HYBRID MEETING- The regular meeting was called to order by Mayor Willey at 6:00 p.m. C.M. Dodd, C.M. Milanowski, C.M. Speer, Mayor Willey, Clerk/Treasurer Oster, and Attorney Unzelman were present. C.M. McRoberts and C.M. Nichols were absent. There was 1 citizen present.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Dodd to approve the agenda. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Milanowski and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve Blanket Voucher #202315 for Claim #'s 21163 and 21174-21187 in the amount of \$39,620.77 and Payroll #'s 21164-21173 in the amount of \$22,343.00 for a Grand Total of \$61963.77. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by C.M. Dodd and seconded by C.M. Speer to approve the purchase orders for Clerk/Treasurer Oster to attend the Vision Training Conference including lodging in the amount of \$1270 plus tax & Fees, billing forms through Vision in the amount of \$413.00 plus tax & shipping, and a water meter for the Weyerhauser service through HD Fowler in the amount of \$2913.93. Motion passed unanimously.


