RESCUE OF DOKEO



Results

Dokéo required higher than expected veterinary costs, with regular injections of vitamins and iron to treat his anaemia.

Allocation of

\$25,000

for:

- The rescue operation
- Salary of a new mahout for one year to ensure Dokeo's care and integration into the sanctuary.

REFORESTATION EFFORTS

Continuous planting in collaboration with the **Department of Forestry and Agriculture**.

\$1 per tree

STRENGTHENING PATROLS IN THE PROTECTED AREA

Funding of the salaries of 3 military rangers for patrols to protect the reserve from poaching and pollution.

Total cost
\$2,500



Results Achieved

Although prices were higher than expected, we still managed to finance three months of the mission - July, August and September - for the military, at a cost of 18 million kip per month, or approximately \$830 per month.



EDUCATIONAL PARTNERSHIP WITH THE THREE SCHOOLS IN PAKBENG / 9 CLASSES INVOLVED /

We welcomed a total of 270 pupils: three classes of 30 pupils from the three schools, one class per week in April, May and June.

\$210 per class

including a T-shirt, lunch and materials (paper and pencils) for the drawing competition.

CONTINUOUS CARE FOR MAE KHAM

Maintain of daily feeding:
50 kilos of **fruit** and kilos of **rice** per day.

FINALISE THE DAY FENCE

Installation of a **5-hectare fence** to facilitate socialisation among our female elephants.

We had to finance repairs to the existing daytime fence (3 hectares) and the females' night-time fence, at a cost of \$2,500, due to damage caused by Typhoon Yagi.


POOL RENOVATION



1 NEW STORAGE FACILITY (BANANAS/CORN)

We require new storage facilities to guarantee the quality and freshness of our fruit and vegetables, to store them in the best possible conditions and to avoid any risk of mould or rodents.

Cost
\$1,000



2 FINISH THE DAY FENCE

Install a **3-hectare fence** to facilitate socialisation among our female elephants.

Cost
\$3,500



3 STRENGTHENING MILITARY PATROLS

Increase the frequency of patrols: at least two missions per year, each lasting three months.

Cost
\$830 per month



4 POOL RENOVATION

Destroyed by Typhoon Yagi

\$3,000






WELCOMING ALL CLASSES FROM PAKBENG SCHOOLS

Last year, we did not welcome children under the age of 6. This year, we would like to invite **all students**, accompanied by their parents: a total of approximately 400 children, teachers and parents.

Cost

\$1 per child

(including lunch, T-shirt and notebook/pen)



NEW HOUSE FOR MAE KHAM'S MAHOUT

As Mae Kham is getting older, we want to ensure continuous supervision, including at night. The goal is to build a house for her mahout in the immediate vicinity of her night enclosure to ensure constant monitoring.

Cost

\$700





NEW NIGHT FENCE

Need to build **a second 10 hectare night fence** so our female elephants always have access to food. This will allow us to move them safely between two fenced areas as needed.

Cost
\$20,000
