Message From The Chair



The Calgary Catholic Education Foundation (CCEF) is a dedicated Catholic Non Profit Association, with it's primary goal being to provide financial assistance for enhancement programs in the schools of the Calgary Catholic School District. These programs greatly benefit, and leave lasting impressions on the students of the CCSD. Since 2009 through the dedication, generosity and tenacity of a volunteer board and the Catholic Community, the Calgary Catholic Schools have received more than \$3.4 million, including this past year's contribution of \$125,000. A portion of these funds came from the CCEF's inaugural Gala, celebrating 10 years of operation, slightly delayed by COVID. This was a magnificent event hosted by Dr. Lucy Miller and Mrs. Linda Woitas, who played an integral part in the CCEF formation. Thank you to the over 100 hundred participants, numerous sponsors, and wonderful volunteers and especially Our Executive Director for the beautiful evening.

Alberta is one of only three provinces in our country where publicly funded Catholic Education is thriving, The CCEF is extending an invitation to all diocesans of southern Alberta to help us to strengthen our community and ensure that our grandchildren will enjoy publicly funded Catholic Education for years to come. Our Catholic Community is very enthusiastic as evidenced by our dedication to Catholic Education Sunday, where 116 readers participated in 45 Parishes throughout our Diocese. We are grateful for their involvement in Catholic Education. The CCEF also had many other successful endeavours this past year, with the CCEF 37th Annual District Golf Tournament moved to a new location to accommodate the increased number of participants, a record year for CCSD payroll donations to the CCEF, and the initiation of several innovative fundraising initiatives in partnership with schools within the district.

Our Board has experienced some changes in the last year, so we would like to take this opportunity to thank those who have served as dedicated directors. Thank you, Bill Ackerman who served since 2021; Thank you Priya D'Souza (Treasurer) Board Member since 2021. Their contribution to the CCEF and our school district is much appreciated. I would also like to express my regrets in stepping down as Chair of the CCEF. My last 7 years on the board have been an enriching experience for me and I will miss the many new friends that I have made.

The CCEF would again like to express our gratitude and appreciation to the entire Catholic community, whose commitment helped us to surpass our fundraising goals. We pray that our good Lord will continue to bless our work as we continue to do our part in ensuring that the students of the Calgary Catholic School District may enjoy enhancement opportunities that will enrich their experience.

Message From Leadership



Looking back over our year, I am struck by the CCEF's incredible efforts to continue supporting Catholic students in our district as we emerged from the pandemic. Catholic Education Sunday is a pillar in our yearly campaigns and one where we speak to the gift of Catholic education across the Diocese. We must strive to uphold this gift to ensure its viability in our ever-increasingly secular province. This year we were once again welcomed into the parishes to speak to the gift of Catholic education, where we saw over 181 masses across the 45 parishes in our area participate. Our participation grew from the previous year, which was reflected in our engagement with the Calgary Catholic School District volunteers and the parishioners. We are one of the only Catholic education foundations in Alberta that engages with its Diocese and its school district for Catholic Education Sunday. It is a privilege and an honour to allocate our resources to do so.

Despite not holding a raffle in the previous fiscal year, the CCEF was determined to resume our grant awards to the schools to pre-pandemic levels of \$125,000. The demand for grant requests, however, was over \$260,000. Therefore, our biennial raffle was moved to an annual raffle, and we surpassed all previous raffles thanks to our technology partner, Rafflebox.

The demand for funding for enhanced learning opportunities continued to grow. The focus is primarily on technology as this has proven to be an invaluable tool for students to adapt their learning. There is a yearly need for technology investment as new students, especially newly arrived Canadians, continue to enroll in the Calgary Catholic School District. The CCEF continues to grow and change from a "one and done" donation model to more sustainable growth to meet future needs.

In May 2022, after multiple years of delay, we held our inaugural Gala to celebrate Catholic education. The evening was a resounding success, hosted by Dave Kelly and raising much-needed funding while boosting our community to celebrate our gift of Catholic education. Our Annual District Golf Tournament maintained its position as a major charitable golf tournament hosting over 100 golfers at the Blue Devil Golf Course, where camaraderie and friendships flourish while playing a "friendly" round to raise money for the CCEF. Shaw Birdies for Kids presented by AltaLink chose the CCEF as one of over 200 charities in Alberta to match funds raised by up to 50%. This incredible matching program allows the CCEF to promote its funding opportunities with this partnership from March until August from direct donations, payroll donations and events.

Fundraising continues to be challenging, and innovation and new strategies are required to remain viable and relevant. To that end, the CCEF is pursuing opportunities to grow our capacity to be able to provide equity in fundraising for the schools.

The CCSD faces rapid enrollment growth, which means limited resources such as technology are overstretched. However, the CCEF wants to continue to meet the needs of schools for enhanced learning opportunities such as Campus Calgary/Open Minds®, assisting in funding aged playground replacements, providing meaningful reconciliation encounters, and ensuring schools are meeting their faith needs. By investing in today's students, we lessen the future burden on society by meeting student needs today to learn and grow into members of the community who continue to grow in our faith.

In November 2022, we were warmly welcomed back to our parishes in the Diocese of Calgary to testify to the gift of Catholic Education. 116 readers attended masses across 45 parishes in Calgary, Chestermere, Airdrie, and Cochrane, bringing with them their school banners. In 2008, all Catholic schools ceased participating in casino fundraisers as they are a social injustice on the family unit. 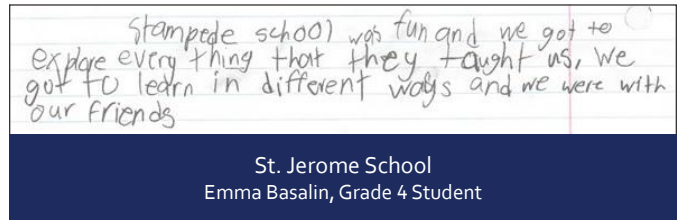
