# Patron

It has been a joy and a privilege to view the huge range of works submitted for the Ravenswood Australian Women's Art Prize this year.

The artworks in the Emerging Artist category explore the female experience in both the domestic sphere and the natural world. Using an innovative range of materials the artists have investigated their relationship to the environment, and the quiet beauty of intimate family life. Each artwork is enriched with the artist's own experience, memory or philosophy.

The calibre of the work submitted for the Emerging Indigenous category is extremely high, with finalists submitting works from across the country. The artists tell us of cultural knowledges passed from mother to daughter, of bush flowers and Bush Medicines, as well as mourning the loss of cultural knowledges, and a rousing challenge to the viewer to take responsibility for their own role in Reconciliation.

From the intimate and introspective to profound environmental themes,



the Professional Artist category presents thought provoking and captivating artworks. This year the artists have pushed the boundaries of diverse media such as experimental photography, sculptural textiles made from horsehair and paintings created with plant-based pigments. The Professional Artists have explored the complexity of female identity through powerful female figures, performative femininity and the plight of the artist mother. Many artists have felt compelled to explore humanity's complex connection to nature, finding powerful and poetic expression for the growing impacts of climate change.

Jennifer Turpin, a Ravenswood Alumni, is an environmental artist who has created awardwinning, public domain artworks at

the interface of art, science, nature and the built environment for more than 30 years. Jennifer and the team at Turpin + Crawford Studio work with scientists, engineers and specialist designers and fabricators to realise their innovative sculptural projects. Her work is held in numerous public collections. Lara was awarded the 2022 Ravenswood Australian Women's Art Prize - Professional Artist category.
