



whole new concept for the National General Assembly was one of the platforms of then Regional Director candidate Bro. Charlie (Delta "Tsack" B. Canada Lambda '92) in 2019. While he did not secure the post that development year, the winning RD, Bro. Manolo "Lito" L. Arasa (Epsilon '81) took to his proposal and made it the central theme of the 2020 NGA. Balik Iskawting... Ulit was launched with an engaging video shot on the Boy Scouts of the Philippines grounds in Mt. Makiling, Los Baños, Laguna. Preparations were already underway then, but due to the pandemic, was shelved.

Fast-forward Bro. to 2021. Tsack is the Regional Director of Region IV-A (CALABARZON) with а refreshing set of platforms that include bringing transparency and

the regional leadership and administrative services closer to the members in the region. He started his administration by crafting the region's Mission and Vision during the Induction and Strategic Planning in October 30, 2021. And then, as the non-election NGA was again awarded to the region, the Balik Iskawting...Ulit theme was revisited and relaunched.

The concept for this theme was taken from the very successful **CAMPORAMA** which Bro. Tsack was one of the pioneers. CAMPORAMA, which started in 1993, is a jamboree-style gathering APO members which became one of the most successful and anticipated activities in the Bicol Administrative Region. This concept while new (as a general assembly theme) is not off-tangent, as APO is based on scouting, after all.

The BSP grounds is chosen specifically for the activities on the NGA program. It is most appropriate for the scouting preliminaries such as the campfire on the first night of the event. What used to be a typical reunion of chapmates will now be a chance to have activities characterized by inclusiveness. Everyone is encouraged to be involved in the activities set forth in the program. There is something for everyone.

A cultural night dubbed as the "Gabi ng Kulturang Filipino" and acoustic night will highlight the first day (Friday, June 3, 2022). A calisthenics activity headed by the collegiate members will start on the morning of second day (Saturday, June 4, 2022) to be followed by competitive scouting activities. Plenary is scheduled after the scouting activities, starting with entry of colors of all the regions; while



learning sessions and seminars are slated for the afternoon. Saturday evening is for the Chairman and President's Night, where there will be live band performance. And finally, a mega service will happen on the last day (Sunday, June 5, 2022). Collegiate members are highly encouraged to attend and participate, especially during the cultural night, the calisthenics, and the competitive scouting activities.

Collective effort brings this event into fruition. The committees for the NGA are nearly the same ones in the 2020 NGA; starting with NEVP Bro. Edgar D. Llarena (Eta Theta '86) as the NGA Overall Chairman; RD Bro. Tsack heads the Activity Committee; V. Penaflorida Ryan Bro. Garcia (Eta Xi '05), the Scouting Activity Committee; Bro. Brent Thomas Villanueva (Epsilon '13), the Service Committee; Bro. Dick Erwin "Ricky" R. Battreal (Delta Xi '79), the Motorcade Committee; Bro. Jose Gregorio A. Lavapiez (Eta Theta '06), the

Logistics Committee; Sis. Hazel L. Gutierrez (Chi '81), the Food Committee; DRD Bro. Jose Magno C. Fortuna (Alpha Nu '99), the Security Committee; Sis. Marita Lapis-Barcia (Alpha Sigma '80), the Registration Committee; Bro. Apolinar L. Dimla (Lambda Psi '01) and Sis. Leny L. Gutierrez (Chi '83), the Accommodation Committee: Bro. Leonardo L. Scouting Spirit Across Asia

It's not the number of meetings or activities that measures your scouting, but the way you live the principles of Leadership, Friendship, Service.

n the previous issue of Torch and Trefoil, I reported about the spirit of being home as one of the factors nudging the ARA-based alumni to move to live the principles of Leadership, Friendship and Service.

In this brief feature, I will highlight the other spirit: the scouting spirit in the context of the activities that transpired in ARA.

The scouting spirit, as we know it, are spelled out in the Scout Oath and Law, as well as motto and slogan. With the spirit moving among us, we are nudged to incorporate these ideals knowingly or unknowingly into our daily lives at home, at work, in our community, in our religious life, and even in our political life.



Community Life

It was the scouting spirit that made possible APO's involvement in their host communities. Blood-letting continued to be a major activity by Hongkong, Singapore, Nagoya, and Siam AAs.

In addition to blood letting, beach clean up was also pursued actively across ARA. And there are signs that ARA will be increasing the scope of their "beach cleanup" commitments, to include parks, churches, and other facilities in the community that need cleaning.

An innovative community activity we noted was APO AA Siam's Valentine Activity in February that saw brethren distributing face masks and lucky bamboos. Good luck bamboos is part of Thai culture, and the service showed our brethren's understanding and appreciation of Thai culture.

APO AA Singapore's regular service of preparing food packets at the Willing Hands continues to attract brethren whenever it is held.

Religious Life

In Singapore, 15 APOAAS alumni members held their annual Visita Iglesia on Maundy Thursday by walking a 17-km odyssey under the Holy Week moon to visit and pray in eight iconic Catholic churches along the way.

They started the journey to the Church of Our Lady Queen of Peace before proceeding to the Church of St Stephen, Church of St. Michael, Church of St Alphonsus (aka Novena Church), Our Lady of Lourdes Church, St. Joseph's Church, Church of Sts Peter & Paul, and the Cathedral of the Good Shepherd.

They completed the journey before daybreak – just enough time to rest and fulfil their Good Friday obligations.

According to ARA Regional Director Paolo Ugale and APOASS President Malvin Jariel, the Visita Iglesia tradition in the Section started in 2016 to continue the practice of this beautiful Catholic Holy Week tradition.

Section 1 chairperson sis Joan Paula Cuya, said Covid-19 safety management protocols response pescribed a limited number of participants, group size and movement. "I am hoping it will be more relaxed next year so that more can participate."

Politics

The scouting spirit was also evident by the way ARA members conducted their politics.

ARA RD Paolo Ugale is an Ilocano and a Bongbong Marcos supporter. A host of Bicolanos and known supporters of Leni Robredo hold responsible positions in the AAs under ARA's purview.

But their political partisanship do not hold sway over their APO life. As Bro Malvin said in a facebook posting:

"Yes! Sa mga hindi pa po nakakaalam, pwedeng magusap ang isang Solid BBM at Kakampink nang hindi nagbabangayan. Lalo na kung ang pinaguusapan ay kung paano makakatulong sa kapatid na nasunugan at sa mga kababayan natin na naapektuhan ng bagyong Agaton. Unahin ang serbisyo bago pulitika."





APOAAS brethren also came forward to support the absentee voting operations at the Philippine Embassy when overseas voting begins in April.

Under sun and rain, and in the true spirit of scouting and service, expect APOAAS volunteers to assist in perform crowd control, access control, yeoman duties, safety management and first aid, to support the operations of Embassy staff.

RD Paolo Ugale is obviously beaming, full of praise of the efforts of members in living their lives APO brethren around the region. "I thank the general membership on their continued support and services, despite the covid restrictions in our respective countries. This year, some countries are easing the restrictions, but may I remind everyone, that safety comes first. Our health is our utmost priority."

Evaluating scouting spirit will always be a judgment call, but our ARA officers have the feel for it. Members across the region know it. And we do not measure this scouting spirit by counting the number of meetings and outings attended. It is within us. We live it. And we manifest it by the way we live our lives in the foreign host communities we are currently a part of. -30.



trengthening the existing Blood Donation Services Networks of Alpha Phi Omega and improving the delivery of safe, adequate, accessible and affordable blood supply to health facilities are essential to improve the delivery of most needed quality blood to the community and to our fraternal beneficiaries.

Recognizing that the dependence on the paid blood donation system through commercial blood banks has unduly exposed the Filipino people to dreaded diseases and that the best ways to prevent further contagion of blood transmissible diseases is voluntary blood donation by removing monetary incentivization, the Alpha Phi Omega Philippines represented by our National President Atty. Sis. Norma Singson De Loen exchanged pens with the Department of Health,



Philippine Blood Center under the National Voluntary Blood Services Program represented by the head of the PBC, Dr. Dennis Dayao L. Ordoña, MD during the signing of another successful series of Memorandum of Agreement last May 19, 2022 at the PBC Building, Quezon Avenue, Quezon City.

The parties envision by helping the Department of Health institutionalize voluntary donation activities in schools. churches. aovernment non-government organizations. We also acknowledged that collaboration and cooperation between government and nongovernment institutions are effective strategies towards the promotion of the people's health. Organizations such as ours are potential sources of blood and play an active role in the dissemination of benefits of voluntary blood donations.

We cannot deny the fact that blood donation has always been a list on the bucket of services. Every chapter has been doing the same thing since time immemorial. The signing is yet another level of recognition that we are in it together to hold a stansardized mobility in blood donation drives nationwide.

With the memorandum of agreement, all supplies, technical equipment and all promotional material needed in every mobile blood donation shall be provided by the PBC. The promotion and awareness campaign prior to the scheduled dates of every blood donation drive will be arranged and done through joint efforts while all promotional material will be supplied by the PBC.


APO shall get a maximum of thirty percent (30%) of the total blood units collected as needed during the duration of the agreement. The blood will be provided by DOH-NVBSP-PBS and will be available to the recipient of blood/blood products upon endorsement of the Kabalikat Partner Coordinator appointed by the APO National Office.

All Chapters having plans of conducting Blood Donation Drive services in the future can closely coordinate with the National Office for the needed support.



HOW TO BE A DONOR & SAVE LIVES

All potential volunteer blood donors will be physically examined with hemoglobin determination prior to donation. Screening tests for Hepatitis B and C, Malaria, Syphilis and HIV will be done on all units of blood collected. In the event that a potential volunteer blood donor is found to be reactive for any of the above tests, PBC shall provide the concerned individual with free counselling on medical health issues that needs to be addressed. Donors should be between the age of 16-65 (with consent for minors) and acceptable weight is 50 kgs and above.



One Heart: The APO Telemed Kind of Love

Then you have not just one or two but 5 people around you who have fallen ill with the Covid-19 virus, you realize there also needs to be 'more of you' to make sense of what is happening. That initial feeling of confusion sets in, «What am I supposed to do now? My whole family has been infected. And yes, that includes me now.» Those were the thoughts running inside the mind of my niece, let us call her by the name Melissa. She is the eldest daughter of my older sister, who is also a member of the Alpha Phi Omega.

Melissa has 2 children and together with her husband and members of their household they had Covid-19, all at the same time, on October 2021. She did not know yet about the APO Telemed but called me one Sunday afternoon to ask for my advice on what to do. That feeling of helplessness can overwhelm anyone who finds out that he or she is afflicted with this dreaded sickness. Hearing many deaths around you and having just experienced two deaths in their families (the uncle of my niece on her father side and the brother of her husband), it was the notorious Delta variant that caused the surge at that time and it was unforgiving for many. My niece, who had been given the run around by her HMO and did not know when their online appointment would be, was feeling desperate and afraid already. I quickly thought about the APO Telemed as I was at an APO event that day she called me.

Melissa was immediately given an appointment that evening to meet with an APO doctor the next day. But first, she had to fill up a google form for each of her family member. That is a very important part of the process. Through this form, the team of volunteers can easily process the request as it already gives a thorough background of the patient. What her family's HMO could not give her for several days, the APO Telemed was able to provide immediately. In no time. she and her family were meeting with the APO doctor and from there, many decisions were made right away. Melissa was so happy and thankful that the doctor was able to answer all her queries and because of this, she was able to make a plan of action for her whole household. They were given (for free) specific medicines that needed to be administered right away and a complete Covid kit. One cannot tell at the onset if their case would be mild, moderate or severe and so the next coming days were absolutely the most crucial ones. Her two boys, as it turned out, had two different cases, the younger one (9 years old) had it mild with very light symptoms but her older one (11 years old) was experiencing moderate symptoms already after a few days due to his comorbidity, his asthmatic condition.

What is the heart and soul of APO Telemed? It is the immediate action given to APO members and their families when Covid hits hard. Through the volunteer staff of APO members, it is giving their patients exactly what they needthe assistance, the attention and guidance in this very desperate time. Immediate action allows the symptoms to be arrested. With Covid, early detection is paramount for survival. The heart of Telemed is also found in the APO doctors who selflessly give their time, effort and dedication especially when every case is urgent and the patients are overwhelmed and at a loss on how to proceed with the recovery. Knowing you have someone to talk to right away pacifies the panic and distraught which is often caused by not knowing what to do next. And when the patients are completely informed and given all the necessary instructions on what to do, what medicines to take and how to track the illness, each patient can have the peace of mind to be able to focus on their recovery.

Melissa and her whole family survived their 2021 Covid ordeal. It was not without its challenges but when relatives and friends found out about their journey, they were all so overwhelmed by role that the APO Telemed had played. For a very minimum cost of P200 for non-members and free of charge for APO members, patients receive medical care that is optimum and at par with even the best HMOs. It has helped save close to 800 APO members, their families and household and continues to play a big role in giving health care through tele-consultation even to non-covid illnesses. And it is because of this service that the Alpha Phi Omega Philippines can truly say that it looks out not just for the wellness and care of its brothers and sisters, but it has become a pillar to lean on during the most difficult times.

APO - MMDA PARTNERSHIP: MILESTONE FOR ALPHA PHI OMEGA CARDINAL PRINCIPLES OF SERVICE

Ipha Phi Omega Philippines Incorporated marks another history being the first ever fraternal organization partnered with Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA) in providing services, awareness and training that will be beneficial to the general public and the community.

Memorandum of Agreement was executed on March 16, 2022 between APO Ph National President Sis. Atty. Norma Singson-de Leon, APO Ph National Vice President for Alumni and Environmental Committee Chair. Sis. Nancy Go and MMDA Chairman Atty. Romando Artes with Usec. Cris San Juan at MMDA Chairman Atty. Romando Artes at the MMDA Headquarters EDSA cor. Orense St., Guadalupe Nuevo, Makati.

Other members and committee heads of APO Ph witnessed the MOA signing.

According to NP Sis. Norma, this partnership is a milestone for Alpha Phi Omega cardinal principles of service, aligned with government national services

APO regularly extends communityoriented services and projects such as clean-up drives, disaster relief operations, urban renewal and environmental protection activities, among others.

This is a venue to build strong partnership between the government and private sector in implementing development programs and projects; create awareness on the programs of the government; and provide



private individuals and groups with volunteering opportunities in government.

MMDA performs planning, monitoring and coordinative functions, and in the process exercises regulatory and supervisory authority over the delivery of metro-wide services within Metro Manila without diminution of the autonomy of the local government units concerning purely local matters. It approves metro-wide plans, programs and projects and issues rules, regulations and resolutions deemed necessary by the MMDA.

MMDA admits that they need extra force multipliers due to their wide scope which covers the cities of Manila, Quezon City, Caloocan, Pasay, Mandaluyong, Makati, Pasig, Marikina, Muntinlupa, Las Piñas, Parañaque, Valenzuela, Malabon, Taguig, Navotas and San Juan and the municipality of Pateros.

In an interview of APO Ph Committee on Information and Communication, MMDA Chairman Atty. Artes said,»Kami ay nagpapasalamat sa Alpha Phi Omega sa pagbo-volunteer po at sa tie-up partnership na ito malaking tulong po ito sa aming mga programa particularly sa aming clean-updrive sa atin pong rescue.»

Included in the MOA that APO and MMDA will collaborate and cooperate with each other in order to fulfill their respective objectives and mandates in serving the community and the country. The MMDA will provide APO the requisite training, materials, tools, and equipment in order to safely and efficiently conduct the latter's community-oriented services and projects. APO can provide manpower to support MMDA's projects.

Meanwhile, a month after MOA signing, the 1st Joint Clean-Up Drive of APO Ph and MMDA was successfully performed in Baseco - Tondo, Maynila on April 16, 2022, Saturday afternoon. Attended by MMDA staff and members of Alpha Phi Omega from different chapters and alumni associations.

This is just the beginning of a handon-hand public-private partnership in serving our fellowmen and our nation. There would be more join force APO-MMDA activities empowering everyone to support the act of volunteerism.

ON NATIONAL SERVICE FOR HEALTH: PROVIDING HEALTHCARE SERVICES IN APO

he Committee on National Service for Health continued to exhaust measures in providing utmost and newly designed services within and outside the circle of Alpha Phi Omega.

HEALTH WEBINARS. In celebration of the local founding anniversary, it has conducted its first Health Webinar for the Laymen with APO doctors as speakers on March 1, 2022 via Zoom teleconferencing with more than 170 attendees. Topics discussed were Mental Health: PTSD and Stress Management by Dr. Ronnie Lesaca, Eta (Psychiatrist); Women's Health: AyPinayOk ka ba? by Dr. Edna Corpuz-Navallo, Eta (Ob-Gyn); Men's Health: Tol! Prostata nAPO sila by Dr. Ed Vizmonte, Alpha Phi (Urologist); and Cardiac Health: Dr. Dodee Rigor, Alpha Phi (Cardiologist- Interventionist). The Webinar Service Team was manned by Dr. Ed Vizmonte, Dr. Kathleen Miranda, Dr. Ian Tristan Vergara, Dr. Cheantal Sunga, Sis Maryam Padayao, and Sis Nadia Espanol. Moderator for the Q & A was Dr. Ramon Reyes. The online event was hosted by Dr. Edward Allan Flores.

HEALTHCARE ON WHEELS. The Healthcare on Wheels Part 2 Anniversary Service was held on March 1, 2022 from 7am to 3pm at the Quezon City Cirle with a total of 59 patients. Laboratory services through a mobile lab was rendered to APO members, families, and friends. Project leader was Sis Madel Camposano-Kho and she was assisted by brods and sis who, mostly, were nurses.

BLOOD TYPING SERVICES. Ang dugo mo ita-tyPe kO is a new advocacy project of NSH under the leadership of committee member Dr. Ferdinand «Ding» Abon. The first wave of service took place on April 2, 2022 at the Brgy. Hall of Sta. Rita, Guiguinto, Bulacan. They were able to blood type 105 patients, pediatric to geriatric, from APO families and friends. This service is a joint project of APO NSH, APO MAFI, APO Bulacan AA, and APO Greater Los Angeles. The 2nd wave Easter Sunday Service was held on April 17, 2022 - River View Farm on Marquez FamilyBrgy. San Roque, Angat, Bulacan with a total of 212 patients from 5 months old to 78 years old.

MEDICAL MISSION COLLABORATIONS. NSH services had also reached our brothers and sisters in Mindanao. Its first collaborative service (medical mission) and third partnership in the Mindanao regions (first and second during the typhoon last December) took place. NSH donated vitamins and medicines for ANDAA (Alpha Phi Omega ng Davao City Alumni Association) mega medical mission on May 14, 2022 where it catered more or less 500 patients (full article on the next issue of TNT).

INCOMING PROJECTS. The committee aims to extend more of its help thru resources in terms of donation of vitamins and medicines for NCAR's Isabela Medical Mission and the like in any other regions as necessary. Another significant step is the procurement of circumcision instruments that could be utilized in the different circumcision services. Its next and second Webinar will be held on June for the Kidney month c/o Dr. Ronnie Lesaca and Dr. John Paul de Leon and the third webinar (Dental) on July to be organized by incoming APO DAP President, Sis Janina Javier. The next wave for the blood typing «Ang dugo mo ita tyPe kO»



will be in Dona Remedios. Bulacan by the end of June 2022. NSH also was starting to build and unite healthcare professionals from different fields through organizing APO Allied Medical Professionals AA led Sis Nadia Espanol and Sis Madel Camposano-Kho. It aims to conveniently gather up nurses, therapists, medical physical technologists, occupational therapists, and other healthcare professionals in APO who could serve in any activities not only in the NCR areas but as deemed necessary for other regions. There will also be a Circumcision Workshop on the last quarter of 2022, to be organized and facilitated by APO NSH and APO MAFI. This will be for the nonmedical brothers and sisters who are willing to volunteer during medical missions. NSH will issue a certificate of completion and can make this requirement for the non-doctors. The volunteers will be required to commit to join tuli missions at least three times a year. In its adherence to protocols and the drive to provide the best healthcare there is for APO, the three entities, NSH- APO MAFI- APO DAP established the Guidelines on Medical-Dental-Circumcision Mission which will be disseminated soonest.



PO ACADEMY rendered its technical expertise were its members served as guest speakers or lecturers in the activities of the basic organizational units (BOUs).

One such engagement was during the GPAC Summit of the Eastern Visayas Administrative Region held on March 20, 2022 at the Price Mansion Hotel, Tacloban City. Bro. Alfonso Labrague talked about the tenets of leadership and how it can be used to promote member and organizational development.

Similarly, Bro. Aldridge Angelo Zablan represented the APO Academy and delivered a talk on the APO Pledgeship Program and Anti-Hazing during the virtual orientation of APO Epsilon Kappa Chapter on April 30, 2022 titled "Why APO? Breaking the Stigma on Fraternities".



NAVIGATING OPPORTUNITIES AMID UNCERTAINTY

he Committee on Membership has, in line with the directive to break barriers, build bridges, and uplift lives during Development Year 2021-2023, sought to be a transformational leader in promoting the progressive development and expansion of membership in Alpha Phi Omega.

The Committee on Membership in 2021

In its first four months of service, it has been the custodian of institutional integrity, ensuring that members and officers act with good conduct and compliance to existing laws. It has sought to go beyond promotion, and uprightly enforce our renunciation of violence in all forms in membership and recruitment. In cooperation with our Board of Trustees, regional officers, and other chapters and associations, it has promoted alternative practices in compliance with RA 11053, the Anti-Hazing Law of 2018, and apprehended and investigated any such acts tending to the opposite.

It has furthermore continued the good work of promoting the formation of new collegiate chapters and alumni associations. From our appointment to office in October 2021 to the the end of the year, CoMe has happily recommended the following organizational units for recognition, who have now become chartered institutional members of APO Philippines, Inc:

- 1. APO Beta Tau Sorority Chapter
- 2. APO Al-Ahsa Alumni Association

As such, at the close of 2021, we reported 360 recognized collegiate fraternity chapters, 161 recognized collegiate sorority chapters, 109 chapter-based alumni associations, and 294 community-based, institution-based, and professional alumni associations. We likewise commend the efforts of our brothers and sisters to promote lifelong membership, with 254 chapter-based alumni associations currently undergoing the recognition process.

The Committee on Membership in the first quarter of 2022

The Committee's work continued unabated as Alpha Phi Omega welcomed yet another year. Four months hence, we have chartered six new basic organizational units into the fold:

- APO Omicron Delta Chapter Manila Law Colleges (Petitioned since 2003)
- 2. APO Omicron Epsilon Chapter Aklan Catholic College (Petitioned since 2009)
- 3. APO Theta Nu Sorority Chapter Mindoro College of Agriculture & Technology
- 4. APO Iota Phi Sorority Chapter Rizal System University
- 5. APO Epsilon Psi Alumni Association
- 6. APO Viga Alumni Association

From January 20 to April 15, 2022, 33 more Alumni Associations submitted their Letter of Intent for charter recognition. Alongside this, four Fraternity basic organizational units (BOUs) filed their petition for recognition, and nine groups filed their Letter of Intent to organize petitioning chapters,



However, there remains much work to do. Even with seven petitioning collegiate fraternity units, 203 petitioning collegiate sorority units, 176 coded petitioning collegiate chapters, and twelve petitioning collegiate chapters, we have yet to break ground in the vast majority of higher education institutions (HEIs) in the country, which number 2,396, according to the 2020 Commission on Higher Education (CHED) report.

Despite this, the Committee on Membership remains optimistic. We see the trends and the conditions brought about by the coronavirus pandemic not as dangers, but opportunities. Much of our effort now is on navigating brotherhood and accountability amid a largely digital and fast-changing environment.

Alongside the development of our very own smartphone app, PO-APPS, which is now downloadable on Google Play, the Committee of Membership has successfully submitted amendments to the APO Internet Code of Conduct, an updated standard of decorum for our members online, which the National Board of Trustees approved in its Third Regular Meeting last April 24, 2022.

To promote our growth not only in quantity, but also in quality, we are likewise developing guidelines for residency requirements for admission, integrating charters for collegiate chapters, additional guidelines and policies for establishing alumni associations, organizing new chapters, and reviving defunct chapters, which we are putting forward to the committee for amendments to the APO Philippines By-Laws.

Additionally, we continue to participate in the editorial board of the Enhanced APO Pledge Process Manual in order to craft a pledge process that is at once consistent with existing laws in the country, reverent of our traditions and principles, and cognizant of developing social conditions in this time and the coming years.

We remain in faith to the cardinal principles of Leadership, Friendship, and Service, and strive to uphold continuity in line with social and cultural advancements, multiplicity with sustainability and quality, and universality of our brotherhood of Service, across gender, culture, creed, and different abilities

The Committee on Membership looks forward to every Alpha Phi Omegan's continued support.

Alpha Phi Omega is a leading service-oriented organization that has long been practicing social responsibility-it is a shared value passed on from the founder to the past and present leaders and with all the members. Correspondingly, it became the organization's way of doing its moral duties and responsibilities towards society and is highly attributed to the lectures and principles passed on during pledgeship became the existing norm in the organization. In addition, other factors in the development of long-practiced values are strong leadership, genuine friendship, and dedicated service. Service projects and activities are manifestations the concrete of this shared value of social responsibility and how the organization connects with society and the people.

For this reason, Alpha Phi Omega Ladies Unified in Service (APU-PLUS) is up to living with its moral duties and obligations toward society through standing by the norm of engaging members to become socially responsible. Be the case, APO-PLUS carefully planned all service projects categorizing its target beneficiaries and maximizing its resources for broader coverage.

On January 2 and March 21, 2022, APO-PLUS conducted activities focused on children aged 5-10 at Brgy. Rabon, San Fabian and Bonuan Boquig, Dagupan City, Pangasinan. With the theme Cultivating the Spirit of Sharing, over 400 underprivileged children received new pairs of slippers, school supplies, essentials, and happy kiddie meals. It was indeed a funpacked activity as there were





parlor games, prizes, and intermission numbers presented by the beneficiaries to the group. It also included free haircut and tons of schemes to entertain the children and their parents. The essence of the program aims to make the children feel that amidst all difficulties, there are a hundred reasons to be grateful, celebrate life, and always hope for a bright tomorrow.

After thorough planning, APO-PLUS spearheaded another project last February 12, 2022. The target beneficiaries of the service were the 37 elderly residents of Little Sisters of the Poor located at Brgy. Catubig, Bolinao, Pangasinan. The agency is a non-profit, non-government organization that caters to abandoned senior citizens. Food, facemasks, alcohol, and other essentials were delivered and warmly received by the management. While the visit was short-timed and limited due to existing protocols just the same, it was as rewarding as it should be. Substantially, the activity became an eye-opener for the attendees, realizing that even though Filipinos have close family ties, some people end up in a home for the aged and elderly institutions after serving their purpose with their respective families.

Last April 2, 2022, and in celebration of the women's month, APO-PLUS in cooperation with Alain Directorate of APO Emarat-121 AA with the Alpha Gamma AA conducted a special activity for the 75 Women in Conflict with the Law at BJMP Dagupan City. Provision of hygiene kits inclusive of sanitary pads, bath soap, and the like, facemasks, alcohol, and other goods were turned over to the management of BJMP for proper documentation and distribution. The service was focused and centered on cultivating change work for women. Also, the deep appreciatoion on the important role of women in nation-building. APO-PLUS as a sorority-based organization deemed it necessary to give due recognition to the women in conflict with the law for APO knows no boundaries when it comes to the welfare of the deprived sector of the society.

Social responsibility encapsulates the concept of doing what is morally right toward others and society. For Alpha Phi Omega, it is not just a concept but a way of life-a part of the system, a shared value, an established culture with which members clearly understand that makes APO distinct from other organizations.

pril 30, 2022, Saturday, was a big day for the community residents, both young and old, of Barangay Cutcut 1st in Capas, Tarlac. It was the day where the APO Central Luzon Administrative Region, under the leadership of Regional Director, Brod Jerry T. Villanueva Jr., implemented the Mega Service Humanitarian Drive organized and coordinated by the Chairman and Members of the Committee on Planning and Implementation under the headship of Chairman Brod Aldrin Galang.

A triple treat (haircut, circumcision, and free slippers) for the young Capas homies plus another triple treat (reading glasses, cataract surgery, and chiropractic massage) for the old Capas residents, supported and attended by no other than the Advisor for Central Luzon Administrative Region Sis. Mel Alejo, Chairman and Members of the Committee on Ways and Means under the headship of Brod Dr. Edward Paraguison, Assistant National Treasurer Sis. Nette Flores Villanueva with her batch mate Sis Amy Violago, APO Academy Chairman Sis. Kaye Gonzales, CLAR Secretary, Brod. Philip Caluag, Committee on Solicitation Sis. Joseli Gaerlan, Section Chair for Tarlac Brod Roldan Luna, Section Chair for Collegiate Pampanga Brod Lorenzo Opiano, Section Chair for Collegiate Bataan Brod. John Kenneth Baringue, Section Chair for Pampanga AA Brod Napoleon Blas, Deputy Regional Director for Collegiate Neljayson Navarro, Regional Director for Collegiate Ulysses Ron Cruz and Officials and Members of Theta Delta Chapter, Theta Delta AA, APO TARAA, Zeta Delta AA, Xi chapter, Xi AA, Zeta Delta Chapter, Epsilon Psi Chapter, Epsilon Psi AA, Epsilon Iota Chapter, Mu Pi Chapter, Alpha Kappa Chapter, Nu Sigma Chapter, Lambda Chapter, Mt. A total of 202 Capas home boys were transformed into growing up young men through a synchronized coordinated surgical circumcision operation composed of (1) the Pre-Surgical Assessment and Screening Team, (2) the Surgical Team, (3) the Surgical Instrument Cleaning and Disinfection Team and (4) the Post-Surgical Operation Management Team.

Every boy who has undergone circumcision was given a MEDICATION KIT composed of 21 capsules of 250 mg Amoxicillin to be taken per orem (or orally) "ter in die" (or 3Xday) for 7 consecutive days to combat post-operative infection and 250 mg mefenamic acid to be taken "quaque die" (or 1Xday) for pain management. Plus, a HYGIENE KIT composed of



10 pieces of face masks, 1 bar of soap, a toothbrush and a tube of toothpaste, 1 bottled alcohol with spray, and a pair of new slippers of his own choice of size and color.

The free slippers were courtesy of the APO Tanod Baybayin AA Pet (Philippine Coast Guard) which donated 250 pairs of slippers for this occasion and was attended by Brod Ensign John Niko Anicete, Brod Ensign John Sebastian Anicete, and Brod Lieutenant Junior Grade Ariel Guiang.

A total of 85 Capas home boys were given a free haircut courtesy of the Section Chair for Tarlac AA, PNP Colonel Bro. Roldan Luna with his better half, Sis Zenaida Luna, who hired three (3) barbers to this part of the CLAR Mega Service Humanitarian Drive. This equated to about 17 minutes per head per barber from 8 AM to 5 PM working simultaneously side by side with a 1-hour lunch break.



A total of 190 correction reading glasses courtesy of the XI AA were fitted and given to the recipient Capas residents with the help of a team of ophthalmologist and optometrist from DRS Optical who also scheduled 23 cataract patients for surgical operations on May 1, 2022 and May 6, 2022 with an additional 12 Capas patients who were given a chiropractic corrective massage supported and attended by the officials and members of Barangay Villa de San Jose under the Chairmanship of Kap. Ruben S. Nolasco.

The sumptuous packed lunch to everyone who participated in the Mega Service was provided by the CAPAS AA under the leadership of president Brod Clod Gamboa. The distribution of the packed lunch and hydration fluids was attended and supervised by CAPAS AA OIC Brod Edward Cadiang.

After the Mega Service, everyone proceeded to the residence of Brod Henry Cruz in Barangay San Juan in Conception, Tarlac for dinner and fellowship. The evening event was officially ended with the awarding of the certificates of attendance to all participating APO units in Central Luzon.



November 6, 2021 – after several attempts over the years, **APO Ala Eh Federation** was finally born after well-attended meeting of officers and members of different alumni associations in Batangas was completed. The primary goal of the federation is to serve as an extended arm and support with Section 1 officers. The federation aims to unite, collaborate and leads over-all and major projects across the province.

Officers of the Federation represents all alumni associations in Batangas to serve the same development years as section officers. Each alumni association has a position in the federation to ensure that all decision-makings are voices heard from our alumni associations as well as communication and cascade of updates are streamlined. In all elections after, the same premise of being well-represented and ensuring of continuity of projects are followed.

Alongside projects of all alumni associations and synchronized activities led by our National Administrative Office, Section 1 and Federation Officers focus on efforts for major and sustainable projects. These are projects minimal in count, but higher on impact to the community in Batangas. Some

"Plant a Tree, Save the Earth" was the first sustainable and legacy project launched and completed by Section 1 and APO Ala Eh Federation upon its charter last November 2021. The project adopts a specific area in the Mangrove Forest in Brgy. Lagadlarin, Lobo, Batangas and conduct at least semi-annual tree planting activity participated by all alumni/chapters in Batangas.

We are in one with Municipality of Lobo's aim to intensify programs on reforestation on mangrove for the benefits of extending the area for mangrove forest located at Brgy Lagadlarin.

Both parties entered and signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) last January 10, 2022 for a structured long-term project towards sustainable environmental service to the community and the nation. The agreement includes activity of at least semi-annual tree planting activity and a monthly reporting of status of all propagules to be cascaded across all alumni associations and private groups involved.

The first "Plant a Tree, Save the Earth" Mangrove Tree Planting Activity was completed last February 27, 2022 in celebration of our 72nd National Anniversary. We have a total of 266 propagules completely planted by 18 groups of APO alumni associations, Scout Royale Brotherhood and Philippine Coast Guard who joined our successful activity to launch our first sustainable project as a section and as a federation. Also completed the same day was the coastal clean-up service to join our National Administrative Office's synchronized activity.

Tulungan nAPO Tayo is the second sustainable project launched last January 15, 2022. The goal is to echo and provide additional support in communicating help needed by fellow brothers and sisters in the organization as service to our fraternity particularly immediate member/s of any alumni association in Batangas. Also, this is to streamline communications and transparency of donations provided by alumni associations individual and/or member of the organization to our fellow brother/sister or their family. Donations are directly given // deposited to the brother/sister in need. Since the launch, the project already provided total of Php 50,300.00 financial support to three brothers for their immediate family members. (Bro Jayson Abayan's wife and new born child, Jan 18, 2022 -Total Cash Donated: Php 13,900.00; Bro Alvin Diaz's mother, Feb 13, 2022 - Total Cash Donated: Php 10,050.00; and Bro Theody Segarra's wife, Feb 17, 2022 - Total Cash Donated: Php 26,350.00).

As we focus on continuity and sustainable projects, section officers and the Federation are looking forward on ironing out implementations of initial plans for the second half of our term. As we empower our alumni associations to continue with all four folds of service, we stay focus on projects that provides more impact, higher exposure and better engagements across the province of Batangas and make our organization known and legendary through the years.

DELTA KAPPA OPERATION TULE

Tule is the Filipino term for circumcision - the action or practice of cutting off the foreskin of a boy's genitalia. In the Philippine culture, circumcision is mostly done on adolescents to signify the culmination of their manhood.

The Delta Kappa Alumni Association prides itself with its own Delta Kappa Medical Team - a group of selected Delta Kappans who does voluntary work and dedicates their time and effort to attend and provide circumcision services in different parts of Luzon week after week.

This medical team was the brainchild of the late Bro. Edmund "Bim" Minegue. His passion for this service is still being carried on by the Chapter. Today, Bro. Michael Malinay, Service Chariman along with the othe key players Bro. Pyke Bonilla, Bro Dave Faminianoand Bro Dr. Roy Operana are spearheading the Medical Team

From as early as December and up to date, "Operation Tule" services were successfully executed in partnership with various collegiate chapters, alumni associations, local government units and other non-government organizations.

The Medical Team uses a cautery machine used to burn and seal blood vessels. This helps reduce or stop bleeding during surgery or after an injury. It is a safe procedure.

To help facilitate the healing and prevent anycomplications, free medications were also prescribed and given to right after the operation. The parents and quantians accompanying thepatients were given instructions on the prescribed dosage of the medication together with instructions on post-circumcision care.

The beneficiaries of the services rendered by the chapter are 5,139 boys and running, as the chapter still has upcoming Operations Tuli scheduled for this summer.

The Delta Kappa Medical Team has institutionalized this service as the main event every summer and will continue for the many summers to come. This is the chapter's good turn daily, realized
