

My First Dressage4Kids Clinic with Lendon Gray

This year, I was able to participate in the D4K Clinic with Lendon Gray for the first time. I cannot describe in words how amazing it was. 
Dressage4Kids Clinic with Lendon Gray

Change this ONE thing for instant improvement in your riding.

In Dressage especially, your thoughts define your reality. Because of this, mindset is EVERYTHING!

Recently, I had the chance to work with a world-renowned sports psychologist, Laura King.

A huge part of riding is mental. Really getting into the right headspace is the difference between having a good and productive ride and not having one!

We all have thoughts of self-doubt sometimes... "I'm not a good enough rider." "I wish I rode better." "I can't do this." "I'm not good enough..."


Or sometimes we obsess and get over-focused on a movement or an incident that occurred in the past... "What if my horse spooks?" "What if I can't get the right lead canter?" "What if I fall off and get hurt?"

These are all thoughts that all riders have at times, but dwelling on these thoughts is not helpful! This is where the purple elephant comes in!

The psychologist that I worked with, Laura King, recommended that anytime we have these negative and unproductive thoughts to **think of a purple elephant**.

Try it today! It really works!

Whenever you are having a bad thought, think of a purple elephant, then when the thought leaves,



replace the purple elephant with a different, positive thought.

"I can do this!"

- "I am a good rider!"
- "I know I can ride that test!"
- "I'm going to get on and get this done!"

"I love to ride, I'm going to enjoy my horse and my ride!"

Getting this positive mindset is so important!

2024 US Eventing Rule Change Proposal Comment Period Now Open

There are several rule change proposals being presented to the USEF that would go into effect on December 1, 2023 for the 2024 eventing season and it is now time for the membership to weigh in on these rule change proposals.

As a reminder, all rules for eventing are under the jurisdiction of the US Equestrian Federation (USEF) and the U.S. Eventing Association (USEA) only has the ability to put forth rule changes proposals for consideration by the USEF.

The online eventing rule change proposal comment portal is now open and the USEA encourages all members to participate in providing feedback on the 2024 rule change proposals.

Access the portal here and login using your USEA Online Services account.

The comment period ends on January 9, 2022, so be sure to submit your survey before that date.

USEA Annual Meeting & Convention attendees had the opportunity to discuss the rule change proposals in person at the annual Rule Change Open Forum. Read a recap of the meeting here.

Regular Meeting November 13, 2023

President Caren Caverly called the membership meeting of the GDCTA to order on November 13, 2023, at 7:00 pm on Zoom.

Secretary Ashley Boyd performed a roll call. A quorum of the board consisting of Caren Caverly, Abigail Kroupa, Joanne Morse, Ashley Boyd, Peter West, Lindsey Burns, Julie Shannon, Katie Patton, Liz Malloy, and Carol Tresan were present. The minutes of the regular meeting on October 16, 2023, were emailed to board members prior to meeting. Julie motioned to approve minutes, Liz seconded the minutes were passed by the board.

Caren asked if there were any nominations from the floor for elections 3 times. Nominations elections closed. All Officers were elected from the group. 3 new board members for two years each Liz Malloy, Lindsey Burns and Janie Pride.

Treasurer's Report – (Peter): October had a loss of about \$4600 mostly because of pre-paying for conferences coming up.

VP Dressage Report – (Abigail): Nothing to report working on clinics for next year.

VP Combined Training – (Joanne): We hosted two educational events this year. The first event was the Sara Kozumplik show jumping clinic that took place at Southern Oaks in Villa Rica, GA. We had 22 participants for that clinic and made a profit of \$385. The second event that we hosted was the Eventing Camp that took place at Chattahoochee Hills Eventing in Fairburn, GA. We expanded from last year and had 5 trainers and 50 rider spots. Four of those spots were sponsored. That clinic made a profit of \$3,932. Both of these profits are stated before taking into account credit card fees that were paid by doing registration through the website.

We plan to host two events next year as well. One regular clinic with the clinician TBD and the eventing camp. We hope to expand the eventing camp again for 2024 and add an additional trainer to the group and be able to take additional riders. **Membership Report** – (Mary Lou): We have the highest numbers we have ever had. Current membership is 861 which is 2.1% more than last year. Discussion about how to connect with people whose membership has lapsed, beyond the emails that are already sent out.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

• Communication (Joanne): No report

• Show Committee (Julie): We did get approval for moving the USDF Labor Day Classic shows to Wills Park on the Summer Finals dates we already hold. 2024 will be GDCTA's 50th Anniversary. Caren proposed making the show also a big celebration with a party with food trucks, DJ, etc. We will need to work on getting sponsorships and vendors for the event. It will be discussed more at future meetings.

- Finance (Peter): No report
- Youth Program (Joanne):
 - Letterman applications coming in well. They are going to adjust the qualifications scores for intro a little bit. Liz reported about 20 applications for recognized Letterman Jacket.
 - The Letterman Program has shown a steady increase in interest sine its inaugural year. We had 23 junior riders apply to the program for the 2022 awards year. That program had a profit of \$277. This profit is stated before taking into account the credit card fees that were paid by having members purchase their jackets and achievements through the website.
 - The 2023 awards year is on target to do the same as last year with more new jackets being awarded. Those final numbers will be available after the closing date on November 30.
 - Dressage for Kids had 12 clinic riders and 19 in festival.
 - Other positive reports on members competing in championship classes.
- Awards (Janie): no report
- Education (Julie): No report

• Gala (Caren): Renewed the click bid, please help get silent auction items. Julie and Katie are doing barn basket and need additional baskets from barns.

- New Member calls for December Lacey
- Committees 2024 Caren announced that they will go over it at the next meeting and for people to think about them and how they can contribute.

Joanne motioned to adjourn. Julie seconded and board approved.
