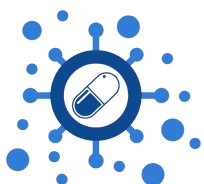

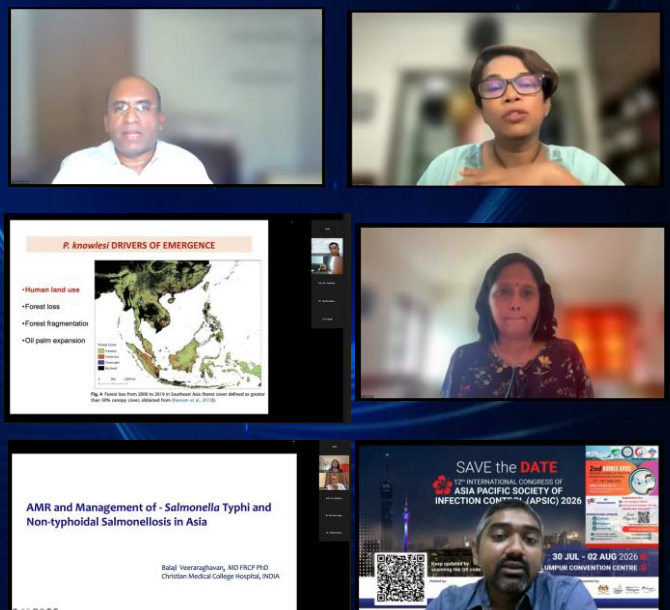

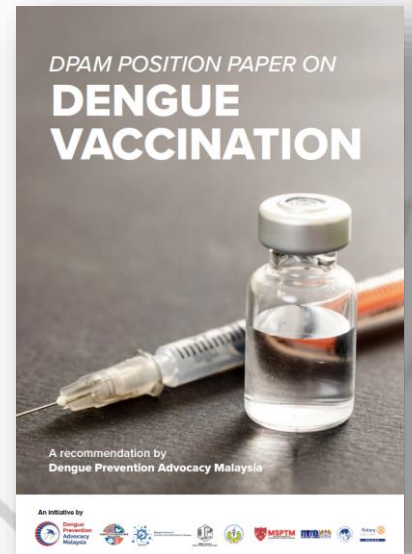

Use of ivermectin to treat Covid-19 worrying — MyICID

JUNE 25 — MyICID is deeply concerned regarding the use of ivermectin as prophylaxis and treatment for Covid-19 among the public before it has been endorsed in any clinical guideline, either locally or internationally for these indications.

Ivermectin is an anti-parasitic drug with good efficacy and safety profile. Based on laboratory evidence, anecdotal reports and several early clinical trials, ivermectin appears to be a potential repurposed drug for Covid-19 prevention and treatment.

However, results from well designed, large randomized controlled trials are needed to determine the efficacy and safety of ivermectin in Covid-19. To date, there are more than 80 randomized controlled trials on ivermectin which are either completed or ongoing around world. A large scale trial like the PRINCIPLE study by the oxford scientist should provide an answer if this drug can be repurposed as an antiviral to treat Covid. Locally, Malaysia is conducting a similar clinical trial involving 500 high risk Covid-19 subjects. The results from these trials will yield robust scientific evidence, not only on the role of ivermectin in Covid-19 treatment, but also on the optimal dose and duration needed for effective outcomes without causing any adverse effects to the patients.

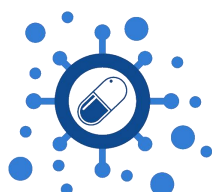
