



Before and after school supervision, known as Extended Care, is provided to assist parents who need additional supervision for children outside of the supervised 7:25 a.m. - 3:35 p.m. school day. For your convenience, Extended Care charges will be billed monthly through your FACTS account.

The following guidelines are to help provide safety and supervision for your child:

- Ensure all contact information is updated for the current school year.
- All pick up occurs via texting. No one is allowed in the building for pick up.
- All K-6 students arriving before 7:45 a.m. will need to be under supervised care.
- All K-6 students who are regularly not picked up in the car line by 3:35 p.m. need to go to Extended Care. Billing begins at 3:15 p.m.
- No K-6 students should be at the gym or other campus locations without supervision.

TIMES: Morning Extended Care – 7:00 a.m. – 7:25 a.m. Afternoon Extended Care – 3:15 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. RATES: \$7.25 per hour/per child (billed in 15 minute increments) Late Fees after 6:00 p.m. are \$1.00 per minute.

Morning Extended Care

Available for all K-6 students and begins in the Kids' Commons at 7:00 a.m. At 7:25 a.m., third through sixth grade students will be sent to the lunchroom where two adults will provide supervision as a portion of their morning duty. There is no charge from 7:25 a.m. – 7:45 a.m.

Afternoon Extended Care

Available for all K-6 students and begins in the Kids' Commons at 3:15 p.m. Please note, if your student is not picked up by 3:35 p.m. from the car line, they will be checked into Extended Care.

Junior High

JH students have Afternoon Extended Study in the Atrium starting at 3:30 p.m. If they are not in extended care, students should be off campus or in an activity by 3:30 p.m. (per the student handbook). The hourly rate is \$7.25.

Elementary After School Programs

Music Offerings

Grace Notes

Open to students in grades 1 & 2. The main focus of this program will be to help students express their musical creativity by building a variety of skills, talents, and abilities. As a part of this program, your child will explore the basics of music by using a variety of classroom instruments, learn new music concepts through music, movement, and imaginative play, participate in a variety of ensemble experiences, and develop an awareness of steady beat, meter, and rhythm, essential musicianship skills with ties to physical development and coordination. They will also develop self-confidence, musicianship, collaboration, and creativity through teamwork, peer interaction, and communication.

Music Makers

Open to students in grades 3 & 4. The main focus of this program will be to expand on the basics of music and begin introducing more advanced musical concepts. In this program, students will creatively explore the fundamentals of music and worship in an energetic, fun filled environment. Students enrolled in this program will participate in leading Chapel for Elementary Worship services. They will also be exposed to the beginning aspects of Worship Leadership and will learn to play piano chords and read from a piano lead sheet.

Elev8

Open to students entering grades 5 & 6. This program will focus on intermediate aspects of worship leadership. Elev8 will begin the process of equipping the next generation of Christ followers with the tools they will need to serve Christ's kingdom while using their gifts effectively. The term elevate means "to lift up or make higher." The main focus of this program will be to help students elevate their awareness of Christ's presence in their lives and translate that knowledge into their worship leadership. Students enrolled in this program will participate in leading Chapel for Elementary Worship services. They will learn to play piano chords and read from a piano lead sheet and will also be equipped with practical keyboard and vocal tools that they will be able to use as they begin to learn how to lead worship effectively.

Art Club

Open to students in grades 1-6. Bay Area Christian School will offer classes for the Art Club. In Psalm 50:2, "From Zion, perfect in beauty, God shines forth." God dwells in beauty and His holiness is beautiful. Art is valued and inspired by God as a means of reflecting and glorifying God's wonders. Students will use certain mediums to explore all the beauty we represent in the Bible and how the stories come to be. The main focus of this program will be to help students refine their artistic skills to glorify the Lord through Art. There will be an interest email with additional information sent at the beginning of school.

Elementary After School Programs

Chess Club

The Knight School Chess Team gives 1st-6th grade students a fun, constructive, and educationally valuable way to spend after-school time. All instructors at The Knight School have passed background checks and are kid-magnet, charismatic, high-energy instructors who demonstrate the highest professionalism and classroom management ability. Bay Area Christian School will offer chess club weekly on Thursdays and there will be an interest email with additional information sent at the beginning of school.

Elementary Before School Programs

STEM Club Offerings

Robotics

Bay Area Christian School offers STEM Club Robotics as a before-school activity for grades 4-6 led by parent volunteers vetted with BACS. Robotics will use VEX GO kit curriculum to inspire young creators for the future. Robotics will meet on certain Fridays for fall or spring semester options and an interest email with additional information will be sent at the beginning of each semester.

Sprouts

Bay Area Christian School offers STEM Club Bronco Sprouts as a before-school activity for grades 1-3 led by parent volunteers vetted with BACS. Bronco Sprouts will study the life cycle of plants and participate in tending raised garden beds. At the end of the club, they will celebrate God's harvest and how it correlates with the parables in Scripture. Bronco Sprouts will meet on certain Fridays for fall or spring semester options and an interest email with additional information will be sent at the beginning of each semester.

Drop off Map


DROP OFF

Logistics:

- League City enters from EAST drive and Friendswood enters from WEST drive.
- When leaving campus, exit the side to which you are headed. Ex. 45=East drive
- Traffic around the Cullins building in one way only CLOCKWISE with a flow lane.
- 4. Elementary drop off points are on the North side of the Cullins Building.
 - a. League City is on the East side (Atrium and 6th grade entrance.)
 - b. Friendswood is on the West side (kindergarten and Atrium entrance.)
- 5. JH & HS drop off points are the Student Center parking lot and HS parking lot.
- 6. Please enter and exit swiftly; parking is limited.
- If you must park, please use the parking by the Main Office on the West side or Student Center parking lot.







Pick up Map


PICK UP

Logistics:

- K-2 & Family pick up MUST enter from the EAST drive pick up from Cullins Bldg. curb.
- 3-6 pick up MUST enter from the WEST drive pick up from the Auditorium curb.
- 3. Pickup is on the NORTH side of the Cullins building.
- 4. All flow is one way only CLOCKWISE with a flow lane.
- JH & HS pick up should use the West drive for Student Center pick up and Center drive for HS lot pick up.
 - A. JH/HS parents, please do not bypass cars queued in the drives!
 - B. A traffic attendant will help usher you into bypass wait on them to do so.
- PLEASE arrive no sooner than 3:05 for elementary pick up. This will allow JH/HS to pick up and decrease congestion.
- FAMILY pick up, please come at 3:25. Elementary students will be on the curb at 3:15.



Uniform Information



Is Lands' End the only provider of uniforms for BACS?

Yes, Lands' End is the exclusive provider of uniforms. However, if students have or want to acquire BACS polo shirts, sweatshirts/hoodies, jackets, etc. from the Bronco Sideline Spirit Wear Shop, those are acceptable items to wear. If a BACS sweatshirt or hoodie is worn, an acceptable school uniform top must be worn underneath the sweatshirt. For consistency, the only places to purchase school approved uniforms is Lands' End and the Bronco Sideline Spirit Wear Shop.



Order online at landsend.com/school and create your account. Include your student and school information in My Account (or find your school using the Preferred School Number Search: 900161282). Start shopping with your personalized product checklist.



Visit baschool.org, click Bronco Life, then Athletics, Athletics Home, then Broncos HQ, then Spirit Wear Shop. All non-collared spirit or BACS shirts can only be worn on Fridays for spirit day. The shop is open year-round and ships in 10-12 days to your home.



Will the styles change from year to year?

Our vision for the style of our uniform is to be consistent in expectation. Therefore, we will not make wholesale changes, rather there may be yearly implementations or additions. In the elementary grades, there may be styles that aren't age appropriate for junior high students. It is good to know that the basic options of shorts, pants, and polos are acceptable in all grades. So, it is conceivable for a seventh grader to wear a polo for several years as long as it fits appropriately.



When can we begin ordering uniforms?

You can start as soon as your student's acceptance has been confirmed. Simply go to their website, landsend.com, and use our school code 900161282. Delivery time is about two to three weeks.



Do all shirts require the school logo?

All shirts and outerwear (vests, sweaters, jackets, etc.) purchased through Lands' End for school uniforms must have the logo. The school logo embroidery is done by Lands' End. Please take advantage of the penny logo incentive when available. Also, if we offer a polo through the Spirit Store, that is an acceptable uniform top as well. Additionally, any spirit day wear is acceptable on spirit day and doesn't require a logo.



What about jackets or fleece options? Do they have to have the school logo?

Any jacket may be worn on campus, but only outerwear with the logos or Spirit Store/Bronco outerwear, hoodies, sweatshirts, etc. may be worn during the day in the school buildings. For instance, a child may wear his or her choice of a jacket or coat on campus to and from the car and at recess, but if it is not part of the school uniform or approved Spirit Store offering, then the student needs to store the jacket while in the building.



Do shirts need to be tucked in for both girls and boys?

Yes, shirts need to be tucked in for both boys and girls. However, Peter Pan collared shirts and Oxford, button-down shirts for girls are not required to be tucked in. Please remember that a BACS sweatshirt can also be worn over a uniform shirt. On Fridays, our Spirit Day, students are not required to tuck in their shirts.



Do girls have to specifically wear skirts, skorts, or pants?

No, girls may wear a variety of options, including shorts. However, in 5th and 6th grade, the skort is NOT a dress code option. When you register your child by grade and gender, all of the available options are provided for you.



Do we have school spirit days?

ABSOLUTELY! We have spirit days on Fridays. Students may wear Lands' End bottoms or modest blue jeans without holes, rips, or tears along with a Bronco Spirit Wear shirt (including class t-shirts for elementary), Bronco Spirit Store wear, or any BACS sports shirts within the red, white, navy and grey school color scheme.



What about after-school activities? Does my child still need to be in uniform?

No, however students should dress modestly and appropriately while on campus.



May my child wear any shoes they want?

Students need to wear shoes that totally enclose the foot - no sandals, Crocs, or flip-flops. Sperry's, Toms, Vans, tennis shoes, flats, boots, or dress shoes (with one-inch heel or less), are all acceptable - colors may vary. House shoes, slippers, sandals, flip-flops, high heels and sling-backs are not permitted.



What kind of socks, belts, or leggings are allowed?

The intention of the dress code is not to remove individuality or choices from students. Therefore, we are not mandating that socks, leggings, shoes, ties, etc. be purchased through Lands' End. There are only a few guidelines regarding these areas: Belts must be worn when there are belt loops. Belts can be any style as long as they fit within the belt loops. In K-6, leggings and socks can be any style or color. Parameters for grades 7-12 are that leggings/tights should be solid colors without textured designs, and socks should not be distracting in style of design or style of wear.



What do I do with my clothes when we leave?



The vision for the uniforms is not to be cumbersome but to be freeing in that they provide consistency in expectations and for the focus to be on other priorities. Therefore, the uniforms may be passed down or sold to schoolmates, friends, and family.
