennis courts and Amphitheater area including the stage, terrace seating area and designated access points.
- It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in any abusive, loud, vulgar or otherwise disorderly conduct.
- Parking areas are for park users only. All vehicles shall be parked within the designated spaces provided.
- Tents, canopies or any other like structure are prohibited unless used for a Township sponsored event.

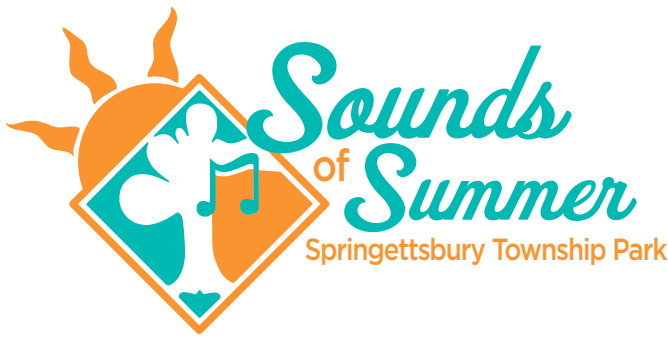

Services Offered

- 1-3 ea. 32-gallon trash bag or trash can per week plus recycling pick-up. **Cost per quarter = \$105.26.**
- 1-96 gallon toter equal to 3-32-gallon trash bags or trash cans per week plus recycling pick-up. **Cost per quarter = \$105.26.**
- Extra waste bags may be purchased at the Township Municipal Building or by calling Penn Waste at 717-767-4456. **The fee per bag is \$5.00.**

Acceptable Large Items

Residents should contact Penn Waste, 717-767-4456 to schedule the large item collection at least one day prior to the normal collection day.

- Appliances
- Carpet 48" maximum length rolled and tied
- Furniture
- Mattresses and box springs
- Car tires only (*must be off rims*)
- Discarded lawnmowers must have gasoline and motor oil removed
- Plumbing fixtures - toilets, sinks, bathtubs, etc.
- Washer and Dryer units

Unacceptable Large Items

- Rechargeable Batteries (For disposal options visit: Call2Recycle.org)
- Television sets and electronic devices
- Stains, Chemicals and Liquids
- Scrap Metal
- Automobile Parts
- Household Hazardous Waste
- Tires on Rims
- Commercial/Industrial Waste
- Construction Material or Debris
To include: Drywall; Brick; Block; Treated Lumber; Roofing Shingles; Ceiling Tiles; Concrete; Doors; Windows. Small quantities of select materials may be accepted at the Resource Recovery Center. Fees may be applied. Call before visiting – 717-845-1066.

Holiday Collection Schedule

Penn Waste observes New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. When your collection day is on or after a holiday, collections will be delayed by one day. Example: Memorial Day falls on a Monday. Collection schedule this week is Tuesday through Saturday. Thanksgiving falls on a Thursday. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday collections will not change. Thursday and Friday collections will move to Friday and Saturday. **EXCEPTION:** If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is **no change** in service prior to or after the holiday.

What to do with Unacceptable Items?

- Used Oil from vehicles can often be disposed of at auto shops or agencies selling auto supplies.
- Unacceptable metal items can often be disposed of through various Metal Recyclers or Scrap Metal facilities in the area.
- Plastic Bags – from all stores - can be recycled at many local grocery stores.
- Truck and tractor tires can be taken to a tire distributor to be disposed of or recycled. Contact business in advance, a fee may be required.

- It is always recommended to call a facility first to see what their policies are regarding accepting materials.

Recycling Acceptable Items

Place **ONLY** these items in your Recycling Bin

Metal: Aluminum and steel food & beverage cans

Glass: Clear, brown, blue and green glass food & beverage containers

Plastic: #1, #2, and #5 ONLY

Paper & Cardboard:

- Corrugated cardboard boxes
- Newspaper, Magazines, and office paper
- Cartons for Juice, Milk, Soy Milk, Soup/Broth, Wine, Egg Substitutes and Cream

Remember:

- Remove all packaging materials (Styrofoam, peanuts, bubble wrap, plastic liners)
- Flatten ALL boxes, and
- Bundle all cardboard that does not fit into the recycling bin
- Cover loose paper with heavier items to prevent it from blowing away. If the weather forecast calls for high winds or wet weather, keep your paper recyclables until the next week. Wet paper products are difficult to process.
- Rinse thoroughly to remove all contaminants.
- Please dispose of any liquids in items before placing in recycling bins

Please have your waste, recycling and large item available for collection at curbside by 6:00 a.m. on your collection day, but no earlier than 4:00 p.m. the day prior to pick up. Empty containers must be removed within 24 hours after collection. No items may be placed at curbsides that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people. Additional trash bags are NOT considered a bulk item.

DID YOU KNOW?

Continental Paper Grading (CPG) accepts magazines, junk mail, catalogs, cereal boxes, and books for paper recycling. Drop off these materials at CPG 3350 Concord Road, York
Monday – Friday from 8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Recycling Unacceptable Items

- Needles & Medical Waste – DO NOT place used needles or any other medical waste with recycling! This is a serious health hazard to everyone.
- Diapers (acceptable as trash)
- Aerosol cans (acceptable as trash)
- Windows, mirrors, ceramics, drinking glasses, light bulbs or broken glass (acceptable as trash)
- Shredded paper (acceptable as trash)
- Aluminum foil (acceptable as trash)
- Food soiled or wet materials including paper, cardboard (acceptable as trash)
- Styrofoam, packing peanuts, bubble wrap (acceptable as trash)
- Plastic bags (acceptable as trash)
- Tissues and other paper products (acceptable as trash)
- Paperboard products such as toilet paper/paper towel rolls, cereal boxes, tissue boxes (acceptable as trash)
- Pool chemicals (Hazardous Waste)
- Hose (acceptable as trash)
- Rechargeable Batteries. (For disposal options visit: Call2Recycle.org)

Yard waste will be collected in four (4) foot lengths once per week (**beginning the first week of March and concluding the first week of December**): bundled; placed in a biodegradable Kraft or other paper bag; placed in maximum 32-gallon container with a Township approved brush identification sticker. Brush stickers can be obtained at the Township Municipal Building for \$.50 each.

REMINDERS: Please do not combine yard waste and recycling materials. Do not use the 96-gallon totes provided by Penn Waste for yard waste. Yard Waste containers should be no larger than a 32-gallon container.

The trash and recycling contract excludes grass clippings as part of yard waste. If residents do not have a reusable option for their grass clippings and need a disposal method, the regular trash collection is the only way Penn Waste will take it. The reason the contract excludes grass clippings is because yard waste is taken to mulch generators in the area and they will not accept grass clippings. Please place your grass clippings in trash bags before placing them in your trash toter.

Remember: The Covered Devices Recycling Act (Act 108) prohibits residents and businesses from placing electronics waste at the curb or in their trash. Covered devices include: desktop computers, laptops, monitors, computer peripherals (keyboard, mouse, printer and speakers), televisions and e-readers that browse the internet.

ELECTRONICS COLLECTION TIMES AND LOCATION

The York County Solid Waste Authority (YCSWA) has a FREE Residential Electronics Recycling Program open to York County residents. Collection of electronics is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to noon at the Small Load Drop-off Facility at the York County Resource Recover Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road.
