

The Wylie Gator Book Club will discuss *Rules of Civility* by Amor Towles at its April 22 meeting. There's plenty of time to grab a copy and come to Jocks and Jills at 6 p.m. for dinner and conversation.



During past America's Boating Club-Charlotte Rendezvous and Co-Op Charting events, Lt/C Brevard S. Myers Jr. SN-ACN would print out navigation charts or even chart books to cover the areas that we were investigating. Then boat crews would crank up their chart plotters (if their vessels were equipped with them) and plot a course to their assigned destinations.

Now, printing those charts is a bit more challenging and expensive. There's also a question about how recently the printed charts or chart plotter data has been updated.



The future, maybe even the near future, is looking up for navigating the open seas and inland waterways. Apps for mobile phones, iPads and laptops – such as Aqua Map, Navionics and Open CPN – make it possible to access digital charts and display them onboard. Other app offerings and updates to current programs are expected to make the experience even more convenient and accurate.

During the April 1 (no fooling) General Membership Meeting, Myers will talk about charts and navigation apps. He will also tell where to buy printed charts or at least get the digital files and how he prints them for our adventures.

America's Boating Club still recommends that we have paper charts onboard when we set out on a sea adventure. The savvy captain will have backups in case the digital aids to navigation fail.

Myers will tell us what the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Office of Coast Survey has for us in the form of charts and how to use them in planning for a coastal or ocean trip.
