# **Barnsley FC Women Withdraw Abruptly**

Yesterday afternoon (4th June), The FA revealed its confirmation of the Women's Football Pyramid (WFP) club allocations for Tiers 1-6 for the 2025-26 season.

Several hours earlier Barnsley FC posted that it was withdrawing its Women's team - Barnsley FC Women - from the FA Women's National League where it had finished eighth in its debut season at tier four.

In a letter on the club website, Chairman Neerav Parekh stated: "Despite our Men's Academy teams being able to play competitive League fixtures on both our Showcase and 4G pitches, under EFL and Premier League regulations, we have been informed by the FA that these facilities do not meet the criteria for the fourth tier of the Women's game and therefore the full operation would need to be moved either onto Oakwell Stadium or a local grassroots club, both are financially and logistically not possible with resources available."

"It may have been possible to obtain temporary dispensation from The FA, however this would only delay the inevitable decision around the additional costs of playing at a different venue."

How much the Barnsley FC players knew about this is not known, but the tim-

ing of the club's announcement hints that it may well have come to them as a bombshell similar to that of recent events at Blackburn Rovers and Wolverhampton Wanderers where announcements surrounding the future of their women's outfits were released much later than what many would term to be in the best interests of the players.

While the exact nature of why "these facilities do not meet the criteria for the fourth tier of the Women's game" is not stated and without knowing what criteria the FAWNL were considering, it is plausible to attribute the distance between the viewing area and toilets and also the absence of a recognised physical turnstile as being most likely.

Barnsley played several games on the main pitch at Oakwell last season drawing some healthy crowds. The Women's team were well served by the media team home and away on match days.

So, the 2025-26

Women's pyramid for tiers 1 to 6 for local teams is as follows.

Tier 2 - Barclays Women's Super League 2. Sheffield United, who finished in 11th and bottom position last season, have been reprieved and will be hoping for much better fortunes in the year ahead.

Tier 4 - FAWNL. The independent (of Oakwell) Barnsley Women's FC will continue in Division One Midlands where they are joined by Sheffield FC (promoted as East Midlands Premier Division champions. Doncaster Rovers Belles, who finished in the higher of the Division One North's two relegation places have also been reprieved from relegation. A last day of the season win over Huddersfield Town ultimately proved crucial and enabled Belles to finish three points clear of AFC Fylde. So, Fylde suffered relegation for a second successive season. They began 2024-25 with a 2-2 draw at Barnsley.

East Midlands (all

four divisions starting with ten teams).

Tier 5 - Chesterfield Ladies (independent of Chesterfield men), Rotherham United and SJR Worksop continue in the Premier Division to which Lincoln City have been relegated.

Tier 6 - Chesterfield Women (connected to Chesterfield men) and Dronfield Town continue in Division One North.

North East (all three divisions starting with twelve teams)

Tier 5 - Brunsmeer Athletic, promoted as Southern Division champions, are the most southerly of the division's dozen teams.

Tier 6 - Handsworth, Kiveton Park and Sheffield Wednesday are joined in the Southern Division by the promoted duo of Millmoor Juniors and Rossington Main (both from Sheffield & Hallam Women and Girls League)

Both the East Midlands and North East Regional Leagues suffered from teams withdrawing over the past year.

# **County Football Rankings**

Lee Hickman, coach at Kiveton Park, has compiled and shared a comprehensive ranking of football clubs within the Sheffield & Hallamshire County FA region, based on their performance in the 2024/25 season. The list, published on social media platform X, orders clubs by merit according to their final league positions.

The ranking system prioritises the level each club occupies within the English football pyramid. For clubs competing at the same step level but in different leagues, Hickman used pointsper-game (PPG) as the deciding metric to determine their relative standing.



# **Club Thorne Calls for Unity**

Club Thorne has issued a public statement addressing growing concerns and speculation surrounding the proposed new community facility in Thorne and Moorends. The statement, released in response to a wave of social media discussion over the weekend, aims to clarify the club's position and encourage constructive dialogue with local authorities and residents.

The club emphasised that its intention is not to criticise Thorne & Moorends Town Council or any of its members, but rather to provide transparency and foster cooperation. "We strongly discourage any form of negative or inappropriate actions or commentary," the statement read. "Our goal remains to work collaboratively with all stakeholders to ensure that the new facility best serves the entire community."

As of Sunday, 1st June, the club confirmed that the Town Council has voted against adjusting the proposed location of the new community building by 50 feet—a change the club says is necessary to



meet Football Association ground grading requirements. No alternative solution has yet been formally proposed or offered to the club.

During a council meeting held on 20th May, several reasons were cited for the decision not to relocate the building. These included potential delays to the overall project timeline, significant costs associated with revising the floor plan-estimated to possibly reach six figures-and the need to remove the existing Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA) to create additional parking. Club Thorne clarified that it has never requested the removal or relocation of the MUGA.

The statement also addressed the £166,000 insurance payout related

to the project. According to the council, these funds are being earmarked for the operational costs of the new Levelling Up Fund (LUF)-supported Community Hub. However, the club noted that, as of 1st June, the official minutes from the 20th May council meeting have not been made publicly available.

Local residents have voiced a mix of concern and support. "It's frustrating to see what feels like a lack of flexibility," said Sarah Jennings, a parent of two young players. "This facility could be a real asset for the whole town, but only if it meets the needs of the people who'll use it most."

Others urged caution. "We have to consider the bigger picture," said

Alan Morris, a long-time resident. "Delays and extra costs could jeopardise the entire project. I just hope both sides can find a compromise."

Club Thorne reiterated its commitment to transparency and open communication with its players, parents, coaches, volunteers, supporters, and the wider community. "We are committed to transparency and wanted to share all currently available information with our community," the board stated.

As discussions continue, the club has expressed hope that a mutually agreeable solution can still be found—one that supports both the development of local sport and the broader needs of the community.

# Cawthorne Stun Leaders in Upset

here was a surprise result in Premier Division at Field Lane, where leaders Wakefield Thornes were beaten by Cawthorne.

The hosts were put in to bat, never recovered from being 16-5, and were all out for 88. Cawthorne then eased their way to a seven-wicket win in the 22nd over.

Sheffield Collegiate are now level with Thornes at the top of the table after beating Hallam at Abbeydale. Abdul Faseeh (94) led the hosts to 217-6, then the wickets were shared around when the visitors were bowled out for 168 in reply,

Christian Leddicoat top-scoring with 60. **Doncaster Town** missed the chance to go top after being bowled out for 185 when they were put in to bat by **Tickhill** at the Brookfield Oval. Adam Copley

took 7-38 for the hosts, helping reduce Town to 49-6, and only when Charlie Kaye (56) and Jak Hotchkiss (52) put on 84 for the seventh wicket did the visitors threaten to get on top. Tickhill were 109-5 in reply, but a quickfire 40 from Jordan Lowe swung the game Tickhill's way, and they got home by three wickets with nine balls to spare.

Cleethorpes are in fourth, just eight points behind the leaders after a convincing win over **Barnsley Woolley Miners** at Chichester Road. Bill Kirby made 67 out of the hosts' 222-7, then Mayank Mishra took 4-31 when the visitors were all out for 97 in reply.

Muhammad Qaisar Ashraf took 5-32 to help **Whitley Hall** bowl out struggling **Shiregreen** for 122 after putting them in to bat at Hatfield House Lane. The visitors then knocked off the required runs for the loss of six wickets in 37 overs.

Kieran Lindley took 5-56 for **Appleby Frodingham** when they bowled **Wickersley Old Village** out for 163 at Northfield Lane, Manan Vohra top-scoring for the hosts with 53. Visiting skipper Alex Grimes (82 not out) then led his side to an eight-wicket victory in the 37th over, after sharing in an opening stand of 95 with Matt Morland.

### **CHAMPIONSHIP**

There are new leaders in the Championship Division, after **Doncaster Town 2nds** moved to the summit by beating overnight leaders **Tickhill 2nds** at Town Fields. Jack Woodiwiss (71) led the hosts to 179-7, then Warren Graca took 5-32 when the visitors were bowled out for 126 in reply.

Sprotbrough moved up to second place with an emphatic win over Elsecar at Melton Road. Forties from Joe Toole and Lewis Hogg took the hosts to 200 all out, then wickets were shared as the visitors were bowled out for 72 in reply.

Whiston Parish Church slipped to fourth place after being well beaten by local rivals **Treeton**

at Church Fields. Mark Cummins (75) and Will Scott (67) put on 127 for the visitors' second wicket, and they posted 223-6. Cummins then took three wickets as Whiston were bowled out for 100 in reply.

Ackworth had the better of a high-scoring encounter at home to Oughtibridge War Memorial. George Gillespie (66) and Daniel Malyan-Walker (89) were in the runs when the hosts made an impressive 297-9, Will Cooper taking 4-54 for Oughtibridge. After the visitors were 61-4 in reply, Michael Brown (92) and Ikramullah Naseri (65) added 132 for the fifth wicket to put their side right back in the game, but in the end, Joshua Hen-Boisen swung the game Ackworth's way with 4-48, and Oughtibridge were all out for 282.

The tightest game of the day came at Green Lane, where an unbeaten 75 from Paul Cummins took **Rockingham Colliery** to 186-7 after they were put in to bat by **Aston Hall**. Gerard Coetzee (77) then took the hosts to 147-4, but after he was out, wickets started to fall, and Aston only got home by one wicket with one ball to spare.

Matthew Tyas (4-29) took four early wickets for **Sheffield Collegiate 2nds** to reduce **Wath** to 46-5, after which they never fully recovered and were all out for 134. Jack Clough was unbeaten on 59 when Collegiate recorded an eightwicket win in the 20th over.
