Dear Friend,

Good oral health is essential for the healthy development of Rhode Island's young children. Our continued collaboration with Samuels Sinclair Dental Center (Samuels) at Rhode Island Hospital is one of the ways we ensure a healthy start for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers at Children's Friend.

According to the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry, children living in poverty are twice as likely to suffer from tooth decay, and their dental diseases are more than twice as likely to go untreated compared to their more affluent peers. Yet, regular dental care sets children up for positive health outcomes throughout their lives.

Over 90% of the families we serve at Children's Friend live at or below the federal poverty level. By working with Samuels to make comprehensive dental care accessible to children, we are directly addressing disparities so that all children have the opportunity for a healthy future. Our partnership with Samuels also allows us to educate families about the importance of coordinated family dental care, which contributes to a lifetime of good oral health outcomes for both children and their caregivers.

We are thrilled to report that more of our families are making dental arrangements with private dentists each year, and most of our families have established a permanent dental home.

We extend a heartfelt thank-you to those who make the comprehensive Dental Program at Children's Friend a reality, including Samuels, the Children's Friend Policy Council and Board of Directors, and our talented team of Health Project Coordinators, Teachers, and Nurses. Thank you for making early oral health a priority for children.
